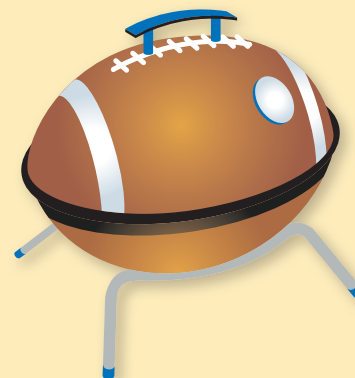

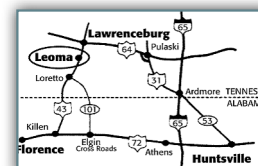

The series: First meeting.

Four-down territory

1. Bad to worse: It's bad enough when Ty Simpson gets sacked, but it's worse when he is strip sacked. That's happened in five straight games. The one against Oklahoma last week led to a field goal and the deciding 23-21 score. Two other strip sacks led to field goals for opponents while another led to a touchdown. "The message all week that Ty knows and is frustrated about is getting the ball out of his hand," offensive coordinator Ryan Grubb said. "He's beaten himself up more than anybody."

2. Time for change? Daniel Hill had one of the most productive outings by a Crimson Tide running back all season in last week's loss. He rushed for 60 yards and two touchdowns with five receptions for 37 yards. He earned more carries (15) than starter Jam Miller (nine for 27 yards). While the run game is one of the worst in the SEC (14th), Alabama could benefit by inserting Hill as the starter. For now, it's still Miller's job. "He wasn't perfect, just like any player," Grubb said of Hill. "I think he's shown the capability of being the guy who can get those tough yards."

3. Responds well: Excluding the season finale against Michigan, the Crimson Tide followed a loss with a win three straight times in 2024. Alabama dropped this year's opener but followed with a win. There isn't much concern Alabama dropping this weekend's matchup with the Panthers, but the loss to OU still stings considering the playoff and SEC title-game implications. "I can already see us dialed in. I know the character of this football team," Alabama head coach Kalen DeBoer said.

4. Panther pride: Alabama defensive coordinator Kane Wommack has a soft spot in his heart for Eastern Illinois. He got his first defensive coordinator job with the Panthers as a 26-year-old. "I learned a lot, positively and certainly through certain adversity as well," he said. "There's some people that are still in that program, Tom Michael, their athletic director who I have a tremendous

amount of respect for. So, a neat opportunity to play them and obviously for our guys I think we're all just ready to get back there on the field."

Key matchup

Alabama DL Edric Hill vs. Eastern Illinois DL Samuel Robles

Hill has started just two games, but is a big presence off the bench with 17 tackles and two sacks. Robles is the leader for the Panthers up front with 27 tackles, including four sacks and six tackles for loss.

Player of the week

Red Morgan, CB

The backup has come up big the

last two games with tackles in the backfield, including a forced fumble against Oklahoma. He's getting more playing time — and should see much more against the Panthers.

Mercer at Auburn

When: 1 p.m. Saturday
TV/radio: SEC+/FM-94.9, FM 100.3
Records: Mercer (9-1), Auburn (4-6)
The series: Auburn leads 13-0.

Four-down territory

1. Take a seat: Ashton Daniels will sit out the Mercer game to keep his redshirt status intact, said Auburn interim coach D.J. Durkin. Daniels could see action if needed against Alabama next week and maintain his redshirt status. That leaves Jackson Arnold and Deuce Knight as the options for Saturday. Arnold has 1,278 passing yards and six touchdowns through nine games. Knight has played in just one game and has two completions on five attempts for 20 yards.

2. Full strength: Top receiver Cam Coleman had an extra week to rest and recover from an ankle injury he sustained against Vanderbilt. He was limited in that game but still finished it. Coleman has 47 receptions for 617 yards and four touchdowns. "Cam's healthy, he's great," Durkin said. "He's been practicing and doing well. He's a full go. I think whenever he hobbled from the game, that's just part of it. He had a lot of touches, and we made a lot of plays in the game as part of it. We're excited about having him to continue to move forward."

3. Slight adjustment: The Auburn defense didn't live up to its reputation the last time out in a 45-38 overtime loss to Vanderbilt. The Tigers hadn't allowed more than 24 points in a game all season. That game was the Tigers' first since firing Hugh Freeze, and the staff was still working out new assignments. With the help of the bye week, Durkin and the staff have put a better plan in place. "It's important in any profession, especially ours, that you take time and reflect. You have to go back and reflect," Durkin said. "We coach our guys all the time and grade them on the film on what they did. I think as a coach, we do the same things."

