



**HOOD RIVER** — The fall season brought tremendous success, with nearly all of our teams reaching the postseason. Girls soccer earned an atlarge bid to the Oregon School Activites Association (OSAA) playoffs, while Boys soccer finished second in league and advanced to the state quarterfinals, falling in penalty kicks to eventual champions La Salle Prep. Head Coach Al Lara was named Northwest Oregon Conference (NWOC) Coach of the Year. Football placed third in the league and narrowly lost in the first playoff round. Boys cross country brought home a 4th-place state trophy, and both water polo teams reached state — boys finishing 4th and girls winning their third consecutive State Championship.

Winter saw multiple teams excel at the state level. The

Boys Snowboard Team, led by Coach Peter Lawson, secured their fourth straight State Title. The Girls alpine ski team, led by Giant Slalom State Champion Emily Teets and Coach Jesse Scroggins, won their first ttate title since 2019. The Boys alpine team were league champions and placed sixth at state. Wrestling qualified three athletes for state, with the boys earning a top-five finish. Girls basketball celebrated their first winning season in 25 years, while boys basketball defeated topranked Wilsonville, La Salle, and Summit.

Spring was fast-paced and successful. Baseball and softball returned to state playoffs, with Softball finishing second in NWOC. Grace Rowan was named Pitcher of the Year, and Coach Madelynn Valleio earned Coach of the Year. Boys golf sent three players to State, with Coach Erin Mason also earning Coach of the Year honors; girls golf sent two players. Girls lacrosse made the playoffs, with Josie Faaborg earning All-State honors, and boys lacrosse also reached the first round. Track and field sent multiple athletes to State, with Sylvaine Farr placing 5th in pole vault and Savina Davis third in the 800. Boys volleyball rebounded from a winless season to a top-8 State finish. Girls tennis went 7-1 in league, placed second at districts, and sent a singles and doubles team to state. Boys tennis had a winning season and sent their top singles player to state.



## The Dalles High School Athletics 2024-2025 Year in Review

THE DALLES — The Dalles High School (TDHS) wrapped up a standout 2024-25 athletic year filled with league titles, state finishes, academic honors, and seven athletes committing to compete at the collegiate level.

Fall sports set the tone with volleyball finishing 19-7, winning the Tri-Valley League, placing 4th at state, and producing two college signees: Laci Hoylman and Maddie

Brock.

Girls soccer went 12-2-2, won back-to-back league titles, reached the quarterfinals, and earned Academic All-State honors with a 3.64 GPA.

Boys soccer finished 12-4 and also reached the quarterfinals, with Hulises Najera Moreno committing to play in college.

Cross country saw the girls place third at state and boys second, with standout Alaina Casady placing second

individually. Casady and Trey Hodges both signed to run at the collegiate level.

Football wrapped up with a 3-6 record and several All-League selections.

In the winter, boys and girls basketball each posted their best preseason records in over a decade and reached the state playoffs. Sydney Newby committed to Linfield University for basketball.

Swim had multiple district champions and top-six finishes at state. Wrestling saw record turnout and debuted a girls team with 10 athletes.

Cheer placed third at Oregon School Activites Associations (OSAA) state

and earned multiple podiums elsewhere, with Ella Anderson committing to the University of Montana.

Spring sports added even more accolades. Baseball went 14-6 and reached the playoffs, with Avery Schwartz signing with Lewis-Clark State College. Softball finished 13-12 and also made the postseason, with Maddie Brock continuing both softball and volleyball at Mt. Hood CC.

In track, the boys 4x100

broke a school record and placed 4th at state — the school's first trophy in 30 years. River McClure signed with Mt. Hood Community College. Golf saw the boys earn Academic All-State (3.39 GPA), and the girls place 5th at districts. Tennis qualified athletes for both singles and doubles at districts.

From records and rankings to scholarships and state-level success, 2024-25 was a year to remember for TDHS athletics.

The Dalles fourth at 4A state volleyball tournament

THE DALLES — The Dalles High Riverhawks took fourth place in the Class 4A volleyball state championship tournament Nov. 8-9 at North Bend High School.

The Riverhawks (19-7), guided by second-year Coach Teresa Morris, brought home a state volleyball trophy for the first time since 1998, when The Dalles was third in the Class 3A state tourney.

The Riverhawks won 3-2 in a Nov. 9 consolation round over the Skyline Conference champion Henley High Hornets (17-5). That victory advanced The Dalles to the fourth-place match which it won over Cascade High.

The Riverhawks had two players chosen to the all-tourney teams: freshman outside hitter Jazzy Morris-Holmes (first team); and senior middle blocker Laci Hoylman (second team). Their fourth-place trophy contest marked the final game of The Dalles High School volleyball careers of Hoylman, Chrissy Geary, Alice Peluso, and Maddie Brock.

THE GORGE — South Wasco and Sherman concluded their 2024 volleyball seasons with losses in the Class 1A state playoffs. The No. 15-ranked Redsides (22-11) advanced to the second round of the playoffs for a fourth consecutive year. The Redsides lost Nov. 2 to defending state champion and top-ranked Crane, 3-0.

The Redsides, guided by second-year Coach Shelley Iverson, won an Oct. 30 first-round state playoff game 3-0 over the Mountain West League champion Triangle Lake High Lakers (15-4) in Blachly (near Eugene).

The Redsides reached the state playoffs for a seventh consecutive season. They finished third in the Big Sky district playoffs.

## Eagle girls water polo make history, win third state championship

**HOOD RIVER** — The Hood River Valley girls' water polo team secured their third consecutive state championship, defeating West Albany 15-11 in the final. After a lopsided 20-4 semifinal win over Hillsboro, the Eagles weathered a West Albany comeback thanks to key saves by senior goalkeeper Kikyo Hawkins. Hood River ended the season with Kykio Hawkins, Sophie Cross, Tess Marsden, and Kylin Elliot making first team all-state; Mackenzie Thurner on second team all-state; and Maya Arndt honorable mention.

This state championship win caps off a strong season and an unprecedented run of three championships in a row for the Eagles. Senior Kylin Elliot feels that this championship is different "because it was my last chance to play for such an amazing team with such awesome players and coaches." Senior Sophie Cross adds "this team is special because we are so bonded. The seniors have been playing together


## Mitchell, Solorio place fifth at state


Everett Coyner (third at district, 165 pounds) lost both his matches and Giovanni Ruiz won one of his three matches at 126 pounds (six team points). Holden

HOOD RIVER — Hood River Valley's (HRV's) track and field team had six individual placers, and the same number of personal bests May 30-31 at the 2025 Class 5A state meet in Eugene. Eagle freshman Savina Davis led the way with her third-place effort in the girls 800 meters final May 31 in 2 minutes, 17.26 seconds. Her teammate Syl Perrin ran a lifetime best of 10:14.51 to place eighth in a stellar 3000-meter field. Davis and Perrin, a junior, ran together on May 31, placing ninth and 10th in the 1500 meter final.

Senior Sylvaine Farr cleared a lifetime best of 10-7.5 (3.24 meters) to place fifth in the pole vault for HRV. Farr finished her HRV career ranked No. 6 all-time in the vault.

Davis, junior Sadie Baumann, freshman Georginia Williams, and junior Hazel Haspela ran the 4x400 relay. Their time of 4:10.10 is No. 10 in school history. The Eagle 4x100 relay also qualified for state, finishing in 51.69 seconds (17th). Team members were sophomore Keira Brennan, freshman Camila Luna, senior Alex Bronson, and Williams.




