# Fatal accidents spur renewed Highway 199 safety efforts

U.S. Highway 199, which runs east into Oregon from U.S. Highway 101 just north of Crescent City, has become one of the deadliest corridors in Oregon, according to details released this week by the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT).

The study shows a persistent four traffic fatalities since June 1 on the highway itself, plus five fatal crashes off the highway along adjacent county

The Highway 199 fatal crash rate has been as high as eight, in 2016, and as low as two, in 2014.

It doesn't seem to be improving. "We have struggled with this corridor for many years," said ODOT public information officer Gary Leaming. "This is not a new problem with this highway, but we seem to have run

## LESSONS PAY OFF IN RIVER EMERGENCY

n a sunny afternoon the first weekend of summer vacation, the Christensen family of Brookings took visiting out-of-state friends to play in the Chetco River at Loeb State Park.

Jenny Christensen recalls a "big discussion" about whether their children would be using

With lifejackets on, Christensen's daughter, Ella, 9, and two other girls decided to try swimming out to the rock in the park's popular swimming hole. Suddenly, the visiting 11-year-old was in trouble as she crossed the river's current.

"Just her face was above the water," said Christensen, who was watching from shore with the older girl's mother. She said neither she nor the girl's mother are adept in the

"It was so scary," Christensen said. "We were watching her be swept down the river in slow motion. There seemed no way those girls were getting back to shore on their

"I remember thinking, 'How does Ella know what to do?""

Ella knew exactly what to do. She used "big arms" to swim toward her friend, and a "loud voice" and direct eye contact with the nearest adults as she called for help.

All without screaming or panicking, said her mother.

Attracted by Ella's actions, three women on shore dove in to help all three girls back to safety, said Christensen.

such an emergency? Just a week prior, she had participated in annual third-grade water safety lessons - a project funded and facilitated by the Rotary Club of Brookings-Harbor, in partnership with Kalmiopsis Elementary School and

the City of Brookings. "Man, was I ever grateful for those lessons," Christensen said. "I didn't put it together (the lessons and Ella's actions), but Ella did."

"We've always felt that providing these water safety lessons every year could potentially

save a child's life," said Rotary Club president Bonnie Jordan. "This is the first time we've gotten concrete proof that it has.'

Jordan said the lessons are provided at the end of the school year, when the young students are likely to be around water at a naturally curious age. The project includes classroom instruction, as well as 30 minutes in the city pool every day for a week.

During the youngsters' first day in the water, organizers determined that half the third-graders either had never been in the water, had no water skills, or were afraid of the water. Yet they all were willing to give it a try.

As part of the lessons, volunteers worked with the children in small groups. The water activities were based on the skill level of each group, with special safety lessons provided for everyone that included an opportunity to try floating in lifejackets, grabbing a rescue ring, and lying down on the pool deck to pull a friend back to the wall.

Ella took additional swim lessons over the summer, said her mother, adding that water safety lessons are "imperative" for thirdgraders.

Jordan said the lessons are one of the club's favorite projects, although only one project among many. "Being a member of the Rotary Club of Brookings-Harbor gives us many opportunities to positively impact our community and the world as a whole," Jordan said. "It's purposeful, meaningful and unbelievably rewarding."

## Harbor Fire District now seeks new chief

The Harbor File District
appointed a new board commissioner and is moving forward with plans to hire a new chief.

That follows a Harbor Rural Fire Protection District Board meeting held Sept. 11, which public information officer Neville Hill declared was interactive and well attended by the public.

The board is looking to replace

commissioner Ken Hall, who is relocating and has resigned. Anthony Burkett was nominated in open session for the post, position 3. After a short executive session with Burkett, the nomination was confirmed and announced to the public in open session.

Burkett also serves in position 5 on the Harbor Sanitary District Board of Directors.

Hill said Burkett's appointment – he has yet to be sworn in - allows the board to achieve a quorum and

begin working to replace former Chief Bob Larson, who resigned effective Aug. 31. Larson's resignation came shortly after a noconfidence petition was submitted by district firefighters to the board Aug 14.

On Aug. 23, Larson filed notice of his intention to bring legal action against the Harbor Fire District and one or more of the district's board members. In his tort claim, Larson said his ability and effectiveness had been undermined by the board.

