

Council reverses Planning Commission

In 3-2 vote, council allows care facility on Passley Road

At the end of a marathon 4.5 hour meeting Monday, Aug. 24, the Brookings City Council voted 3-2 to overturn a planning commission denial and allow the development of a 14-unit residential care facility to proceed — with conditions to be finalized at a subsequent meeting.

Councilors Brad Alcorn and John McKinney voted against the motion, with councilors Brad Alcorn, Ron Hedenskog and Mayor Jake Pieper voting in fa-

vor. The council may meet again as soon as Monday to consider conditions. Applicant Brett Kemp and his wife Aga Kemp spoke on behalf of the project they would like to build on property located at 17212 S. Passley Rd. Their .58 acre parcel is in the Dawson Tract area of Brookings, located just to the north of the West Cliff subdivision. According to city planning staff, development of a residential care facility is permitted on the lot, which is zoned R-1-6 (residential) if a Conditional Use Permit is granted. Neighbors objected to the development and on July 7 by a vote of 5-2 the city planning commission agreed with them that the project didn't meet city standards. The applicants appealed to

the city council. In a staff report, the city council was told that the commission denied the application based on:

- Size and shape of the “flag lot” — which can only be accessed off of Passley Road by way of a 140-foot long driveway.
- Relation of streets — the planning commission did not believe the street met standards for commercial vehicles. However, staff reported that Fire Chief Jim Watson assured staff that the 15-foot driveway width would be adequate for emergency vehicles and also that the fire code allows a reduction in driveway width if the building is equipped with a fire suppression system (sprinklers), which staff said would be part of the design.

Cascade Home Center is seventh store for Gold Beach based company

Former Kerr's Ace Hardware

In January 2008, the recession hadn't hit Curry County quite yet. Homes were being built and Gold Beach Lumber was making 40 deliveries a day — with 80% of them to Brookings, 27 miles south. Ryan Ringer was partners

with his father Reed. Not yet 30, he wanted to grow the business from the single store in Gold Beach founded by his great-grandparents. And when he saw the former Ford dealership in Harbor suddenly vacant, it seemed the perfect opportunity to expand. His father didn't see it that way, Ryan Ringer said, but he agreed that his son could buy him out of the business. So, still a newlywed — Ryan and his

wife Jocelyn were married in 2007 — Ringer took over the business and opened Gold Beach Lumber in Harbor in June 2008. Soon thereafter, though, the recession did hit Curry County. As Ringer recalls, his business dropped off by 60% in the 10 days immediately following the Nov. 4, 2008, presidential election. There were two full years to follow, he said, when not a single building permit was issued in Curry County.

He credits creative ideas from his staff — and concessions they agreed to make — to allowing the company to stay afloat. And having the store in Harbor also allowed the company to capture more of the south county market. People weren't building homes, but they were still painting, landscaping and doing other projects. Customers from Brookings and Harbor would not have gone

Curry County clerk reports no concern about mailed ballots

THE PILOT

Concern about the United States Postal Service and the November election have been in the news lately, but Curry County Clerk Renée Kolen said in a statement earlier this week that she is not concerned that the election will be disrupted. “The USPS has announced that there will be no postal service changes until after the November election,” Kolen said. “Oregon voters can be assured that their ballots will be mailed to them and they will have the same return options and timelines as they had in the May Primary when a record 1.3 million

Oregonians participated. Voters can cast their ballot just like they have in previous elections.” She said USPS partners here in Oregon continue to support elections and go above and beyond to make sure that ballots travel efficiently through the mail. “We understand voters are concerned whether their vote will be counted in the upcoming election,” Kolen said. “We want to personally reassure Oregonians that we continue to do everything within our power to guarantee the security and integrity of our vote by mail system, which has been a success for more than 20 years.”

