





Four-down territory

- **1. Him again:** Auburn is quite familiar with Vanderbilt quarterback Diego Pavia. He played for New Mexico State last season and helped the Aggies to a 31-10 upset win against Auburn. He's with Vanderbilt now and has the Commodores playing competitively, including a close game against No. 5 Texas. He leads the team in rushing (537) and passing (1,534). "I'm sick of seeing that quarterback. I've had enough of him," Auburn coach Hugh Freeze said. This will be the third time Freeze has faced a Pavia-led team. Freeze was Liberty's head coach in 2022 in a 49-14 loss to New Mexico State.
- **2. That's more like it:** Jarquez Hunter's career-high 278 rushing yards against Kentucky was a welcome sight for an Auburn offense in need of a spark. It also catapulted Hunter to the top spot in the SEC for rushing (863). It was the most rushing yards by an Auburn player since Tre Mason (304) in the 2013 SEC championship game. Now the question is, will Hunter continue to be fed the ball? His 23 carries last week was the most this season. He's had 15 carries or less four times in eight games. The two times he's had 20 or more carries, Hunter eclipsed 100 vards.
- **3. Back home:** After an entire month on the road, Auburn returns to Jordan-Hare Stadium. Auburn went 1-2 in the three-game stretch in October. Homefield advantage hasn't been spectacular for Auburn, though. The Tigers opened the season with five home games and went 2-3. Vanderbilt isn't exactly a welcome sight, either. The Commodores are playing their best football in a long time. Vandy has three seasons with nine wins, the last in 2013. Before that? 1915.
- **4. Turning the corner:** Auburn could easily be sitting at 6-2 if not for some fourth-quarter blunders. Maybe even 7-1. That's why there was a sense of relief after the Tigers got their first SEC win of the season last week. "I told them at halftime it's time to experience what it's like to find a way to win," Freeze said. "That's where the joy came from."

Payton Thorne, OB

Yes, Thorne hasn't been the most consistent player for Auburn this season, but he will be important against Vandy. The defense will surely key on Jarquez Hunter after his nearly 300-yard day last week. That leaves it up to Thorne to deliver.

WR KeAndre Lambert-Smith vs. Vanderbilt WR Eli Stowers

Lambert-Smith's 579 yards leads all

Tiger receivers and so does his 30 receptions and seven TDs. He's no doubt the second-most valuable player on the offense behind Hunter. Stowers has 496 vards is the top target for Vandy. He has three games of 100-plus yards, including 130 last week.

Big-star alumni boost unbeaten Hurricanes

CORAL GABLES, Fla. – The Miami sideline was loaded with talent this past weekend. Michael Irvin was there, just like he's been all season no matter where the game is. Ray Lewis did his trademark dance. Edgerrin James, Jessie Armstead, Bryant McKinnie, Rohan Marley, Bernie Kosar and Clinton Portis all showed up as well.

Today's Hurricanes clearly have the attention of the program's best from yesteryear.

When the big names show up at Miami games, it tends to be a pretty good indicator of what's happening on the field. Getting the alumni – particularly the Miami greats - more involved was a priority for Hurricanes coach Mario Cristobal when he came home in 2021, and he's seeing the payoff.

"Some of those guys look like they can still play, and probably can," said Cristobal, a Miami alum and national champion as a player himself. "Look at the old games, back in the '80s and '90s, look at that sideline and how littered it was with real-deal dudes. Like, into it, passionate, love Miami, bleed orange and green, dudes and how much of an attraction it was. I used to kill to get over here to watch these guys go at it."

Some are expected back on the sideline this weekend, when No. 5 Miami (8-0, 4-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) plays host to Duke (6-2, 2-2) and former Hurricanes coach Manny Diaz on Saturday.

There were well over 100 recruits at this past weekend's 36-14 win over rival Florida State, and they all got to see the big names from the past. Time will tell if it left an impact on their upcoming decisions.

But for the current players, having the alumni back is a big deal as well.

"I always talk to those guys, and those guys are all saying they wish they could be in our shoes on the team that we have," wide receiver Xavier Restrepo said. "So, that really means a lot, coming from those guys who have done so much us."

in the game of football. I have unlimited respect for those guys and any time I can get a word with those guys, it's just amazing and I really pay attention."

If there's a sideline alumni MVP this season, Irvin would seem to be the frontrunner by a wide margin.

