# WHEN DO I REGISTER? NOW!

## Fall registration is open

Registration priority for non-veterans is based on the number of credits successfully completed at CGCC. It does not include courses attempted or graded F, W, I, AU, or NP, transfer credits, or classes currently in progress.

In compliance with House Bill 2565, CGCC offers priority registration to veterans, active or reserve service members, and dependents receiving VA education benefits, in advance of their official registration period each term.

Students may also register on any scheduled registration day or time after their priority day through the first week of the term. After the first week, students must obtain instructor permission to join a class in progress.

### Discounts for District Residents, age 65+

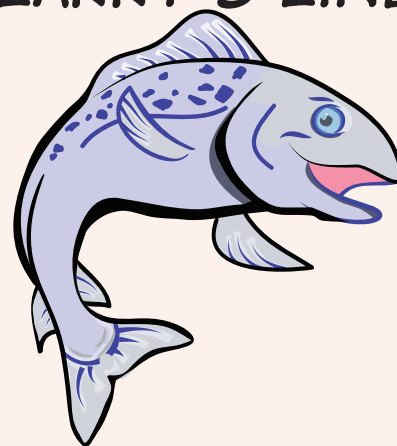
District residents of Hood River or Wasco Counties 65 years or older are eligible to receive a 50 percent tuition discount on both credit and community education classes on a seat available basis. Check the course description for eligibility since some classes may not allow tuition discounts. Discounts do not apply to full classes or to lab and other class fees. You will be notified if the class is full and the tuition discount will not apply. Request your discount at the time of payment or by calling the Business Office.

### Oregon Senior Option—applies to credit classes only

Senior Oregon residents are eligible for a program called Oregon Senior Option that allows them to audit classes that are not full while paying no tuition. Students pay associated fees and book costs. For more information, contact Student Services.

# WHEN AND WHERE DO I PAY?

## Credit Class Payments

Payment for credit classes is due on the first Friday of the term, unless a payment arrangement has been made with the business office. Late fees will be assessed at a rate of 10% of account balance, up to \$75, if paid after the first week of the term.

## Community Education Class Payments

Payment for community education/non-credit classes is due at the time of registration.

## Drop Dates, Refunds & Removal of Charges

### Charges:

Charges are applied to a student's account when the student registers for a class. All of the tuition charges associated with a class will be removed if the student officially drops within the refund period. Some lab fees are non-refundable. No charges will be removed if the student drops after the drop deadline.

### Drop Deadlines for Credit Classes:

Credit classes must be dropped online through MyCGCC. If a credit class is not dropped within the drop period, it will result in a "W" grade on the transcript, indicating a withdrawal, and no charges will be refunded.

Students are entitled to a 100% refund, except for non-refundable lab fees, when a course is dropped during the following deadlines:

- 8-11 week classes | drop by the first Friday of the term
- 2-7 week classes | drop by the end of the first day of the class
- classes fewer than 2-weeks | drop before the first day the class meets
- No refunds will be given after the deadline

If you believe an extreme hardship forced you to withdraw after the drop with refund period, or prevented you from dropping within the refund period, and you wish to petition for a removal of charges, see the section titled "Refund Requests After the Drop Period" later in this section.

### Drop Deadlines for Non-Credit Classes:

Non-credit/community education classes may be dropped online, in person at Student Services, or over the phone with a Student Services representative.

Students are entitled to a 100% refund, except for non-refundable lab fees, when a non-credit course is dropped prior to the first class meeting.

### Refund Requests Within the Drop Period:

The Business Office automatically issues refunds to students who drop within the drop period. The refund process as follows:

- Refunds from tuition and fees are first applied to outstanding charges on the student's account. If the student receives financial aid and opted to charge books on his/her account, this will also be deducted prior to any refund.
- If the credit is the result of a payment by check or cash, a check is issued in the student's name.
- If the credit is the result of a bank card payment, the refund will be applied to the original bank card.
- Refunds resulting from check overpayment are held two weeks from the date of the original payment.

