

# To Smart, no-Saban Tide not strange

ATHENS, Ga. – Kirby Smart no longer has to worry about his mentor-turnednemesis in Tuscaloosa. Somewhere, deep in his gut, the Georgia coach might be a bit relieved that Nick Saban is now wearing a mic at the broadcast table rather than a headset on the sideline.

Just don't expect Smart to come right out and say it.

Deflecting several versions of the same question — essentially, what's it going to be like to face an Alabama team that's not coached by Saban? – Smart kept the focus squarely on the two power-

night on Saban Field at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

"No, I don't expect it to be strange," Smart said Monday. "That's just the normal course of progression."

Still, there's no getting around the major issue hanging over a rivalry that largely has charted the course of the Southeastern Conference for nearly a decade.

Saban is not a part of it anymore other than his duties as an analyst for ESPN's "College GameDay," which will be on hand in Tuscaloosa as the No. 2 Bulldogs (3-0, 1-0 SEC) face the No. 4 Crimson Tide (3-0, 0-0).

Smart said he's glad that Saban - who house programs that will meet Saturday retired in January after winning a record

seven national titles, six of them in Tuscaloosa to take over the good-butcharge of the Alabama program — seems to be cherishing life after coaching.

"I'm thrilled that he gets an opportunity to do what he wants to do and be with who he wants to be with within his family and enjoy that," Smart said. "I'm really happy he's still part of college football because he makes college football better."

These two coaches — one now retired, the other in the prime of his career — will be linked forever.

Smart was on Saban's staff for more than a decade, soaking up every bit of wisdom he could glean from perhaps the greatest coach in college football history.

After the 2015 season, Smart departed

not-quite-great program at his alma mater, quickly pushing the Bulldogs to that next level.

You know, the spot at the top of the conference held by Saban's Crimson Tide.

Georgia captured the SEC crown in Smart's second season, only to be defeated in the national title game by Alabama in an overtime thriller.

Saban beat his former assistant three more times - twice with the league championship on the line, another time in a regular season — before Smart finally broke through with a 33-18 victory in the

more times - twice with the league championship on the line, another time in a regular season — before Smart finally broke through with a 33-18 victory in the national championship game at the end of the 2021 season.

That was the first of two straight national titles for Smart's Bulldogs, moving them to the pinnacle of college football's hierarchy, but it was Saban who delivered the final salvo to his former pupil.

After Georgia breezed through the 2023 regular season at 12-0 and seemed poised for an unprecedented third straight title in the poll era, Alabama pulled off a 27-24 upset in the SEC championship game – a result that knocked the Dawgs out of the four-team playoff.

It was a loss that still stings between the hedges.

"We definitely have a chip on our shoulder," receiver Arian Smith conceded.

Smart, who has brought a singular focus to the Bulldogs that was a hallmark of Saban's teams, doesn't want his players thinking about a game from nine months ago, especially when the Crimson Tide is now coached by Kalen

"I don't know how similar or different it will be," Smart said. "We're a different team. They're a different team. They're a different staff. We're a similar staff. So, I can't compare last year's game to

Alabama.

For sure, Saban's presence still looms over this rivalry. There may be a different guy on the Alabama sideline Saturday night, but many of those taking the field will have ties to the previous coach.

"Well, he recruited a lot of them, and they're good players," Smart said of Saban, before catching himself and quickly shifting the focus to the game at

hand and not who will - or won't - be coaching in it.

Nick Saban, after retiring as Alabama's coach, is now an analyst on

"Any time you go against a really good team that's a powerhouse in college football, it's a challenge," Smart said, firmly back on message. "I really look at it like this is a hell of an opportunity for our kids, our program, on a national stage."

He went on a bit longer, but there was no more mention of Saban.



this year."

This will be Smart's second trip to Tuscaloosa since taking the Georgia job. During the pandemic-plagued 2020 season, the Bulldogs lost 41-24 to an Alabama squad that went on to claim what would be Saban's final national title.

"You move on," Smart said. "I think the last time we went (to Tuscaloosa), it was four or five years from the time we had lived there. It's so weird when you play there because you're in and out. You're there and then you're gone."