No new COVID cases in Curry

Information for this weekly COVID-19 update for Curry and Del Norte counties is gathered just before the Thursday morning print deadline. Curry County's case total case numbers remain the same as a week ago since no new cases have been reported since Wednesday, Aug. 19. But Del Norte County reported nine new cases between Aug. 21 and yesterday morning. These cases included two among employees of Castle Rock Charter School. According to the Del Norte Unified School District, both cases were confirmed Aug. 21, but were unrelated. “They are in two different segments of the school,” said Superintendent Jeff Harris in his weekly video presentation Monday, Aug. 24. “The two contacts may have come from two completely different areas.” He said Del Norte County Health Department is conducting contact tracing and has reached out to several other staff members as part of the process. Del Norte's Public Health Officer Dr. Warren Rehwaldt commented on some of the positive cases reported during the week, noting that many were close contacts to known cases and had been directed to test. At least three of the new cases are travel-related. Some were symptomatic, while others were not.

In comments to the Del Norte County Board of Supervisors this week, Dr. Rehwaldt emphasized the importance of people avoiding get-togethers. Since last week's print report Pelican Bay State Prison reported one additional staff testing positive, but continued to show no inmate cases as of the deadline for this edition. There were no COVID-19 related deaths or hospitalizations reported in the two counties during the past week. Both counties reported increases in total number tested for the virus during the week. In Curry County, total tested increased by 82 from 1197 to 1279 over the seven days covered by this report. In Del Norte County, total tested increased by 329 from 6,696 to 7,025 over the same period. Del Norte's data includes testing for staff and inmates at PBS. A daily (Monday through Friday) report on COVID-19 activity in Curry and Del Norte counties is published at 8 a.m. on currypilot.com and triplicate.com.

Voters to fill local seats in November election

Filing periods have closed and voters will soon know their choices for local seats up for election in November. See next week's paper for an update on other local races.

City of Brookings

The City of Brookings Election Officer has certified the list of City Council candidates to be included on the Nov. 3 general election ballot. The final

date to file by completed petition was Aug. 25.

Candidates include Jake Pieper who is running for reelection to a two-year term as mayor. He has no challengers.

For Council Position #1, incumbent Brad Alcorn's candidacy has been certified, as has that of challenger Anthony Bond.

For Council Position #2, currently filled by Brent Hodges, two candidates were certified — Diana Cooper and Ed Schreiber.

Hodges did not file for reelection.

Curry County

Incumbent Sue Gold will face challenger John Herzog Nov. 3. The duo plus Shelia Megson were up for election during the May 19 primary election. Herzog won 37.9% of the vote and Gold won 37.58% (with Megson at 24.11%). Because no candidate won at least 50%, there will be a run-off between Herzog and Gold for the position 2 seat.

Small wildfire contained

The Rogue River-Siskiyou National Forest responded to one fire on Tuesday, Aug. 25, near Bear Camp Road and Indigo Creek in the Gold Beach Ranger District. The fire was human caused and contained at .01 acre.

"We encourage everyone to be very diligent to prevent starting a fire," a spokesperson for the United States Forest Service said. "Even a small fire can grow to become a threat to our forests and communities. While there is

some relief from the high temperatures, low humidity persists. Any wind can fan a fire in the dry fuels and extreme fire danger in place."

When planning outdoor recreation, camping or hunting, please check the fire prevention requirements where you are going. The rules may be different between land managers and may change. Find information on current RRSNF fire restrictions on the Forest Service website, www.fs.usda.gov.

The RRSNF continues to utilize fixed-wing

aerial reconnaissance to detect fires early. Engines, handcrews, and a dozer remain available for quick firefighting response. Resources also continue to be shared with partner agencies including the Fremont-Winema National Forest and Central Oregon to assist with ongoing fire incidents.

Year-to-date, the Rogue River-Siskiyou National Forest has responded to 26 fires with a total of 2.81 acres burned. Three of these fires were caused by lightning, and 24 were human-caused.

• Neighborhood impact — The planning commission found the facility inconsistent with the zoning, although staff said that it is allowed in the zone with a CUP. Neighbors were also concerned about traffic, parking and drainage.

But the bottom line for the city council may have been the cautionary statement in discussion of neighborhood impact: "Staff believes that denial of the proposal based on this approval criterion could be subject to challenge by the applicant for violation of one or more federal fair housing laws."

Indeed, the Kemps did cite such laws in material presented to council, noting that their intent is to provide a home for disabled senior citizens and veterans and that they believe the law is on their side in allowing such a home to be established in a

residential neighborhood.

