Officers chase RV through two states

Staff Report

An Oregon man faces criminal charges after investigators said he led them on a two-state, high-speed pursuit that began near Port Orford and ended in Crescent City.

According to the Oregon State Police, the incident began about 6:15 p.m. Sept. 5, along U.S. Highway 101 near Humbug State Park,

when law-enforcement officers encountered a woman apparently in distress.

A male operating a motorhome left that scene traveling southbound as the female was being offered assistance.

The motorhome later was seen on Highway 101 near Brookings, where officers attempted to stop it for a traffic violation. The large RV refused to yield and was

pursued as it fled further south along Highway 101 and into Del Norte County.

California Highway Patrol and Del Norte County Sheriff's Office personnel joined in the chase, but

reportedly fell back because of the RV driver's reckless driving.

Sgt. Edward Wilson, Crescent City's acting chief of police, said a spike strip was deployed within

the city limits that slowed the vehicle somewhat. A Crescent City police officer subsequently attempted to force the RV to the side of the road, then continued the pursuit.

Meanwhile, another officer raced ahead to warn motorists that a dangerous pursuit was coming. "One driver was unable to pull away, and the suspect ended up ramming a Tesla from

behind," Wilson said. "The victim was not injured and the car suffered mild to moderate damage."

The suspect, later described as Danniel John Anderson, 37, of Woodburn, drove down 9th Street in Crescent City to Pebble Beach, then on 5th Street to a dead end, where he

Fishing out of Brookings Harbor means knowing the 'port sampler'

Editor's Note: This is The Pilot's first in a series of "Who We Are" profiles, periodic special reports about the interesting people in our community and the difference they make.

Anyone who launches or moors a fishing boat at Brookings Harbor knows Trinity Sylvester - or will know her soon.

Sylvester is a "port sampler" for the Ocean Sampling Project of the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW), which is based in Newport.

What kind of job is a port sampler? You count fish.

Throughout the day, Sylvester greets every boat she sees in the harbor, then asks everyone aboard a series of questions:

"How many people were fishing?" Sylvester asks. "What time did you leave?" "Did you catch anything?" "Anything of color?" "Did you release any fish?"

"How deep were you fishing?" "What area were you fishing in?" "Were you fish-

ing above or below Whaleshead?"

She also notes whether the boat is a charter or private craft.

Then, at the end of the day, Sylvester watches surveillance videos and counts the number of boats that crossed in and out of Brookings Harbor, so she can calculate the total number of boat trips.

The average number of boat trips per day this season has been 60, she said, but in years past it was more than 100. She attributed the lower numbers to lots of wind and a lower-than-expected salmon count this season.

"The lack of salmon has created more pressure on bottom fishing," Sylvester said.

All of the information she collects is averaged to estimate the total numbers and weights of the daily catches of each species, for each region.

On a recent sunny afternoon, The Pilot followed Sylvester around to see her in action, checking out the day's catches in a variety of buckets and ice chests.

Hers is quite a task.

- Black rockfish management area elimination or modification

discussion (daily trip limits)

- Harvest outlook from the 2019 cabezon stock assessment
- Review of the 2019 season to date
- Process and options for setting 2020 regulations

- Update on ODFW black rockfish habitat modeling
- Input from industry and others interested in 2020 commercial nearshore fishery state management.

The meetings will be held at

6:30 p.m. at the Pacific Reef Resort, 29362 Ellensburg and U.S. Highway 101 in Gold Beach; and the Port Orford Library, 1421 Oregon St.

City Council gets in the holiday spirit

Organizers of the Coastal Christmas Light Parade said they are moving forward with the event following approval of a permit-fee waiver by the Brookings City Council.

The action came during the council's public session Monday night.

Councilors waived their \$62.50 permit fee, which organizers said would go towards purchasing cocoa, cookies, candy canes, and insurance required for the event.

Parade organizers said that each year, the number of participants has increased and the subsequent Santa Party has grown more popular. They said they anticipate 200 people will be attracted to the downtown area for the holiday events this Christmas season.