Smart has certainly carved his own dynastic path at Georgia, but he never quite escaped Saban's shadow. His record against his former boss was 1-5. The Bulldogs have only two losses in their last 51 games — both of them coming to

## Four-down territory

1. Everyone's watching: With ESPN's College GameDay coming to town, as well as former President Donald Trump, it's safe to say Saturday's game has the attention of the country. For Alabama, what matters is tuning out the hoopla and preparing for an important game. Still, it's hard not to take in some of the fun. "Yeah, it is kinda cool to have a lot of people who want to come be part of the atmosphere and add to the excitement and energy that the game will bring," Alabama coach Kalen DeBoer said.

2. Pressure is on: One of the keys for Alabama is getting quarterback Carson Beck rattled in the pocket. That doesn't happen often. The Bulldogs have allowed just two sacks in three games. The offensive line allowed 13 total sacks last season. Beck threw for nearly 4,000 yards last year and averages 226 this season. "This guy's a complete quarterback," Alabama defensive coordinator Kane Wommack said. "He's really as good as I've seen in the last couple of years. We have to be mindful of making him uncomfortable, but you want to make sure you're not sacrificing things from a coverage perspective in order to get that done."

3. Explosion or dud?: Jalen Milroe is No. 3 in the nation with a passing efficiency of 213.38 with eight touchdowns and no interceptions. He's also averaging nearly 17 yards per completion. Translation: He makes explosive plays. The issue is the Georgia defense, which is No. 1 in the SEC in pass defense (91 yards per game) and No. 3 in the nation in scoring defense (six points per game). The Bulldogs have allowed one explosive play (36 yards) all season. "The explosive play (film) cutup is not long, so that didn't take a very long time to watch," Alabama offensive coordinator Nick Sheridan said.

**4. Talkin' Tide:** Alabama freshman receiver Ryan Williams and freshman defensive back Jaylen Mbakwe have been busy on the field helping the Crimson Tide to a 3-0 record. They are also working hard off the field with their "New Wave

Podcast." The duo have just a few episodes so far but have grown a popular following. The duo faced off in high school at the Class 6A title game and were teammates at the Under Armour All-American Game. "We've been talking about it for two years," Mbakwe said. "At the All-American Game, we were in front of the cameras a lot, so we said we need to start a podcast."

# Beck, Georgia work to 'clean up' offense

ATHENS, Ga. - On Saturday, Georgia will venture into Alabama's Bryant-Denny Stadium, one of the toughest road environments in the SEC.

It's not a place the Bulldogs have been often - just 10 times in 132 years of football and three times this century – nor a venue in which they've had much success. They've won their just twice. Ever.

It's certainly not a place a team goes to get well. Yet that's what Georgia's offense will attempt to do as it arrives for Saturday's primetime

The Bulldogs will pull into Tuscaloosa with an offense nearly dry of the optimism that overflowed during the preseason. Through three games, Georgia is nine points and 95 yards a game behind last season's pace  $(40.\frac{1}{496.5}).$ 

Being the Bulldogs' quarterback, Carson Beck has been the object of much of the finger-pointing for those shortcomings. So has offensive coordinator Mike Bobo. Whether either deserves that is a matter of debate.

"We have a really good offense, we have people around them and we've got a good quarterback," Georgia coach Kirby Smart contended last week. "We've just got to go out and execute. ... Clean up what you do, do it at a higher rate, make good decisions, communicate better."

Starting faster would be good, too, Smart added. An issue at times last year, slow starts have plagued Georgia in their two games of note this year. In their 13-12 win over Kentucky on Sept. 14, the Bulldogs had only 63 yards offense at the half. Beck accounted for 32 of that on 5-of-11 passing. They had three first downs. They trailed 6-3.

Having led Clemson only 6-0 at halftime of the season opener, that means Bulldogs are averaging 4.5 first-half points against FBS competition this season.

Improving on that is mainly a matter of effectively running the takes to win." football, Beck said.

It was well into the second half before Georgia got going against the Wildcats. After finally crossing the goal line three minutes into the fourth quarter, they needed a couple of huge first downs to salt away victory. Beck's 33-yard completion to Dominick Lovett and an eight-vard gain on a pass to Oscar Delp assured that Kentucky wouldn't have time to come back.

