



Big money, same powers remain favorites

Headline after headline during the offseason spoke to the same reality for college football: Millions of dollars are headed directly into the pockets of players and only programs that can nimbly recalibrate and replenish their resources will succeed.

Now, with preseason camps winding down and opening kickoffs approaching, a different reality hits: The more things change, the more they stay the same.

The preseason AP Top 25 for 2025 could have just as easily come from 1975. The first official season of revenue sharing between schools and their players in the new name, image and likeness era of college sports is sorting programs into familiar categories.

The first includes college football's biggest brands, which are dominating the list of favorites once again: No. 1 Texas, No. 2 Penn State, No. 3 Ohio State and No. 4 Clemson.

Second are teams we've talked about over the past few decades that are using money and celebrity coaches to elbow their way into the conversation: Colorado, North Carolina and No. 23 Texas Tech.

And then there are those who see the second year of the 12-team playoff and a different playing field created by revenue sharing and think they might be able to fashion a turnaround not unlike No. 20 Indiana's worst to (almost) first resurgence last year: Pick a name, any name, but a good starting point might be UCLA (now with star QB Nico Iamaleava) or Virginia (which, like Indiana last year, avoids pretty much every top team on its conference schedule).

Jeffrey Kessler, the attorney who helped broker the massive legal settlement that compelled virtually all schools eligible for the playoff to share millions with their athletes, says these times remind him of the early 1990s, when the NFL introduced unrestricted free agency and the salary cap.

"It's a big change," Kessler said. "But I think the system will adapt and the better-managed athletic departments will do well, as they always do. And athletic departments that are poorly managed won't do so well, and probably didn't do so well in the old system, either."

Heisman, title watch

Pay or no pay, one thing hasn't changed in college football or any sport: Great players win games.

It's no big surprise, then, to see Texas at the top of almost everyone's watch list. Leading the Longhorns is none other than Arch Manning, the sophomore quarterback with the reported \$6 million-plus NIL deal, and the latest burgeoning star in a family that has produced lots of them, from Archie to Peyton to Eli.

"For Arch, he grew up in this era of seeing high-level football," Texas coach Steve Sarkisian said. "He's watched Super Bowls. He's watched

gold jackets getting put on. He's been to playoff games. He's been recruited at the highest level as the No. 1 player in the country."

Besides Manning, other favorites include receiver Jeremiah Smith, whose success with defending champion Ohio State figures to depend a lot on whether the Buckeyes' next quarterback, Julian Sayin, who is also in the Heisman mix, is as good as advertised.

Clemson QB Cade Klubnik is among the favorites, as are the Tigers for a repeat title in the ACC.

Quarterback Drew Allar is in his fourth season at Penn State, where the Nittany Lions are expected to face Ohio State for the Big Ten title. (They first play Nov. 1, and coach James Franklin is 1-10 against the Buckeyes.)

What about Alabama?

The Crimson Tide's four losses in coach Kalen DeBoer's first season were the most since Nick Saban's debut in 2007. The Tide's hopes for a turnaround rest on quarterback Ty Simpson, who won the starting job this month after sitting on the sideline for his first three seasons in Tuscaloosa.

Simpson is a rarity — a five-star recruit who didn't bail on his school in search of more playing time and potentially more money.

1. Receiving praise: Cam Coleman was one of the top freshman receivers in the nation last year with 598 yards and eight touchdowns. He's got some help this season with Georgia Tech transfer

Eric Singleton Jr. (754 yards) and Wake Forest transfer Horiatio Fields (463). Add returnee Malcolm Simmons (451) and the Tigers are looking at an elite group at wideout. "Obviously, it's a bunch of studs out there," quarterback Jackson Arnold said. "I'm not going to name them because we have too many. But I'm super excited by this group, and I think they're going to produce a lot on

the field this year."