He's been in huddles on the sideline, yelling his head off in some cases. Irvin went viral for getting on his hands and knees during Miami's wild 25-point comeback to beat Cal 39-38.

And when Miami held on to beat Virginia Tech 38-34 - a game where the Hurricanes prevailed when a Hail Mary touchdown by the Hokies was overturned by replay of the game's final play - Irvin was absolutely drenched in sweat on the sideline, the white shirt that he wore emblazoned with Miami's famed orange and green "U" logo stuck to his skin.

"I've never worked so hard in all of my life for a victory, even when I was playing football," Irvin said in a video he posted the night. "Every guy in that locker room came to me and said, 'Michael, way to bring that energy. Way to pull it out of

Four-down territory

- 1. Dark mode: The Volunteers will wear their dark-mode uniforms at Neyland Stadium. The team announced the uniform decision via a commercial, which resembled the movie "Venom," which had receiver Dont'e Thornton transition from the tradition Vols uniform into all-black digs with orange lettering and numbers. Tennessee first broke out the dark-mode uniforms in 2021 against South Carolina. The Vols won that game 45-20. Tennessee first wore black jerseys (with orange pants) in 2009. Tennessee is 4-1 when wearing black jerseys.
- 2. Be prepared: Tennessee might see two quarterbacks on Saturday. Brock Vandagriff has been Kentucky's starter all season, but Gavin Wimsatt got into the action last week against Auburn. That doesn't mean the Wildcats will use a two-QB system against Tennessee, but Kentucky needs something to change after three straight losses. It didn't help much against Auburn as the Wildcats had just 224 yards of offense, including 154 passing yards.
- 3. Stay in the present: The first playoff rankings will be released after this
 week's games and Tennessee is in the
 mix to be included. There is still several
 more games to play, however, and the
 rankings won't matter if you don't win
 the games in front of you. That's how
 Josh Heupel sees it. "You make your
 case (to the playoff committee) by controlling what you can control, which is
 your performance on Saturdays," the
 Tennessee coach said. "If you are worried about (playoffs) you are going to
 make mistakes you can't afford."
- **4. Mismatch:** There is a reason Tennessee is a heavy favorite Saturday. Tennessee boasts the top-ranked scoring offense (40 points per game) in the SEC, while Kentucky is ranked the worst (16). Compound that with the fact Tennessee hasn't allowed more than 19 points in a game this season. The Wildcats have scored 43 total points in their last three games, all losses.

Tennessee DL James Pierce Jr. vs. Kentucky DL Deone Walker

There's much to be said about leadership and how it can carry a unit. Defensively for Tennessee, it's Pierce. For Kentucky, it's Walker. Pierce has 3.5 sacks with 5.5 tackles for loss. Walker has four tackles for a loss with 1.5 sacks.

Player of the game

Dylan Sampson, RB

Sampson ran for 139 yards against a good Alabama defense two weeks ago. That's not easy to do. Kentucky's defense doesn't look good and Sampson might roll up 200 yards if things don't improve.

By the numbers

- **19:** Tennessee has allowed just 19 first-half points while rolling up 149 points through the first two quarters.
- **3:** Tennessee has forced a goal-line turnover (two fumbles, one interception) in three of its last four games.
- **4:** Tennessee has won 17 of its last 18 home games and has four losses at home under Heupel with 24 wins.
- **6:** Dylan Sampson's six 100-yard games ties for sixth-most in school history (Jay Graham, 11 games, 1995).

Prediction

Tennessee 48, Kentucky 13

Tennessee had a hiccup against Arkansas a few weeks ago, but a win against Alabama has the Vols back on track and looking unstoppable again. This had the makings of a quality matchup in the preseason when Kentucky looked poised to take a step forward. The Wildcats have not only taken a step back, they have completely fallen down and can't get off the mat. This game could get out of hand quickly.

Four-down territory

1. It's OK to be selfish: Sharing isn't always caring. Certainly not always on the football field. And just when it looked like UNA had gotten over its affliction of giving the ball to the other team -15times through the first five games and 16 overall entering last Saturday — the Lions decided to share a little more. UNA coughed up the ball a season-high five times at Central Arkansas to bring its season total to 21. It's a mark that is tied with Southern Miss and East Carolina for second most in Division I. Mississippi Valley State leads with 22.

