# BOMB CYCLONE PACKS A PUNCH

#### Staff report

The clean-up from Tuesday's regional windstorm was underway Wednesday morning, as a path of destruction greeted local residents and visitors.

There had been no reports of injuries following what forecasters called a "historic bomb cyclone weather system" that swept across Curry and Del Norte counties, and south into California.

First-responders and utility crews were kept busy will a flurry of service calls, while drivers and pedestrians dodged a number of downed trees, fallen electrical wires, and other storm debris in roadways and along sidewalks.

Brookings police reported no blocked streets by Wednesday morning after city, county and state works crews removed debris. Motorists were warned that some outlying roadways might still be blocked by downed trees.

In Crescent City, Russell Kinikin, the Ace Hardware assistant manager, said that at about 1 p.m. Tuesday one of his lumber buildings lost about 7,000 square feet of roof from a 120,000-square-foot facility.

Kinikin said the wind caused no damage to the main store nor to any merchandise or vehicles. Crescent City Ace Hardware was open for regular business on Wednesday.

Crescent City Manager Eric

Wier said the storm kept emergency responders tied up throughout the day Tuesday and into the night. "The major issue with this storm was not major rain, but major wind creating a lot of unusual scenarios and power outages," Wier said.

Emergency calls put a significant demand on the city's response resources, Wier said. He estimated that

On Nov. 2, volunteers gathered in Azalea Park to string the lights in a "String the Joy" project. "There's so much to do and the public is how it gets done," Dunn said

#### Washing dishes – watching bears

Donna Vail was washing dishes in her Smith River home last Saturday when out the kitchen window she spotted a trio of bears.

She and husband Larry have lived in Del Norte County for 10 years, the last three on the Smith River along South Bank Road. They've seen plenty of wildlife, from elk to eagles.

But no bears.

So Donna Vail ran to get her 300mm Nikon camera, then snapped some quick shots of the three bears.

"It was early morning, about 9 a.m. The bears are usually out at night when we're sleeping. We don't normally see them in the daytime," Vail said.

"I captured this big papa standing there. I like to think the other two were mama and

baby. It's fun to think of them as a family."

Vail said her neighbors regularly talk of bears amongst the trees, getting into trash cans. One of her neighbors down South Bank Road even set up a nightvision camera to keep an eye

on the four-legged visitors.

Peter Tira, a California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) public information officer, said black bears actually are quite active this

time of year. "You've got to keep in mind that bears have a great sense of smell. They are always looking for food before they hibernate for the

winter," Tira said.

"They do slow down and are far less active, but right now, they're out fattening up on the landscape. So, you really need to be vigilant if you live in bear country."

Tira said black bears are very common in the northwest corner of California, adding that the population is growing statewide. According to the CDFW, California's black bear population has increased over the past 25 years.

In 1982, the statewide bear population was estimated at 10,000 to 15,000. The California black bear population today is conservatively estimated at 30,000 to 40,000.

#### Science foundation funds coastal flooding research

An Oregon State University anthropologist has been awarded \$750,000 by the National Science Foundation to research issues facing coastal communities exposed to repetitive flooding, and the

effectiveness of federal disas-

ter response policies.

Said Elizabeth Marino, an assistant professor in the OSU College of Liberal Arts: "Communities are facing relocation, yet current disaster-response relocation policies favor solutions that focus on nuclear families and

individual households. "These policies and solutions ignore the distinct needs of tight-knit and interdependent indigenous communities, such as those in rural Alaska, or other communities with a strong sense of social cohesion."

Marino will lead a threeyear study to investigate options for communities and individuals in Alaska and throughout the U.S. that face repetitive flooding. The work will also examine how communities have used relocation as an adaptation

to increasing risks from frequent natural disasters.

Over the past five years, disaster costs nationally have doubled, largely due to severe storms and flooding. Rising coastal waters are especially challenging for the 31 Native American communities in Alaska that depend on the ocean as an economic and cultural resource.

As a result of rising sea levels, these communities face the increasing possibility that they must relocate

to protect themselves from inundation, Marino said. Twelve of these communities have requested relocation assistance from the federal government, but Marino said have not yet been relocated.

Across the U.S., repetitive

flooding of private properties makes up 2% of claims made through the National Flood Insurance Program. Yet such flooding comprises more than 25% of the total claims made.

Marino said she hopes

that by mapping political and economic costs, and incorporating historical examples and policy analysis, her team will find solutions that can be applied both in Alaska and to communities throughout the country that face flooding.

