



Four-down territory

1. Still the man: Jackson Arnold has had a rough go of it the past three games, passing for 482 yards with one touchdown and 15 sacks. Against Georgia, Arnold went 14-for-19 for 107 vards in the first half but was 5-of-12 for 20 yards in the second half. Despite the struggles, Auburn coach Hugh Freeze gave the Oklahoma transfer a vote of confidence this week week and is sticking with him as the starter. Backups have not seen significant playing time. Freshman Deuce Knight has just five pass attempts and Stanford transfer Ashton Daniels has not played.

2. Dismissal: Auburn running back Damari Alston is no longer with the team, Freeze confirmed this week, saying Alston "failed to meet the expectations and standard of our program." Alston, a team captain, played in four games with 32 carries for 128 yards and a touchdown. He was one of three Tigers with significant rushing attempts (Arnold 83, Jeremiah Cobb 70). Freeze said the backup options to Cobb will likely be Omar Mabson II, Justin Jones (combined 11 carries) and Alvin Henderson (no carries).

3. Battle ahead: Ahmad Hardy leads the SEC in rushing (782) and rushing touchdowns (9). But the entire Missouri run game is dangerous. Mizzou is No. 6 nationally in rushing offense with 1,623 yards and its 19 rushing scores is tied for third most in the nation. The Tigers average 270 yards per game. The good news is Auburn is No. 11 in the nation in run defense, allowing just 86 yards per game with a 106 average in three SEC games. Last week against Alabama, Hardy failed to top the 100-yard mark for the first time this season, finishing

4. Taking their time: Missouri is second in the nation in average time of possession (34:49) behind Army. Even scarier, the Tigers boast the nation's No. 2 defense (224) and No. 7 offense (511) in yards per game, making Missouri the only team in the country to rank within

the top seven in both categories. With a methodical offense and a defense that holds opponents to 25% on third down conversions (19-of-77), Auburn could be in for a long day. Auburn is 36% on third down, including three straight threeand-outs in the second half against Georgia.

Key matchup

Auburn LB Elijah Melendez vs. Missouri **LB Khalil Jacobs**

Melendez, a true freshman, has steadily become a leader for the Tigers. He has 17 tackles, including six (two for a loss) last week. Jacobs is a mainstay for Mizzou with 20 tackles and three sacks.

Player of the week Cam Coleman, WR

Auburn is in a rut right now, and someone must step up and right the ship. Coleman appears to be up for the challenge. A 50-yard game last week and an 88-yard effort against Oklahoma shows he's capable of taking over a game.

Manning shrugs off critics with smile

AUSTIN, Texas – All smiles after the biggest victory of his career, Texas quarterback Arch Manning said Monday he wasn't bothered by the harsh criticism leveled at him the first half of the season.

Everyone, he said, is entitled to their opinion of him.

"Look, I wasn't playing well and I'm going to continue to get better. But you know, everyone has their own opinion. That's what's good about America, everyone gets freedom of speech. It doesn't bother me," Manning said Monday.

Manning struggled through his first five games as a starter while No. 21 Texas (4-2, 1-1 Southeastern Conference) fell all the way from preseason No. 1 to unranked for a week.

But a crisp and efficient effort in a 23-6 win over rival Oklahoma in the pressure cooker of the Cotton Bowl in Dallas was the kind of performance by a player and team that could turn a season around.

Manning completed 21 of 27 passes for 166 yards and threw the go-ahead 12-yard TD to DeAndre Moore Jr. on the opening drive of the second half for the Longhorns. He both managed the game and delivered the big plays in a confidence builder of a game.

But those moments have been the end of the year," Taaffe said.

exception rather than the rule for the player who was a preseason favorite for the Heisman Trophy.

Those kind of expectations opened him to intense criticism amid a rough start for the player and the team. The critics reached a fever pitch last week after a road loss at Florida left the Longhorns unranked.

And they'll be back if he has another poor game.

"I feel like I try to do my best to block out the noise, and then you get 100 text messages, 'Keep blocking out the noise,'" Manning said. "There must be a lot of noise. So yeah, I try my best."

Texas plays at Kentucky (2-3, 0-3) on Saturday night.

