Beyond her governmental experience, Padilla is the founder of Padilla Consulting/Problem Solving Doctors, a firm that has supported thirteen United States federal agencies and numerous tribal and local governments. She is also a certified project manager with credentials in data science, economic development and municipal software. Her professional affiliations include the International City/County Management Association and the Arizona City/County Management Association as well as memberships in national organizations such as the American Association of Municipal Executives and Women Leading Government.

Padilla has also been actively involved in professional development and engagement, having previously served on the board of the Arizona Chapter of Women Leading Government and presented on topics ranging from finance to Artificial Intelligence (AI) with other public administration organizations.

"I am both honored and excited to join the City of Gold Beach at such a pivotal time," she stated. "I look forward to working with the mayor, city council, staff, and community to support thoughtful growth, strong public services and a culture of transparency, respect, efficiency and results."

Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation Hosted Awareness Walk for Missing and Murdered Indigenous People

High Rates of Violence Plague Native American and Alaska Native Communities

The Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation stood in solidarity with Missing and Murdered Indigenous People (MMIP) during their 3rd annual MMIP Awareness Walk.

The walk aimed to shed light on the thousands of Indigenous individuals who go missing or are tragically murdered each

Staff from the Nation's Community and Family Wellness Victim Services Division were on-site offering sign-making and face-painting stations for participants of the walk.

Participants walked a route spanning several blocks along L and M streets, starting and concluding at the Del Norte County Fairgrounds. In past years, community members have shown their support by honking car horns and waving to the walkers.

The Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation hopes this year's walk will bring greater awareness to the individuals who have gone missing within their service area, which includes Del Norte and Curry counties, particularly the Smith River region as well as the broader nationwide crisis of

rates of assault, abduction, and murder, a crisis that community advocates attribute to the enduring legacy of historical government policies. Forced removals, land seizures and violence inflict-

ed upon Native peoples are cited

A stark 2016 study by the National Institute of Justice (NIJ) revealed the staggering prevalence of violence against American Indian and Alaska Native women. The study found

that more than four in five (84.3 percent) have experienced violence in their lifetime, with 56.1 percent having endured

Legislation introduced to permanently protect the Pacific, Atlantic Oceans from offshore drilling

U.S. Senators Ron Wyden and Jeff Merkley are co-sponsoring two bills that would permanently protect the Pacific and Atlantic oceans from the environmental and economic costs of fossil fuel drilling off our coastal shores.

Merkley also led a bill to prohibit drilling in the Arctic, which Wyden also co-sponsored.

"The U.S. simply does not need to drill in the coastal waters of the Pacific. We have more than enough clean energy resources without putting Oregon's outdoor recreation and seafood industries at risk," Wyden said. "These bills are all about looking out for small businesses that depend on

tourism and the fishing industry, rather than capitulating to the 'oiligarchs' whose only goal is to fatten their wallets, no matter the environmental and economic toil it could bring to our shores."

"Offshore drilling guarantees future oil spills with devastating consequences: from oiled beaches to catastrophic damage to tourism, commercial sport fishing, and ocean ecosystems," Merkley said. "Trump's Dirty Energy First strategy would see his administration expand offshore drilling—all to enrich billionaire corporate polluters—but Senator Wyden and I are leading the charge to protect the Oregon Coast and beyond

From page 1 sexual violence. In the year preceding the study, 39.8 percent of these women experienced violence, including 14.4 percent who were victims of sexual violence. Overall, more than 1.5 million American Indian and Alaska Native women have experienced violence in their lives.

Data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) further underscores the severity of the situation. Their National Intimate Partner and Sexual Violence Survey indicated that non-Hispanic American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/ AN) females experienced the second-highest rate of homicide in 2020. That same year, homicide was among the top ten leading causes of death for AI/AN females aged one to forty-five; furthermore, more than two in five (43.7%)non-Hispanic AI/AN women reported being raped in their lifetime.

The crisis extends to men as well. Non-Hispanic AI/AN males also had the second-highest rate of ho-

micide compared to males in all other racial and ethnic groups in 2020. Homicide was a leading cause of death for AI/AN males aged one to fifty-four in the same year. The issue is further

compounded by the complexities surrounding missing persons' cases. According to the National Crime Information Center, there were 5,712 reports of missing American Indian and Alaska Native women and girls in 2016; however, the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs), the federal database for such cases, logged only one hundred sixteen of these reports. This significant discrepancy highlights the challenges in accurately tracking

and addressing these cases. While research indicates that rates of violence on reservations can be up to ten times higher than national averages, a critical gap in data exists regarding violence against American Indian and Alaska Native women living in urban areas, where approximately seventy-one percent of this population resides.

The Urban Indian Health

Institute notes the lack of research in this area.

Adding to the difficulties, reports suggest an unreliable count of missing and murdered Native women due to misclassification on missing-person forms. Researchers have found instances where women are incorrectly categorized as Hispanic or Asian, leading to their exclusion from federal missing-persons databases.

The Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) estimates that there are approximately 4,200 unsolved missing and murdered cases involving American Indian and Alaska Natives. Statistics show that approximately 1.500 American Indian and Alaska Native missing persons have been entered into the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) nationwide, and around 2,700 cases of Murder and Nonnegligent Homicide Offenses have been reported to the Federal Government's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)

resources needed to pursue leads, re-examine evidence and review suspect activities.

A 2017 Government Ac-

countability Office (GAO) report on human trafficking in Indian Country further revealed challenges. Only twenty-seven of one hundred thirty-two responding tribal law enforcement agencies reported initiating human trafficking investigations between 2014 and 2016, and just six of sixty-one major city law enforcement agencies reported such investigations involving at least one Native victim during the same period. The report identified a lack of training, victim reluctance to come forward, and limited-service provider resources as significant barriers.

The ongoing crisis underscores the urgent need for focused data collection, increased investigative resources, and culturally sensitive support services to address the high rates of violence impacting Native American and Alaska Native communities across the United States.

Curry County to Host Cybersecurity Summit Amid Rising Infrastructure Threats

Curry County is taking proactive steps to combat the growing threat of cyber attacks targeting critical infrastructure with its inaugural Cybersecurity Summit, scheduled for May 13th through 15th. The event will convene local government leaders, representatives from special districts and cybersecurity experts to address the escalating dangers facing essential

Recognizing that entities like water districts, fire departments, healthcare providers, educational institutions and ports are increasingly becoming prime targets for cyber criminals, the summit aims to arm local leaders with the crucial knowledge and tools necessary to fortify their defenses

Phil Dickson, the lead organizer of the summit, emphasized the urgency of the situation. "The persistent threat to our local government by state-sponsored attackers has made it clear that no district is immune," he stated. "This event is about empowering our leaders with the tools to defend against these threats and ensure the safety of the services our communities rely on."

The three-day summit will feature presentations from representatives of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), who will share insights into pressing cybersecurity challenges and offer practical solutions.

Attendees can expect to delve into sector-specific threat discussions by examining real-world examples of cyber threats that have impacted vital sectors, including water utilities, firefighting equipment, healthcare systems and educational institutions. Discussions will cover a range of risks, from ransomware attacks to equipment malfunctions.

There will be expert presentations that will cover essential cybersecurity topics such as access control, multi-factor authentication, network security, data backup and recovery strategies and incident response planning.

Also included is hands-on training that will equip participants with actionable strategies to identify phishing attempts, implement robust password policies and monitor for suspicious network activity.

"Cybersecurity is no longer a distant concern. It is a pressing issue that impacts every aspect of community life," Dickson said. "Recent high-profile attacks, such as those on the American Water Utility, Seattle Public Library and public K-12 schools, highlight the vulnerabilities even small, rural districts face."

The summit underscores the critical importance of cybersecurity, which involves safeguarding computer systems, networks, programs and data from unauthorized access, damage, or theft.

A robust cybersecurity posture relies on a layered approach encompassing technology, processes and skilled personnel to protect the confidentiality, integrity and availability of vital information and

ensure the continuity of essential services.

Dickson further emphasized the inclusive nature of the threat stating, "Cyber threats are not just a matter for urban areas, they affect all of us from large utilities to local fire districts. By coming together, we can build a stronger more resilient future."

The Cybersecurity Summit will be held at the Event Center on the Beach in Gold Beach and will extend its reach beyond Curry County, welcoming leaders from neighboring Coos, Lane, Jackson, Josephine and Del Norte Counties. The event will provide valuable opportunities for networking, sharing best practices and developing collaborative solutions among peers and experts.

While noting that all candidates were well-qualified, the commissioners agreed that Coker stood out due to his diverse experience and strong leadership vision.

Lynn Coker was appointed to fulfill the Commissioner Vacancy with a term to begin on May 2, 2025.

from dangerous offshore oil and gas drilling.'

The West Coast Protection Act would permanently prohibit new oil and gas leases for drilling off the coast of California, Oregon, and Washington.

The Clean Ocean and Safe Tourism (COAST) Anti-Drilling Act would permanently prohibit the U.S. Department of the Interior from issuing leases for the exploration, development, or production of oil and gas in the North Atlantic, Mid-Atlantic, South Atlantic, and Straits of Florida Planning Areas of the U.S. Outer Continental Shelf.

The Stop Arctic Ocean Drilling Act, led by Merkley, would permanently ban new or renewed leases for oil, gas, or mineral extraction in the Arctic Ocean Planning Areas of the Outer Continental Shelf, protecting one of the planet's most fragile ecosystems.

This legislation comes following the 15th anniversary of the Deepwater Horizon oil spill, which resulted in the deaths of 11 workers, 134 million gallons spilled into the Gulf of Mexico over 87 days, the demise of thousands of marine mammals and sea turtles, and billions of dollars in economic losses from the fishing, outdoor recreation, and tourism industries.