This will be the sixth year the Coastal Christmas Elves have organized a downtown holiday light parade.

The lineup for the parade begins Dec. 14 at 4:30 p.m. at Azalea Middle School. The parade will wind down Oat Street to Railroad Street to Center Street, then into Oasis Park for a tree-lighting ceremony, Christmas caroling and Santa visits.

In other business, the City Council authorized City Manager Janell Howard to execute an agreement with Ferguson Waterworks to purchase an automated meter reading system for \$375,000. The purchase was budgeted in the city's water fund and the Brookings Water System Replacement Fund.

Over the past few years, the city and its budget committee have discussed converting to "smart" meters. The 2019-20 adopted budget includes funds to complete the first phase of that process.

Howard said the funding includes radios to be used to read customers' water meters, a complete drive-by package, and installation and training for the drive-by package.

The city will not be replacing meters, only inserting the smart radio into current meters.

"Once this phase is complete, we will be able to read all meters in approximately one hour, compared to two weeks," Howard wrote in her council report. "With cost savings from a decrease in staffing of a half-time position, we estimate that it will be a 7- to 8-year return on investment."

The radios are covered by a 15-year "bumper-to-bumper" warranty."

Council members also received a

“We count all of the fish they have on the boat and get some information about what they’ve turned loose, because we use that to see what the fisheries are actually doing and how well things are going,” Sylvester said.

“I have to physically put eyes on each fish, identify the type of fish and count the number of each.”

The first boat we talked with that afternoon was a charter with an assortment of very large crabs (caught at 110-foot depth), blue rockfish and deacon rockfish, but no ling cod. She didn’t need to measure the fish on that boat, because she already had measurements for every type of fish they had caught.

Several other boats early that afternoon had brought in lots of crabs, more deacons, blues and a few petrale ... but still no ling cod. Some halibut fishermen had no luck, whereas a couple of others did catch two, measuring about 34 inches each.

Then, towards the end of the day, the lings started to show up. “Massive fish!” Sylvester noted. “None of them are small. These are

beautiful fish.” Of the four fish on board, the largest was 38 inches long and weighed 24 pounds.

“We had a halibut come in earlier today that was 52 inches,” she said. “That made for a happy boater.”

ODFW uses the information collected to manage fisheries and keep them sustainable. For example, the counting done by Sylvester and her counterparts along the southern Oregon coast determine whether the annual halibut quota and other rockfish quotas have been met or not.

A quick check of the ODFW website shows the quota for this area still has lots of room for halibut catches. Anglers currently can keep two halibut a day.

Other data Sylvester collect, such as depths and locations, let ODFW know what areas are being fished heavily and where the various types of fish are being found.

The depth information tells the agency if there will be greater “dead loss” from barotrauma - what divers know as “the bends.” If a fish is being released because it is not allowed due to size or species, fishermen are required to use “descending devices,” which send the fish back to the bottom quickly and protect its life, she said.

In a break between arriving boats, Sylvester discussed other aspects of her job, including the recent “Slam’n Salmon Derby.” “It was a very busy weekend, especially with just two of us,” she said. “We had close to 200 boats cross the bar on Saturday, the high day.”

She said the number of salmon caught was good, relative to the rest of this year, but compared to past seasons it fell short.

“Probably around 150 fish were brought in over the weekend, somewhere in the seven- to 15-mile range. The winner was a 20-pound fish, whereas in years past it would have been 35 pounds-plus, or in earlier years past 50.

“We didn’t have a complete lack of fish, but they weren’t ‘keepable’ sizes.”

Sylvester came to her port sampler job seven years ago. “I actually went to school for this kind of thing,” she said. “Then I ran a business for a couple of years. I worked as a volunteer for a year with the agency before this job came up, applied for it and they hired me.

“I have a bachelor’s in environmental science. I was going to turn that into a marine biology degree, but life took different directions.

