

## County addresses homeless issue

Curry County Commissioner Court Boice drew attention to the issue of homelessness following a recently-released poll showing that the overwhelming majority of Southern Oregonians want community leaders to find a solution to homelessness. "It's something we are all interested in, but we aren't making a lot of forward momentum and I'm concerned about that," Boice said during the Sept. 21 board

of commissioners meeting. Local nonprofit leaders Beth Barker-Hidalgo of The Curry Homeless Coalition, and Diana Cooper of Brookings CORE Response, urged county officials to include members of the homeless community in the process to design a homeless plan at the start of the meeting. Later in the meeting during his presentation, Boice said his idea to address homelessness in Curry County would be to identify homeless "visitors" and entice them to leave the county.

Under his plan "Curry Compassionate Homeless Solutions," the goal would be to sort out homeless Curry County families and find ways to help them, then transport non-Curry residents to Salem. "They need help. They need to be moved where they can be helped," Boice said. The commissioner quoted ethical rules from a "hobo code," recounted an interaction with a man on the beach who he believed to be under the influences of substances, and held up a photo of man reportedly exposing himself in Crescent

City during the presentation. Boice also compared Oregon to the state of Illinois – where he said radicalized governments favor criminals and bypass law abiding citizens. While the commissioner said he believed the majority of homeless people were non-violent and just trying to survive, he said he thought 90 percent of the homeless population in the United States and in Oregon was the result of alcohol and drug abuse.

## Skateboarder raising money for suicide awareness

Eugene man travels through Curry County on skateboarding mission to San Francisco

Mike Crispino is a man on a mission to honor the lives of two teen men from his community. Crispino passed through Curry County in September on his mission skateboard 831 miles from his hometown in Eugene, Ore. to San Francisco, Cali. to bring awareness to suicide and struggles with mental health. Crispino is also being joined by Brookings resident Ethan Hall, who has been with him since start of the journey by offering support if he should need it in a vehicle.

Crispino lost two of his friends, Ben Moody and Silas Strimple, as a result of suicide and untreated mental health issues. "Both were loved, colorful and respected members of the Eugene skateboarding community and their loss has had a lasting effect on their families and on

the young community in Eugene," Crispino said. "I chose to take the 101 route because as I've come to know and witness for myself that coastal communities and Curry County specifically have higher numbers of suicide and difficulty with barriers and access to proper care," he said. In Crispino's opinion, "We have a state of emergency on our hands."

Suicide is the second leading cause of death among 10-24 year olds in Oregon, and suicide rates in Oregon have been higher than U.S. rates over the past 10 years, according to Oregon Suicide Prevention.

"It is difficult to pin down the root cause – but I have high hopes during my travels that what I'm wishing to accomplish locally in Eugene will also inspire others," Crispino said.

Crispino said he has already made lasting connections along his journey – including Curry County.

"While I was briefly in Curry County, anyone that noticed me skateboarding and every person I spoke with had a story just like ours to share," he said. "The feeling I had been left with in each

## County commissioner scolded by sheriff

A county ethics presentation backfired on County Commissioner Court Boice during the Sept. 21 Board of Commissioners meeting. After he called upon his fellow commissioners to ask County Treasurer David Barnes to resign, they refused. Sheriff John Ward then took the podium saying he would support a voter recall of Commissioner Boice.

Before Sheriff Ward took the stand, Boice stood at the podium to ask for David Barnes' resignation in an ethics presentation to his fellow commissioners.

Only a little more than a month prior, Boice had commended his fellow county commissioners and staff for a "new spirit of safety and team attitude."

But at the meeting on Sept. 21 he spoke of dissent, and "a lot of things going on in Curry County."

Boice said Treasurer David Barnes has asked for six public officials to resign, and that even though he felt special that Barnes hadn't asked him to resign, he must be stopped.

"We remain with a tyrannical person roaming the halls of the Curry County annex, threatening anyone who disagrees with him. It is way beyond a toxic work environment. It is scary for the people working here," Boice said.

Commissioners Paasch and Herzog said they would not join Boice in asking for Barnes resignation or a vote of no confidence.

"As I said before you cannot have unity without humility. I do not believe that this is doing anything for unity right now," Herzog said.

"You have made some accusations here today that Mr. Barnes has called people names. I would like to see it stop from everyone," Commissioner Paasch said.

"I am going to reference one letter where you called Mr. Herzog weak. You called the sheriff a liar and you called me corrupt and you called David Barnes several other names. So if you want to have ethics and you want to have civility in this county – I think we need to worry about the logs in our own eyes before we worry about the twigs in someone else's," Paasch said.