Hill said the district already had received two applications for the position. At present, he said, "Assistant Chiefs Thomas Sorrentino and Joshua Frame are acting in the capacity of fire chief and covering all the calls."

There has been no impact on the department's ability to respond to calls and provide protection to the

community, stated Hill. The Harbor Fire Department is located at 98069 West Denham

## 'Bike the Rogue' draws from Oregon, California

Seventy-eight riders from across Oregon and northern California gathered Sept. 7 at Buffington Park in Gold Beach for the 10th-annual "Bike the Rogue" event.

Riders could choose from one of four scenic routes offered in the cycling event.

Thirty-eight riders completed the 25-mile route, heading east along the south bank of the Rogue River, crossing Lobster Creek Bridge, and returning to Gold Beach along the north bank of the river.

Fourteen cyclists rode the 40-mile route, which included an 8-mile stretch through ranch land, and 11 miles along the ocean with views of sea stacks and sandy beaches.

Twenty-one metric-century (62.2 miles) cyclists rode an extended version of the 40-mile route, adding an additional 22.5 miles east along the Rogue

River. And four die-hard riders completed the challenging 100mile route, including Charles Mahaffy of Coos Bay, who

turns 80 years old in January 2020.

The youngest rider this year was 14 years old, the oldest 95.

All riders were treated to a warm welcome across the finish line. That included free beer, provided at cost to the event by locally owned Arch Rock Brewing, and a free wood-oven-fired pizza, all included as part of each cyclist's entry fee.

While enjoying their personal pizzas, James and Frances Maunder of Eureka, California said this was their first time in the Gold Beach event. They've participated in numerous bike rides throughout the U.S., and said "Bike the Rogue's" metriccentury route along the Rogue River and the Pacific Ocean is now their favorite.

They said they plan to return to Gold Beach on Sept. 12, 2020 for the 11th-annual event, which is hosted by the Rotary Club of Gold Beach.

# No sign yet of missing Crescent City man

#### **Staff Report**

The search for Norbert Anthony (Tony) Danztman continues after the 89-yearold Crescent City man walked away from a motel Aug. 30 in Winter, Wisconsin and disappeared.

His granddaughter, Haley Smith of Crescent City, has stayed in communications with Patricia Sanchez, the Sawyer County, Wisconsin, search and rescue coordinator and county emergency manager.


Leads to Dantzman's whereabouts have been few, said Smith, with the added

challenge of separating rumors from viable tips.

"There has been nothing, literally nothing," she said. There was a rumor he was found (that was) spreading here and in Wisconsin. But he was not found. (Sanchez) has been on rumor control.'

200 see and share it," said Smith. "It's been awesome how much it's going out. We're just trying to get the word out." Smith said she remains in daily contact Sanchez.

The Sawyer County Sheriff's Office said in a press release that extensive searches of the immedi-

ate area had been conducted utilizing ground surveillance, canines and areal support. The canines lost Dantzman's scent along a road heading toward County Highway West, so he may have hitched a ride, the sheriff's office

Sanchez, a member of the county's search and rescue team since 2002, said she's surprised they've found no clues, given the search effort initiated.

said.

"We had canines on the scene within a couple hours and drones, planes, civilian air patrol. We've moved to cadaver dogs, just to cover all possibilities. But we've

still found nothing," Sanchez

"We're always optimistic. The highway has so much traffic, somebody had to have seen him. All we need is that one good tip.

"It doesn't matter if you have all the technology and resources in the world, you can miss somebody," said Sanchez. "I checked one grid area where the weeds were over my head. I tripped and got stuck.

"So, at this point, we can't rule out anything."

Smith added that she and other family members are weighing whether to fly to Winter to assist in the search.

#### **Staff Report**

The Pilot first reported in July that Curry and eight other Oregon counties that experienced storms last winter and early spring have qualified for federal financial assistance.

On Thursday, Oregon U.S. Sens. Jeff Merkley and Ron Wyden announced that \$150 million is now available to help rural communities recover from substantial damages and losses caused by the severe storms, which closed roads and left families without power for weeks.

Nine Oregon counties - Coos, Curry, Douglas, Grant, Jefferson, Lane, Linn, Umatilla and Wheeler - are eligible to apply for grants from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, part of a \$19.1-billion bipartisan disaster-relief package passed by Congress this summer.

