



And if you're still having trouble deciding, gift certificates are available and equally welcome.

(A chance to wander around a bookstore? Okay!)

Please keep in mind that area bookstores are still dealing with supply chain issues that include paper shortages and limited press availability — and that's all before any shipping issues inevitably arise. Start your shopping early, and be patient and understanding if the title you want isn't immediately available. Booksellers are working as hard as possible to keep up with demand.



















#### **TEENS AND TWEENS**

Alebrijes (hardcover) by Donna Barba Higuera. Ages 10-14; \$18.99. When Gabi is caught stealing fruit from the Pocatelan elite, Leando takes the fall. But his exile proves more than he ever could have imagined — his consciousness is placed inside an ancient drone and left to fend on its own. But beyond the walls of Pocatel lie other alebrijes like Leandro, who seek for a better world, as well as mutant monsters, wasteland pirates, a hidden oasis, and the truth.

How to Navigate Middle School: Kid Confident Book 4 (hardcover) by Anna Pozzatti, Bonnie Massimino, Bonnie Zucker (editor). Ages 11-14; \$16.99. How to Navigate Middle School shows readers how to handle the increasing academic demands of middle school, organizational skills and time management, how to be self-determined, have grit, and a sense of agency.

Artifice (hardcover) by Sharon Cameron. Ages 12 and up; \$19.99. A dramatic story of duplicity and resistance, betrayal and loyalty, set against the backdrop of World War II and featuring a gutsy heroine.

The Spirit Bares Its Teeth (hardcover) by Andrew Joseph White. Age 14 and up; \$19.99. September/October 2023 Kids Indie Next List. A blood-soaked and nauseating triumph that cuts like a scalpel and reads like your darkest nightmare. New York Times bestselling author Andrew Joseph White returns with the transgressive Gothic horror of our time.

#### **FICTION**

Bookshops & Bonedust: Legends & Lattes (paperback) by Travis Baldree. Fiction; \$17.99. When an injury throws a young,

battle-hungry orc off her chosen path, she may find that what we need isn't always what we seek. Set in the world of New York Times bestselling "Legends & Lattes," Baldree's Bookshops & Bonedust takes you on a journey of high fantasy, first loves, and secondhand books.

*Malice House* (paperback) by Megan Shepherd. SciFi & fantasy; \$17.99. First book in The Malice Compendium series. Dark magic, family secrets and monsters that won't stay fictional with a contemporary horror tone.

Remarkably Bright Creatures (hardcover) by Shelby Van Pelt. Fiction; \$29.99. May 2022 Indie Next List. A luminous novel about a widow's unlikely friendship with a curmudgeonly giant Pacific octopus reluctantly residing at a local aquarium.

Soul Jar: Thirty-One Fantastical Tales by Disabled Authors (paperback) by Annie Carl (editor). SciFi & fantasy; \$18. Too often, science fiction and fantasy stories erase — or cure — characters with disabilities. Soul Jar, edited by author and bookstore owner Annie Carl, features 31 stories by disabled authors, imagining such wonders as a shapeshifter on a first date, skin that sprouts orchid buds, and a cereal-box demon.

#### **NONFICTION**

The Lost Supper: Searching for the Future of Food in the Flavors of the Past (hardcover) by Taras Grescoe. Food writing; \$29.95. In the tradition of Michael Pollan, Anthony Bourdain, and Mark Bittman, "a surprising, flavorsome tour of ancient cuisines" from Neolithic bread to ancient Roman fish sauce, and why reviving the foods of the past is the key to saving the future.

My Name is LaMoosh (paperback) by Linda Meanus. Ages

8-12; \$14.95. Warm Springs Tribal Elder Meanus shares her unique and compelling life story of growing up near Celilo Falls before construction of The Dalles Dam.

100 Bike Rides of a Lifetime: The World's Ultimate Cycling Experiences (hardcover) by Roff Smith. Sports & recreation; \$35. This illustrated guide from National Geographic reveals the ultimate bucket list destinations for cyclists, from the vineyards of New Zealand to the peaks of Patagonia.