Following Boice's ethics presentation, Sheriff John Ward said Commissioner Boice needed to learn his place. He also said Commissioner Boice had attempted to discredit him.

"I've been doing this work for 31 years and I'm pretty popular in this county," Sheriff Ward said.

"The relationships I've built are incredible. You discredit me," he said.

Sheriff Ward read the email that Commissioner Paasch had referred to, saying it was an email that Boice had sent to him, then later denied.

In the email, Boice reportedly accuses Sheriff Ward of "con-

## Brookings council spreads word about suicide awareness, bullying prevention

The City of Brookings declared September 2022 as Suicide Awareness and Prevention month, and October 2022 as Bully Prevention month.

"Suicidal thoughts can affect anyone regardless of age, gender, race, orientation, income level, religion or background; and is a major public health issue that requires vigilant attention and preventative action, especially during times of a pandemic," Mayor Ron Hedenskog said while reading the proclamation on Monday, Sept. 26.

"The councilors encourage all citizens to learn the warning signs, trust their gut and use that information to ask a troubled friend, colleague or family member, 'Are you okay?' and be prepared to listen," Mayor Hedenskog said. "That conversation could change a life."

The mayor went on to read a proclamation for the month of October.

"Bullying can be in the form of physical, verbal, sexual or emotional intimidation intentionally directed at a person or group of people. It can happen in neighborhoods, playground, schools, on job sites and through technology," he said.

Research indicates that bullying is the most common form of violence affecting children and adolescents. Targets of bullying are more likely to acquire physical, emotional and learning problems, while children who bully are at greater risk of engaging in more serious violent behaviors.

of those interactions was that communities aren't comfortable speaking on these issues in such a way to address them and ultimately offer tangible solutions."

The skateboarder said he thinks this probably stems from the stigma of suicide and the discomforts involved in such a conversation. But these conversations are worth having, he said.

"Of the people I've made connections with, many feel unseen, unsupported and left on their own to manage," he said.

Crispino is skateboarding to raise money to build his friends a memorial at the skateboard in Eugene.

"It was their second home. I watched both grow up from children into teens in the 9-years of the parks existence, and as an older skater myself (at age 48) I have seen a great many young people find the focus, community and solace they crave from the sport just as I have in my own life," Crispino said.

The skateboarder said the loss of the two Eugene skateboarders has left many other community members feeling left behind – and they are in need of support as well.

"Our youth in Eugene are saying they do not know where to go for their own struggles and I'd like to do something about that if I can," he said.

Crispino said his hope is to not only memorialize the friends he has lost, but also to spur the growth of community programs and resources to support others health and well-being.

"I want programs for the youth that they can easily access should they ever need it. That is also my ultimate goal of my trip," Crispino said.

"Councilors encourage all community members to become engaged in a variety of awareness and prevention activities designed to make our communities safe for all children, adolescents and adults," Hedenskog said.

Brookings suicide and bullying awareness advocate Gordon Clay spoke to the council following the proclamations.

He let councilmembers know that even though Oregon is the 27th largest state it has the 13th highest suicide rate. Curry County is the 27th largest County in Oregon, but it rates first in suicide deaths in Oregon.

"As suicide rates remain highest in rural communities, it is time for citizens to step up and do what each one of us can do to reduce these rates," Clay said.

tinued lies," being "best friends" with Commissioner Paasch and an ally of Treasurer Barnes.

"You say stuff all the time and it is ridiculous. You attack people. You attack me and I'm not going to put up with it," Ward said.

"You are one of three commissioners. You need to make a decision as three. But you keep going out on your own and trying to do things you have no authority to do," he said.

After Sheriff Ward finished speaking, Commissioner Boice said, "I stand behind the letter."

Commissioner Herzog said, "We are done."

And the meeting continued.

# Curry General receives 4-star rating

Curry General Hospital is the only coastal Oregon hospital within 100 miles north and 100 miles south of Gold Beach to receive a 4-star rating from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services in the July 2022 report, an accolade bestowed on only 29% of the 3,307 hospitals included. Even fewer - 6% - earned 5-stars.

CMS assigns star ratings to hospitals nationwide based on performance reported by adult patients after discharge through a standardized, 29-question survey. Patients of Curry Health Network receive the survey by mail through an unbiased, independent third-party; the CMS ranking system helps consumers easily compare hospitals to make more informed decisions about their care.