### Refund Requests After the Drop Period:

If an extreme hardship prevented you from completing a credit course, and you could not drop during the refund period, you may request to have tuition charges removed from your account. Fees, especially any non-refundable lab fees may not be refunded. A Tuition Appeal form for requesting a refund can be obtained from the Student Services office in The Dalles or Hood River. You will be asked to provide documentation of your circumstances to support your claim. Your petition, and all accompanying documentation, must be received by the filing deadline to be considered. ## GEOLOGIC DISCOVERY FIELD TRIPS

### High Lava Plains

Saturday, September 14th  
8:00 AM – 6:00 PM  
Cost: \$50 (includes transportation and lunch)  
Course Description:

In this day-long geology field trip with geology professor Steve Carlson, students will engage in experiential learning at investigative sites to analyze specific features of Central Oregon's high lava plains that tell the story of the geologic past. The West Coast of North America is an active Continental Margin. Large-Scale geological processes involving horizontal and vertical motions of the outmost layers of the earth cause earthquakes volcanic eruptions and the uplift of mountains. The rocks and landscapes that one sees while driving between The Dalles and Sunriver are nearly all related, in one fashion or another, to volcanism. At the end of this course, students will understand how the Miocene Lavas were produced, the development of the High Cascade volcanoes and associated Cascade platform of the western and central Cascade system, and will be able to apply volcanic theories explaining shape, explosiveness, and features to the high lava plains. This excursion begins in The Dalles and travels south through Cove Palisades and Smith Rock State Parks and several other points of interest before culminating at Criterion Summit and Sherars Falls.

### Hood-Gorge (Mt. Hood & the Columbia River Gorge)

Saturday, October 5th  
8:00 AM – 6:00 PM  
Cost: \$50 (includes transportation and lunch)  
Course Description:

In this day-long geology field trip with geology professor Steve Carlson, students will engage in experiential learning at investigative sites to analyze specific features of the Columbia River Gorge and Mount Hood that tell the story of the geologic past. The Gorge began forming as far back as the Miocene with massive lava flows, and continued to take shape through the Pleistocene ice ages. During this period, the Cascade Range was also forming, including Mount Hood, Oregon's tallest mountain and a stratovolcano made of lava flows, domes, and volcaniclastic deposits. Cataclysmic events resulting from this geologic activity have shaped the Hood-Gorge landscape that we know today. At the end of this course, students will understand the development of the upper Columbia River Gorge, the geologic history of Mount Hood, and the volcanic hazards associated with Cascade volcanoes. Students will meet at the Columbia Gorge Discovery Center in The Dalles, and make their way to Timberline Lodge on Mount Hood, interpreting deeply along the way.

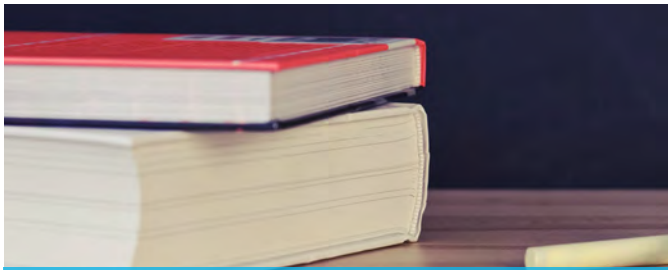

Quality Matters is a nationally-recognized, faculty-centered, peer review process designed to certify the quality of online courses. Courses marked with this code have completed the formal (3-person panel) QM review process.

## Additional fees and other information

### Moodle fee - \$50

Online and hybrid classes are delivered through a system called Moodle, and a fee is charged per-class to cover administrative costs of the technology.

### Instructional fee - varies

Some courses include a fee that covers additional instructional costs for that class. These may be charged on a per-course or per-credit basis, and are listed with the specific class to which they apply.

### Lab fee - varies

Lab fees are charged for classes that have supplies and materials used by students each term for specific classes.

### Service fee - \$20 per credit