In February 2019, cold air from the north merged with Pacific moisture that caused heavy snow and dangerous wintry conditions in Oregon. The result was a massive snowpack exceeding average levels by as much as 160%. A state of emergency was declared for

According to Wyden and Merkley, municipalities, public bodies, nonprofit organizations and tribal nations in those Oregon counties now can apply for the disaster-relief grants through the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Community Facilities Program.

The alarm goes off at 3 and the day begins with a quick shower to wake up me up. Off to the boat we go, to finish up a few last-minute details icing the fish boxes, attaching drag straps and, of course, getting the rods in the proper positions.

Now it's 4:45, and me and my two fishing partners leave the slip to follow another fishing buddy out. He has radar, which is a big plus when running in the dark.

We're heading out 17 miles to the warm, blue water in which albacore had been caught over the past few days. An hour later, we have our gear in the water.

Within a few minutes, four

rods bend over and drags start singing - looks like a promising day already! Three out of the four make it onto the deck, and we're off and running.

However, as most fisherman know, things can change in a hurry due to weather, current changes or just Mother Nature protecting her bounty. So as the day progresses, we score enough action to keep our interest and to hold us on the water until about 1 p.m., before heading in.

When the spray settles, we have 22 on board and moving

There's nothing quite like fishing the Blue Water in anticipation of hooking up with an albacore, pound for pound one of the best fighting fish out there. And excellent table fare as well. Smoked, barbecued or canned, it's hard to miss with fresh-caught tuna!

into a breaking point this summer."

Highway 199 - the Redwood Highway - is a rural arterial that runs from I-5 in Grants Pass south and west to Crescent City. Nearly 42 miles of the 80-mile highway are in Oregon.

ODOT considers the route a critical link for tourists and commuters, and it serves as a main street for numerous residents living along and off the highway.

The ODOT report lists several causes for traffic crashes in the years January 2009-January 2018, including driving too fast for conditions, following too close and other driver errors.

Road characteristics in those accidents range from straightaways to sharp curves. The times of the crashes include all days, with Monday being the worst. Crashes increase through the afternoon and into the evening.

The months of May through the end of the calendar year see the most crashes, with July being the worst.

The report shows drivers of all ages are involved, although 20- to 29-year-olds are the predominant risk

The most-sever accidents occur between Kerby and Cave Junction.

"One of the things we are struggling with is personal responsibility dealing with the conditions," Learning said, "not being drunk, drugged or impaired. Many of the crashes have one or another of these elements."

Because of the ongoing. even increasing, fatality rate along Highway 199 ODOT has launched a new public-awareness campaign, partnering with city and county organizations and law-enforcement agencies along the corridor.

That effort includes portable electronic reader boards stationed along the route cautioning drivers to slow down, plus a media and public-outreach campaign.

ODOT also has launched systemic safety improvements, including rumble strips at the Applegate River Bridge and in Cave Junction. The rumble strips are designed to alert drivers if they are veering off of the roadway.

A "U.S. Highway 199 Stakeholder Working Group" has been established to seek long-term solutions, which might include development of a safety corridor along portions of the highway.

Also planned are removing roadside obstacles, adding guardrails and protection barriers, and improving the side slope of the roadway to make it more recoverable in the event a vehicle runs off the road. That project will be funded at \$435,885.

A pedestrian bridge is planned over Holton Creek in Kerby.

Leaming said that over the past several years, other safety improvements have been made. "From mileposts 7 to 28, along about

21 miles of the highway, we have added brand-new pavement, recessed pavement markers, and in all we have invested \$33 million in the corridor."

ODOT's report says Highway 199 law enforcement by state police and county sheriffs is sparse, stemming from staffing issues.

It also cites local residents asking for more public outreach on safety messages in the corridor, plus financial help for driver-education courses, especially for younger motorists.

"ODOT is committed to working with local and state partners - both short and long-term - to do what we can to help with the safety challenges along the Redwood Highway," the report states. "We are committed to a corridor planning study to reveal long-term possible safety improvements."

But the report adds that a comprehensive effort is not expected until mid-2020.