#### **COMICS AND GRAPHIC NOVELS**

We Are Not Strangers (hardcover) by Josh Tuininga. Comics & graphic novels, historical fiction; \$24.99. Inspired by a true story, this graphic novel follows a Jewish immigrant's efforts to help his Japanese neighbors while they are incarcerated during World War II.

The Mysteries (hardcover) by Bill Watterson and John Kascht (illustrator). Comics & graphic novels, supernatural/fantasy; \$19.99. From Bill Watterson, bestselling creator of the comic strip Calvin and Hobbes, and John Kascht, one of America's most renowned caricaturists, comes a mysterious and beautifully illustrated fable about what lies beyond human understanding.

The Calvin and Hobbes Portable Compendium Set 1 (paperback) by Bill Watterson. Comics & graphic novels, humorous; \$19.99. The first set of books collecting Watterson's Calvin and Hobbes comics features nearly 500 comics from the strip's debut in November 1985 through March 1987; this is the first set in a series of seven.

Every child is different, but luckily, the Gorge is full of amazing local businesses with lots of options. If your child is a voracious reader, look no further than Klindt's in The Dalles. Besides being a great location to visit with its history as the oldest bookstore in Oregon, it also has an entire kids' room in the back. The room is brimming with kids' books, but also has many educational wooden toys for the tots who might not be reading yet but still have a natural curiosity and desire to learn.

The Workshop, located in The Dalles, also has many books for children, with a special twist. Many of the books featured at The Workshop have an Oregon focus. For example, O is for Oregon or Let's Count Oregon: Numbers and Colors in the Beaver State. They also sell a variety of stuffed animals as well as crafts for your artsy kiddo. In particular, I think their DIY ornaments are darling. For \$5, you get a little wooden ornament for your child to color and design, and you can hang it on your tree every year as a reminder of the holiday you shared together.

If you're hoping to get some cute clothes for that special kid in your life, I can't recommend Lucky Littles in Hood River enough. They have tons of cute clothes for babies and toddlers, as well as adorable baby toys. They also have some toy sets for the older kids, including a train set and a veterinarian playset that even comes with two "patients" to treat.

# Gifts for Birders and naturalists



One of the most useful gifts for a birder or nature enthusiast is an up-to-date field guide to their favorite creatures. *The Sibley Guide to Birds* is one of the most popular texts; the smaller incarnation, *Field Guide to the Birds of Western North America*, can be handily carried in a sturdy pocket. Whenever scientists update bird taxonomy, the field guides change; the latest update might be most appreciated. You can find that, a pack of Sibley's handy flashcards, a humorous bird calendar, or a book on bird biology and behavior at Waucoma or Kindt's, for under \$30. Klindt's Booksellers: 315 E. Second St., The Dalles, www.klindtsbooks.com; and Waucoma Bookstore: 221 Oak St., Hood River, www.waucomabookstore.com.

Explore Artifact Books for second-hand birding memoirs and scientific treatises, some of which are fascinating — for instance, *In Search of the Ivory-Billed Woodpecker*, by Jerome A. Jackson, happens to be on the shelf — and which make great presents for a curious naturalist.

Which brings us to pockets. Pockets for field guides, pockets for handwarmers, pockets for lunch. In winter, that season of cold, wind, rain, and strange visiting sparrows, a birder's most-appreciated present could be a warm coat with lots of pockets, a cozy hat, or fingerless gloves! Beware of something too delicate and fashionable for a person who enjoys romping after magpies, though; that can be a muddy business.

In Hood River, Shortt Supply provides a variety of warm, tough outdoor clothing, and other supplies such as insulated canteens. They've got everything a birder could need in the way of coats, vests, and gloves for the chill wind blowing up the Columbia. There's a thick North Face jacket, and a Super-Strand vest for \$149. Shortt Supply: 116 Oak St., Hood River, shorttsupply.com.

For gloves, hats and scarves, Pistil Designs has got you covered, with their own lines of soft scarves, fingerless gloves (good for focusing binoculars and manipulating camera buttons in the cold), thick crew socks in a range of patterns, and warm beanies. Beanies and gloves range from about \$30 up; socks are \$20. Most are in dull colors and patterns, a good call for nature lovers: Fluttering white and neon colors can scare the wildlife away. Laurel and Eddie not only carries a selection of artistic and warm hats and coats, they've got this lovely warm marigold Stripe Heart Crew sweater for \$125 for fashionable insulation under all the fluff you'll need to stay warm in a Gorge winter. Laurel and Eddie: 215 Oak St., Hood River, laurel-eddie.com.