"Every single game is a national championship game is how we're looking at it," Moore said. "So every week needs our most and our best."

The Longhorns were staggered a week earlier with a loss at Florida that pushed them out of the national rankings.

"There's no such thing as a championship team without going through some adversity," Texas safety Michael Taaffe said after loss at Florida.

At that point, Taaffe also predicted the Longhorns were about to go on a "crazy run" to put the season back on track.

Four-down territory

- 1. Gamblin' man: Alabama coach Kalen DeBoer hasn't been shy about going for it on fourth down this season. It's paid off. too. Alabama is 10-of-16 on fourthdown conversions. Alabama has scored seven touchdowns on those possessions with three fourth-down scores (Missouri, Vanderbilt and Wisconsin). On fourth down, Alabama was 3-of-3 against Missouri, 2-of-3 vs. Vandy, but 2-of-5 against Florida State. Most of that was out of necessity, trailing by two touchdowns in the second half. Alabama was 7-of-13 overall on fourth down last
- 2. Swiss Army tackle: Kadyn Proctor is an All-SEC caliber tackle, but the 6-foot-7, 366-pounder has also lined up at receiver, running back, and was QB in the wildcat formation last week, picking up a first down. He also picked up a first down as a running back against Vanderbilt, and nearly scored on a pitch play against Georgia. "We're using it in big moments," DeBoer said. "It's something that we feel isn't just exhibition. It's something we feel like (Proctor) can do some things in a positive way where we can gain yards in critical moments."
- 3. Playing time push: Freshman defensive back Dijon Lee saw significant snaps last week in taking over for starter Domani Jackson. He even sealed the game with an interception. Fellow freshman lineman Michael Carroll also earned extra playing time, taking over for Wilkin Formby at right tackle. More game reps could be on tap this weekend. "You have to answer for the things that we put on tape and we liked what Dijon was doing in the game. As the game was going on, he was operating at a very efficient level and doing his job at an efficient level," Alabama defensive coordinator Kane Wommack said.
- 4. No Jam session: It's obvious the Alabama run game is better with Jam Miller in the backfield. In the two Power 5 games he didn't play due to injury, the

the three SEC games Miller played in, Alabama ran for 117, 146 and 125. Miller is questionable for Tennessee due to concussion protocol. The good news is backup Kevin Riley has found his groove (167 yards) and third-string back Daniel Hill performed well in Miller's late absence against Missouri, rushing for 16 yards with a nice touchdown catch.

Key matchup

Alabama K Connor Talty vs. Tennessee K Max Gilbert

Special teams are important in these rivalry games. Talty hasn't been consistent outside of 40 yards (2-of-5), but reliable inside 40 (5-of-5). Gilbert is solid for the Vols, 4-of-6 outside 40 yards (including two from beyond 50) and a Crimson Tide ran for 159 total yards. In perfect 6-for-6 inside of 40 yards.

Player of the week **Lotzeir Brooks. WR**

The true freshman (13 catches for 216 yards) has played well this season and stepped up his game against Missouri (four catches, 58 yards). Alabama will need him again against Tennessee.

Alabama has turned the season around since the debacle in the opener against FSU. The Tide handled business in the first three SEC games, but Bama isn't going to waltz in and catch Tennessee off guard. The Vols are a scoring machine with the No. 1 scoring offense in the nation (48 points per game) and the defense is the best in the nation in sacks (26). Ty Simpson has to have time to make plays in the pocket with Jam Miller's status at running back in

