

21 Alabama (0-1)

The series: Alabama leads 3-1.

Four-down territory

1. Problematic pattern: Florida State quarterback Tony Castellanos had a big day against the Alabama defense - and not just passing. He led the team with 78 rushing yards. Alabama has not faired well against dual-threat quarterbacks under coach Kalen DeBoer. Whether it was Vanderbilt's Diego Pavia (56 yards), Tennessee's Nico Iamaleava (44 vards) or Oklahoma's Jackson Arnold (131 yards), containing them was an issue. Although ULM's Aidan Armenta isn't really a running QB, he did have 39 yards last week. "We weren't able to execute well enough on game day," Alabama defensive coordinator Kane Wommack said. "Schematically, I need to give our players the best chance to be successful based upon the body of work that we've put on the field."

2. That's an issue: Ryan Williams left the FSU game in the fourth quarter after taking a hit to the head and is listed as day-to-day for ULM. That's not the only issue. He was targeted 10 times last week but had five catches for 30 yards with three drops. The sophomore was moved to the slot position. Since starting his freshman season so well in 2024, his production has faded over the last six games. In that span, he has 18 catches for 193 yards with one touchdown.

3. On the mend: Alabama was without key players last week who won't be available Saturday, either. Defensive lineman Tim Keenan III (ankle), right guard Jaeden Roberts (concussion) running back Jam Miller (upper body) are still recovering from preseason injuries. A few players were banged up in the opener and are day-to-day, including defensive lineman Jah-Marien Latham (lower-body injury), receiver Isaiah Horton (lower body injury) and Williams (concussion protocol). "Isaiah Horton, really proud of the way he fought through a lower-body injury that he had," DeBoer said. "He just kept fighting through Saturday."

4. Welcome back: ULM coach Bryant Vincent is coming back to Alabama. The West Alabama graduate made several coaching stops in the state, including in the Warhawks' opener.

UAB and South Alabama, plus Spanish Fort, Greenville, Spain Park and Charles Henderson high schools. He led Spanish Fort to the 2010 Class 5A state championship. He served as interim head coach for UAB in 2022 and went 7-6. He's in his third year at ULM with a 13-13 overall record.

Four-down territory

- 1. Making his case: Auburn's Darrion Smith played just eight snaps in last week's win at Baylor, but the true freshman defensive lineman made the most of them with two OB hurries. "We probably should have played him more," coach Hugh Freeze said. "He was harassing the quarterback pretty well. I thought he made the most of his opportunities, which ultimately should lead to more opportunities now." Smith played mostly toward the end of the game.
- **2. Nice options:** Jackson Arnold stole the show running the ball last week, but performance by running backs Damari Alston and Jeremiah Cobb were a welcome sight for a team searching for Jarquez Hunter's replacement. Alson's 84 yards and a score and Cobb's 74 yards with a score gave the Tigers two good options in the backfield. "They waited for their time and have developed," Freeze said. "It's good to see them have success in their first real outing. We will need them both."
- **3. Right attitude:** Izavion Miller has been the starter at right tackle since he was a sophomore. Until the season opener. The senior had to sit on the bench for most of the game with Baylor. He did get into the rotation but played just 19 snaps. "If there's ever a reason to pout, he would be at the top of the line, but he doesn't," Freeze said. "When he came in, he gave us a spark. Those drives when he was in there, he was moving people."
- **4. Needs work:** It wasn't perfect, but the Tigers' season opener was an emphatic success. The one area Freeze did address this week was Baylor's ability to move the ball through the air. Baylor totaled 419 passing yards, including 204 yards after catch. "We probably should have played more dime and bracketed (Baylor receiver Kole Wilson) some," Freeze said. "It's us that coached it and us that executed it. I know they can show me because they've done it right a bunch. We didn't do it right when it counted the most."

Four-down territory

1. Last-second change: Tennessee guard Jesse Perry found out Saturday before the opener with Syracuse he was moving to tackle. Freshman David Sanders was injured in practice and was ruled out. "I got told in the morning, but I was ready for it," he said. "I've taken enough reps at tackle. I felt confident to go out there. It sucked not having David out there, but as a unit, we're ready. Next man up mentality. Just go out there and play for each other."

2. Looking good: QB Joey Aguilar had a spectacular debut for the Vols, passing for 247 yards with three TDs. His teammates couldn't be happier and aren't surprised. "I've seen his poise at practice, even when we're going up against the best defense in the nation in practice," tight end Miles Kitselman said. "I don't know if impressed is the right word, but just being able to go out there and do his job. It's like this is the Joey I've seen in practice, and I was just really glad that he went out there and played how I know he can play."

3. Business as usual: The Tennessee defense picked up where it left off last season, particularly dominating the line of scrimmage. The Vols recorded five sacks and held Syracuse to 103 rushing yards. But there is always room for improvement. "We gave up a good amount of touchdowns (three rushing). So, yeah, we just can't let that happen in the next game. We're just going to get better with that," defensive lineman Tyree Weathersby said.

4. No letting up: After a big win and seeing ETSU ahead on the schedule, it could be understandable to coast this week. Tennessee head coach Josh Heupel wants to keep the foot on the gas pedal, especially with Georgia just over the horizon. "The standard is the standard," he said. "We are chasing perfection, or as close to it as we can. We have to approach (ETSU) the right way."