- **2. Perfect fit:** The transfer portal is a nice way for teams to strengthen the roster, but it doesn't always work out. Some players aren't a good fit. Freeze came up with a way to help with that issue by giving potential transfers personality tests. It's like a college version of the Wonderlic tests NFL prospects take before the draft. "We definitely try to do that with portal kids because you're speed dating; you have 24 hours to make a decision, and I like that test," Freeze said. The Tigers added 19 transfers, including Arnold from Oklahoma.
- 3. Clean slate: The quarterback spot has been overhauled for Auburn. Of the six quarterbacks on the roster, John Colvin is the only returnee, and he didn't see action. Arnold should be the season-opening starter with Stanford transfer Ashton Daniels providing depth. Arnold split time as the starter at OU, passing for 1,421 yards and 12 TDs. Dual-threat, four-star freshman Deuce Knight and freshman Will Myers fill out the QB spot. Auburn was in the middle of the SEC pack with 3,167 passing yards (263 per game), but 13 interceptions ranked near the bottom.
- 4. Star power: Auburn hasn't had a first-round NFL draft selection since Derrick Brown in 2020. Defensive end Keldric Faulk could break that streak. The defensive anchor has been mentioned by several media outlets (CBS, ESPN) as a top-10 draft prospect. He has to have another big season to earn that spot, though. Faulk had 29 tackles, 11 for loss, including seven sacks last season. "Last year I was one of the leaders that led by example," Faulk said. "I had to take over that role of just being a little more vocal, letting people hear my voice."

Upset special

Cheer: Alabama. Anything can happen in Iordan-Hare Stadium, Although the past two visits to the Plains resulted in Crimson Tide wins courtesy of wild circumstances, Auburn should be poised for the upset. Alabama has won five straight Iron Bowls, but you have to go back over 40 years to find six straight Bama wins.

Jeer: Baylor. The first game of the season is a tone-setter, and the Tigers

aren't exactly full of confidence these days. There is a lot of depth chart adjusting going on before the season. Baylor is a tough leadoff opponent for a team trying to figure things out.

7-5: The Tigers could have easily been 7-5 last season. They blew leads to Oklahoma and Missouri and were in the mix with other games. It all came down to fourth-quarter failure. Correcting this is paramount for a winning season and a trip to a bowl, something the Tigers have done just once in the last three seasons. Freeze is on the hot seat and he knows it. The results will improve, but not enough to land the Tigers in the playoffs.

Four-down territory

1. 3 of a kind: Ty Simpson has been announced as the starting quarterback, taking over for two-year starter Jalen Milroe. It's not like Simpson is a fish out of water. The junior has seen some playing time in his three seasons, although mostly in mop-up duty. Still, he knows the offense and has an established relationship with the receivers. There is hype surrounding freshman Keelon Russell. a five-star player who is quick and can make plays outside the pocket. Also pushing for playing time is Austin Mack, who played for DeBoer at Washington. He saw limited playing time in 2024 but is battling for the backup spot.

2. Hubbub over Grubb: The offense had its fair share of issues last season. There were lots of finger pointing going on,

most of it in the direction of offensive coordinator Nick Sheridan. He's still on staff as the QB coach but he's out at coordinator, and Ryan Grubb is in. Grubb was the OC at Washington with DeBoer as head coach. That Huskie team was an offensive juggernaut and played in the national title game. "The rest of the staff has been awesome in how they embraced Ryan Grubb coming in," DeBoer said. "The players have, as well. Ryan's hit the ground running and added some things on the things he's learned."

3. Bust a move: A big fuss was made, rightfully so, about Tide receiver Ryan Williams and the fact he led the team with 865 yards and eight TDs last year - as a 17-year-old. His football skills are obvious, but he has other talents. "Behind the scenes, he is a funny guy," lineman Kadyn Proctor said. "If y'all ever get to talk to him, he's a funny,

goofy guy. You've seen him his TikTok dances. He's not afraid of who he is, and I love that for him. He's had great success his first year, and I know year two will be even better for him."

4. Head scratcher: There was much frustration with Alabama's rollercoaster 2024 season. The same team that beat No. 2 Georgia, followed it with an embarrassing loss to unranked Vanderbilt. There were also losses to Oklahoma and Michigan, also unranked. That's unusual for Alabama, but not for DeBoer. In five seasons as a Division I head coach, he's 15-3 against top-25 teams but 13-10 against unranked or FCS opponents. "You fight, execute, find a way to win," DeBoer said. "That's what we've got to do here going into year two at Alabama."

