# Planning continues for Azalea Festival

# Event scheduled for May 23-25 in Brookings

For now, the 81st annual Azalea Festival in Brookings is still happening, according to organizer Amber Nalls with the City of Brookings.

The Azalea Festival is scheduled for May 23-25. "Yes it is still on," Nalls said on Friday, May 28.

"We are moving forward."
The festival is the marquee event of the year for Brookings and Harbor and draws thousands of people to the Southern Oregon Coast. The Azalea Festival was awarded the "The Oregon Heritage Tradition"

award.

While planning moves forward, Nalls is fully aware that one positive COVID-19 case in Curry County or if the current "stay-home, save-lives" order from Gov. Brown is not lifted soon enough, the festival will have to be canceled or postponed.

Nalls said May 1 is their hard deadline.

"I feel we can put the festival on if we have a month," she said. Whether to postpone or cancel would be a decision when the times come.

As of March 31, there were zero confirmed CO-VID-19 cases in Brookings

or Curry County. There are 690 confirmed cases in Oregon and 18 deaths related to the virus.

Currently, the transient lodging is banned in Curry County following steps taken by the Curry County Commissioners and councils in Brookings and Gold Beach. Those bans are through May 1 but could be extended.

On March 23, Gov. Brown issued an executive order directing Oregonians to stay home "to the maximum extent possible," except for when carrying out essential tasks like getting groceries, refueling their vehicles, or obtaining health care

"I asked and urged
Oregonians to stay home,"
Brown said in a conference call with reporters,
following a weekend where
Oregonians mobbed the
coast and other areas. "On
Friday night, I frankly
directed them to stay home.
And now I am ordering
them to stay home."

Recreational activity like jogging or hiking is permitted under the order, so long as people can keep 6 feet away from others. Social gatherings of any size are prohibited, though there's a notable exception if a

6-foot buffer is maintained. Restaurants and bars are

still allowed to sell take-out orders, per the governor's order.

Violations of the order can be treated as a class C misdemeanor, punishable by up to 30 days in jail and a \$1,250 fine.

Gov. Brown did not say exactly when the order would end.

Schools in Oregon are closed through at least April 28 and the expectation is they will remain closed for the remainder of the current school year.

The Brookings-Harbor Azalea Festival is a community celebration filled with weekend activities that include the Azalea Festival Parade, City Center Street Fair vendors, Community Church Service, Memorial Day Service, Azalea Park Family Fun Events, Elks Deep Pit BBQ and live music, just to name a few.

The Azalea Festival planning committee has been meeting for months. The Azalea Festival Princesses have been out in the community. Musicians for the concerts are lined up. Vendors have not backed

"I have spoken with a lot of stakeholders and they want to see the festival happen," Nalls said.

Wild Rivers Animal Rescue in Gold Beach has announced the launch of the Catherine Powers Memorial Pet Food Pantry.

"With the large number of people in our community laid off or without a source of reliable income due to the current pandemic, many pets are at risk," said Nicole Farrell, executive director of Wild Rivers Animal Rescue. "Anything that affects people, affects their pets. Things are going to be tight for the next few months, and we aim to help keep pets with their people by offering supplies to those in need. People will go hungry to feed their pets, and we do not want that. We are also wary that there may be an increase in surrenders because

people can no longer afford their pets. We hope to remedy this by offering this service to our community so that we may keep pets with the people who love them."

Wild Rivers Animal Rescue is accepting donations currently of food, litter and other pet supplies; anyone who is out of work or otherwise is welcome to apply for food assistance. Food will be available as long as they have a supply to give.

The rescue hopes to make this project sustainable for years to come but is asking for community support.

The rescue plans to create a veterinary assistance fund for pet owners as well and is expect-

# Fitness in a socially distanced world

awn Van Dort of Studio 1 Fitness is online Monday through Friday at 9 a.m. leading free exercise classes to bring fitness opportunities for those stuck at home while saving her own sanity.

"I'm extremely high energy and can't just sit around," Van Dort said. "I spend a good hour or two coming up with workouts, and it keeps my mind busy."

The classes can be attended on her Facebook page. She's been doing them for a week, and some of the class videos posted on her page have reached 300 views — that's a good kind of viral activity. If you miss class, the workouts can still be accessed on her page when you scroll down. The workouts are challenging for the moderately fit, but Van Dort offers modifications for those who are just starting an exercise program, as well as increasingly difficult moves for those who are in tip-top shape and want to be pushed harder.

