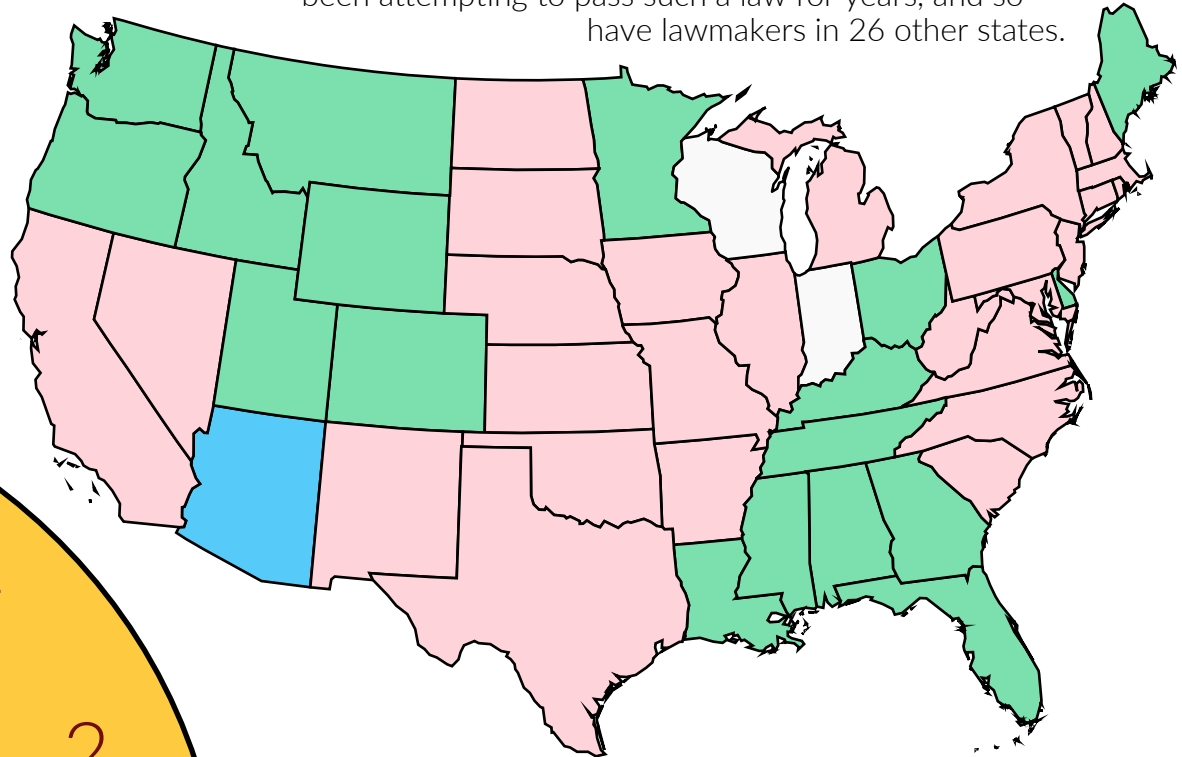
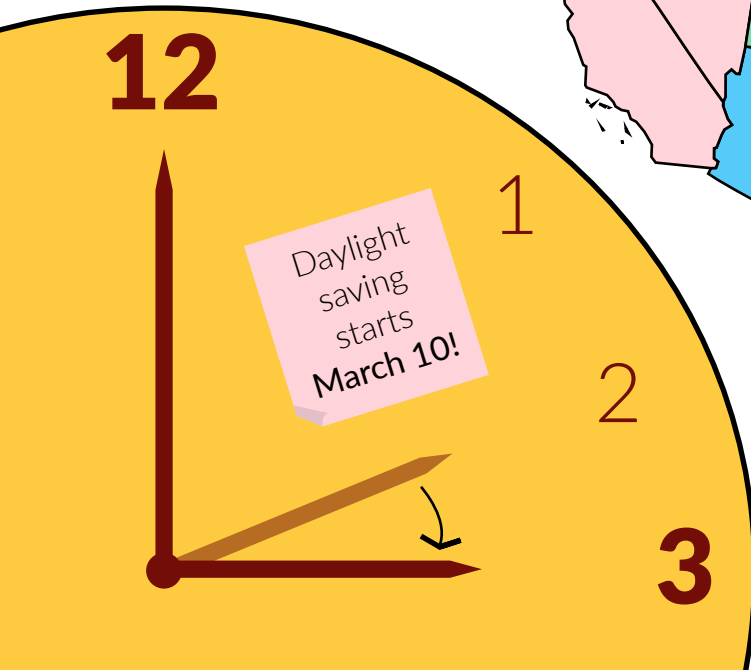
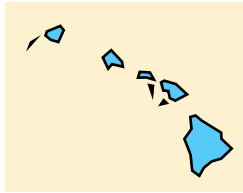
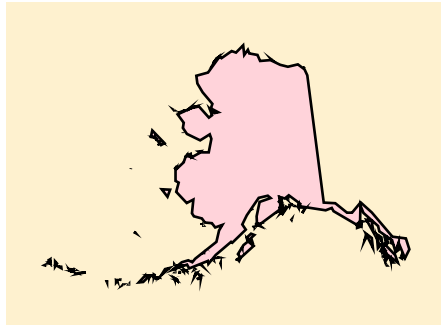


While federal law prohibits permanent daylight saving time, many states want it

A bill in the Missouri legislature would extend daylight saving time from eight months to year-round if passed, but only in statute. **Nineteen states** have permanent daylight saving time trigger laws on the books that would take effect if federal law on the subject were to ever change. Missouri lawmakers have been attempting to pass such a law for years, and so have lawmakers in 26 other states.