Four-down territory

- **1. Tying up Ty:** Alabama quarterback Ty Simpson is having a remarkable season and is in the Heisman Trophy discussion. He leads the SEC in passing efficiency and touchdowns (16). He makes it tough on defenses with the ability to escape the pocket and run if he has to. "He is playing with a lot of confidence, is a good decision maker that is taking care of the football," Vols coach Josh Heupel said. The good news for UT is getting to the quarterback is the defense's specialty. The Vols lead the nation with 26 sacks.
- **2. Tide Takeaways:** One key factor to Alabama's success this season is ball control. The offense has just three turnovers, two of which came last week with a Simpson interception and fumble. Tennessee has a knack for forcing turnovers — and scoring on them. Forcing a turnover or two could change the game in the Vols' favor. ""Everyone at any time can make plays so it is fun being a part of a defense that can make plays," Tennessee defensive back Jalen McMurrav said.
- **3. Big push:** One area where Alabama is susceptible is in the run game and teams have ripped off big runs against the Tide. It all starts with strong offensive line play, which has led the Vols' No. 3 rushing offense in the SEC. Alabama's run defense is 13th in the league, giving up 156 yards per game. "We just have to do our assignments and do our jobs at a high level, play physical because they are going to be really good and play physical with good hands," UT lineman Jesse Perry said. "We just have to match that and more."
- **4. Ready to go:** Speaking of the run game, Tennessee running back DeSean Bishop left last week's game against Arkansas with a lower body injury and didn't return. He ended the day with - Edwin Stanton

146 yards and a touchdown. The team's leading rusher (481, 5 TDs) is recovering, and Heupel said, "I feel like DeSean will be ready to go in this one."

Key matchup

Tennessee K Max Gilbert vs. Alabama **K Connor Talty**

Special teams are important in these rivalry games. Gilbert is solid for the Vols, going 4-of-6 outside 40 yards (including two from beyond 50) and a perfect 6-for-6 inside of 40. Talty hasn't been consistent outside of 40 yards (2-of-5), but reliable inside 40 (5-of-5).

One of the leaders on the defensive line. West can come up with the big play at the right time. He has 15 tackles, including four sacks.

The best thing Tennessee can do against Alabama is to not change anything. The style of play, score in bunches and lean on the defense, has worked well. The atmosphere will be rough, and Tennessee hasn't won in Tuscaloosa since 2003. Still, the Vols are playing sound football and have finished games strong, something that will combat the Crimson Tide's second-half surge (average of seven points allowed in second half).

Four-down territory

1. Perhaps a first? It's starting to — well, it is - sound like a broken record. UNA has not had the same quarterback start and finish a game this season. Maybe that will change Saturday. Destin Wade, who has been nursing a shoulder injury since the Sept. 20 game at Illinois State, played in the second half of last week's 49-21 blowout loss to Central Arkansas after receiving a pain-numbing shot. He finished 7-for-23 passing for 86 yards and a touchdown. Wade is completing just 49% of his throws for 391 yards and four scores in five appearances, but he has just to turn the ball over, a positive for a team that has only scored more than 30 points once in four matchups against FCS opponents.

2. Can it be close at halftime? This is directed at UNA's defense. In each of the last two games -a 52-23 loss atAbilene Christian and Central Arkansas (see above) - the Lions have surrendered 28 and 35 points (as well as 248 and 310 yards), respectively, in the first half. It resulted in the Lions being down 21 points each time. It seems like that would be some deficits to battle back from, right? If you said yes, you are correct. UNA is tied for 120th out of 126 FCS teams in scoring defense (40.8 points per game) and 116th in total defense (468.3 vards per game).

3. Another close matchup? This is the fourth matchup between UNA and Eastern Kentucky. Each of the previous three were relatively close with 10 points being the largest margin of victory. The Colonels won 56-53 in 2022 after then-quarterback Parker McKinney led an eight-play, 64-yard drive in the final minute. Eastern Kentucky claimed a 32-22 win in 2023 that was made closer after Lions receiver J.J. Evans caught a 3-yard touchdown with 1:44 remaining. Last year, the Colonels closed out the regular season - and clinched a playoff spot — with a 21-15 victory thanks to Matt Morrissey's 67-yard touchdown pass to Marcus Calwise Jr. with 8:10 left in the fourth quarter.

4. Learning to march? Eastern Kentucky

began the season by playing at Louisville and at Marshall in two of the first three weeks. Naturally, both were losses. The Colonels, however, are 3-1 against FCS opponents with the three wins -Houston Christian, Nicholls State and then-No.16 Austin Peay – being decided by 10 points or more. Eastern Kentucky enters Saturday on a two-game win streak. The loss came courtesy of then-No. 22 West Georgia. The Wolves won 33-12.

