





# Tennessee at Georgia

When: 6:30 p.m. Saturday TV/radio: ABC/FM-93.9, AM-920 **Records:** No. 6 Tennessee (8-1, 5-1 SEC), No. 11 Georgia (7-2, 5-2) The series: Georgia leads 28-23-2.

#### Four-down territory

1. Can't break through: It's been a onesided contest in the Tennessee-Georgia series in recent history. Georgia holds a 17-6 record in the 21st century, winning 12 of the last 14 and seven straight. The Bulldogs enter the matchup as a 9 ½point favorite and have a 30-game win streak at Sanford Stadium to boot. The Vols haven't just lost to Georgia seven straight times, they've been crushed. In the last seven games, Tennessee has lost by 28, 14, 26, 24, 29, 24 and 41 (in a shutout).

**2. Impatiently waiting:** Tennessee needs every advantage it can get against Georgia. Not having the quarterback 100% doesn't help. Nico Iamaleava missed the second half last week with an upper body injury. His status for the Georgia game is unclear. "He was with us today," Tennessee coach Josh Heupel said Monday. "Had a really good day. Feel like he'll be in great shape for Saturday." Gaston Moore took over for Iamaleava and completed 5 of 8 attempts for 38 yards against Mississippi State. For the season, Moore is 16-of-25 for 201 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions.

**3. It's all about the defense:** The status of Iamaleava is a big factor for Saturday, but it's the defense that's the crucial element of the game. Tennessee is one of the top units in the country and hasn't allowed more than 19 points in a game. Georgia is coming off a loss at Ole Miss in which it scored just 10 points. Tennessee's redzone defense is also a factor and ranked No. 1 in the SEC and No. 5 in the country.

**4. Bad Dawgs:** One area where Tennessee can make a difference is with turnovers, and Georgia seems to be eager to oblige. The Bulldogs have 15 turnovers, Beck. The Bulldogs are susceptible to sacks, too. Georgia has allowed 15 sacks this season, five of which came last week. Tennessee has 22 sacks this season.

#### Lost weekend: Florida teams mired in muck

CORAL GABLES, Fla. – Worst day ever? Worst week ever? There was no joy, at least of the major-college football variety, in Florida this weekend.

There were eight games involving the state's FBS and FCS teams last Saturday and nine last weekend.

There were no wins.

For only the second time, the other being Oct. 10, 2020, the state saw its seven FBS programs - Miami, Florida, Florida State, UCF, South Florida, Florida Atlantic and Florida International - combine to go 0-5 on the same dav.

It all happened Saturday: Miami watched its unbeaten start end with a 28-23 loss to Georgia Tech, Florida State lost 52-3 to Notre Dame, Florida lost to Texas 49-17, South Florida lost 28-7 to Navy and UCF lost 35-31 to Arizona State.

"We're in a bad place with the results that we've seen," Florida State coach Mike Norvell after his team fell to 1-9 with a seven-touchdown loss.

He was speaking of his team, and it indeed has been a miserable year for the Seminoles – the preseason pick to win the Atlantic Coast Conference and a team that will finish no better than tied for last in that 17-team league.

But misery had a lot of company this weekend. Misery has had a lot of company all season.

This is the 20th season of Florida having seven FBS-level programs and combined, it'll be one of the worst years the state has seen in that era.

Miami is 9-1, by far the best of the bunch and still in control of its destiny when it comes to reaching the ACC title game even after losing to Georgia Tech. No other Sunshine State school at the FBS level even has a winning record at this point.

"We have everything in front of us to play for," Miami coach Mario Cristobal said.

Not everyone else in Florida can say that. Not even close.

South Florida and Florida are both 4-5, UCF is 4-6, Florida International is 3-6, Florida Atlantic is 2-7 and Florida State is 1-9. It's possible the Hurricanes will be the only majorcollege Florida team that goes to a bowl game.

"We have a ton of young talent that I think will continue to develop," Florida coach Billy Napier said after losing to Texas. "They're learning, they're going through this experience, and I

think that will prove beneficial in the

future."

Add up the records so far this season and the state's FBS teams are 27-39, a .409 winning percentage. The worst combined record in the era of the state having seven FBS schools came in 2021 when they went 35-51, a .407 winning percentage.

Last Saturday marked only the sixth time since 1978 that the state's three traditional top programs - the Hurricanes, Seminoles and Gators – lost on the same day. The UCF and USF losses added to the tally, and the news got worse when adding the state's three FCS teams into the mix. Florida Atlantic started the "party" last Thursday, losing 49-14 to East Carolina.

The only team among the state's FBS and FCS schools that didn't lose this weekend was FIU. The Panthers didn't play.