2. No more Braly (this year) after this: Hip, hip, hooray? UNA's time inside the cozy confines of this gem of a stadium is either at a close or drawing to a close depending on how you want to look at it. The matchup against Austin Peay is the Lions' last home game of the season. UNA is 2-2 at home and 1-4 away from it. But the Governors are also better on the road (2-2 compared to 1-3 in Clarksville). And the Lions' time in Braly will be finished – allegedly – after next season. Oh. UNA will also honor its seniors before kickoff Saturday.

3. Winning out still matters: No, the Lions aren't able to have a winning season. They squandered that away at Central Arkansas (see above). It marks the sixth straight year UNA won't have a winning record. On the other hand, the Lions still have a chance to avoid a sixth straight losing season. They just have to win their final three games to finish .500. After Austin Peay, UNA plays at Southern Utah and Eastern Kentucky.

4. Don't expect last year: Austin Peay won the 2023 matchup 49-39. It would be hard pressed if the score is that high this time around. The Governors are averaging 20 points per game, buoyed by a season-high 59 they scored against Alabama A&M. Their other point totals? That would be zero, 17, 17, 17, 20 and 13. UNA has held five opponents to fewer than 30 points this season, four of which have come in the past five games. But will the Lions' offense score enough points?

Smith, meanwhile, turned in one of his weaker outings at Central Arkansas. He completed 14 of 30 passes for 191 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions. He's thrown three picks in the last two games.

Gregory Reddick. S

Austin Peav doesn't do much well

offensively. Running back La'Vell Wright leads the Governors with 416 yards and four touchdowns on just 64 carries, so it could give Reddick a chance to add to his tackle totals. The safety leads UNA with 69, almost eight a game.

20: The number of touchdowns Austin Peay has scored this year, which ranks eighth out of the nine-team UAC. UNA is fifth with 28.

32:17: UNA's average time of possession. It leads the conference by 43 seconds. The Lions' 290:40 overall time is almost 40 minutes higher than second-place Eastern Kentucky.

The Rebels have traded wins and losses their last four outings.... This starts a three-game homestand for Arkansas, which is trying to become bowl eligible. ... Ole Miss coach Lane Kiffin is one of three active SEC coaches with 100 career wins. Kiffin has 101, while Brian Kelly is at 192 and Kirby Smart 100. Razorbacks coach Sam Pittman, conversely, has a ways to go to catch that. He owns a 28-28 career record.

The Black Bears beat Mississippi State in 2004. ... The Sooners have lost two straight in Norman for only the second time since 1999. The other year was 2014. The last time Oklahoma lost three straight was 1997. John Blake was the head coach that season. He was gone after the 1998 campaign and finished with a 12-22 record. ... Maine is 4-26 all-time against FBS schools. Two of the wins have come against lowly UMass. ... The Black Bears are 2-2 against ranked opponents this season. All four were FCS schools.



... The Blazers have dropped six straight and have given up almost 38 points per game this season. UAB's scoring defense ranks 128th in the 133-team FBS. ... Tulsa has left many an offense with a warm feeling this year, too. The Golden Hurricanes allows an average of almost 439 yards per game and almost 61/2 yards per play. ... Tulsa has given up at least 45 points four times this season, including last week's 46-45 win over Texas-San Antonio. ... Tulsa ranks nine spots ahead of UAB's scoring defense nationally. ... UAB receiver Amare Thomas has 20 catches for 248 yards and four touchdowns in his last three games. ... Tulsa quarterback Cooper Legas came off the bench and threw for 331 yards and five touchdowns against UTSA. ... The Hurricanes rallied from a 42-17 third-quarter deficit, taking the lead with 1:01 left on Legas' 4-yard TD pass to Kamdyn Benjamin.

Hoosiers put Big Ten TV issue on display

Indiana has made only two network television appearances in the first season of the Big Ten's media deal with Fox, NBC and CBS.

The Hoosiers, though, should receive more national recognition with crucial games against Michigan on Saturday and Ohio State on Nov. 23.

Indiana's first 8-0 start since 1967 is one of many pieces the conference and the networks must work with when determining what matchups to put into the top spots.

Fox has the early afternoon window, while CBS is in its first season at 2:30 p.m. after many years of carrying the SEC. NBC is in its second season with the prime-time package. It is the first time a conference has had a weekly package with three broadcast networks.