CHN's CEO Virginia (Ginny) Williams said it is the growing number of positive patient experiences - like that of Curry County Commissioner Christopher Paasch, owner of Cornerstone Ranch - that make it easy to understand why the hospital's patient satisfaction star rating skyrocketed during the last quarter from 2- to 4-stars.

Paasch found himself in Curry General for a ruptured appendix near the end of July, and discovered firsthand how the hospital continues to strive to provide patients with the best care possible.

## Brookings adopts stricter taxi driver rules

The city of Brookings tightened up their taxicab regulations to adopt higher driver standards. Council members passed a new taxi driver permit ordinance at their meeting Monday, Sept. 26. The city's taxicab regulations were last updated nearly 30 years ago. Since that time, alternatives to taxis, such as Lyft and Uber have come onto the scene. Brookings staff recommended the council take a look at the current regulations and take action to better fulfill a public safety role in the operation of vehicles for hire. Under the new rules, driver permits

will be denied to anyone who has been convicted of a felony within the previous 84 months; has a driving while suspended conviction within 36 months; or if they are, or are required to be, registered as a sex offender. Previous taxi driver rules still remain in place. Each driver must be over 21 and hold a current Oregon or California State driver's license. Drivers will be denied a permit if they have more than three traffic citations in the past year. The city manager can revoke a driver's permit if any of the rules required for a permit are broken, or if a driver is convicted of possession of an open container of alcohol or possession, manufacture or delivery of a controlled substance.

## Elk River hatchery chinook bag limit increased

Elk River anglers can keep one more hatchery chinook salmon per day Sept. 26-Dec. 1, raising the daily bag limit to three hatchery fish. The new limit applies from the mouth to Bald Mountain Creek. The increased bag limit is meant to reduce the number of hatchery chinook that reach spawning grounds. Hatchery

fish were identified in the 2014 Coastal Multi-Species Conservation and Management Plan as a limiting factor for wild Elk River fall chinook. While the bag limit increases Sept. 26, most chinook don't start entering the Elk River until the end of October. Anglers are reminded that all wild chinook salmon must be released.

# Manufacturing industry needs help to thrive

In nearly every corner of Oregon, manufacturers provide living-wage jobs while innovating constantly to increase sustainability. They make wine and cheese, paper and wood products. They turn recycled plastic into broadband conduit and garbage into paper products. They make semiconductors, too.

The success of the manufacturing sector has made Oregon a national outlier. Manufacturing employment increased by 14% between 1969 and 2019 even as manufacturing jobs nationwide declined by 34%, according to research conducted by ECONorthwest. That's a good thing, as median earnings for full-time manufacturing employees exceed those of workers in other industries by 17%, a premium that exists across racial and ethnic categories. In total, manufacturing contributes \$33 billion to Oregon's gross domestic product annually. A 10% increase in manufacturing output would generate an additional \$800 million in state and local government revenue.

But will such growth happen? It's tempting to assume that manufacturing will continue to thrive in Oregon simply because it has in the past. But growth isn't guaranteed. In fact, Oregon could rapidly lose the gains the state has seen over the past 40 years unless state lawmakers listen more carefully to employers and seek to create the conditions they

need to thrive.

Employers featured in Oregon Business & Industry's recent Manufacturing and Innovation Roadshow pointed time and again to a few problems that make growing businesses in Oregon difficult.

The first involves Oregon's chronic shortage of buildable industrial land. Fixing this problem will not require a drastic reconsideration of Oregon's established land-use system. Rather, it will require a bipartisan, good-faith effort to better balance the need to preserve farms and forests with the need to provide land for other important uses, including manufacturing.

The second problem involves Oregon's regulatory climate. By and large, the manufacturers who participated in the Roadshow praised the responsiveness of city and county governments. At the same time, almost all noted the difficulty of dealing with state agencies. Problems include the siloed and often oppositional nature of agency rulemaking and the difficulty of obtaining air and water permits. Oregon should seek to create clear and consistent policies and help employers comply with them.

Finally, the Legislature should consider incentives that align with the needs of manufacturers and maintain Oregon's competitiveness. Manufacturers spend heavily on innovation, including the adoption of technologies and processes to operate more sustainably. For many, meanwhile, providing child care for employ-

ees would be feasible with the right incentives.

Oregon lawmakers could say "no" to such changes, and various groups will urge them to do just that. But this would have costs, including the loss of lucrative jobs and Oregon's hard-won status as a leader in innovation, manufacturing, and sustainable approaches. This would happen, ironically, just as the country is waking up to the need to grow domestic manufacturing capacity.