As part of the official public hearing on the appeal, the council heard testimony from supporters of the project who said such a facility is needed in Brookings and from property owners in the surrounding neighborhood who oppose the development at that location.

Hedenskog reported that he researched the history of the very narrow private West Cliff Drive and believes that it was intended as a "half street" allowable under city code at the time it was constructed with the intention that the other half would be built when the property to the north was developed.

However, the street was not dedicated to the city and is maintained by the property owners association. Property owners also dispute a city easement for drainage, although city staff stated they believe the city has the easement that would allow a drainage system to be established

for the property to be developed.

Alcorn and McKinney stated they were concerned about neighborhood impact. Hedenskog suggested eight possible mitigations and city staff will review those prior to the council convening again to finalize approval of the CUP.

to Gold Beach for those items, he said, but many did support the store in Harbor.

"We would have lost more employees if we didn't have the second store," he said.

Expansion

After surviving that recession, Ringer was ready for more expansion. In 2013 he opened Gold Beach Lumber in Port Orford. Around that time he approached the Kerr family of Brookings with hopes to purchase Kerr's Ace Hardware in the middle of town — but they weren't interested at the time. So Ringer looked inland, acquiring Cascade Home Improvement stores in Cottage Grove and Creswell in 2016 and Van Well Building Supply in Dallas in 2018. All three of the Oregon stores had family ownerships looking to retire, he said.

And by early 2020, Tom and Steve Kerr decided they were ready to retire, as well, and no family members were interested in taking over the business their father Bob established in 1952. Plans were made for the business to change hands in April — and then along came the COVID-19 pandemic.

Ringer said the pandemic delayed the transaction in part because of travel restrictions. The Kerrs have been part of the Ace hardware coop, but Ringer's company is tied with the Do-It-Best coop based in Indiana. Having already completed transitions at other stores, he knew he would need consultants on site locally to assist.

Eventually the transaction could be completed and the Kerrs wrapped up their final day of business on Thurs-

day, Aug. 20, with Ringer reopening the store last week as Cascade Home Center.

But if you visit the store soon, you might not notice much change. Most of the Kerr staff remained, although the logos on their shirts now say "Cascade Home Center." You might see some Gold Beach Lumber staff helping out. And the Ace branding and merchandise has not yet been replaced.

Acquiring new signage and product are among the other COVID-19 related challenges. Ringer said he doesn't know for sure when new signage will arrive. But he does have a merchandise plan and eventually every area of the store will get a facelift.

The future

With Gold Beach Lumber in Harbor and Cascade Home Center in Brookings, Ringer said he plans to develop the two stores to meet different segments of the market.

In a community the size of Brookings-Harbor, he said, there's room for both a "home center" like the former Kerr's store and a "pro center." Although both will sell lumber, Cascade Home Center will focus on smaller cuts such as might be used in home improvement projects and Gold Beach Lumber will focus on serving professional contractors.

And although COVID-19 continues to be a challenge for all aspects

of the business, Ringer remains optimistic. There is still a need for new housing to be built, he said, and that's good news for people in the lumber business.

History

The Ringer family got its start in the lumber business in Curry County when Ryan's great-grandparents, Clarence and Pearl, moved from the Willamette Valley to Gold Beach in 1959 and started Gold Beach Lumber.

In early 1973 their son Rod — Ryan's grandfather — moved to the area to help them when they were both suffering from cancer. And in 1981, when Ryan was about two years old, his parents Reed and Elnora came into the company which Ryan took over entirely in 2008.

But, he is quick to point out, Gold Beach Lumber is not a "one man band."

He credits his team for the company's success, including John Schwels who he said was his father's first hire in 1981.

"He celebrated his 39th anniversary with us yesterday," Ringer said in an interview Tuesday.

