## Coconut Shrimp

#### **INGREDIENTS**


12 jumbo shrimp 2 egg whites (slightly beaten) Dash of red pepper

1/2 tsp salt 1/2 cup cornstarch 1 cup sweetened flaked coconut

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

Peel shrimp, leave tail, de-vein if desired. Pour oil at a depth of 3 1/2 inches (350 degrees). Combine egg white, ground red pepper and salt in shallow bowl. Cornstarch in another bowl. Coconut in another bowl. Coat shrimp with cornstarch, shake off excess. Dip in egg white mix, dredge in coconut. Fry in two batches, 2 to 3 minutes until golden brown. Serves up to 4 people. Marmalade Dip Sauce: 1 cup orange marmalade, 4 tsp stoneground mustard, 1 tsp horseradish (can use prepared, I prefer fresh). This is so easy to prepare!



## Auburn at Baylor

When: 7 p.m. Friday TV/radio: FOX/FM-94.9

**2024 records:** Auburn (5-7), Baylor

**The series:** Baylor leads 2-1-1.

#### Four-down territory

- 1. **Keep it simple:** Ouarterback Jackson Arnold makes his Auburn debut, and while the Oklahoma transfer is experienced, Auburn coach Hugh Freeze wants to ease Arnold into shallow water before throwing him in the deep end. That means keeping it simple and getting everyone else to help their new OB. "We've got to make sure we're not doing too much," Freeze said. "We want our receivers in the right spots at the right time. We're athletic enough there to win. Just do what the play is designed to do, and we're good enough there to win and get open. That will help our quarterbacks."
- **2. Long list:** The entire Auburn defense was listed as potential starters on the Tigers' depth chart early this week. Instead of a clearly defined starter, each player had the word "OR" next to their name. There are 34 potential starters listed on the defensive depth chart while the offense lists eight clear starters. "My first thought was that it was going to be a long introduction at Jordan-Hare when we introduce our starters on defense," Freeze said. "We will play all of those guys, I suspect, on Friday night."
- **3. Dye honor:** Auburn will honor former Tigers coach, the late Pat Dye, with a sponsorship logo on Pat Dye Field in Jordan-Hare Stadium. The Pat Dye Field logo will be on the 25-yard line. Auburn named the field in honor of Dye in 2005, the same year he was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. Dye's Auburn teams were 99-39-4 from 1981-92, including SEC championships in 1983, 1987, 1988 and 1989, and the recently added 1983 national title. "For my people my age, Coach Dye put this program on the map of what it could become," Freeze said.
- 4. Health update: Alex McPherson was sidelined for a majority of the 2024 season with ulcerative colitis and had just two field-goal attempts, a year after going 13-for-13. Freeze announced this week McPherson

may not be available against Baylor. Between Towns McGough and Ian Vachon, Auburn was 11-of-20 on field goals last season. Along with McGough, Connor Gibbs is available Friday. "Obviously, Alex is super talented and accurate," Freeze said. "It's just a matter of what he feels like he's able to do and then we'll go from there with Towns and Gibbs."

#### **Key matchup**

#### Auburn RB Damari Alston vs. Baylor RB **Bryson Washington**

Alston gets the nod as the new Tigers' starter with the departure of Jarquez Hunter. He has played in 34 games and has 681 yards with five touchdowns. Washington ran for 1,028 yards last season with 12 touchdowns.

#### Player of the week

#### Dillon Wade. LG

With 37 starts under his belt, Wade is perhaps the biggest leader on the AU offensive line and will be a key cog this season in keeping defensive linemen away from new Tigers OB Jackson Arnold.

#### By the numbers

**24:** Auburn is 24-8-1 all-time against the Big 12. The Tigers last matchup with a current Big 12 team was a loss to Houston in the 2021 Birmingham Bowl.

236: Auburn's offensive line has combined for 236 career games played, the most in the SEC and seventh most in the

1995: Baylor hasn't hosted a team from the SEC since Mississippi State played in Waco in 1995.