Four-down territory

1. Back in the FCS: Both UNA and Southeast Missouri opened the season with money games — aka FBS bodybag games — last week. Both results went as expected. The Lions lost at Western Kentucky 55-6. Western Kentucky's highlight was quarterback Maverick McIvor tossing five touchdown passes. UNA's was kicker Ian Vachon providing two field goals. Southeast Missouri fell at Arkansas State 42-24 with the Red Wolves scoring three rushing and three passing touchdowns on the Redhawks. So, plenty of red all around.

2. Whoa, big man: Jax Leatherwood is Southeast Missouri's starting quarterback. He's listed at 6-foot-8. He completed 26 of 36 passes for 272 yards and two touchdowns at Arkansas State. The junior spent last season at San Diego Mesa College, a junior college, after redshirting at Nevada in 2023. Nevada, apparently, had a thing for very tall QBs. The year before Leatherwood's arrival, the Wolfpack played Nate Cox, who at 6-9 was the tallest signal caller in college football history. Jamar Graham tied that mark last season at Alabama A&M against Kentucky State. Graham is not listed on the Bulldogs' roster this year.

3. The road isn't where the heart is: For all of Braly's flaws — and there are many — UNA has been better in the ghastly stadium than away from it since its first Division I season in 2018. The Lions are 14-18 when playing in Florence. On the road? UNA is just 7-32, which includes the season opener at Western Kentucky. The Lions have just one season with a winning road record. That was in 2018 when they beat Southern Utah, Alabama A&M and Jackson State.

4. Close the curtain: Saturday will be Southeast Missouri's home opener, which is 7-4 in such games under coach Tom Matukewicz. The Redhawks are encouraging their fans to wear black for a "black out." How effective will it be? Dunno. Depends if UNA decides to wear its highly fashionable black alternate jerseys. One would think the Lions

ought to leave those at home.

Key matchup

SEMO offensive line vs. UNA defensive line

Yeah, we're going to avoid specific players for this one. It's better that way. The Lions need their D-line to be effective in this game. Western Kentucky rolled up 563 yards offense last week. Southeast Missouri had just 372 last season, but it totaled 176 of those yards — and four touchdowns — on the ground. UNA can't have a repeat of the "you get a touchdown, you get a touchdown, everybody gets a touchdown" outcome.

Player of the week Tanaka Scott. WR

Scott is listed at 6-foot-5, making him one of the tallest targets for quarterback Ari Patu to throw to. He had just one catch for 5 yards against Western Kentucky. Finding a way to get him the ball, especially if the Lions get inside the red zone could be helpful.

Quick judgments often overreactions

First glances grab our attention. Especially when everything changes in the course of a holiday weekend.

In just less than 24 hours, we saw Auburn look like a contender and Alabama look like a phony, flopping narratives from this space just the week before.

But our initial feels are often overreactions. Let's take a look at what we gleaned and where we're headed after the SEC's opening weekend.

Texas, Arch Manning are frauds

The hype over quarterback Arch Manning has been off the charts since he arrived at Texas all because of his DNA. In his first start of the 2025 season, he failed to impress, throwing for just 170 yards and a touchdown in a 14-7 loss to defending national champion Ohio

By the rankings, this was an upset. According to oddsmakers, this played out close to form.

Clearly, neither Manning nor Texas were ready for the spotlight. But let's be honest, you're talking about opening on the road against the nation's most dominant program, yet the Longhorns still had a shot down the stretch.

The verdict: Overreaction. Texas won't face a team like this until November, so there's plenty of time to build confidence and a resumé before back-to-back ranked opponents in October. In fact, the schedule sets up nicely for the Longhorns again with the two biggest challenges remaining near the end (at Georgia on Nov. 15, home vs. Texas A&M on Nov. 28).

Auburn is back, baby

The Tigers went on the road and pulled away from a Baylor team that finished 2024 on fire and may be a darkhorse Big 12 contender. The most encouraging sign was the offense, led by Oklahoma transfer Jackson Arnold (137 rushing yards, 245 total).

This was as good as we've seen a Hugh Freeze offense look since arriving on The Plains and Arnold is a good fit for the success we saw from Freeze's teams at Ole Miss and Liberty.

The verdict: Overreaction. Auburn looked very good, indeed. But Baylor's Sawyer Robertson riddled the Tigers for 419 yards and receivers ran wild after the catch.

DeBoer in over his head

Alabama laid the biggest egg, losing by two scores to a Florida State team that went 2-10 a year ago. The Tide defense, projected to be one of the nation's best, had few answers for Gus Malzahn's offense, which Thomas Castellanos ran flawlessly. Meanwhile, the offense sputtered under new QB Ty Simpson.

In Alabama's five losses during coach Kalen DeBoer's 15-game tenure, four have come as heavy favorites (13 ½-point

lines or more). Adding to the concern: all four losses came away from Bryant-Denny Stadium.

The verdict: Trending in that direction. DeBoer owns Top 10 matchups. That's not the argument. It's the inability to have his team ready when the light isn't so bright. The program has slipped, but beating Alabama remains a field-storming big deal. Further complicating this trend: Alabama must travel to Georgia, Missouri, South Carolina and Auburn this season. At least the SEC will get rich off fines.

CFP-bound LSU, S. Carolina

LSU and South Carolina recorded the most impressive season-opening wins. They have veteran quarterbacks — two of the best in the nation - in common. The biggest step forward came from the LSU defense, which looked salty against Clemson.

The verdict: Minefields ahead. LSU must face Florida and Ole Miss before the end of the month. If week one wasn't a mirage, the schedule is spaced out for a potential 10-2 run. But things get much more difficult for South Carolina, which faces five current Top 25 programs (including LSU) in a space of six weeks once October rolls around.