Instead, Oregon should support the kind of innovation and commitment to sustainability the Manufacturing Roadshow spotlighted in August. In Woodburn, for example, Cascade Poly Pipe and Conduit transforms recycled plastic into conduit used in power and broadband projects. And in Toledo, Georgia Pacific's Juno facility extracts paper fiber from household trash, a technology that soon will be available on a commercial scale.

Helping manufacturers innovate, thrive and provide living-wage jobs should not be a partisan issue. That's why we'd like to urge Democrats and Republicans to work together to that end.

What's the worst that can happen on the web? I get hate-filled emails telling me I should be sexually assaulted and then see where I'd stand on a "rape exception." It comes with the territory.

Yes, I've also prayed the rosary in front of the Planned Parenthood clinic down the street from my apartment, quietly and without any interaction with clinic escorts. But my body has never been on the line.

That's why what just happened to Bucks County, Pa., pro-life activist Michael Houck sent a chill down my spine. From where I sit — safely lounging behind my laptop — Houck looks like a very loud canary in an extremely troubling coal mine.

This past week, a SWAT team of federal agents came to Houck's home wielding an arsenal of assault weapons and arrested him, in front of his family, and over what?

One year ago, he had an altercation outside an abortion clinic where he was praying and protesting. According to statements from Houck and the Department of

Justice, the incident involved — at most — some shoving between Houck and a pro-abortion activist who, Houck claims, was whispering pornographic comments into the ears of Hauck's 12-year-old son with him at the clinic during the peaceful protest. The man fell back, suffered no injuries, and then filed a lawsuit. No injuries, no claim.

The suit was dismissed.

And now the Biden administration is sending in the big guns for a high-profile arrest? Even if you accept the worst-case scenario of Houck's behavior, an early morning raid of his house nearly a year later still makes no sense. While he's charged with violating the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrance Act, there was no evidence that Houck blocked any entrance or that any woman was denied an abortion because of his actions.

Once again, even if there were, what did the body-armor adorned FBI agents fear? That he would brandish his Bible?

The FBI's Philly office claims the description of 20 to 25 officers on the scene of the arrest "is an overstatement," but they don't give a specific number or deny that guns were drawn. All for a husband and father whose attorney had already told the DOJ he would turn himself in if asked.

The DOJ's action makes sense only if you see that federal law enforcement has

become a politicized arm of the Biden administration, which has decided that the right to an abortion is the only thing that allows women to survive in this predatory, patriarchal society. The president and his supporters are rabid advocates for the most extreme policies, including demonizing those of us who respect the life of unborn children. Many of us are people of faith, but even more are people who respect and believe in science, a science that tells us that from the moment of conception, human life exists.

And now that Biden has the Justice Department cops on speed dial, he has decided to use its power in the most dramatic and despicable ways. That SWAT team was not sent out to arrest one family man, surrounded by his seven kids and worried wife, who has done nothing that can actually be prosecuted at the federal or state levels.

Instead, Biden's DOJ has put all pro-life activists on notice that we have a target on our backs and that our activism is now in the "potential domestic terrorism" category. Remember Biden's "Red Dawn" speech in Philadelphia a few weeks ago when he labeled "MAGA Republican" Trump supporters a danger to our democracy? That speech with the red-and-black lighting was like a staff meeting on the Death Star.

Did you notice how Biden included among the enemies of the state "MAGA forces are determined to take this country backwards to an America where there is no right to choose"?

And now it takes a village of storm-troopers to arrest one pro-life dad?

There is a very dangerous trend developing in this country, and it's not just on social media. Note the rise in anti-Catholic hate crimes, with churches being vandalized and opinion pieces in elite journals about "assault rosaries."

When the armed agents came, Houck announced the presence of his children and pleaded for the federal officers to put down their guns and that he would come peacefully. According to his wife, that's not what happened. They staged the same sort of assault that the officers in the Elian Gonzalez controversy executed over a generation ago. That, too, was under a Democratic regime.

Philly's leafy suburbs were the scene of the most recent example of Biden administration thuggery and overreach. Given the heated rhetoric from the commander in chief, it will likely not be the last.

"That's all they care about. I'm not saying it's impossible to reach them, but it makes it tougher. It doesn't absolve us of responsibility. We can try but some of them will refuse help. We all have family members or neighbors that we are aware of," the commissioner said.

Boice said the most compassionate thing he could think of do was to offer homeless persons \$50 to get on a bus to Salem, then give them another \$50 when they depart the bus in Salem. Curry County would network to put them in touch with religious and civic organizations, he said. Funds given to the homeless who consent to go to Salem would reportedly come from a variety of private and government grants.