“People assume since I’m out here doing this, I must

have an actual fisheries degree,” she said. “But most of my fisheries knowledge came from the fact I had a commercial fisherman for a father, and actually being out here on the docks with hands-on experience.”

And her handheld computer contains a great program that allows her to look up information on the fish that come in.

Sylvester’s backpack is full of tools of the trade: scales, bags for putting fish snouts in during salmon season, more bags for fish that must be confiscated if they’re not species that are allowed or not big enough, thermometers, resource books, information data sheets to hand out to boaters.

Altogether, the backpack and her fish measuring tool weigh about 20 pounds. One particular tool that’s been a problem for her is keeping a hold of her small fish scale. One of the scales fell off the end of the dock and was in the water for some three weeks. A Coast Guard mem-

ber retrieved it for her while “magnet fishing.”

Two weeks later, the replacement scale slipped out of her hands while she was trying to juggle her computer and notebook, and fell into a crevice between sections of the deck. She later was able to see and retrieve it one day during low tide.

Now, the tool has its own mini-floatation device attached to it.

Most of the fishermen greet Sylvester with a smile and jovial conversation. They aren’t threatened by talking with her. “We do not issue citations,” Sylvester said. “Our main point is to collect data. In the state of Oregon, (citations are issued) by the Oregon State Police.

“We are not out here looking for problems. We’ve got to be out here every day working with these folks, and being a government agency, sometimes people just don’t want to see us. If people know my goal is not to catch them doing something wrong, that I just want to get some

information real quick, they are usually going to be nicer and easier to work with,” she said.

Recreational fishermen stop her on the docks to ask what catches she has been seeing, what closures they need to worry about, about the size restrictions and catch limits, and plenty more.

According to Sylvester, these are quotas have been filled for the year: cabezon, China rockfish, quillback rockfish and copper rockfish. “Salmon season just closed,” she said.

“Yelloweye rockfish are not allowed to be kept ever. They were overfished and the ODFW is working on rebuilding the stock.”

As Sylvesters concludes her brief interview with each boat, she asks whether the fisherman plan to go out the next day. She’ll be there - and expects she’ll see them again.

attempted to make a U-turn in the 500 block of M Street but became stuck in the sand, Wilson said.

Cmdr. Bill Steven of the Del Norte County Sheriff’s Office said that although sheriff’s deputies were involved in the pursuit, Crescent City police officers were given the lead in making the arrest.

Anderson was held for suspicion of driving under the influence of drugs, evading police/causing injury, assault with a deadly weapon, hit and run, and using or under the influence of a controlled

substance.

Anderson was booked in the Crescent City Jail and held on \$75,000 bail.

“It was a pretty unusual pursuit,” Wilson said. “Most people don’t try to flee in motorhomes.

“He was driving pretty recklessly. That’s why we backed off the initial pursuit,” said Wilson. “But once he hit

the spike strips, it was mostly a slower pursuit through the city.”

Investigators identified the female victim encountered in Oregon as Jessica Lynn Cannon, 34. Her address was not listed in the Oregon State Police report, although it did say she was the owner of the RV.

The local participants said "Ultimook" was a great way to start the upcoming season.



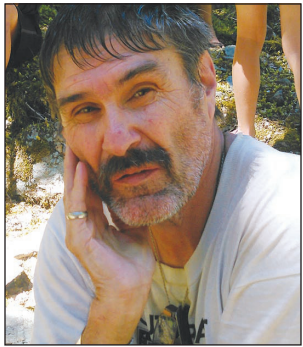

For one thing, the Tigers have had ample time to assemble a team, hold practices, and will be at home.

Add to that Bandon's state playoff swag from last year and one can see why Bavaro is wary.

First, a little history: The Bandon football dynasty is well known from the 1980's, when then-football coach Don Markum introduced the double-wing to prep football on the south coast and destroyed all comers, often hanging nearly 100 points on opposing teams.

Oregon's prep "mercy rule" was adopted as a result, to ease teams' humiliation by ending contests with a

running clock once the game reached 45 points.