According to the CDFW's website, the North Coast/Cascade black bear subpopulation occurs north and west of the Sierra evada Mountains. About half of the statewide black bear population resides in this portion of the state.

Studies indicate that densities range from 1.0 to 2.5 bears per square mile, according to the

Tira said the state of California does not have grizzly bears, only black bears. However, the black bear comes in several shades of fur, including black, blonde, brown and cinnamon.

"Black bears are active this time of year. You

see them all over the state. They get killed on the highways. So, you need to be 'bear aware,"

"In another month or so, they will disappear. They'll have made dens -hopefully, not under your house or cabin.'

The trick to keeping bears away from home is to keep them wild, Tira said.

And the CDFW offers general guidelines to help keep you safe in the event of a black bear encounter.

- If a bear breaks into your home, do not confront it. Most bears will quickly look for an escape route. Move away to a safe place. Do not block exit points. If the bear does not leave, get to a safe place and call 911.
- If you encounter a bear in your yard, chances are it will move on if there is nothing

for the bear to forage. If there is enough distance between you and the bear, you can encourage the bear to leave by using noisemakers or blowing a whistle.

- Do not toss food scraps out into the yard.
- Purchase and properly use a bear-proof garbage container. Wait to put trash out until the morning of collection day.
- Do not leave trash, groceries or pet food in

• Keep garbage cans clean; deodorize them with bleach or ammonia. Keep barbecue grills clean and stored in a garage or shed when not in use.

• It's better not to not hang bird feeders in bear country. If you must, do so only during November through March, and make them inaccessible to bears ... which are excellent climbers.

If a bear causes damage to your home or property, contact the North Region Department of Fish and Wildlife Regional Office at 530-225-2300. CDFW will provide strategies to make your property less attractive to bears, explain the depredation permit process, and may conduct a site inspection.

more than 40 911 calls were received from noon-9 p.m. Tuesday.

Wier said the 60-mph winds hitting Crescent City, combined with king tides, created a storm surge considerably larger than normal. As a result, he said, portions of Howe Drive and the B Street Pier were closed.

In addition, Wier said, the wind caused one trailer tent at the Shoreline RV park to flip and tore off a portion of the roof at Ace Hardware, 840 East Washington Blvd.

"Also, at the Shoreline RV park we asked campers to move back from the beachfront sites due to the high tides. We made sure

he said.

As for utilities, Wier said many of the 21 lift stations in the city and adjacent areas, which operate the sewers, don't have generators attached. So throughout the night, crews took generators to these sites to maintain operations.

He said the storm also caused issues with communications involving the city's water systems. "But there were no outages with water and sewer systems. They ran without loss of service throughout the night. We have a lot of tired crews this morning," Wier said.

He added that non-essential city staff were sent home midday because of energy brownouts, which can cause substantial damage to the municipal computer systems.

"Hats off to Pacific Power as well," said Wier. "Multi-

reports of damaged transmission mains outside town, so we expected a lot longer outages, to at least 1 or 2 a.m. But Pacific Power evaluated the situation and had power back on around 11 p.m.

"That was not expected. It was a welcome site, especially since colder temperatures are expected. With a sustained power outage, the drain on our resources would have been substantial," Wier

California Highway Patrol public information officer Brandy Gonzalas said CHP deputies responded to calls to help clear debris, plus reports of downed power lines. At one point, she said, residents lost cell service along U.S. Highway 199.

Gonzalas said there were no major injuries or fatalities reported.

Pacific Power crews worked throughout the night repairing storm-damaged equipment in northern California and southern Oregon, to restore power to customers affected by a powerful Pacific storm with high winds and heavy mountain

According to the utility, the number of customers affected had been reduced from about 19,000 at the peak of the storm to some 1,700 by 10 a.m. Wednesday. Pacific Power brought in additional crews to continue restoration efforts Wednesday morning.

Jacob Knudsen, marketing and member services manager at Coos-Curry Electric Co-Op, said approximately 3,500 members had power interrupted for more than a few minutes due to the storm. The utility estimated that the majority of outages would be resolved by Wednesday afternoon.

Knudsen said those outages were caused by branches, trees and debris being blown into the power lines. "We sustained only minor infrastructure damage, with just three poles being broken," he said.

"Our power grid proved to be very resilient. We weathered a significant weather event with only minor dam-









executive director of the Oregon State Sheriff's Association, was found guilty Nov. 22 of stealing from the sheriff's association, according to The Oregonian in

Portland.

Bishop was convicted of felony first-degree theft for stealing from the nonprofit lobbying organization that represents the 36 elected sheriffs in Oregon.