In Beck, the Bulldogs still believe. "He handled it," junior running back Trevor Etienne said. "The moment didn't get too high. You know, he handled it well. I'd say he kept the offense poised and kept us all connected. We believed in him and followed and believed he'd do what it

Beck almost always has. With the "Got to be physical in the run victory, he improved to 16-1 as Geor-

## Four-down territory

- 1. Up in the air: If you are wondering about where the Auburn QB situation stands, so is head coach Hugh Freeze. After switching from Payton Thorne to Hank Brown and then back to Thorne, Auburn's still not set on finding an answer to who will take the reins of the offense. The two have combined for eight interceptions. "It's going to be a battle this week trying to figure out who can master the plan against all these fronts that we're going to face against Oklahoma," Freeze said.
- 2. Not the only one: Oklahoma is in the same boat with Auburn regarding quarterback play. After a rough outing last week against Tennessee, OU starter Jackson Arnold has been benched and replaced with freshman Michael Hawkins Jr. He took over for Arnold in the Tennessee game, but he'll start his first game inside Jordan-Hare Stadium, not exactly an ideal situation for a true freshman. He's thrown 22 passes for 149 yards and a touchdown and ran 14 times for 32 yards. Mobile OBs (See Arkansas' Taylen Green) are trouble for the Tigers.
- 3. More issues: The quarterback mess isn't the only trouble facing Auburn. The Tigers' run game goes up against a Sooner defense that allows 96 yards per game with one rushing touchdown. The outlier is last week's 151 yards allowed against Tennessee. Balance was the key for the Vols (194 passing), which is what Auburn is striving for, too. In the two losses, Auburn did have a fairly balanced offense. The problem was turnovers (four in each game).
- **4. Lowering the boom:** Oklahoma doesn't mess around on defense when it comes to pressure. The Sooners are ranked seventh nationally with 14 sacks. That puts the Auburn QBs in a bigger spotlight, which is something the offense doesn't need. OU also has 32 tackles for loss. The Sooners are tough to score on, too. They allow 14 points per game. Auburn generated just 14 points in each of its losses.

Auburn needs Hunter to break loose against a quality opponent. He rushed for 67 and 69 yards against Cal and Arkansas, respectively. The Sooners need a big effort from Barnes, too. With a new OB at the helm, he'll have to give OU all the help it can get.

## Player of the week

## KeAndre Lambert-Smith, WR

There's a quarterback issue at Auburn, but Lambert-Smith doesn't have any issues catching the ball from either of them. He leads the Tigers with 338 yards and five touchdowns. He's easily the

Tigers' primary target and playmaker.

## Four-down territory

1. Frenemies, again: UNA decided to give the whole Division I thing a try starting in 2018. This is West Georgia's first year as an FCS program. The two, however, are pretty familiar with each other. The Lions and Wolves were once Gulf South Conference foes, meeting every year 1983-2017. West Georgia won the last meeting 37-23, while UNA has taken seven of the last 10. And, hey, the Lions won't have to worry about playing in an old, outdated stadium, either. West Georgia's opened in 2009.

2. In (bad) need of a win: UNA is on an eight-game losing streak dating to last season. The program record is 12 over 1971-72. The Lions are 18-45 in six-plus seasons as a Division I team and are 19-45 against FCS competition since 1978. A loss to the Wolves, three games out of Division II, would likely be one of, if not, the biggest for the program since UNA officially moved in 2018. # Football not Smith's first priority

LANSING, Mich. - Armorion Smith pressed his palms together over the bridge of his nose, closed his eyes and leaned against the kitchen sink.

The 21-year-old Michigan State defensive back needed a moment in the four-bedroom. two-bathroom home he shares with five younger siblings. He has a lot on his plate, more than most college students and certainly more than most student-athletes.

His mother, Gala Gilliam, died of breast cancer a month ago and, without a father in the family's life, Smith has become the head of the household while studying criminal justice and playing major college football. He became the legal guardian for four siblings on Sept. 11.

"My cards were given to me," Smith said softly with a steely gaze, standing on a small porch behind the home as the sun set on a recent evening. "I didn't choose my deck of cards."

His 19-year-old sister, Aleion, is in charge while he is gone for about 12 hours most days to be a student and athlete. Appreciating her selfless sacrifice, Smith said he hopes to help her find a way to start taking classes next semester while juggling her role with the family.

Smith looks and sounds determined to help his siblings be happy, healthy and safe. His teammates watch in awe.

"I couldn't even begin to imagine if I was in his situation," linebacker Jordan Hall said. "He's in a tough spot, but he is one of the strongest guys I have ever known."

## The family

Smith grew up in in Detroit, recalling how he was homeless at times and hopped from house to house to find places to sleep.

He was a three-star prospect at River Rouge High School and attended the University of Cincinnati for two years.

After Smith's mother was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2022 during his sophomore season with the Bearcats, he transferred last year to be closer to home. The life lessons from his mom continued.