Extra point

The Crimson Tide failed to make the SEC title game last year, but Alabama hasn't missed the title game in backto-back seasons since 2010-11. Alabama has played in 10 league title games since 2008, winning nine.

Upset special

Cheer: Georgia. It will be hard to top last season's thriller, but Alabama has a flair for the theatrics when Georgia is involved. It's going to take a lot more than a Ryan Williams acrobatic catch to win this one, but recent history against the Dawgs is on the Tide's side.

Jeer: South Carolina. Bad news for Bama is LaNorris Sellers is back at OB for the Gamecocks. He nearly led South Carolina to the upset in Tuscaloosa last season. He might make it happen this time in Columbia.

"Going through a quarterback competition, that's pressure alone. These guys

10-3: A world-class defense, multiple weapons at the skill position and a solid offensive make the Crimson Tide a national title contender. The most important position is the quarterback, Alabama's big question mark. Ty Simpson is sure to be the week 1 starter, but - Edwin Stanton

he's got to take control early and win over the team if he intends to stay QB1. There is little margin for error if a playoff run is in Alabama's future. There is little wiggle room for DeBoer this season.

Four-down territory

1. Moving on: In a wild offseason with NIL negotiations, the Vols parted ways with quarterback Nico Iamaleava, who transferred to UCLA. The Vols picked up Joey Aguilar, who was at UCLA for a month or so before Iamaleava showed up. At Appalachian State, he had 3,003 passing yards and 23 TDs last season. "He's a great, decisive, decision maker, very good with the ball in his hands, takes care of the ball," linebacker Arion Carter said of Aguilar. George MacIntyre comes into Knoxville as a highly touted freshman expected to turn heads, unless he gets redshirted. Redshirt freshman Jake Merklinger is also in the mix.

2. Big shoes to fill: SEC offensive player of the year Dylan Sampson accounted for about half of the Vols' rushing yards and more than half of the touchdowns last year. He's gone, and the race is on to find some players to fill the void. That's easier said than done, but there are several candidates up for the task. DeSean Bishop

ran for 455 yards with three scores last season and is poised to be the starter. He will get pushed by Duke transfer Star Thomas (871 yards, 7 TDs). Peyton Lewis (339 yards, 3 TDs) will compete for carries as well. "The last two years we've led the SEC in rushing," Heupel said. "We have to continue to grow as we move forward this year into the 2025 season."

3. Help wanted: Ouarterback isn't the only open position the Vols need to fill. Sampson is gone, along with top receivers Dont'e Thornton Jr., Squirrel White and Bru McCoy. That's basically all of the Vols' offense. Peyton Lewis and DeSean Bishop are expected to step up at running back, but it's not cut and dry at receiver. The player with the most experience is Chris Brazzell II. He will be joined by Mike Matthews, Braylon Staley, Amari Jefferson, Radarious Jackson, Travis

Smith, and Joakim Dodson will have opportunities to shine.

4. Keep the line moving: The Vols were No. 2 in the SEC and No. 10 in the nation in run defense. A big reason was the defensive line. Sack leader James Pearce is gone, but seniors Joshua Josephs, Tyre West and Bryson Eason are back to pick up the slack, along with junior Daevin Hobbs. The quartet combined for seven sacks last year. "(Defensive line coach) Rodney Garner understands what it takes to win on Saturdays," Heupel said. "He does a great job of fundamentals and technique, and with the development of our guys."

Extra point

Mike Keith is the new "Voice of the Vols." Bob Kesling stepped down this past season, ending a 26-year career with Tennessee. Keith is a UT graduate and was the Tennessee Titans play-by-play guy from 1999-2024. Before Kesling, John Ward broadcast the Vols starting in 1965.

Upset special


Cheer: Alabama. After 15 years of Alabama being a one-sided affair, the Vols have made this series competitive again, winning two of the last three contests. The bad news is that the game is in Tuscaloosa, but the good news is Alabama's breaking in a new quarterback, too.

Jeer: Georgia. The Vols can't catch a break against the Bulldogs. They have lost eight straight to their neighbors to the south. Georgia comes to Knoxville this time, but the Dawgs are reloading while Tennessee is rebuilding.

