


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EARLY NUMBERS SHOW TIGHT GUBERNATORIAL RACE, YOUNGKIN'S JOB RATING REMAINS HIGH & STEADY


While Republican Donald Trump failed to break his party's presidential losing streak in Virginia, the race for governor this November appears to be more competitive in its early stages. Perhaps this is due to Governor Glenn Youngkin's continued high approval rating for his handling of the job.

In the governor's race itself, Republican Lieutenant Governor Winsome Earle-Sears is running a tight race against both potential Democratic nominees. Sears runs slightly behind former U.S. Representative Abigail Spanberger (trailing 47%-44%) and slightly ahead of incumbent U.S. Representative Bobby Scott (leading 46%-44%)





Meanwhile, in the aftermath of a fierce presidential campaign, Youngkin's job rating has not budged an inch over the past year. Statewide, 58% approve of Youngkin's performance as governor, 37% oppose and 5% are not sure.



These numbers are identical to our poll taken almost exactly one year ago.

HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED

This poll was conducted by Mason-Dixon Polling & Strategy, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida from December 15 through December 19, 2023. A total of 625 registered Virginia voters statewide were interviewed live by telephone.

Those interviewed were randomly selected from a phone-matched Virginia voter registration list that included both landline and cell phone numbers. Quotas were assigned to reflect voter registration by county.

The margin for error, according to standards customarily used by statisticians, is no more than \pm 4 percentage points. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that the "true" figure would fall within that range if all voters were surveyed. The margin for error is higher for any subgroup, such as a gender or age grouping
