Voters give road tax a green light

Residents agree road needs justify increase **ANALYSIS**

The Boone County Commission managed to convince enough people that better roads are worth a higher sales tax. But it was close.

Proposition 1, the road tax, faced vicious opposition. Not only did the ballot issue have to overcome a strong anti-tax mood among voters, but it was denounced by City Council members, the Mid-Missouri Green Party, the Boone County Libertarians and the Frederick Douglass coalition.

"Basically, the poor will be subsidizing people in

the county for development," said Matt Harline, city councilman. "They've thrown a \$32 million anchor around the people of Columbia, in terms of building a community center, et cetera, and the main accomplishment is to increase noise and traffic in the county."

But for months, Boone County commissioners took the proposed half-cent sales tax to the people.

Armed with slides and graphs, they set up meetings throughout the county, sometimes with groups of fewer than five people. The com-