1. It's about Manning time: College football fans have been waiting to see the nephew of Peyton and Eli, and the grandson of Archie, take the starting job forever. Finally, with Ouinn Ewers gone to the NFL, it's Arch's time to shine for the Longhorns. He got some meaningful snaps last season in certain situations, but now the Longhorns will sink or swim ing defenses might be able to exploit, with him calling the plays.

2. Longhorns are loaded: Even though

the spotlight will shine on the new quarterback, he's surrounded by stars. Tre Wisner returns at running back after rushing for 1,064 yards to lead the SEC and added five touchdowns. He also caught 44 passes for 311 vards and a score. Receivers DeAndre Moore Jr. and Ryan Wingo return, and Sarkisian added Stanford transfer Emmett Mosley V, who caught 48 passes for 525 yards and six TDs in his freshman campaign.

3. Line games: If there's a place opposat least early on, it's the offensive line where Texas is replacing four starters.

But most of the new starters have been working with Manning on the secondteam offense, so that will help the transition.

4. Defense stacked: Texas has potential All-America players across the defense. It starts up front with led by sophomore Colin Simmons, who had nine sacks in 2024. Anthony Hill Jr. might be the best linebacker in the country after recording 16.5 tackles for loss and eight sacks.

Extra point

Texas has improved its win totals in each of Sarkisian's four seasons. He has taken the Longhorns from five wins to seven wins to 12 wins and finally, to 13 wins last season. Can the Longhorns get to 14 or 15 this season and bring home a championship?

Upset special

Cheer: SEC teams get dissed for easy nonconference schedules and only playing eight conference games, but Texas will open at Ohio State, the team that ousted it in the CFP semifinals last season. No doubt that will play a part in Texas getting a measure of revenge on the Buckeyes, albeit in the season opener with both teams sporting different looks.

Jeer: Texas travels to Georgia in mid-November and the Bulldogs seemingly have Texas' number. Georgia won both meetings a year ago - in the regular season and SEC championship. Along with Ohio State, Georgia is one of the only other teams on the schedule that can match athletes with the Longhorns.

level of the defense.

"I thought he handled that moment well, and he taught a lot of our young players that you've got to be prepared and ready," Smart said. Stockton, from tiny Tiger, Georgia, in the northeast corner of the state, threw for 234 yards and a score in a playoff quarterfinal loss to Notre Dame.

3. A rematch with Bama: Last year's game in Tuscaloosa was wild, with the

Bulldogs mounting a massive comeback before Alabama rallied for a 41-34 win. Alabama is 9-2 in the series over the last 20 years, with the teams splitting a pair of national championship meetings, but this will be the Tide's first visit to Athens in a decade. "It's what the fan bases want. It's what the nation wants. It's what college football needs. It's what college football and the SEC is about," Smart said. "Georgia and Alabama at home, at our place, I wish it could happen more often."

4. A bright future: Georgia is blessed with excellent recruiting territory, and the Bulldogs are taking advantage.

vs. Notre Dame L. 23-10

Based on mid-August rankings from 247 Sports, they received four commitments from five-star prospects – all of whom are from Georgia - in the class of 2025, and their 2026 recruiting class currently ranks first nationally.

Extra point

Smart's .847 winning percentage so far is the best in program history, well ahead of modern standouts Mark Richt (.740 over 15 years) and Vince Dooley (.715 over 25 years).

Upset special

Cheer: Texas. It's borderline to even call this a potential upset, but it might be the likeliest opportunity for the Bulldogs to be an underdog.

3. Spin it, DJ! Quarterback DJ Lagway took over as the starter last October after Graham Mertz got hurt and provided optimism for a Florida team needing it. He completed nearly 60% of his passes rally for a respectable season. Four of the for over 1,900 yards and 12 touchdowns.

Now a sophomore, if Lagway himself can get healthy this season - he's recovering from a calf injury - Florida will not be an easy offense to stop. "We've built around the guy. There's no question," Napier said. "Players want to play with DJ."