He has been ordered to pay \$13,000 in restitution to the association, and was sentenced to two years of probation and 189 hours of community service.

As part of a plea deal, his Department of Public Safety Standards and Training certification was revoked.

The charges arose from "inappropriate expenditures" by the 57-year-old Bishop

that surfaced during a review of financial records. Some of those questionable expenditures included Bluetooth headphones, Apple AirPods, a wireless gaming headset for an Xbox, lunch purchases, items with missing receipts, whited-out receipts, and web-based football playbook software, according to the Department of Justice investigation, as reported in The Oregonian.

Bishop retired in 2014 as Curry County's sheriff, where he had served since 2008, to run for the sheriff's association position.





#### Wife can't forgive herself for her own costly error

**DEAR ABBY** 

DEAR ABBY: I am a woman in my 50s who has been the family "screw-up" since I was a teenager. Eighteen months ago, I screwed up in the worst way possible. Without my husband's knowledge, I started robbing Peter to pay Paul with the bills. The end result: I lost us everything (home, vehicle, etc.).

He is a good man, and he deserved so much better than what I put him through. He has said he forgives me for everything, but my problem is that I can't forgive myself.

We are divorcing now, and I'm struggling to live my life without the man I love (and who still loves me). The divorce was pushed-for right after we lost everything. His adult son paid for it, so he hasn't dropped it. He says he doesn't want to make waves because he's living in his son's guest room. I had to move back in with my dad several states

We talk daily, but I am still incredibly depressed. I have found a job near where I live now, but I have no medical benefits, so therapy is out of the question (and so is everything else I need to take care of my

health). I have worked with mental health patients my whole adult life, so I recognize the symptoms (I have to force myself to perform personal hygiene, I sleep whenever I'm not at work, etc.).

Abby, I don't know what to do anymore. There are days when I don't know why I bother continuing on. I feel like I don't deserve to live after what I did to my husband. There is no way I will ever be able to give him back everything I caused him to lose, and that knowledge haunts me every minute of every day. How does someone learn to forgive themselves? --

#### FOREVER THE **SCREW-UP**

**DEAR FOREVER:** There are options available for individuals who have little or no money and need help with their mental health. I researched what might be available in your community and found there is a university with a department of psychological services. Contact it and inquire if someone in that department might be able to help you. There is also the option of the County Department of Mental Health.

Once you are stable again, you can begin to work on forgiving yourself. The problem

with being labeled a "screwup" as a teenager is that once the idea is embedded, it can become a self-fulfilling prophecy. Start there.

**DEAR ABBY:** I have a grocery store etiquette question. I become really offended when I'm unloading my groceries onto the conveyor belt at checkout and -- before I'm finished -- another shopper comes up behind me and begins unloading hers. It leaves me not enough room to finish unloading mine! I think it's rude, and it baffles me that so many people do it. Is it impolite to tell them they are being rude? Or is it dangerous these days? -- GOING AS FAST AS I ČAN

**DEAR GOING**: It wouldn't be impolite or dangerous to tell the person behind you that you haven't finished unloading your purchases and to please stop. I do, however, think you should suppress the urge to lecture the person about manners unless you're looking for an argument.

If this happens often, talk to the store manager about it. In some businesses there is a mark on the floor indicating where shoppers should stand while waiting for the person ahead to complete his or her purchase.

#### New hiking book by local author

Tim Palmer is excited to share his latest book, "America's Great Mountain Trails: 100 Highcountry Hikes of a Lifetime."

The local author has written 28 other books since 1980 about the environment, outdoors and adventure travel. They range from pocket guides to hardbound coffee table books, and cover rafting, kayaking, canoeing, hiking, forests, mountains and rivers.

His latest book is a hardbound, 320-page coffee table volume, lavishly illustrated with 220 color photos taken by Palmer. The book is described by Amazon as a "hiker's inspirational bucket

list."

"The idea was to cover ranges," Palmer said. "There are 11 principle mountain ranges. Mountains and foothills cover 40% of the country.

"I picked 100 trails throughout, with an interest in covering the whole geography and having variety, like short trips and long trips, easy ones and hard ones, focusing on scenery and really notable, memorable experiences."

The book starts with an overview of why mountains are important, plus advice for how to plan for a trip. The 100 trails are divided into regions that include New England, the Central and Southern Appalachians, Rocky Mountains, Desert and Dryland ranges, Sierra Nevada, Cascade Mountains, the Coast Range, the Klamath and Siskiyou ranges, Olympic Mountains, Alaska Ranges and Tropical Islands (Puerto Rico and Hawaii).