"You're allowed to rest. Nobody can see you," she says in one of the videos. "It's your workout."

The planning for each workout involves putting together the exercise routines to cover all the major muscle groups along with providing some aerobic training, plus selecting the music for the workouts. Van Dort goes through each of the routines herself before presenting them to her followers. If you don't have weights or stretchy bands, she suggests alternatives to still do the workout.

The 53-year-old aerobics instructor and personal trainer was previously teaching a dozen classes a week, between pilates and booty camp at the Rush Building in Gold Beach, where she resides, and spin classes at the fitness studio in the basement of her home. When Governor Kate Brown came out with





# Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation mobilizes needed resources during COVID-19 crisis

To address local impacts from the global COVID-19 pandemic, the Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation is rolling out a streamlined process for providing Tribal elders, families and individuals with easy access to Tribal Government programs and services.

Through the Elder Emergency, General Assistance and other programs, the Tolowa Community and Family Services Department is mobilizing resources toward those in need, which is a primary objective of the Nation's CÖVID-19 Emergency Operations Plan.

To enroll in Tribal programs and services, Tribal citizens are encouraged to call 707-487-3183 from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. and from 1 to 5 p.m. between Monday and Thursday. The Community and Family Services Department is administering the following assistance programs: General Assistance, Elder Emergency, Medical Travel and Hospitalization.

Those who have completed the 2020 application for these programs and still need aid are now eligible to request additional support.

The services available to Tribal citizens include:

#### **TANF** and **Child Care Services:**

• New applicants — The application and intake process can be completed over the phone by calling 707-487-3183. A staff member will assist you in completing the application and in gathering the necessary documents. CFS is extending time limits for some documentation and your case worker will make an appointment to finalize the application.

• Current Child Care participants - Please submit your monthly eligibility

report and/or child care billing by mail, e-mail or by dropping it in the locked box at either of the CFS offices.


Child Welfare Services Staff is available to take reports of suspected child, elder and vulnerable adult abuse. Call 707-487-3183 to speak with a staff member. Social workers are also available to assist families. If an emergency occurs at a time when the CFS office is closed, call 9-1-1 and notify the operator of the nature of your emergency.

Substance Abuse Services Intake, assessment and individual counseling services will be continued as scheduled, Monday through Thursday. Group counseling will not be offered except through phone or video as our facilities do not have space for the required social distancing.

Crisis services for victims of domestic violence will remain open 24/7 and can be obtained by calling 707-487-3175. For general questions, call 707-487-

If you are able to, please consider this suggestion. Also, pass this on so others across our great country may do the same.



PacifiCorp's general rate change request, its first since 2013 and filed prior to the COVID-19 outbreak, is undergoing a nearly year-long review and will be fully investigated by the PUC. the Oregon Citizen's Utility Board, the Alliance of Western Energy Consumers, and other intervening parties.

This public comment hearing is part of that investigation, which will conclude by the end of this year when the Commissioners will rule on the request.

PacifiCorp is asking for an overall rate increase of 5.4 percent or \$70.8 million annually. Under the proposed filing, an average residential customer who uses 900 kilo-watt hours per month would see their bill increase by just under \$7 monthly.

PacifiCorp customers and other interested persons may participate in the public comment hearing to provide verbal comments to the Commissioners and the Administrative Law Judge presiding over this rate case

There will not be formal presentations, as the purpose of this webinar is to hear directly from customers.







**Emergency Management** Team is engaged in a multifaceted effort to assist Tribal citizens for the duration of the crisis. The **Emergency Management** Team is also taking preemptive actions to prevent local residents, especially the elderly and other immunosuppressed individuals, from being exposed to the virus once it arrives in the local area, which public health experts believe is an inevitable reality.

Additionally, Tribal representatives will be performing regular checkins with Tribal elders, who will be surveyed to identify their real-time needs. The information collected will be used to tailor actions that will be implemented under the Emergency Operations Plan.

The Nation is creating a mechanism to assess the current needs of younger vulnerable citizens and families, too. Similar to the elder data, this information will be used to optimize the emergency response document.

"The Emergency Plan establishes a strong foundation to maintain the continuity of government operations. We are doing everything possible to address the many facets of this complex emergency and keep our community safe," said Briannon Fraley, the Nation's Chief Governance Officer and Public Information Officer.