# Mercer at Alabama

#### Four-down territory

- **1. Making a statement:** There weren't too many fans or pundits who saw a 42-13 Crimson Tide win at LSU coming. The win sets up Alabama nicely to be in the mix for the 12-team playoff, provided it wins its next three games. The attitude has changed inside the locker room as well. "There's confidence that continues to build, a trust that happens between the front and the back halves. I just really like the demeanor that they bring," Alabama coach Kalen DeBoer
- **2. Pump up the Jam:** The game plan against LSU was to get the running backs involved. Mission accomplished. Jam Miller had 13 rushing attempts and also led the offense with five receptions for 50 yards. "It makes it harder to defend, and something that we'll always incorporate in our offense," Alabama offensive coordinator Nick Sheridan said of using running backs as receivers. Miller was crucial on third-down catches out of the backfield in the first half and helped pave the way for Jalen Milroe to run for 185 yards and four touchdowns.
- **3. Big loss:** Alabama will be without linebacker Oue Robinson the rest of the season after he injured his elbow against LSU. Robinson is tied for the team lead in sacks with four and has seven tackles for loss. There are players available to fill the void in Oua Russaw and Yhonzae Pierre. The defense is also without Keanu Koht, who is serving a suspension and missed the LSU game and won't play against Mercer.
- **4. It's a trap:** If any team knows about not living up to expectations after a big win it's Alabama. After taking down Georgia, Alabama fell flat and lost to Vanderbilt. There may not be as big a risk of losing to Mercer, but the lesson is still there to be learned. "We understand that it's all about building on what we did do last week because it was significant, just like we would learn from the areas that we're falling short on in a game we've lost," DeBoer said.

#### Player of the game

The offensive line started the year with high expectations. The unit is a semifinalist for the Joe Moore Award for the nation's top offensive line and is led by Booker, who was named SEC offensive lineman of the week after his performance against LSU.

#### **Kev matchup**

#### Alabama LB Jihaad Campbell vs. Mercer **LB Ken Standley**

Campbell has emerged as a leader for the defense, racking up a team-leading 78 tackles with four sacks. He was

instrumental against LSU with 12 tackles and a forced fumble. Standley is the top man for Mercer. He leads the Bears with 63 tackles and has seven tackles for loss.

#### By the numbers

- 1: The Alabama defense has allowed just one touchdown in the last two games.
- 2: Bray Hubbard, filling in for injured safety Keon Sabb, has two interceptions in two games.

#### Four-down territory

- 1. Change is coming: Ouarterback Payton Thorne didn't practice during the bye week after injuring his shoulder in the Vanderbilt game. That means he may not play against ULM. Hank Brown earned a start against New Mexico and Arkansas, but he was pulled in the second half against the Razorbacks. Holden Geriner and Walker White are also options at QB. They all took snaps during practice. Geriner has played in two games while White has not seen any action.
- 2. Slow it down: Auburn coach Hugh Freeze said he's watched film from the Tigers' games and from other teams around the SEC that run similar plays on offense. The glaring difference is the other teams have success. Freeze indicated he might try to simplify the offense, particularly at receiver. "Whether it's adjusting our calls or limiting what we call so our kids still have confidence; in the receiver room I think we're still young there in a lot of ways and maybe (we're) asking too much," he said.
- **3. Take a break:** The Tigers used the by e week mostly to give starters a rest. Running back Jarquez Hunter's 132 carries ranks third in the SEC. The time off gave Damari Alston and Jeremiah Cobb more reps, as well as freshman Christian Burnette. The break was good for offensive linemen Jeremiah Wright and Izavion Miller, and allowed freshmen DeAndre Carter and Tyler Johnson to see more practice time.
- **4. Stick around:** In the age of the transfer portal, recruiting doesn't stop once a player is on campus. It's a year-round process of trying to keep players from leaving. It's a bigger issue when the team is struggling, like Auburn. Convincing your top players not to leave a team that's struggled the past two seasons is a hard sell. "It's not much fun," Freeze said of recruiting players already on the roster. "You want to have relationships built on trust and communication. That's harder to do when you have to handle every facet of today's game."

**The lowdown:** These longtime rivals are reunited, but does it feel so good? They played annually from 1932 through 1991, after which Arkansas fled for the bigmoney SEC. Now, the Longhorns have joined the party.... In four nonconference meetings over the last 25 years, including two bowl games, the Razorbacks own four wins. Their most-recent showdown was in September 2021, a 40-21 Arkansas home victory. ... Though this isn't one, the two have had high-stakes meetings. The biggest was the "Game of the Century" in 1969, a battle of unbeatens, with President Richard Nixon in attendance, No. 1 Texas beat No. 2 Arkansas 15-14. ... This year, both offenses rank in the top 10 nationally. Arkansas is No. 5 at almost 484 yards per game with UT ninth at 465. ... The defenses, at least the Hogs', don't stack up. While the Longhorns are second at 251 yards per game, Arkansas is No. 90 at over 387. ... Texas has won nine straight true road games, its longest such streak since a 15-gamer 2003-6.... The Razorbacks are hosting their third top-10 opponent of the season, a first-time feat in school history. They beat No. 4 Tennessee on Oct. 5 and lost to No. 8 LSU two weeks later.

### In Big 12, late suspense almost normal

Seventh-ranked BYU and the Big 12 are taking games down to the wire.

No other conference is keeping things so close this season.

The Cougars (9-0, 6-0 Big 12) are one of four remaining undefeated FBS teams after their 22-21 win at Utah. Will Ferrin kicked a 44-yard field goal with three seconds left in the first Holy War since 2010 with the instate rivals in the same conference.