4. Don't forget him: Most of the attention at receiver goes to Coleman, and rightfully so. But Eric Singleton Jr. has become a valuable weapon for the Tiger offense. He has a catch in every game of his career, extending his streak to 34 games with a career-high 11 catches for 102 yards and a touchdown in Auburn's last game at Vanderbilt. The 11 receptions

were the most by an Auburn player since Seth Williams had 13 vs. Georgia in 2019.

Key matchup

Auburn RB Jeremiah Cobb vs. Mercer RB CJ Miller

Cobb has proved to be one of the top backs in the SEC with 904 yards (90 per game) and four touchdowns. Miller is the bell cow for Mercer with 804 yards (81 per game) and 13 touchdowns.

Player of the week

Jackson Arnold, QB

After being benched for a few games,

Arnold will get his chance to shine with Ashton Daniels sitting this one out. It's a perfect opportunity for success and confidence building.

By the numbers

The Tigers have lost six of their last seven games, so Mercer is a welcome sight. The Bears are a great Southern Conference team, but they don't have a chance, even against an abysmal Auburn team. Auburn needs all the confidence it can get before hosting Alabama next week for their regular-season finale.

Tennessee at Florida

When: 6:30 p.m. Saturday

TV/radio: ABC/ FM-97.9/AM-1340

Records: No. 20 Tennessee (7-3, 3-3 SEC), Florida (3-7, 2-5)

The series: Florida leads 32-22.

Four-down territory

1. In the running: Chris Brazzell is having an exceptional season and is one of the top receivers in the nation. With 873 yards and eight touchdowns, Brazzell was named a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award, given to the best receiver in the country. "I never was really worried about Biletnikoff to be honest, so I wasn't really thinking it, but I kind of thought and believed in myself as one of the best receivers," he said.

2. Swamp fever: Saying Tennessee doesn't play well in Gainesville is a huge understatement. The Vols haven't won in the Swamp since 2003 and have an 8-17 overall record at their rival's home field. The last three meetings in the Sunshine State have not been close with the Vols being outscored 101-33. "This is a great game, and it's going to be a great stage," Vols coach Josh Heupel said. "One play doesn't have anything to do with the next, and a previous trip down to Gainesville doesn't have anything to do with it."

3. Fast start: Tennessee outscores opponents 688-247 in the first quarter under Heupel, including 145-45 this season. The Vols have scored at least one touchdown in the first quarter in 49 of 62 games, including nine of 10 games this season. Six of those 10 games have seen the Vols score multiple first-quarter touchdowns. "You've got to prepare the right way. You've got to practice the right way, and you're going to have to go play extremely well in this one," Heupel said.

4. Not a factor: The Vols are not worried about any changes the Gators and interim coach Billy Gonzales might have planned for Saturday. Florida has a few games under its belt with Gonzales at the helm, so the Vols don't expect to see anything out of the ordinary, but are staying cautious. "You know that there could be a whole change in the offense or defense," UT linebacker Jeremiah Telander said. "We do have a couple of games (on film) with them and the new coach. We trust our preparation and what the coaches tell us."

Tennessee RB DeSean Bishop vs. Florida RB Jadan Baugh

Don't be surprised to see both players have big days. Bishop has been reliable the whole season with 770 yards on 119 attempts with 10 touchdowns. Baugh has been the workhorse for the Gators with 164 attempts for 808 yards and six touchdowns.

Player of the week

Colton Hood, DB

The freshman has made an immediate impact and is tied for fifth in the SEC in

pass breakups with eight, and he has four tackles for loss.

By the numbers

Southern Utah at UNA

When: 6 p.m. Saturday

TV: ESPN+

Records: Southern Utah (6-5, 5-2 UAC), UNA (2-9, 1-6)

The series: Tied 1-1.

Four-down territory

1. Signing off: It is finally here. UNA's final game at Braly Stadium. It's been the Lions' home since the program was restarted in 1949. UNA will move into its new facility next season. While it has outlived its usefulness, Braly has seen some notable achievements from the Lions. They won three straight Division II national titles (1993-95) there and had two more teams (1985 and 2016) qualify for the title game (although those were played in different stadiums). Overall, UNA has compiled a 281-134-8 record at Braly, including a 26-8 mark in playoff games. It's been quite rough since the Lions decided to move to Division I in 2018. They have a 16-20 home record since then and have produced five straight losing records. A loss Saturday would make six. But seven of those 16 wins came in the first two years of the DI move. So, is parting sweet sorrow?