4. Room for growth: Florida ranked second-to-last in total defense among SEC teams last year. While a challenging schedule might explain some of that, there's no reason Florida should finish ahead of only Mississippi State among SEC teams in total defense. But the Gators might be trending in the right direction: They held each of their final four opponents last season to fewer than 20 points.

Extra point

Florida finished last season on a fourgame winning streak. The Gators closed the prior two seasons on five-game and three-game losing skids.

Upset special

Cheer: Georgia. Few things would better indicate a successful turnaround than a win over the Bulldogs, who have won four straight and seven of eight in the series.

Jeer: Florida State. Weird things happen in rivalries. And while the Gators seem like a much-healthier program and a comfortable favorite right now, the Seminoles surely aren't going 2-10 again. A tight season finale wouldn't be a shock.





competition. So, is it a bare-knuckles fight or are gloves involved? To be fair, men's basketball won a share of the ASUN regular-season title last season, while men's tennis won the ASUN tournament title, men's cross country won the conference's individual crown and men's golf had an NCAA participant. Then again, one year is a small sample size - and against similar schools. Football, however, has been a different story. UNA has not produced a winning season since 2018 when it competed against a mixed DI and II schedule. The Lions are 21-49 since moving to the FCS, including a 6-19 mark against conference foes. They were picked to finish in a tie for seventh in their nine-team league this year. Ding. Ding.

3. Newer is better? UNA is replacing its

top passer (TJ Smith), receiver (Takairee Kenebrew), tackler (Gregory Reddick), sack leader (Jackson Bratton), interception leader (Ashaad Williams) and scorer (Scott Payne) from last season. The Lions also lost starting left tackle (Mickel Clay, who is now at West Virginia) and the UAC freshman of the year (LB Josh Anglin, who is now at Tulsa). But with the way recent results have been (see above), that might be a good thing. UNA ranked 71st in scoring offense (23.6 points per game) and 83rd in scoring defense (29.2 ppg). The NCAA listed 123 FCS teams.

4. Just be selfish: This is more directed at the offense. Hold onto the football. UNA turned the ball over 26 times last season, per ncaa.com. Want to know where that ranked in the FCS? It was tied for 119th with Murray State. Only Mississippi Valley State (27 turnovers), Rhode Island (27) and Stetson (31) were worse. UNA had 24 the year before. Conversely, the Lions were tied

What the Aggies need most is for Reed to make quicker decisions in the pocket, where he had a 29.4 grade under pressure. He tends to hold the ball too long, leading to turnovers. The Aggies were 13th in the league at 210 passing yards per game. He has to be better this season.

3. Best run game in the SEC? Some of the pressure on Reed will be alleviated by the return of Le'Veon Moss at running back, who was third in the SEC with 609 vards before sustaining a knee injury in the loss to South Carolina. Moss' backfield mates - Amari Daniels, Reuben Owens and EJ Smith – also return, and the Aggies were second in the SEC in rushing with 195.5 yards per game. A good run game should make it easier for Reed to have more success throwing.

4. Revamped receivers: Elko dipped into the transfer portal to land four players who should help Reed in the passing game, KC Concepcion (N.C. State), Mario Craver (Mississippi State) and Jonah Wilson (Washington) were added along with former Alabama/Texas tight end Amari Niblack. Concepcion caught 124 passes for 1,299 yards and 16 touchdowns during his career with the Wolfpack and is one of the top receivers in the yards after catch category.

Extra point

Former Auburn assistant Trooper Taylor begins his second season at Texas

A&M. Taylor was the receivers coach for the Tigers when they won the 2010 national championship. Auburn won 33 games and four postseason games during the well-traveled Taylor's four-year stint on the Plains.

Upset special

Cheer: The Aggies go to Notre Dame for their third game and should emerge with a win after the Fighting Irish were all-in last season in the hunt for a national title. It's not a must-win game, but a good road victory would give the Aggies plenty of momentum going into the SEC portion of their schedule.

Jeer: The Aggies should be favored in their first four SEC games, with only one on the road. Looming, though, is a game at LSU. A loss in Baton Rouge could scuttle the Aggies' conference title hopes.

Neither happened in 2024 and it's likely that another subpar season, which would be the third in his four years, could result in the program going another direction sooner rather than later with its head coach.