Key matchup

EKU DL Brad Gurley Jr. vs. UNA interior 0L

Gurley leads the Colonels with four sacks, including two in each of the past two games, and six tackles for loss. His four sacks are tied for third in the UAC. The Lions surrendered three sacks last week and there were plenty of times Wade was forced out of the pocket to scramble around for his life. Best not to have a repeat of that this week.

Player of the week

Fred Vili, DL

UNA has sacked opposing quarterbacks 11 times. Just 3 1/2 have come from defensive ends. Vili recorded his first sack of the season last week and led the Lions with 1 1/2 tackles for loss. It would be good for UNA to see him do that again.



8 SEC teams remain in hunt for CFP bid

For once, maybe for the first time this season, an SEC Saturday played out as you'd expect.

Alabama survived on the road, Texas A&M flexed some muscle, Tennessee survived the Bobby Petrino experience and Auburn saw another golden opportunity slip away - in part, due to controversial officiating.

Oh, there was an upset. Texas played up to expectations to slay Oklahoma. And no one could have thought Washington State would give Ole Miss a challenge, yet the Rebels survived.

Nationally, is another story. Indiana stunned the world by beating Oregon. Complain all you want about the schedule, but the Hoosiers are the real deal and seem like a CFP lock.

Meanwhile, Florida State and Penn State dropped their third straight, falling from Top 10 rankings to oblivion. Things are so bad that James Franklin went from preseason favorite to well-compensated unemployed.

Right now, your possibilities for the CFP are narrowing by the week. We're still seeing projections of four or five SEC teams in the field, but that's frankly off the mark because of the roads ahead. For the SEC to dominate the field, you need a lot of collapses elsewhere.

Let's take a minute to look at the latest contenders and how the metrics compare:

- Big Ten (4 contenders): No. 1 Ohio State (6-0, ranked 1st in the Sagarin ratings with a strength of schedule of 17); No. 8 Oregon (5-1, 3rd in Sagarin, 33rd SOS). No. 3 Indiana (6-0, 4th in Sagarin, 30th SOS); No. 20 Southern Cal (5-1, 13th in Sagarin, 57th SOS).
- **SEC (8):** No. 6 Alabama (5-1, 5th Sagarin, 2nd SOS); No. 4 Texas A&M (6-0, 7th Sagarin, 15th SOS); No. 9 Georgia (5-1, 8th Sagarin, 10th SOS); No. 21 Texas (4-2, 9th Sagarin, 42nd SOS); No. 10 LSU (5-1, 10th Sagarin, 9th SOS); No. 5 Ole Miss (6-0, 12th Sagarin, 47th SOS); No. 11 Tennessee (5-1, 15th Sagarin, 46th SOS); No. 17 Vanderbilt (5-1, 19th Sagarin, 67th SOS).
- ACC (3): No. 2 Miami (5-0, 6th Sagarin, 8th SOS); Louisville (4-1, 25th Sagarin, 59th SOS); No. 12 Georgia Tech (6-0, 32nd Sagarin, 56th SOS).

- Others (3): No. 13 Notre Dame (4-2, 2nd Sagarin, 5th SOS); No. 22 Memphis (6-0, 36th Sagarin, 134th SOS); No. 19 USF (5-1, 41st Sagarin, 34th SOS).

Looking ahead

• LSU at Vanderbilt (11 a.m. on ABC): Who has the scarier offense? Right now, it's the brainiacs from Nashville. But LSU's defense is championship worthy.

- Oklahoma at South Carolina (11:45 a.m. on SEC Network): John Mateer is back, but the Sooners got smoked last week. This isn't the guaranteed rebound you need to get back on track.
- Ole Miss at Georgia (2:30 p.m. on ABC): Break out the caffeine. Two notorious slow starters face-off between the hedges. This is Ole Miss' biggest remaining challenge.
- Tennessee at Alabama (6:30 p.m. on ABC): Another week another Top 16 foe for Bama as the Tide continues

its revenge tour. The Third Saturday in October gets prime-time treatment. Now, if they'd both only wear their home colors, like in the days of yore.

• Missouri at Auburn (6:45 p.m. on ESPN): Another big one down on the Plains and another chance for Hugh Freeze to grasp that elusive Top 25 victory.





