

Columbia Gorge CASA

- PROGRAM OVERVIEW -

Our team of court-appointed volunteer advocates stands up for children who have experienced abuse or neglect. Each CASA volunteer's goal is to serve as a consistent, caring presence during a time of deep uncertainty. Volunteers meet regularly with children in their placements and also speak with parents, teachers, caseworkers, and resource/foster parents to gather a complete picture of each child's circumstances and needs.

They use this insight to provide judges with thoughtful, detailed reports that advocate for the child's safety, stability, and well-being. Because CASA volunteers focus on a small number of children, they bring a uniquely personal perspective to the court.

CASA advocacy matters because every child deserves to be seen, supported, and to know that their story has not been forgotten. Our volunteers devote countless hours listening, observing, and documenting the experiences of children navigating foster care. By meeting children in their placements, gathering information, and providing detailed recommendations, advocates help judges make more informed decisions that serve the child's best interests.

This year, our community has seen an influx of children entering foster care, and many remain on our waitlist—waiting for an advocate to stand by their side. By supporting Columbia Gorge CASA, you help ensure that every child has someone fighting for their future.



- GIVING OPPORTUNITIES -

Columbia Gorge CASA relies on the generosity and dedication of community members to ensure that children in foster care in Hood River, Wasco, and Sherman Counties have someone advocating for their best interests. There are many ways to make a meaningful impact—through financial support, volunteering, leadership involvement, or business partnerships.

Financial Giving: Your donations help support critical advocacy for children navigating foster care. Monthly giving is especially impactful, helping to provide consistency in the often-uncertain world of nonprofit work. Even a small recurring gift is greatly valued and helps support the longevity of our work. One-time gifts are also appreciated and help increase our capacity to serve more children.

Volunteer Advocacy: Becoming a CASA volunteer is one of the most direct ways of supporting our community's most vulnerable children. Volunteers are appointed by the court to represent the best interests of children who have experienced abuse or neglect. CASA advocates spend time with the child, gather information, and provide the court with detailed, thoughtful recommendations. Each volunteer focuses on a small number of children, offering consistent support and guidance during a time of deep uncertainty.

Business Partnerships: Local businesses play a vital role in CASA's success by providing resources, funding, and visibility for our mission. Businesses can sponsor events such as our Fall Family Run or Playhouse Raffle, or help raise awareness about the need for volunteer advocates. Partnerships strengthen our efforts to ensure every child has a dedicated advocate and the opportunity for a brighter, more hopeful future. Supporting CASA demonstrates a business's commitment to the community and creates lasting change for vulnerable children.



- PROGRAM OVERVIEW -

Columbia Gorge Food Bank serves Hood River, Wasco, and Sherman Counties as the regional food bank. As part of the Oregon Food Bank Network, we connect statewide food resources with local pantries and community partners — ensuring nourishing food reaches people in need across the Gorge.

How We Move Food Where It's Needed

Food sourcing: We receive food from the government, grocery stores, local farmers, orchardists, and community food drives.

Food distribution: Using data-driven and equity-focused strategies, we distribute food where it is needed most.

Food safety & compliance: We follow strict food safety requirements and help local pantries maintain compliance.

Disaster response: We prepare for and respond to crises to keep food, water, and essential resources flowing.

Community support: We invest in partnerships and programs that strengthen long-term food security, helping local pantries operate more efficiently and sustainably.



Youth Empowerment Shelter

- PROGRAM OVERVIEW -

Youth Empowerment Shelter (YES) provides housing and crisis services to youth ages 10-24 years old. We have two main housing programs as well as additional community based supports. Our largest program is the YES House, which is a 24/7/365 crisis shelter for youth ages 10-19 years old. YES House provides access to basic needs: shelter, food, clothing, and safety, as well as supportive services like life skills and case management. Since 2016, YES House has provided over 10,500 nights of shelter to youth in need. The second main YES program is the Transition House. Transition House is a subsidized rental program for young adults ages 17-24 years old that are experiencing houselessness. While offering an affordable living space, the program also provides weekly case management and life skill building support to help young adults prepare for independence. Along with our main programs, YES provides several community-based services. These services include: weekly NA meetings for young adults, weekly Art program with a local artist, ongoing Magic the Gathering nights for the community, outreach services, and family support services like mediation. Youth Empowerment Shelter is the only organization in the Columbia River Gorge that focuses solely on youth experiencing houselessness. Together, we are making sure that no youth in our community falls through the cracks.