4. Reloading across the board: Venables

hit the transfer portal hard in an effort to shore up the team's many deficiencies. Tops among the newcomers are quarterback John Mateer (Washington State) and running back Jaydn Ott (Cal). Those two should make an immediate impact on a team that averaged 13.5 points in its six SEC losses.

Extra point

New offensive coordinator Ben Arbuckle is only 29 years old, but he already has a reputation as one of the best coordinators in the country. Last season at Washington State, Arbuckle's offense finished sixth nationally in scoring. That's good news for the Sooners, who were offensively challenged a year ago.

Upset special

Cheer: The Sooners will get an early gut check when Michigan comes to town on Sept. 6. A win over the Wolverines could set the stage for a bounceback season.

Jeer: The annual Red River Rivalry game on Oct. 11 will show if the Sooners have closed the gap on their rival and SEC favorite Texas. Truth is, they haven't.

3. Lesson learned? Last year, Mizzou's first road game of the year was its fifth game at Texas A&M. Mizzou came in undefeated and left with a 41-10 loss. "I feel like I let our team down by

Drinkwitz said. "We were not, with the adjustment of the transfer portal and players, I don't think they understood the routine and what it was going to be." This year's first road game is not until Oct. 18 at Auburn.

4. Perception and priorities: Drinkwitz was asked this summer if it bothers him that Missouri might not get as much as attention as other programs despite 21 wins over the past two seasons. "At the end of the day, two-minute drive, fourth quarter, that's not what you're thinking about. You think about your trust and belief in each other, doing your job at a higher level," he said. "You can think about it as temporary motivation, but in the key moments it's more about the belief in each other."

Extra point

Mizzou is coming off consecutive 10-win seasons for the third time in school history (2007-08, 2013-14). The Tigers have never had three in a row.

Upset special

Cheer: Alabama. This would be a stunner because recent history hasn't been kind to the Tigers. Last year's 34-0 Alabama romp was the Tide's fifth straight rout in the series.

State. He said offensive coordinator Bobby Petrino, who has experience with dual-threat quarterbacks, gives him the freedom to make changes at the line of scrimmage. Green completed 60% of his passes last year for 3,154 yards and 15 scores with nine interceptions, and he added 602 yards rushing and eight TDs.

3. Hooking up with the Horns: Texas' recent entrance into the SEC should help foster more meetings with Arkansas. They played regularly from the 1930s through the '80s, including a famous 15-14 Texas win in 1969, and have met sporadically in recent years. Texas won 20-10 last season in Favetteville. "I believe if you ask our fan base and from the feel of the stadium when we play the University of Texas, I believe that it's one of our rivals, if not number one," Pittman said.

4. Chef Ball: Senior defensive lineman Cam Ball has a passion for cooking, which he shared with his father, who died of cancer in June. Cam has big culinary plans. "I've got my own business, if you ain't heard of it. It's called Ball's Barbecue. Do your research, if you haven't. It's going to be jumping pretty soon now," he said. "But I specialize in ribs, chicken. My girlfriend, she (fixes) the sides with the baked beans and mac and cheese. Shout out to Cassidy. That's one of my biggest experiences, just having my teammates

over and selling plates to my teammates and people in Fayetteville."

Extra point

The Razorbacks' last seven losses dating to the finale of the 2023 season - have been to opponents that were ranked in the Top 25.

Upset special

Cheer: Missouri. The Tigers lead the Battle Line Rivalry 9-2 since 2012, but both Arkansas wins have been in Favetteville.

A substantial buyout in Stoops' contract makes that unlikely for now, but the team has something to prove to its supporters.

If it doesn't work with Calzada, the Cats might turn to Cutter Boley, a local product who was highly touted out of high school and had mixed results in a couple games late last year. An improved offensive line would help.

3. High-profile departures: Kentucky has lost some familiar faces beyond those who were out of eligibility. Ace recruiter Vince Marrow, who used connections in Ohio to upgrade Kentucky's talent level, left for an off-field role at Louisville. Kentucky's top two receivers - return specialist Barion Brown and Lexing-Georgia quarterback Brock Vandagriff. ton product Dane Key — transferred to

LSU and Nebraska, respectively. Hardley Gilmore and Ja'Mori Maclin, whose brother Jeremy was a standout at Missouri and the NFL, might be the top pass-catching targets.