That was then, this is now. Bandon is 0-1 after dropping its first non-league game, 18-33, to Glide.

Bandon football coach Aaron Freitag's Tigers finished up last year by taking an impressive second in league (3-1) behind undefeated Coquille.

That record earned the Tigers a ticket to the 2A state playoffs, although their ride was derailed in the first round-by Neah-Kah-Nie, 14-22.

Bavaro assesses Brookings-Harbor's upcoming competitor this way: "Bandon has some really good, skilled kids, and runs multiple sets and schemes to really keep you on your

toes," he said. "Their QB is a good runner and passer, and that can keep a play alive if needed."

Bavaro said Bandon also has good team speed and that Freitag has done a nice job of rebuilding the program.

"They have most of their team back from the playoff run they made last year, so it's a huge challenge for us to improve on all phases of our program," Bavaro said.

In Brookings' game at Gold Beach, Bavaro rotated his three starting quarterbacks. Does he plan to do that at Bandon?

"Yes, we will be rotating in our QB's," he said. "Our staff now has a plan on how we are evaluating that position, and we have three really good options now at that

position."

Finally, what did the second-year Bruins coach take away from his team's first game? "We learned that our kids are relentless, and we have some nice schemes on offense and defense that fit our athletes' abilities well."

That said, "We still have room for improvement in all phases of the game," he said. "We (coaches) need to be more efficient in our subbing, so that our players can continue to play with relentless effort every day."

DEE-NI'

The Tolowa Dee-Ni' Nation celebrated its "Dee-Ni' Day" in Smith River on Sept. 7. And after 14 years now, the organizers know what works and draws visitors.

"We don't really add anything new, so much as stay with the tried-and-true events," said Andromeda Lopez, an Office of Self Governance Program analyst for the Tolowa Dee-Ni'.

"The key difference this year is beefing up the main attractions."

For example, in the past, "Dee-Ni' Day" provided only samples from its traditional salmon bake. This year, salmon filets were offered for sale as part of a full meal. Lopez said that proved a popular decision. Some 150 servings sold out by noon.

For Frank Ault, on his second year of baking the salmon, the festival's attraction is simple. "Everything is better on a stick," he said.

Veteran cook Armando Lopez returned to prepare the salmon for his 10th year. He said 300 pounds of whole salmon were purchased for the event. His day began at 6 a.m. by preparing the fire pit using red wood, which stays heavy and