- GIVING OPPORTUNITIES -

Ways to Give to YES

- 1. Become a monthly donor. Donate by check, set up a bill pay option through your bank, or sign up to become a monthly donor on our YES website.
- 2. Link your Fred Meyer account to YES. Once linked, Fred Meyer will donate to YES every time you make a purchase.
- 3. Donate your cans and bottles. YES has an ongoing blue bag bottle drive fundraiser. Simply grab a blue bag in the back, fill it up with cans and bottles for deposit, and drop it off on our porch. All of the money earned from this drive goes directly to the youth at YES through activities, events, earned income opportunities, and more!
- 4. Green Bag Bottle Drop. Do you already have a Green Bag Bottle Drop Account? Consider donating your account funds to YES!
- 5. Purchase supplies on our Amazon Wish List. Items include backpacks, water bottles, socks, weighted blankets, and more. All of the items on the wishlist will go directly to the youth we serve when they enter our programs.
- 6. Sign up to be a volunteer at one of our events.
- 7. Are you 70 ½ or older? Consider a QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution) from your IRA, and exclude the amount from taxable income.
- 8. Fundraise on Facebook for a special event (ex: birthday, anniversary), listing YES as the charity recipient. Click Fundraisers on the left side of your newsfeed and follow the instructions.
- 9. Ask your employer to match your contributions.
- 10. Consider naming YES in your will.
- 11. Subscribe to our newsletter
- 12. Spread the word about our programs and services!

Helping Hands Against Violence, Inc

- PROGRAM OVERVIEW -

Helping Hands Against Violence makes a profound difference in the lives of survivors by offering safety, stability and compassionate support at a moment of crisis. Our 30-day emergency shelter provides a safe environment where survivors can escape physical danger, emotional abuse and ongoing control and gain the space to breathe, recover, and make decisions without fear. Our shelter houses up to six families, where each family has their own room and 24/7 ability to connect with staff trained to respond to trauma with empathy and respect.

Helping Hands advocates offer crucial emotional support. They help survivors process their experiences, rebuild self-esteem, and understand the dynamics of abuse and how to break through the barriers ahead.

At Helping Hands, survivors—whether they need shelter or not—receive help with essentials such as food, clothing as well as guidance in navigating legal systems such as obtaining restraining orders or pursuing custody arrangements. Our advocates help with employment resources and housing searches, helping survivors regain independence and long-term stability.

Ultimately, Helping Hands empowers survivors to reclaim control of their lives. We provide the tools for survivors fleeing abusive situations to build a foundation of safety, dignity, and hope from which it becomes possible for them to envision a future free from violence.

- PROGRAM OVERVIEW -

Hope Medical Clinic is a Pregnancy Diagnosis and Support Clinic serving women and families throughout the Columbia Gorge. Entirely donation-funded and operating at two locations, we assist more than 100 individuals and families each year. Our mission is to empower and equip women—regardless of circumstance—through compassionate, confidential, and cost free services.

We provide free limited medical services of pregnancy diagnosis and support for anyone facing an unplanned pregnancy, including options counseling, nurse-administered urine pregnancy tests, limited obstetrical ultrasounds, nursing consultations, and referrals. Whether exploring options, seeking information, or simply needing a safe and supportive place to decide, we offer judgment-free care from medical staff who truly care.

Our Parenting Program supports clients from pregnancy through their child's first birthday. Women and their spouses or significant others can participate in individualized or couple-based prenatal and parenting coaching. Using the learning platform (BrightCourse) of video-based education, clients learn and grow on topics like pregnancy, labor and delivery, infant care, parenting, finances, and emotional, physical, and spiritual health. Clients meet weekly with ann advocate for encouragement and support; each completed appointment earns points redeemable in our baby boutique, stocked with diapers, wipes, clothing, and other essentials. To celebrate each birth, we provide a donated layette of new baby items and offer postpartum kits to support mothers after delivery.



The Crag Rats

- PROGRAM OVERVIEW -

Founded in 1926, the Crag Rats is our nation's oldest all-volunteer mountain rescue organization. We were founding members of the national Mountain Rescue Association and are proud stewards of the historic Cloud Cap Inn on Mt. Hood.

100 YEARS OF SERVICE

On a winter's day just over a century ago, a boy got lost on the flanks of Mt. Hood, spurring a massive search. Days later, a group of friends, mostly orchardists from the Hood River Valley, found the boy and returned him to safety. A few years later, the same Hood River climbers and skiers rescued another lost boy on Mt. Hood. When reporters asked the Hood River men what their group was called, they remembered a wife describing them as a bunch of rats because they spent weekends on the crags instead of with their families. Someone blurted out "we're the Hood River Crag Rats", a name that's become renowned in the annals of mountain rescue..

Since then, the Rats have rescued thousands of lost or injured hikers, climbers, and skiers. In 2026 we're celebrating 100 years of service to Hood River County, the Columbia Gorge, and the surrounding region.

- GIVING OPPORTUNITIES -

Donate: The Crag Rats are 100% volunteer and have no dedicated funding source. We are constantly in need of financial support for rescue equipment. We also have two primary capital campaigns: a new training wall and ongoing maintenance of the historic Cloud Cap Inn on Mt. Hood.

Training Wall: In honor of our Centennial, the Crag Rats will be building a state-of-the-art training facility next to our Hut in the Hood River Valley. We expect this facility to greatly improve our own training abilities, and we plan to open it for use by our neighboring SAR teams. We could really use your donations to help make this happen! (We need an additional \$120,000 for construction.)