The Pacific west coast economy provides over \$80 Billion in GDP via industries like tourism, outdoor recreation, fishing, retail, and real estate, supporting more than 825,000 jobs. And BAPPC's 8,100 business members rely on a clean ocean to drive their revenues and provide for their customers, employees and families, according to Grant Bixby, a founding member of The Business Alliance for Protecting the Pacific Coast.

"We strongly support the West Coast Protection

Act and other legislation to prohibit new offshore drilling and protect our businesses by prioritizing a healthy coastal ecosystem," Bixby said.

In addition to Wyden and Merkley, the West Coast Protection Act is cosponsored by Senators Cory Booker (D-N.J.), Maria Cantwell (D-Wash.), Edward J. Markey (D-Mass.), Patty Murray

(D-Wash.), Bernie Sanders (I-Vt.), Adam Schiff (D-Calif.), and Sheldon Whitehouse (D-R.I.) and led by Senator Alex Padilla (D-Calif.).

The COAST Anti-Drilling Act, led by Senators Cory Booker (D-NJ) and Jack Reed (D-R.I.), is co-sponsored by Wyden and Merkley, along with Senators Richard Blumenthal

(D-Conn.), Chris Coons (D-Del.), Angus King (I-Maine), Markey, Sanders, Jeanne Shaheen (D-N.H.), Chris Van Hollen (D-Md.), Elizabeth Warren (D-Mass.), and Whitehouse.

Merkley's Stop Arctic Ocean Drilling Act was co-sponsored by Markey, Blumenthal, Sanders, and Warren, in addition to Wyden.



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CITIZENS' LAW ENFORCEMENT LEVY RETURN SAFETY TO CURRY COUNTY VOTE YES ON 8-117

THE PURPOSE OF THIS LEVY IS TWO-FOLD. Provide funding to recover positions for five Sheriff's Patrol Deputies, two Dispatchers, and one Sergeant, and replace funding currently paid for by general and road funds for portions of five Sheriff's Office divisions.

DURING THE LAST BUDGET CUTS, funding for the Sheriff's Office was greatly reduced. Three or fewer patrol deputies now patrol county roads. Curry County is 1,988 square miles and about one hundred miles north to south.

HOW CAN THE SHERIFF RETAIN CURRENT EMPLOYEES AND HIRE NEW **ONES** if he can't depend upon a known annual budget to support his deputies, dispatchers, and personnel? He can't. The Levy will provide a known amount of funding for five years, regardless of who is sitting in the commissioners' seats.

THE CITIZENS' LAW ENFORCEMENT LEVY is \$1.12 per thousand of assessed property value. Without county law enforcement, 911 call response times will increase and crime in the county will migrate into the cities.

YOU DECIDE. Either you do not want law enforcement in Curry County, or you do and you're willing to pay for it. There is no option for bringing safety back to Curry County at no cost to you. This Levy provides a known cost for a known amount of time. It is half of what the commissioners' levy was last year. If funding is recovered through another source during the five years, the Levy can be stopped. There is currently no viable alternative funding plan provided to Curry County citizens that will provide the benefits of this Levy for all.



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BLM issues nearly \$28M to

Western Oregon Counties from timber revenue

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has distributed more than \$27.7 million in timber revenue payments to 18 western Oregon counties.

The payments are supported by the timber harvested from public lands and support local services, including emergency response and education, according to a release from the BLM.

"The BLM is working to protect our national and economic security, as directed in President Trump's order, by immediately expanding American timber production," BLM Oregon/Washington State Director Barry Bushue said. "We manage more than 2.4 million acres of some of the world's most productive forests in western Oregon, and are committed to supplying a reliable, secure, and resilient domestic supply of timber, while providing jobs and other support to local communities through timber production."

The BLM manages this area, referred to as O&C and CBWR lands, as well as the funds generated from timber harvests in accordance with two laws. The Oregon and California Railroad and Coos Bay Wagon Road Grant Lands Grant Act of 1937 directs revenue from O&C Lands is shared between the U.S. Treasury and 18 western Oregon counties. The Coos Bay Wagon Road Act of 1939 directs revenue from CBWR Lands be paid in-lieu of tax payments to Coos and Douglas counties.


The timber harvesting funding provides local communities with the means to construct new county buildings; develop fairgrounds and museums; support libraries, schools, and jails; and build flood-control dams and reservoirs, according to the BLM.

Beyond these direct payments to counties, the BLM timber program supports approximately 2,000 local jobs and generates more than \$1 billion for local economies.

"BLM forestry and timber production supports economic security, reduces risks from wildfire, improves fish and wildlife habitat, and decreases the cost of energy production. Local communities rely on jobs that come from BLM-managed forests, and timber from public land feeds local industry," according to the release.