4. Motivated Mark: Having expressed frustration in the past over some of the challenges of managing the program, Stoops points to his track record at Kentucky and maintains he can return UK to the competitive standard it has had for most of his tenure. "You look at the history of what we've done, there's a lot of great ones that didn't make it very long. I'm proud of the run that we have,"

Stoops said. "I want to use last year for us to learn from and to grow from [it] and to get better and to get back to who we want to be."

Extra point

The Oct. 18 game against Texas will be the Longhorns' first trip to Lexington. The two previous meetings were Texas wins in Austin — last year and 1951.

Upset special

Cheer: Louisville. Thumped last year at home, Kentucky has won four straight road games in this series where strangely — each team has a winning record in the other's stadium since the rivalry was renewed in 1994.

Jeer: Toledo. The idea of Kentucky opening with a loss is plausible enough that it's been a conversation piece among fans throughout the summer. The Cats should be fine, but a loss would dramatically turn up pressure on Stoops.

- 1. New sheriff in town: Kelly takes over as head coach after Rich Rodriguez left for West Virginia. Kelly brings a wealth of experience to the Gamecocks, most recently as an assistant at Auburn. In 2023, he was named 247Sports national recruiter of the year. Kelly has coached for Nick Saban, Hugh Freeze and Deion Sanders, among others. That's a pretty good pedigree to bring to Jacksonville
- 2. Transfer portal steal, Part I? The Gamecocks might have gotten a steal out of the transfer portal when TCU running back Cam Cook joined the program. Cook led TCU in rushing a year ago with 460 yards and nine touchdowns.

3. Transfer portal steal, Part II? Safety Trevor Woods joins the Gamecocks after four seasons at Colorado, where Kelly was his position coach in 2023. Woods had a solid career with the Buffaloes, where he played in 33 games with 168 tackles, three interceptions, three forced He's expected to be a main cog in the fumbles, and 10 pass breakups. He's a

welcome addition to the defense.

4. New coordinators: Trickett comes in as the offensive coordinator where he will get to work alongside his father, Rick. Trickett was at Georgia Southern a year ago and will also work with quarterbacks and tight ends. Williams comes to Jacksonville State after serving as Maryland's defensive coordinator for the past three seasons. He also has a previous stint at UAB.

Extra point

Very few players spend their entire career at one place, and Kelly tapped into the portal to add a few players with several previous schools on their resumés. New QB Gavin Wimsatt (Rutgers/ Kentucky), DT Khurtiss Perry (Alabama/ Virginia Tech) and DB Tre'Quon Fegans (Alabama/Southern Cal/Central Florida) are now on the roster.

Upset special

Cheer: Liberty. A lot of upsets happen early in the season. Even though the JSU program has undergone a transformation since Rodriguez left for West Virginia, an early win over CUSA favorite Liberty would be massive as the Gamecocks try to repeat as conference champs.

Jeer: Western Kentucky. The Gamecocks went 1-1 against the Hilltoppers a year ago with a regular-season loss and a championship game drubbing. This game could decide which team wins the regular-season title and a home loss could relegate the Gamecocks to third or fourth place.

1. Riding OB Kitna: Ouarterback Jalen Kitna was an eight-game starter last year and finished with 2,209 yards with 17 touchdowns and 11 interceptions. His 404 yards and six touchdowns against Tulsa helped the Blazers snap a six-game losing streak last year. Kitna started his college career at Florida but left after two seasons. He's the son of Jon Kitna. who played 14 NFL seasons and threw for almost 30,000 yards, 10,000 more than Dilfer in his 14 NFL seasons.

2. Bryant on an island: Safety Sirad Bryant is UAB's only returning defensive starter, though a major overhaul was in store after last year's matadorstyle effort. The Blazers gave up an average of almost 394 yards per game Delange was last season's American to rank 94th in the nation. Bryant played in every game last year, starting

10, and was third on the team with 60 tackles.

