## Timeline of events for Fiji hazing incident

Oct. 19, 2021 Freshman Daniel Santulli hospitalized following fraternity event

Santulli was hospitalized with a blood alcohol content of

0.486% and suffered cardiac arrest in the early hours of October 20, 2021, according to court documents. At a "Pledge Father Reveal" party held by the Phi Gamma Delta fraternity, commonly called Fiji, Santulli was allegedly pressured to drink a bottle of vodka.

MU withdraws recognition of Fiji

protested outside of the Fiji house as MU temporarily

On Santulli's 19th birthday, his parents filed a civil lawsuit against Phi Gamma Delta, its MU chapter's board of advisors,

Oct. 22, 2021 MU withdraws recognition of Fiji

Both MU and the national Fiji fraternity removed its local

chapter from campus as the university began an evaluation of "fraternity and campus culture." Hundreds of students

suspended all fraternity activities.

student leaders and other fraternity members. Their attorney, who specializes in hazing litigation, called Santulli's injuries the worst he'd seen in 30 years of practice.

May 5, 2022 MU disciplines 13 students for roles in incident

The university didn't specify which or how many students

May 10, 2022 Family reaches settlements with first 23 defendants

Santulli's parents and older sister appeared in Boone County
Court to announce that they reached confidential settlements

with all of the defendants from their initial lawsuit.

Prosecutor files first criminal charges

Criminal proceedings remain ongoing.

The Boone County prosecutor's office initially filed

of 11 men for their roles in the Fiji event — most of them for felony hazing. An online petition urging the prosecutor to file the hazing charges gathered more than 120,000 signatures.

Aug. 18, 2022 New year of fraternity recruitment begins

MU fraternities kicked off another year of formal recruitment while Santulli, who still cannot walk, talk or see, lives with his family in his hometown of Eden Prairie, Minnesota.

The Santulli family has settled with a total of 25 parties in their civil lawsuit with one remaining defendant.