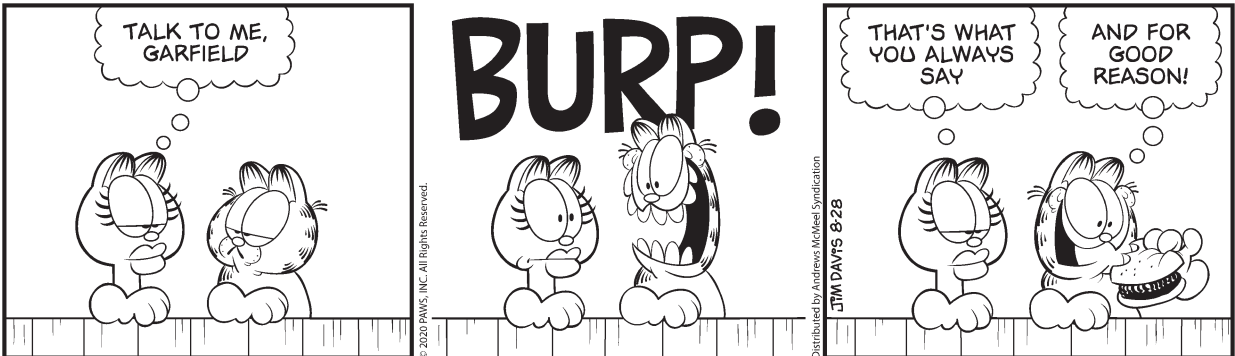
Among key staff are Todd Rigby who is the company's Southern Stores Regional Manager and will be the Acting Store Manager at the former Kerr's store for the first couple of years, Ringer said.

He noted that another staff member, Dean Kruschke, has been instrumental in establishing hiring and training processes that are consistent throughout all of the stores.

Ringer spoke well of his Gold Beach Lumber staff, as well as those from Kerr's who just joined his company.

"We've acquired some true professionals," he said. "I'm really excited by the team. They had some great people."

Seats open on county planning commission and fair board

THE PILOT

Due to resignations, the Curry County Board of Commissioners is seeking applicants to fill three positions — two seats on the county planning commission and a seat on the fair board.

Interested applicants are encouraged to apply.

Planning commission

The vacant planning commission positions are a south county seat with a term expiring March 12, 2023, and a central county position with a term expiring April 1, 2023.

The Curry County Planning Commission is appointed by the board of commissioners. The planning commission provides recommendations to the board regarding county land use regulations and policies, hears appeals of the planning director's decisions and takes action on applications for division of land and other land use actions not assigned by the zoning code to the planning director.

The seven member commission is comprised of two four-year term members from the area extending from the Coos County line south to an east-west line at the mouth of Mussel Creek (Arizona Beach); two four-year term members from the area extending from the east-west line at the mouth of Mussel Creek (Arizona Beach) south to an east-west line

at Crook Point; and two four-year term members from the area extending from the east-west line at Crook Point south to the California state line; and one two-year term at large member from one of the three areas.

Residents south of Crook Point and residents of the area extending from the east-west line at the mouth of Mussel Creek (Arizona Beach) south to an east-west line at Crook Point who would like to serve on the Planning Commission should apply on the county's website at: <http://www.co.curry.or.us> or call 541-247-3296 to obtain an application. Fair board

The vacant Curry County Fair Board position has a term ending Dec. 31, 2021.

The fair board is comprised of seven members. It has statutory authority for the exclusive management of the ground and all other property owned, leased, used or controlled by the county and devoted to the use of county fair and fairgrounds.

Reminder: Unemployment benefits taxable

Thousands of Oregonians, many of them for the first time, are now receiving unemployment benefits. The Oregon Department of Revenue wants to remind recipients that these benefits are taxable, and they should consider having tax withheld from their benefits to avoid owing taxes when they file their federal and Oregon income tax return next year.

By law, unemployment benefits are taxable and must be reported on a 2020 federal and Oregon income tax return. Taxable benefits include any of the special unemployment compensation authorized under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, enacted this spring.

Withholding is voluntary. Federal law allows any recipient to choose to have a flat 10% withheld, and Oregon law allows recipients to choose to have a flat 6% withheld from their benefits to cover part or all of their tax liability. To do that, fill out Form 1040WH, Authorization for Tax Withholding, and send it to the Oregon Employment Department. Don't send it to the IRS or the Oregon Department of Revenue.

If a recipient of unemployment benefits doesn't choose withholding, or if withholding is not enough, they can make quarterly estimated tax payments instead. The payment for the first two quarters of 2020 was due on July 15. Third and fourth quarter payments are due Sept.

15 and Jan. 15, 2021, respectively. For more information, including some helpful worksheets, see Publication OR-ESTIMATE, available online at www.oregon.gov/dor.