In The Dalles, Skookum Outfitters caters to those who, like anglers or maybe birders, spent their time out in the cold and wet. They've got their own lines of brimmed hats and warm beanies, as well as carrying more well-known brands like Patagonia. Prices from \$30 to about \$50 for a hat or some such. From the coats, you can choose a Clearwater waterproof wading jacket for about \$229, which could protect a birder and their notebooks even in very wet weather, or a warm Patagonia hooded vest for about \$149. Skookum Outfitters: 109 W. Second St., The Dalles, www.skookumoutfitters.com.

In art, some birders enjoy charming anthropomorphisms, and some prefer their painted birds to be identifiable to subspecies. Whether your friends enjoy photorealistic oil paintings or simple metal quail, local art galleries have something for them. At Art On Oak, you can find Elizabeth See's oil paintings of cranes, ducks, and songbirds. An oil painting of a sandhill crane is going for \$150, although prints — including a lovely depiction of a varied thrush and an Oregon dark-eyed junco — are less. Art On Oak also carries the work of several other artists, who explore the forms of salmon, trees, land-scapes, and other subjects in their work. There are many other small galleries to explore in Hood River. Art On Oak: 210 Oak St., artonoak.com.

Other cards, including a thrush at her nest, can be found at Hood River Stationers, Klindt's Booksellers, and many other gift shops.



As a child, I found no Christmas gift more satisfying than that of a full stocking. Gigantic crinkly beribboned Christmas presents, of course, are thrilling — but there's something about a stocking-full of tiny delightful objects that enchants a child of any age.

Finding just the right tiny treasures for one specific person can be quite a challenge. Often, the necessary stocking-sized objects hide in widely different stores.

Exploring Hood River, White Salmon, and The Dalles, I found enough small presents to fill a stocking for any loved one, be they children, crafters, tea drinkers, or your local wild-life biologist. Please note, some of the prizes of this treasure hunt, like charms and tiny artist's palettes, are extra small and could pose a choking hazard to young children.

For knitters and crafters, every imaginable color of yarn and a range of useful knitting notions are available at the House of A La Mode. A skein ranges in price from less than \$10 to about \$30. Plenty are small enough to go into a stocking.

For the farmer in your life, Lines of Designs also carries colorful leather cow and horse key chains, the most expensive being \$20.

OF practical fishing equipment, like a rainproof Patagonia hat or a selection of flies, they've also got a broad selection.

There's even a trout-shaped butter knife, to spread peanut butter on your sandwich while you're out there counting fish, or you can fork over \$9 for a handy Rumpl Beer Blanket to keep a drink at just the right temperature.

And for the wildlife tracker, Tokki Art Supply carries a full set of animal-track stamps, accurate depictions of everything from beaver prints to squirrel sign small enough to fit on the end of your thumb.

Shopping for children? The Workshop is a good place to start, with stickers, wooden ornaments, and pins of all kinds. Children who like art can enjoy a miniature-but-useful selection from Tokki Art Supply. Most of the treasures I found, perhaps because of their negligible size, were between \$1 and \$10. Small enough for stocking-stuffing are packets of chalk, pencils, fancy erasers, multi-colored clay, bracelet kits, stamps and a miniaturized artist's palette so amusingly small, adults and dollies will both adore using it.

And if nothing else strikes a chord, hey — you can't possibly go wrong with sparkly, goo-y Christmas slime, provided you don't mind a wee bit of cleanup. Find it at Hood River Stationers, \$9.95 per container, in all its glittery outrageousness. I recommend purple.

If afraid of the dark, this emporium also carries a merry little light-up Santa in a globe that might be just the thing to clear up Christmas nightmares.

And I favor Artifact Books for their snarky bumper stickers, as well as cool finger puppets for \$2 apiece. I gravitated immediately to the walnut-sized colorful eyeball puppets, but there's also happier-looking wildlife — squirrels, raccoons, horned owls, hedgehogs, unicorns, chicken feet ...