Cloud Cap Inn: The Cloud Cap Inn is a beloved log building at 6,000 feet on the north side of Mt. Hood. Built in 1889, the Inn attracted customers from far and wide until it fell into disrepair in the 1940s. That's when the Crag Rats stepped in, maintaining the historic building in exchange for its use as a rescue and training base. The challenge for the Rats is that 100-mile-an-hour winds pound against the wooden walls and roof through much of the winter. Combined with heavy rain and deep snow, the structure needs constant upkeep, with nearly every log, window, and shingle having been replaced time-and-again. It's a never-ending process. Your financial support would be awesome! (We anticipate that repairs that need to happen soon will cost up to \$400,000).





- PROGRAM OVERVIEW -

In 2025, the museum presented a special exhibit and speaker series about water sports in Hood River and the Gorge which attracted a lot of interest in this unique recent history. We also opened a new Latino History exhibit, Nuestras Raices, all in Spanish with English interpretation. We hope this will be a model for other museums in the Gorge. In September, our Timewinder Tales Poderosas! production shared the stories of four powerful and influential Latina women from our community. The production was in Spanish with simultaneous English interpretation, a new experience for many English speakers and a good opportunity to understand what Spanish speakers in our community experience.

In 2026 we will continue bilingual presentations, with plans for a special quinceanera exhibit. We are also planning a youth speaker series to give local young people a chance to express their hopes for our community and country in the future. This series will complement the temporary exhibit, The Pursuit of Happiness that captures the heart of festivals, events, and celebrations that bring communities together across the state, with photos by Peter Marbach. The museum will continue to host groups of students for tours of the museum, as well as outreach to local classrooms.



- Agricultural Research: We support our local scientists and researchers as they investigate innovative methods for horticultural practices, including new fruit varieties, irrigation practices, pest control, use of technology in the field, and post-harvest storage of fruit.

Mt. Adams Resource Stewards

- PROGRAM OVERVIEW -

Driven by the belief that healthy forests, lands and communities are inseparable and are better off when local people are empowered as stewards, our programs include:

The Mt. Adams Community Forest, owned and managed by MARS, conserves important working forestlands in western Klickitat County to ensure that local forests are forever forests, managed for multiple community benefits: economic, environmental, educational, cultural, and recreational. Over 1,800 acres have been purchased that are actively managed for long-term forest productivity, habitat, fire resiliency and public access. And we continue to grow.

Our Fire and Fuels Program is advancing multiple initiatives to increase the safety of local communities and restore the health of area forests. We employ a highly skilled stewardship crew, a prescribed fire program that strategically uses "good" fire to reduce the threat of catastrophic wildfire, and are constructing miles of fuel breaks in West Klickitat County. Our Fire Adapted Communities Program provides support for wildfire risk reduction at the home and neighborhood levels.

Our Cooperative Land Stewardship Program takes an "all lands" approach, working with partners to provide capacity to increase the pace and scale of forest stewardship on public and private lands. We currently provide staffing to the Gifford Pinchot National Forest and US Fish and Wildlife Service.

Our Native Species Recovery Program works closely with partners to support the recovery of native species. Recently, MARS crews have played an integral role in the rebound of the Oregon spotted frog population in the Glenwood Valley.

- PROGRAM OVERVIEW -

The CGCC Foundation exists to make higher education and workforce training attainable for more students in the Columbia Gorge, especially those who might not otherwise imagine a college experience. Each year, the Foundation stewards and awards nearly \$200,000 in scholarships that help cover tuition, books, and fees so students can focus on learning rather than on how to pay their next bill. These scholarships are designed to recognize financial need and student promise, supporting people returning to school, first-generation students, and those preparing for in-demand careers.

Beyond scholarships, the Foundation invests in college programs and facilities that expand opportunity for the entire region. Recent projects include support for CGCC's new regional workforce skills center and student residence hall in The Dalles, which together provide hands-on training space and affordable housing that make college more accessible, especially for our rural and commuting students. 

- PROGRAM OVERVIEW -

The United Way of the Columbia Gorge (UWCG) is a non-profit organization that is changing thousands of lives in our community by funding a diverse group of local programs that serve basic human needs and foster healthy independence. When you give to the UWCG, your contribution supports the entire community — serving many age groups and demographics.

Here's how it works: local non-profit agencies throughout the Gorge need financial support beyond their own annual fundraising efforts to keep their programs running and provide children and adults the services they desperately need. Each year, any non-profit human service program from Hood River, Wasco, Sherman, Klickitat and Skamania Counties with a two year operating history is welcome to apply for United Way funding.* Applicants undergo a rigorous UWCG screening and interview process to demonstrate how their program will directly help people living in the Gorge.

A team of volunteer Gorge residents representing the five counties selects funding recipients based on stringent standards in governance, ethics, financial management and efficient/effective program operations. Each funded program must also provide detailed reporting on how funding was used with outcome results. Since our inception in 2006, we have invested over \$3 million into our Gorge community. During the 2024-2025 funding cycle the United Way of the Columbia Gorge allocated \$354,500 to 30 local programs.