Unemployment benefit recipients who return to work before the end of the year can use the Oregon Personal Income Tax Withholding Calculator to determine if they're having enough tax taken out of their paycheck. This online tool can help any worker or pension recipient avoid or lessen their year-end tax bill or estimate the refund they want.

In January 2021, unemployment benefit recipients should receive a Form 1099-G, Certain Government Payments, from the Oregon Employment Department, showing the amount of unemployment benefits they received during 2020 in Box 1, any federal income tax withheld in Box 4, and Oregon income tax withheld in Box 11. Recipients will report this information, along with their Form W-2 income, on their 2020 federal and Oregon income tax returns.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the Rural Utility Services, as required by the National Environmental Policy Act, is issuing an Environmental Assessment (EA) in connection with possible impacts related to a project proposed by the City of Brookings, Curry County Oregon (City). The City of Brookings is proposing to construct sewer collection improvements including within the city of Harbor and Lone Ranch, sewer main replacement and rehabilitation, pump station rehabilitation and wastewater treatment plant rehabilitation.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS:

Early environmental discussions for this undertaking included detailed coordination between the applicant and the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS), Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW), Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ), and the Oregon Water Resources Department (OWRD). If implemented, the project will create temporary wetland disturbance to several palustrine emergent wetlands. Based on 7 CFR 1970.410(a), section 363, prohibits wetland conversion through the use of Agency financial assistance for CONACT authorized programs. This statutory language is more restrictive than that of Exec. Order 11990, which requires that wetland impacts be avoided whenever a practicable alternative is available, but allows wetland impact when no practicable alternative is present, and there is purpose and need for the proposal. Section 363 exempts utility lines from the wetland impact prohibition provision. Therefore, Agency financial assistance for programs listed in 1970.411(c) cannot be used to directly finance a proposal to drain, dredge, fill or level or otherwise manipulate a wetland except in the case of utility lines.

The city authored a Biological Assessment (BA), dated December 2017 to address the effects of the city's Wastewater System Improvement Project on fish listed or proposed as threatened or endangered and critical habitat under the federal Endangered Species Act (ESA) of 1973. NMFS responded with a Biological Opinion (BO), dated January 23, 2020, which concluded that:

After reviewing and analyzing the current status of the listed species and critical habitat, the environmental baseline within the action area, the effects of the proposed action, the effects of other activities caused by the proposed action, and cumulative effects, it is NMFS' biological opinion that the proposed action is not likely to jeopardize the continued existence of **SONCC coho salmon** or destroy or adversely modify its designated critical habitat. After reviewing and analyzing the current status of the listed species and critical habitat, the environmental baseline within the action area, the effects of the proposed action, the effects of other activities caused by the proposed action, and cumulative effects, it is NMFS' biological opinion that the proposed action is not likely to jeopardize the continued existence of **green sturgeon** or destroy or adversely modify its designated critical habitat. After reviewing and analyzing the current status of the listed species and critical habitat, the environmental baseline within the action area, the effects of the proposed action, the effects of other activities caused by the proposed action, and cumulative effects, it is NMFS' biological opinion that the proposed action is not likely to jeopardize the continued existence of **eulachon**.

As a result, NMFS' biological opinion, the proposed action is not likely to jeopardize the continued existence of SONCC coho salmon or destroy or adversely modify its designated critical habitat. RUS has included NMFS's conservation recommendations in the project mitigation measures to avoid, minimize, or otherwise offset potential adverse effects on EFH.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The city's prepared the Environmental Assessment and Biological Assessment for RUS that describes the project, assesses the proposed project's environmental impacts, and summarizes, as applicable, any mitigation measures used to minimize environmental effects. RUS has conducted an independent evaluation of the environmental assessment and believes that it accurately assesses the impacts of the proposed project.

No significant impacts are expected as a result of the construction of the project.

Questions and comments should be sent to RUS at the address provided. RUS will accept questions and comments on the environmental assessment for 14 days from the date of publication of this notice.

Any final action by RUS related to the proposed project will be subject to, and contingent upon, compliance with all relevant Federal environmental laws and regulations and completion of environmental review procedures as prescribed by 7 CFR Part 1970, Environmental Policies and Procedures.