When Smith, holding his 2-year-old sister, arrived at a recent fundraiser, each of his other siblings introduced themselves to people there to support the family and shook their hands while making eye contact.

"That's from my mom," he

She was trying to prepare him

for what was to come before she died Aug. 19. She was 41.

"She used to tell me everything: 'Get hard' and all of that," he recalled. "And I see why she was under a lot of stress."

Smith keeps notes on his phone to help manage busy days that start before dawn, when he is up to make sure his two sisters and three brothers are awake before he leaves for school. Smith gets a lift from a teammate or a ride-hailing service to make the 4-mile trip to campus for therapy on his surgically repaired shoulders and meetings with the football team before going to classes and practice.

His eldest sister gets their business."

16- and 15-year-old brothers, Armond and Avaugn, and 11-year-old sister, Arial, ready for school. There are two varieties of Cap'n Crunch atop the refrigerator in a kitchen that didn't have a table or chairs during a recent visit.

The school-age brothers rely on a ride-hailing company to get them to school and back while their oldest sister cares for their toddler sister, Amaira.

"Me and my sister got to work together to keep this all afloat," he said. "While I'm in college sports, she's got to be able to take care of everything that I can't do, like pick up where I left off, while I'm taking care of

He and the siblings he is now responsible for at least have a home thanks in part to a GoFundMe campaign.

## Student caregivers

While Smith's story is unusual in college sports the NCAA does not track the number of athletes whose day-to-day activities include caring for a dependent - a 2020 study from the National Center for Education Statistics found 19.5% of undergraduate college students had a dependent and 5.5% of them were responsible for non-child dependents. Other research

shows student-caregivers are disproportionately from historically marginalized racial and ethnic groups.

Ray Ray McElrathbey was a 19-year-old freshman at Clemson in 2006 when he took over custody of his 10-year-old brother because of his mother's drug problems and his father's gambling addiction. Initially, they lived solely off McElrathbey's scholarship and later the NCAA approved a plan where donations were administered by a local bank and distributed to Ray and Fahmarr. His story was the subject of "Safety," a Disney movie.

When McElrathbey was a child and saw "Angels in the Outfield," it inspired him because he felt there were other children out there like him. These days, he does speaking engagements and shares his message of hope with young people.

"Just kind to speak to those kids in a similar situation like I was growing up and have them have something to inspire them is the greatest gift," he said.

Tufts University professor Emma Armstrong-Carter, who has done research on children caregivers, said these young people show amazing strength and don't want to be pitied.

"Isn't it incredible that these young people are able to overcome so many challenges and support their families in ways that are necessary and meaningful?" Armstrong-Carter said. "There's a need for more institutional support to help them thrive."

Smith and his family are able to afford renting a house in the state capital, paying for utilities, bills, food and ridehailing services thanks to waves of financial support. The GoFundMe effort has raised more than \$60,000, and he makes some money through name, image and likeness deals. Michigan State has helped through a student assistance

fund. Two fundraisers were hosted at a McDonald's in Lansing and an IHOP in Livonia set up by former Michigan State football players Jason Strayhorn and Sedrick Irvin and promoted on their "This is Sparta MSU" podcast.

Road trips are part of the calendar and the Spartans don't play two home games in a row until the end of the season in November, though two bye weekends will give Smith more time at home.

One of his mother's close friends, Yolanda Wilson, whose son, Nick Marsh, is a standout freshman receiver and former high school teammate, has been a source of support.

"I'm going to be there no matter what," she said. "That's a promise I made to their mother. And they have everybody here backing them up. So, it's going to be a hard transition as it is, but we're going to be that tight-knit community and have their back."

The love is not lost on Smith. "Me and my family are very happy, very appreciative and grateful," he said. "There's a lot of love Spartan Nation has shown us these past few months. It's been a rough time, but to be able to take some of the stress off of my shoulders and show me a lot of love is a blessing and has warmed my heart."

When Smith gave The Associated Press access to his home one recent evening, three siblings were upstairs in their bedrooms while a teenage brother was napping on a sectional couch in a living room

without a TV or table. His toddler sister giggled between drinks from a sippy cup.

"It just puts a smile on my face to see them happy," he said while watching video clips from practice on his phone.

Smith's sadness comes and goes, but he knows his mother would want him to carry on.

"I can feel her living through me," he said. "Almost like I hear her voice telling me how proud she is of me."