Readers in this region don't need to travel far beyond their own backyards to find what Palmer has deemed some of America's "Great Mountain Trails." But perhaps it takes someone else describing places already familiar to realize how special they are.

For readers in Crescent City, Prairie Creek Redwoods to the south of Klamath is described as having "one of the best trails anywhere through groves of redwoods topping 300 feet. A gentle climb over the westernmost Coast Range topography leads to an Edenic canyon bedecked in ferns, favorite pastures of elk and campsites just a stroll from Pacific whitecaps.'

For both Crescent City and southern Oregon, two trails in the Kalmiopsis Wilderness make Palmer's top 100 hikes. He describes one of the hikes outside of Cave Junction as "a harsh range of rocky ridgelines, forbidding canyons, and outcrops of colorfully mixed minerals metamorphosed from rock formed undersea and then pushed up by powerful tectonic forces." Palmer does advise, "But let's be clear: this place is not for everyone.

Further north, more local landmarks and trails are in Palmer's top 100 hikes - the Lower Rogue River Trail, located between Agness and Merlin, is described as "the best footpath that transects the apex of the Klamath-Siskiyou Mountains, and for that matter, the entire Coast Range." And Humbug

Mountain, between Gold Beach and Port Orford, as "the tallest summit rising directly from the ocean on the Oregon Coast."

Palmer grew up in the Appalachian foothills of Pennsylvania. "I ran wild in the woods as a little kid and developed this inseparable attachment to the natural world at a young age," he said. As he grew older, he began exploring further afield, and started backpacking in high school, taking every trail he could find. During his freshman year in college, he applied for a laborer's position with the park service and got a job at Crater Lake National Park.

'I hitchhiked out here, and hitchhiked every weekend while I was here, exploring the Northwest, including Mt. Hood, and came down here to the coast. Then, the next summer I got a job with the forest service as a seasonal landscape architect in Idaho, in the Sawtooth National Forest.

"It's been like that ever since."

After receiving a bachelor of science degree in landscape architecture from Pennsylvania State University, Palmer worked for eight years as a planner on land use and environmental topics from 1971-1980. He started to write full-time in 1980.

After spending 22 years living as a nomad in his van, he and his wife now live in Port Orford.

Palmer has no formal training in photography or writing, but that hasn't stopped him from winning numerous awards for his books, including two National Outdoor Book Awards, Oregon Book Award Finalist, Benjamin Franklin Book Award, and an Indie Silver Award for best Adventure Book.

He has been featured as a public speaker at hundreds of state, national and provincial conferences, conservation gatherings, and at colleges and universities nationwide.

Palmer will share his photos and talk about his newest book at two local events in December. He'll speak at 6 p.m. Dec. 4 at Chetco Community Public Library in Brookings, 405 Alder St.

He'll appear at 5:30 p.m. Dec. 12 at Curry County Public Library in Gold Beach, 94341 3rd St. Both events are free.

#### Trail work ongoing at Natural Bridges viewpoint

The observation deck and trail at Natural Bridges viewpoint north of Brookings are undergoing a makeover.

The platform and a short section of the Oregon Coast Trail are closed, from the parking lot south to milepost 346.1, while the construction work is being done.

The trail and platform is expected to reopen the first week of December.

The short trail takes visitors to a vantage point where they can see the "seven iconic arch rocks and blowholes known as Natural Bridges," according to the Oregon State Parks website.

"It is one of the nicest

views I've seen on the Oregon Coast Trail," said Dani Padilla, park manager for the Harris Beach State Park management unit.

The estimated \$80,000 project will add gravel to the path, stabilize footings for the platform, and replace decking, which has deteriorated due to rot, on the structure that was originally built in the early 1980s, Padilla said.

"The new platform will be 5 feet wider to make it more accessible," she said. "This allows people with mobility issues to see more."

Last year, viewshed work was done to provide a better

The location of the trail work is near where 28-yearold Callie Ellwood needed

to be rescued from a cliff by search and rescue on Sept. 20 after she left the trail to try to reach the beach.

Padilla emphasized that while the Oregon Coast Trail travels through the platform, no trail goes down to the Natural Bridges. "Pioneer' trails and deer trails are often mistaken for official trails, she said.

Oregon Parks plans to put more signage showing Oregon Coast Trail locations with a kiosk at that location, she said. Because of social media, more visitors are accessing the scenic wonders of the southern Oregon coast, which is causing a rise in mishaps.

Natural Bridges is about 11 miles north of Brookings on U.S. Highway 101.