# Fred Meyer, labor union spar

Apparently bracing for a potential strike, Fred Meyer recently posted fliers in their grocery stores seeking replacement workers, offering a pay rate of \$15 per hour.

The fliers reportedly say the store is accepting applications as a "precautionary measure due to a potential labor dispute with the UFCW

A strike by the union seemingly would affect the Fred Meyer store

in Brookings, among those in other

United Food and Commercial Workers Local 555 announced earlier this week that it has canceled all contracts with Fred Meyer parent company Kroger "due to unfair labor practices by Fred Meyer," according to a press release from the

The union stressed that a contract cancelation did not put its workers in jeopardy. "The law requires employers to maintain the status quo for their employees," according to the press release.

Labor union spokesperson Kelley McAllistair said that Fred Meyer advertising for temporary workers is a "technique to scare our workers," according to an article on the Portland Mercury blog website.

In its press release, the union accused the company of other intimidation tactics as well, including the "widespread one-on-one 'captive audience' meetings that Fred Meyer CCK employees were recently subjected to."

The UFCW Local 555 press release said Fred Meyer stores took its actions in spite of the union "stating in no uncertain terms that a strike would not be called as part of this announcement." The union said further details would follow on

United Food and Commercial Workers Local 555 represents grocery workers in Oregon and southwest Washington. The negotiations are not just with Fred Meyer stores, but also include Safeway, QFC and Alberston's. That said, there's no indication grocery stores other than Fred Meyer's are advertising for replacements, according to the union's press release.

and socks are available to anyone ranging from the frugal shopper, to the family with kids who outgrow shoes way too quickly, to the family with sports shoe needs, to the person needing shoes for work, to the young person wanting to look nice for a formal dance, or the homeless person needing something to protect the feet.

"It is very rewarding when someone gets a new job that requires specific shoe wear, and we can provide that for them," Schreiber said. "It 's fun when the kids come in and find the perfect pair of cleats or tennis shoes, or sparkly pink shoes for the first day of school.

And it's humbling when a homeless person comes in and their shoes are falling apart and their socks are wet, and we can change that situation."

Schreiber said the community has been generous donating shoes that are in fine condition, sometimes even new with tags still on them.

"We try to sort through all of the shoes and put only the ones in very good condition out on the tables," she said. "I routinely bring a dozen pairs home to wash and make more suitable for display."

Larry Retzlaffe of Smith River began the Brookings Harbor Shoe Bank 10 years ago, with the assistance of space from the Brookings Harbor Elks Lodge.

"Larry started the exchange initially to help students at

Smith River Elementary/Middle School who were unable to participate in sports and activities because they couldn't afford the shoes that were required," said Schreiber. "He was soon providing all sorts of shoes, because he saw the children weren't coming to school in proper shoe wear and adults didn't have appropriate shoes for work."

Schreiber said her role with the Shoe Bank began as a board member for the soccer league discovering cleats piled up in the equipment locker that weren't being donated. "My daughter was looking for a community volunteer project then, so Larry put her in charge of all sports cleats. The number of shoes just continued to grow.

"After faithfully working at this for a number of years, Larry needed to step aside, so I stepped in to head it up,"

said Schreiber. At that time, because of limited volunteers, the shoe bank's operation was cut back to once a month. "Most people know they can call me if something is needed in between," Schreiber said.

"I also bring all the cleats home when soccer or football season is beginning, and again when baseball or soft-

ball is beginning, so people can come by any day and look in the bins.

"I generally get a good response to this, with about 20 pairs of cleats being given or exchanged each season."

When the shoe bank inventory gets too large, or shoes have been on hand for too long, Sac's Thrift Ave at 1150 9th St. in Crescent City helps donate them to Thrift International, where they are taken oversees for distribution.

Schreiber said the shoe bank's greatest challenge is the lack of volunteers. "The three of us who set it up each month are very busy people, and it's hard for us to commit each month," she said. "And it is hard work setting up and cleaning up.

"Some months, we are blessed with customers who show up early to help us set up, as they truly don't want something for nothing, and that is nice and appreciated. But some months, I am on my own and there are a lot of shoes."

Another challenge, said Schreiber, is getting the word we give out 40 to 50 pairs of shoes. But on some days, we only give out five to six pairs," she said. "I know the need is greater than that, but somehow we are missing the people in need."
