Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted between June 26-July 5, 2020 among a national sample of 796 Colorado Registered Voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Colorado Registered Voters based on gender, age, educational attainment, race, home ownership, and 2016 Presidential vote. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