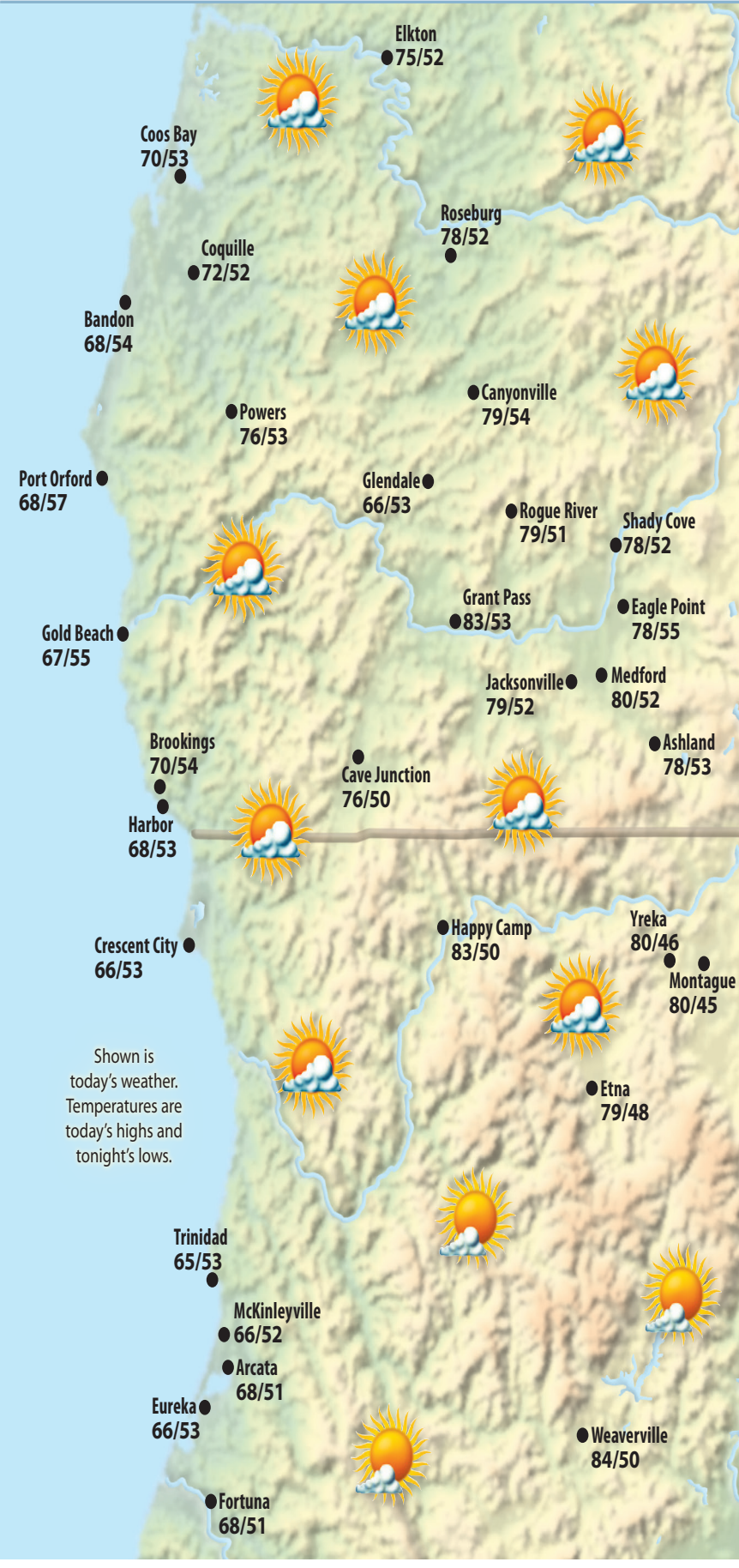

wet and burns longer at a lower temperature, ideal for rotating the salmon in and out.

Two filets are skewered per stick, skin-side to the flames, helping heat the filet enough to adhere to the stick. Although not all of the filets stay attached. "You've always got to lose one or two to the fire," Lopez said. "It's good luck."

The filets are rotated after 20 minutes, again at another 10 minutes, then every three minutes until done, Lopez said.

Attending a fire of her

own was Nieca Wright, baking sand bread. She mixed up simple ingredients of flower, water, salt and baking powder to craft a traditional flat bread. She said the bread isn't actually baked in sand. Rather, it's buried under hot rocks and pebbles heated by flaming wood.

After a few minutes, she uncovers the bread, making a perfect accompaniment to the baked salmon. "Everybody loves sand bread," Wright confided.

Another event seeing a revival was the traditional gambling game Ch'ut-lh-xut, or shell dice game. Cynthia Ford ran the women's gambling tournaments

and explained the rules:

The game involves shaking two sets of concave shells, one large and one small. If a set matches facing up or down, the roller celebrates with a cheer, "Waa-Chuu-Ti," and gets one point and a pick-up stick. The team with all of the sticks, or the most as time expires, wins.

Ford said that about six years ago, the tribe hosted a workshop to reintroduce the game to the next generation. "At the workshop, the women made dice and revived the game. Now, young kids are playing," she said.

She added that the men's version of the game in-

volves playing drums and singing during each toss of the shells.

The traditional events were rounded out by stick games, this year played down on the beach.

"Dee-Ni' Day" included non-traditional Indian events as well, Lopez said, to draw in more community participation. Those included making fresh cider from a press, and a popular horseshoe tournament that attracts eight to 10 teams every year.

Lopez said the event can draw about 200 visitors each year.