In addition to surveying at-risk citizens, the Nation is collecting data on the number of Tribal members who have been laid off as a result of the COVID-19 emergency. If you are out of work because of the pandemic, please contact the Tolowa Employment Rights Office at 707-487-9255 ext. 1165 or by email at zachary.chapman@ tolowa.com.

On Thursday, March 19, the Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation Tribal Council issued a state of emergency declaration to direct Tribal staff and resources toward resolving challenges associated with the public health emergency. All Tribal offices are closed to the public until further notice to protect Tribal staff and citizens. At present, there are no confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the local area.

All residents are asked to adhere to the US Centers for Disease Control's social distancing and transmission prevention recommendations. The Nation has postponed all large social events, including the Annual Tribal Membership Meeting, as a precautionary measure. The yearly event is scheduled for Saturday, April 4 and has been modified to be consistent with social distancing guidelines.

The Tolowa Tribal Youth Activity Reimbursement Program is also temporarily suspended. Those who requested reimbursements between January and March will still be repaid. The program will resume making reimbursements as soon as it is feasible.

Under the leadership of the Tribal Council, the **Emergency Management** Team is working with all available Tribal personnel to anticipate and address any issues that may arise as a consequence of this crisis.

The Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation's Emergency Management Team is providing regular updates to Tribal citizens and the general public via social media, the tolowa-nsn.gov, and a phone service called One Call Now. recommendations to limit groups of 10 or more people, Van Dort shut down classes to protect the health of her clients and herself. Van Dort is in the at-risk group with her Lupus, as are a number of her older clients. Since then, the governor closed fitness studios and gyms altogether until further notice, at the same time sending many people to work from home.

With so many people stuck at home, Van Dort warns people to be cautious about signing up with fake online fitness companies. Many so-called fitness sites use a fitness model, scantily clad, to entice participants, who then end up in a contract.

Van Dort became involved in fitness starting at the age of 7 and was a competitive gymnast up through the college level. She started college as a nursing student but changed direction after the death of one of her children. Battling through depression, she weighed more than 200 pounds when a friend introduced her to step aerobics. The exercise was good for her mentally and physically, taking her weight down to 126 pounds without even trying to lose weight. She switched her major in college and obtained her personal training certification. That was 29 years ago.

"It is the most rewarding career I could ever imagine," she said. "Right now, I'm losing about \$3,000 a month in revenue. But my equipment is paid off, so I'm not impacted except to cut back on expenses."

She spends her profits on more equipment for her fitness studio. She and her husband, Jon, moved to Gold Beach 7 years ago when he retired.

Van Dort sees two benefits to offering her classes to people for free. She plans to keep the online classes coming until the "stay home, stay healthy" recommendations are lifted.

"A lot of people can't attend my regular classes because of the hours they work, or feel too tired after a full workday, so they end up not working out at all," she said. "You will have more energy if you start exercising. Now people get to try the workouts, and they will continue to exercise.

"The second benefit is that people will know that I'm here, and that's great," she said.

It took 3 or 4 years for people to learn about her classes in Gold Beach.

"People get to meet me and learn that I'm fun and not intimidating," she said.

On her web page, studio1fitness. bike, she says, "My job? I kill fat for a living."

ing to launch this service in six months to a year.

Due to the current need for social distancing, the rescue is offering limited drop-off service to homebound seniors and people with conditions that cause them to be unable to pick up food. People looking for drop-off service can contact the rescue at 541-247-2514 to inquire about drop-off opportunities.

"We believe that helping people and their pets in

any way possible is the key to strengthening our community for not only its animals but its residents,' Farrell said. "We hope that this program will honor the legacy of our founder, Catherine Powers and her drive to help Curry County's animals in any

way possible. "The pantry's namesake was a local woman with a huge heart who would take time out of her busy schedule to walk dogs at the local impound facility so that they might have some time in the fresh air," Farrell said. "After doing this for months, she arrived one day to find that the dogs

had all been destroyed.

"Heartbroken but determined, she petitioned county officials for control of the shelter and won. Later, when the county's financial difficulties threatened to close the shelter permanently, Catherine successfully established it as a 501(c) 3 nonprofit. For the next year-and-a-half, she was a fierce advocate for animal welfare, saving and adopting out countless dogs, and laying the groundwork for a new 'cattery wing' at the shelter. It was our great loss when she suddenly died, but our mission and her legacy continues at Wild Rivers






