

Missouri has 30 'Founding Farms' recognized in honor of the state's bicentennial

In order for a farm to be considered a Founding Farm, the farm must have been in the same family name since 1821 or earlier. Farms not shown on the map include Linhorst Farm in Jefferson County, founded in 1819, and three farms from the Joseph LaPlante Family Farm, founded in 1792 in New Madrid County.