"It was good fun," said BYU punter Sam Vander Haar, who is also the holder for Ferrin's kicks. "I mean, it's what you train all the hours for, is for moments like that."

That was the 13th game involving a Big 12 team when the winning points were scored in the final minute of the fourth quarter, and nine of those came in conference play. It was the second for BYU, the only league team with two last-minute wins, and the second game in a row the Utes lost that way.

According to research for the Big 12 by OptaStats, the next-closest league with games decided in the final minute is the Big Ten with 10. The Sun Belt had nine through last weekend, ahead of eight each for the MAC and Mountain West. The ACC has seven, two of those wins against the Big 12, and the SEC five.

BYU has its highest AP ranking since peaking at No. 7 in 2009 while still in the Mountain West with the Utes (4-5, 1-5), the Big 12 newcomer this season that had lost its previous game 17-14 on a gameending field goal in Houston.

In all, the Big 12 has had 24 conference games with lead changes in the fourth quarter. The Big Ten has 19, the SEC 17 and the ACC 16.

The only Big 12 loss for No. 18 Colorado (7-2, 5-1) was 31-28 to No. 20 Kansas State (7-2, 4-2) after Avery Johnson's 50-yard TD pass to Jayce Brown with 2:14 left.

Iowa State went into November undefeated for the first time since 1938, with a 7-0 record and No. 9 ranking, after quarterback Rocco Becht's 1-yard TD run with 30 seconds left to beat UCF. In their next game at home, the Cyclones lost 23-22 loss when Texas Tech running back Tahi Brooks had a 5-yard TD with 20 seconds left.

The Cyclones got through

non-conference play unscathed thanks to Kyle Konrardy's 54-yard field goal with six seconds left in a 20-19 win over instate rival Iowa on Sept. 7.

ACC team Pittsburgh also won its first seven games this season, including last-minute wins against Big 12 teams Cincinnati and West Virginia in September. The only loss for ACC newcomer and league leader SMU was at home Sept. 6 when Ferrin kicked a 26-yard field goal with 1:58 left to give BYU an 18-15 victory.

BYU was 5-7 last year, including a 2-7

conference record in its Big 12 debut after 12 seasons playing as an independent team. Now they are undefeated along with No. 1 Oregon (10-0), No. 5 Indiana (9-0) and No. 16 Army (9-0).

The other last-minute Big 12 win for BYU was in mid-October against Oklahoma State, when Cougars quarterback Jake Retzlaff hit Darius Lassiter for a 35-yard touchdown with 10 seconds left for a 38-35 win.

Oklahoma State (3-7, 0-7) notched its only win against a Power Four team in double overtime against Arkansas, when

the Cowbovs went ahead with 55 seconds left in regulation on a field goal and the visiting Razorbacks tied it with a field goal on the final play.

Along with Utah, Kansas and TCU are the only other Big 12 teams with two conferences losses in the final minute.

TCU (6-4, 4-3) would be just below BYU in the league standings if not for those losses. UCF beat TCU 36-35 after a TD with 36 seconds left and Isaiah Hankins' game-ending 33-yard field goal gave Baylor a 37-34 win over the Horned Frogs earlier this month.

## Pribula gives Penn State late options

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. – It's too chilly in Happy Valley for shirtless strolls around the practice field, but Beau Pribula and Andy Kotelnicki continue to bond even as those walks come to an end.

In his first year as Penn State's offensive coordinator, Kotelnicki has had to adjust No. 4 Penn State's game plan each week with two lingering questions.

How much Pribula is the right amount and how should Penn State (8-1, 5-1 Big Ten, No. 6 CFP) deploy the shifty dualthreat quarterback in an offense that's fueled primarily by rocket-armed starter Drew Allar?

"You have to evaluate how sustainable things are through the course of a game, for the course of the season," Kotelnicki said. "Evaluate if you're putting your players in a good position to do things that you know that they can execute well. So I think that we have been accurate in answering those two questions on a weekly basis."

The Nittany Lions will keep tinkering as they begin their final push toward a possible College Football Playoff berth with a trip to Purdue (1-8, 0-6) on Saturday.


Considering the Boilermakers' overall struggles on defense, Pribula could get more chances to boost his modest numbers. Seven reserve quarterbacks have played against the Boilermakers' 122nd-ranked defense so far this season.

It helps that Pribula has proven he can do more than just add an element to the running game.

"He's obviously shown it in games that he's extremely athletic," wide receiver Liam Clifford said. "He can make plays with his feet and then he can also obviously throw the rock pretty well, and I know he showed that in the Wisconsin game."

The fact that Pribula's arm came alive two weeks ago when the Nittany Lions needed him most has his teammates and coaches feeling confident that the team's quarterback depth is in a good place.

Then, the 6-foot-5, 235-pound Allar suffered an apparent left knee injury just before halftime. After a big hug from Allar, the 6-foot-2, 205-pound Pribula took over with Penn State down 10-7. He completed 11 of 13 throws – a handful of a 28-13 win.