2. One streak will continue: UNA has lost its last four games, including the 61-0 scrubbing it received at Tarleton State last week. It was the worst loss in school history. Another loss on Saturday would tie the program mark for most losses in a regular season. The Lions went 1-10 in 1971 and in 2022. Southern Utah, meanwhile, comes into the matchup the victor of five straight. That includes a 31-24 win over Abilene Christian (a team that beat UNA 52-23), a 33-17 victory against Austin Peay (a team UNA lost to 56-28) and a 28-21 win over Central Arkansas (a team that topped UNA 49-21). The Thunderbirds also bested Utah Tech 28-7 (a team tied with the Lions at the bottom of the league standings, but beat UNA 34-33 in overtime) and Eastern Kentucky 27-17 (a team UNA also beat 35-14).

3. Push the pause button: Perhaps it's fitting Southern Utah will be the

opponent for UNA's final game at Braly. The Thunderbirds were the Lions' first opponent in that first DI season in 2018. UNA won 34-30 in Cedar City, Utah. (It was not a sign of things to come.) The Lions returned last season and lost 38-26. But this might be the last matchup between the two for a while. Southern Utah is leaving the UAC after this season to return to the Big Sky, a place it was a conference member from 2012-21. UNA is remaining in the UAC, which will be the rebranded WAC for all sports.

4. Familiar face: Southern Utah coach DeLane Fitzgerald and UNA coach Brent Dearmon are acquainted with each other. Fitzgerald served as Dearmon's college offensive coordinator at Bethel (Tennessee) in 2005. The Wildcats finished the season 7-4, including 5-0 in conference play. Dearmon was a junior quarterback. It was of his quieter seasons. Dearmon, who holds the school records for career passing yards (7,045) and touchdowns (77), had his fewest passing yards that season (not listed among the single-season marks with his three other years) as well as passing TDs (13, after 25 as a freshman, 21 as a sophomore and 18 as a senior). Fitzgerald left the next year to be the offensive coordinator at DIII

Southern Virginia.

Key matchup

UNA defense (the whole thing) vs. Southern Utah RB Joshua Dye

Stopping Dye will be the Lions' top priority. The redshirt sophomore ranks second in the FCS with 1,723 rushing yards, 9 yards behind Monmouth's Rodney Nelson. Dye leads the FCS in rushing touchdowns with 25. Not too shabby considering Targhee Lambson rushed for more than 1,900 yards for the Thunderbirds last season, which included a 173-yards and three-touchdown effort against UNA last season. The Lions are giving up almost 180 yards on the ground per game this year.

Player of the week

Your best guess

Is there even one to pick after last week's debacle? But let's go with QB John Austin Wood. It's been a tough going for the freshman since he was pressed into playing time against West Georgia, where he finished 4-for-11 passing for 25 yards and an interception. He followed that up with another 4-for-11 outing at Tarleton State for 23 yards before being benched for DC Tabscott, who proceeded

to throw four interceptions. Overall, Wood has led the offense to three points in his two showings, but he also hasn't gotten a chance to look very comfortable, either. He's getting hit — in the backfield — a lot. Southern Utah's Lando Brown leads the league with 12 sacks.

Samford at No. 3 Texas A&M

When: 11 a.m. Saturday
TV: SEC+
Records: Samford (1-10), Texas A&M (10-0)
The series: First meeting.
The lowdown: This will be Scot Sloan's second game as Samford's interim coach. The Bulldogs lost 30-16 at Austin Peay last week. ... Texas A&M managed — barely — to top lowly South Carolina. The Aggies needed to engineer a 27-point

comeback — the largest in school history — to win 31-30. ... This will be Samford's second Power Four opponent. Its second trip to Texas as well. The Bulldogs lost 42-7 at Baylor on Sept. 13. This time, however, Samford is likely to keep an eye out for wayward state troopers. ... Texas A&M is 10-0 for the first time since 1992 and has its first 10-win season since 2012. The Aggies finished 11-2 that year. ... Samford's win came against fellow bottom-feeder VMI. The Bulldogs

won 24-22 on Oct. 18. VMI is also 1-10. ... Samford, however, will be well compensated for its future beatdown. The Aggies are paying \$550,000. ... Texas A&M opened its pocketbook for Mike Elko, too. He received a six-year extension after the comeback win.