Boice admitted the plan was in its early stages and needed refinement.

"We have finite resources and our citizens and local agencies are not equipped to deal with financial, housing, medical and other challenges that these folks pose to our area. Salem has far more resources to a safer and hopefully more productive life," Boice said. "The alternative is the current status quo with more coming — depleting whatever resources the county has, resulting in more folks roaming the streets, camping in unsafe locations and contributing to stressed agencies."

Boice asked for feedback from his fellow commissioners.

Commissioner John Herzog wondered if Salem had the resources to address the issue either.

"I've been to Salem in the past couple years and they have blocks blocked off with homeless, tent

cities on the street and it is a homeless camp in town," he said. "If they have the services... I don't think they can fix it."

Salem's Mayor Chuck Bennett denied to comment on whether he thought the Curry County plan was feasible or if the city of Salem has the resources to help additional homeless people.

"Mayor Bennett will not comment on the specifics of a Curry County general meeting; however, the city recognizes homelessness as a critical problem in our community and addressing it is one of Salem's top priorities," said Gretchen Bennett, a spokesperson with City of Salem mayor and city manager's office. "We remain committed to actively work with partner organizations to prevent and solve homelessness in our community as well as work to reduce hardships that lead to homelessness."

Barker-Hidalgo of The Curry Homeless Coalition said she emailed Commissioner Boice after the meeting with her thoughts on his presentation.

She said to move people who are experiencing homelessness to a community that may or may not have resources is irresponsible.

"It's short sighted and doesn't take individual situations into consideration," Barker-Hidalgo said.

"If you are going to devise a plan at least include the people," she added.

Barker-Hidalgo said deciding who is and isn't worth helping isn't the proper way to form a homeless plan.

"It's discriminatory and it's illegal. You need to serve the entire population," said the executive director of the homeless coalition.

"Everyone wants a simple fix but it's not that easy," she said.

Both County Commissioner Boice and Brookings CORE Response nonprofit executive director Cooper referenced the findings of a recent poll of 400 Southern Oregon residents at the Sept. 21 commissioners meeting.

This results of this telephone poll found that 90 percent of residents in Southern Oregon consider homelessness to be an important issue in the community. Two-thirds said they see more homeless people today than a year ago and 92 percent said local governments need to take action.

When asked about solutions, 36 percent of respondents said their first choice would be to provide mental illness and substance abuse counseling. About 35 percent suggest providing direct housing or subsidized affordable housing.

"It is clear that the best way to build consensus around homelessness in our region will be to integrate treatment and accountability with housing," said Sam Engel, director of social determinants of health at AllCare Health.

When Brookings CORE Response executive director Cooper addressed the board of commissioners about the homeless plan, she asked them to especially consider seniors in Curry County.

Cooper said when Brookings CORE response tries to find housing for families experiencing homelessness, they often encounter wait lists of 2 to 3 years, and for seniors it's even longer, with an average wait list of 5 to 7 years.

"It's life threatening for them to be out on the street. So we have struggled to get people into housing to save their life — and we have lost some and we don't want to lose anymore," Cooper said.

# Brookings hires firms for infrastructure projects

 The Brookings City Council unanimously approved entering into contracts with three separate engineering companies to meet the demand of several planned infrastructure projects over the next five years. This includes a \$30 million sewer infrastructure and wastewater treatment plant upgrade. The city has been authorized to immediately start engineering for this project. "I hope you have your seatbelt on because this is going to be a heck of a

ride these next few years," Mayor Ron Hedenskog said to city Planner Tony Baron at the Council meeting Sept. 26. Brookings staff advertised a request for qualifications in August for the variety of projects. The Dyer Partnership, Civil West Engineering and Jacobs all responded and each will be selected to perform work. The Dyer Partnership Engineers and Planners has been the city's engineer for nearly 15 years and has authored several of the city's infrastructure master plans. Dyer has offices in Coos Bay, Lebanon and

Sutherlin. Civil West Engineering has nearly 30 staff and has experience in roadway, stormwater, water and wastewater engineering projects, as well as electrical and mechanical engineers on staff. Jacobs has been providing a variety of engineering services in the Northwest for more than 76 years. They have local experience in water, sewer, stormwater, streets, transportation and environmental engineering. This firm was selected in 2018 and is currently under contract to operate the Brookings water and wastewater

treatment facilities. City Manager Pro Tem Gary Milliman said the city is considering whether to assign a current member of the staff to oversee the variety of projects or to hire a project manager. "This is a very large collection of projects we are going to be doing and it requires an effort to interact with all of the agencies," he said.