3. Delange hits spot: Kicker Jonah Conference special teams player of the year. He was 21-of-24 on field goals, including 2-of-2 from at least 50 yards. Delange hit the offseason in a slump, missing his final two kicks of the season at Charlotte (35 and 27 yards).

4. Bye, bye, Beebe: The Blazers would have had a nice running complement to

Kitna, but Lee Beebe absconded to Indiana. Beebe ran for 884 yards and seven touchdowns last year. The rest of the Blazers racked up 690 yards and two rushing touchdowns.

Extra point

The Blazers have 48 new players on their roster, a new defensive coordinator and five more new defensive assistant coaches.

Upset special

Cheer: Memphis? The Tigers have had a scorched-earth policy of late against the Blazers, scoring at least 45 points each of the last three meetings. At least the teams have a cool rivalry name: the Battle of the Bones.

Jeer: Hard to find due to the state of the program. How about Rice? After going to UConn, UAB will be making a second straight lengthy trip when the Blazers visit the Owls.

- 1. OB questions: After Matthew Caldwell turned in his Troy T for Texas, the Trojans have a quarterback conundrum. Goose Crowder and Tucker Kilcrease combined for 919 yards and eight touchdowns last year. Crowder was the starter going into last seasons before injuries derailed his season after 11 quarters. Kilcrease, due to injuries to Caldwell, started twice and played in seven games.
- **2. Taylor made (out):** Damien Taylor. after crossing 1,000 yards rushing last season, crossed state lines, fleeing Troy for Ole Miss. His 1,010 was the 13th 1,000-yard effort in school history, though he only scored seven times. The

Trojans have had a 1,000-yard rusher each of the last three years after Kimani Vidal totaled a school-record 1.661 in 2023 and 1.132 in 2022.

3. Ross hits road: Receiver Devonte Ross, Troy's biggest star last year, cashed in his big season with a ticket to Happy Valley. He's now at Penn State following a 76-catch, 1,043-vard season. His 11 touchdown catches led the Sun Belt and ranked fifth nationally.

4. Rough start: Troy's atrocious start

last year led to a late-season surge that stoked optimism, at least before the portal struck with a vengeance. The Trojans lost seven of their first eight with the victory coming over FCS Florida A&M. But, in the month of November, Troy ranked 10th in the nation in offense and 25th in defense, winning three of its final four games.

Extra point

Troy has an \$11.6 million indoor -A. Stacy Long

practice facility that is scheduled to open this season. Plans called for 88,000 square feet and a fully covered 120-yard turf field. The most-recent major football-related construction at Troy was its stadium north end zone project that opened in 2018.

Upset special

Cheer: South Alabama. Troy had dominated the series in recent years before last season's hiccup. Both teams have major portal-inflicted questions to answer early this year.

Jeer: Louisiana-Monroe. ULM has been the dregs of the Sun Belt, recording all of one winning season this century (2012). The Warhawks, however, were 5-7 last year in Bryant Vincent's first season as coach, a three-win improvement over 2023. It included a win at Troy.

Bothwell, after starring for the Jags as a freshman, now suits up for the Mississippi State Bulldogs. That leaves Bullock, who had 41 more carries last year, to shoulder a heavier load. The two each had 832 yards a season ago with Bothwell scoring 13 times and Bullock

4. Just Blayne good: Junior linebacker -A. Stacy Long

vs. Western Michigan W, 30-23

Blayne Myrick is the Sun Belt Conference's preseason defensive player of the year. He racked up 101 tackles last season, reaching double figures in five games, including a career-high 13 at Arkansas State. His tackle total was the highest for the Jags in seven years.

Extra point

Last year's top two receivers, Jamaal Pritchett and Jeremiah Webb, both signed NFL free agent contracts this spring. They combined for 127 of USA's 154 catches last year, 1,775 of its 3,163 receiving yards, and 14 of its 21 passing

Upset special

Cheer: Tulane. In so doing, the Jags can help Mobile gain Mardi Gras bragging rights over New Orleans.

Jeer: Troy. South snapped a six-game losing streak to the Trojans last year in what's called the Battle of the Belt and hasn't won at Troy since 2017.