Records: Missouri (7-3, 3-3 SEC),

Oklahoma (8-2, 4-2)
The series: Oklahoma leads 67-25-5.
The lowdown: The former rivals in the Big 8 and then Big 12 met last year for the first time since 2011. Missouri won 30-24. ... Hardy scored on runs of 72, 43 and 10 yards. ... Hardy fell 19 yards shy of the school record set by Devin West in 1998. ... Hardy has 1,346 yards this season, which ranks fifth in Mizzou single-season history, and took over as the nation's leader. ... Hardy's 300 is the most in an FBS game this season. ... The Tigers also returned two interceptions for touchdowns for the second time in school history. They also did it at Texas Tech in 2006. ... 


Michael Van Buren Jr., LSU's starting quarterback after Garrett Nussmeier's injury, was 21-of-31 for 221 yards and the go-ahead 12-yard TD. ... Western Kentucky racked 642 yards total offense in last week's 42-26 win over Middle Tennessee. It marked the seventh straight win by the Hilltoppers in a rivalry known as 100 Miles of Hate. ... Coaching carousel joins season of chaos

We've only got two weeks left of the most chaotic, thrilling college football regular season we've ever seen. Yes, even better than 2007, which was more a battle of mediocrity. (Sorry, LSU.)

Nowhere does this hold true more than the SEC.

Yes, the haves and have-nots have separated, by the slimmest of margins. Consider poor Arkansas, winless in the SEC, yet five of the losses have come by six points or less. The exception: a nine-point loss to Auburn that kept the Tigers out of the cellar.

Meanwhile Auburn's losses pile up in one-score affairs. Flip those around and these Tigers could easily be headed into the Iron Bowl playing for a CFP berth.

Chaos, we expected. But only on the field. Now it's spilling over into the world of coaching carousels. Lane Kiffin has his choices of life-changing offers. Last week, it looked like he'd bolt Oxford for Gainesville. This week, Baton Rouge enters, stage left.

He may well stay put at Ole Miss and build the kind of legacy he can't build anywhere else. Or he may stall his current SEC suitors and wait for the Texas job to open. Speculation — and some reporting — is that Steve Sarkisian may not be long for Austin.

At any other point in human history, that would seem ludicrous. But in this season to top all seasons, it would make perfect sense.

Meanwhile, the rest of college football once again ridicules a handful of teams for taking a cupcake breather before huge rivalry games. Where were they when the SEC was taking on Ohio State and Baylor, while the Big Ten was feasting on Grambling and Kennesaw State? Or when the SEC tested itself against Michigan, Arizona State and Clemson (well, it seemed big at the time) while the Big 12 kicked off against UT Martin and Wagner?

For the record, the SEC went 10-3 against Power Four brethren. Only the Big 12 had a similar record (10-6), but still went 0-3 against the SEC. That's why more than a third of the league may get a playoff bid.

But we've got to get to decision day first. Until then, the only guarantee is that

Looking ahead

• **Missouri at Oklahoma (11 a.m. on ABC):** The Sooners are back in the mix after taking down Alabama a week ago. Theoretically, Missouri's chances are kaput. But a Mizzou victory over the Sooners could create some handwringing for the committee.

• **Arkansas at Texas (2:30 p.m. on ABC):** This seems like a no-brainer, and it should be. But think of this: If Texas opened with a cupcake instead of at Ohio State, the Longhorns would still be very much in the mix. At some point, scheduling has to matter more to the CFP.

• **Kentucky at Vanderbilt (2:30 p.m. on ESPN):** Vandy still has an outside shot at making the CFP. But resurgent Kentucky can alter who gets to Atlanta with an upset

win that would totally change tiebreakers.

• **Tennessee at Florida (6:30 p.m. on ABC):** In a galaxy not too long ago and not too far away this was, briefly, the SEC's premier rivalry. It's still got plenty of gas, even though the stakes aren't the same.

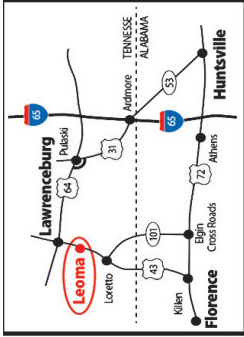