"The whole design here was for the top

three games every week to be on broadcast television. And as we know, broadcast television continues to aggregate massive amounts of eyeballs for these big-time live events," CBS Sports executive vice president of programming Dan Weinberg said. "I think the conference recognized the potential upside of that model with how successful the NFL has been. I think the structure of what they tried to create is what we're seeing in practice, and we view it as a positive with even more upside to come over these next several years."

There was already plenty of intrigue going into the season with the addition of Oregon, Southern California, UCLA and Washington. The Ducks rising to the top spot in the AP Top 25 has been another benefit of the expansion.

Oregon, Penn State and Ohio State occupy three of the top four spots in this week's poll, and the Hoosiers are ranked 13th.

"I think the depth and the breadth of

matchups with these four additional teams coming in has provided an opportunity to spread the proverbial peanut butter around a little bit more," said Justin Byczek, NBC Sports' senior vice president of programming. "We've been able to drive the best matchups every week into our respective windows."

Oregon makes its second straight appearance on CBS Saturday when it visits Michigan. It will be the fifth time in seven weeks that CBS will have a matchup with one of the Big Ten's West Coast schools.

Last Saturday marked the first time since the 2007 Sun Bowl that the Ducks were on CBS.

"We talked about it prior to the start of the season when we were looking over the composite schedule. On any given week, there are matchups on paper that would be Rose Bowls in previous years. And that's just exciting," Weinberg said.

Besides the "Big Noon Saturday" slot,


Fox has showcased the Big Ten with nine matchups on Friday nights. All four West Coast schools have at least one Friday night home game, while the Bruins, Ducks and Huskies make two appearances.

"We wanted to use Friday to showcase the new West Coast schools and on Saturday to go a little deeper and not have it always be Ohio State and Michigan," said Mike Mulvihill, Fox's president of insights and analytics.

Ironically, Indiana is one of five conference schools that wasn't scheduled for a Friday night game.

The Hoosiers were on NBC on Sept. 14, spoiling UCLA's conference debut. They appeared on Fox on Oct. 19, when they beat Nebraska 56-7. Indiana's other three conference games were on Big Ten Network.

However, Indiana does have a national window on Saturday, with its game against Michigan State being streamed on Peacock.

8 remaining unbeatens face tough paths

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. – None of the last eight unbeaten teams in major college football this season were unbeaten going into November last year.

Or the year before that. Or the year before that.

Or in the decades before that, in some cases.

The last eight unbeatens: No. 1 Oregon (8-0), No. 3 Penn State (7-0), No. 5 Miami (8-0), No. 9 BYU (8-0), No. 11 Iowa State (7-0), No. 13 Indiana (8-0), No. 18 Pitt (7-0) and No. 21 Army (7-0).

"It can get real special," Miami running back Mark Fletcher Jr. said after the unbeaten and extend perhaps the best

Hurricanes beat Florida State on Saturday. "We've just got to keep attacking, go 1-0 every single week. On to the next."

In the cases of Oregon, Penn State and maybe Miami, those starts aren't necessarily surprising. With regard to everyone else on the list, yes, it's fair to say most would be surprised.

Of the eight teams, five were unranked in the AP Top 25 preseason poll. And three of the eight - Pitt, BYU and Indiana weren't even supposed to be in the top half of their conferences if preseason rankings are to be believed.

"It means everything," Indiana offensive lineman Mike Katic said after the Hoosiers beat Washington to remain feel-good story in college football this fall.


"I love this place with my whole heart. and I'm so grateful for everyone in this program that has helped me get to where I am. I'm so proud of this team and these coaches for everything and breaking through and getting Indiana football back on top."

Take away the pandemic-shortened season of 2020, and the last time Indiana was undefeated going into November was 1967. That 57-year wait is more than most on the list – but nothing compared with Iowa State. The last time the Cyclones were unbeaten going into November was during World War II; the last time they were unbeaten and untied this late into the calendar was 1938.

"The character of our team keeps showing up," Iowa State coach Matt Campbell said after the Cyclones – who were off last weekend - rallied to beat UCF on Oct. 19. "You can say, boy, you really love this team in January and you can say, boy, I really love this team in spring ball. But I think the reality is that it is who they have grown to become in the offseason and as a football team. The leadership and the resolve just showcase themselves."