**2010:** Auburn has not played a game on a Friday since the Iron Bowl in 2010.

#### **Prediction**

#### Auburn 28, Baylor 14

There is reason to be optimistic on the Plains. The defense will be better while the offense will have a new look and feel. The question is can Freeze and company bring it all together and lead the Tigers to new heights? Going on the road against a Power 5 opponent isn't an ideal season-opener warmup, but an enthusiastic and athletic Auburn team will carry the day. Whether the Tigers can sustain those traits is the next question.

## Alabama at Florida State

When: 2:30 p.m. Saturday

**The series:** Alabama leads 3-1-1.

#### Four-down territory

**1. High standard:** Alabama had its share of struggles last season, but defense was not an issue. The Crimson Tide defense allowed just 17.4 points per game (fourth in the SEC and 10th nationally). Over the final six games, the defense surrendered just 12.8 points. The 17.4 points per game total is the lowest scoring average allowed by a Tide defense since 2017 when that national championship squad finished first in the nation in scoring defense (11.9).

2. Familiar face: Alabama is quite familiar with FSU offensive coordinator Gus Malzahn. The former Auburn head coach had some success against the Crimson Tide, winning three out of eight Iron Bowls. He was also the Auburn offensive coordinator when the Tigers beat Alabama in 2010. "I have tremendous respect for Gus Malzahn, who I've known for a very long time," Alabama defensive coordinator Kane Wommack said. "Gus always presents a number of challenges to you formationally, with motions, quarterback run, one-plus element and their ability to go tempo with their run game."

3. Bird's eye view: New Alabama offensive coordinator Ryan Grubb is back with Kalen DeBoer, but he won't be on the sidelines with him. He will be the only Tide assistant coach in the coach's booth. Last season, OC Nick Sheridan and former safeties coach Colin Hitschler were the two assistants in the booth. "I've got other guys up there with me," Grubb said. "It's pretty much the same setup I've done. I've got guys, Mitch Dahlen's up there, he's been with me for five years up in the box, so he's got a good set of eyes. Tyler Hughes was with us in Washington, veteran coach as well. Feel like it's pretty much the same setup."

4. Cautious of Castellanos: One area Alabama's defense struggled in last year was holding dual-threat QBs at bay. (See Oklahoma's Jackson Arnold, South Florida's Byrum Brown and Vanderbilt's Diego Pavia.) Seminoles OB Tommy Castellanos rushed for 1,000 yards in 2023 at Boston College. However, after Castellanos said

in June that "(Alabama doesn't) have Nick Saban to save them ... I just don't see them stopping me," Alabama does have some incentive to stop him.

#### **Key matchup**

#### Alabama QB Ty Simpson vs. FSU QB **Tommy Castellanos**

Two QBs are making their debuts, Simpson as a starter and Castellanos as a Seminole. The experience and skill factors go to Castellanos (3,689 career passing yards, 1,427 rushing) but Simpson has a veteran offensive line in front of him.

#### Player of the week

#### Tim Keenan III, DL

The senior will be a leader on

Alabama's line this season. He was a leader last year, but it's his time to shine. He had seven tackles for loss last season with three sacks and at 6-foot-2, 320 pounds, Keenan is a run killer in the middle.

#### By the numbers

1: Crimson Tide opponents averaged just 1 yard per return in 2024, which led the nation.

**22:** Alabama has won 22 straight season openers, the second longest streak in the nation behind Ohio State (22).

**28:** UA forced 28 total turnovers (11 fumbles, 17 interceptions) in 2024, the second-most in the SEC and tied for fifth most in Division I.

**278:** Alabama began the 2008 season — *Edwin Stanton* 

at No. 24 in the AP preseason poll. Since then, UA has not been ranked lower than No. 17 in the 278 polls that followed.

#### **Prediction**

#### Alabama 24, Florida State 17

We don't know much about this Alabama team. It wouldn't be a surprise to see the Crimson Tide struggle, but it wouldn't be a shocker to see them win in a blowout. What we do know is Alabama has lots of talent and potential. The question is the coaching. Year two is a critical time for DeBoer, and there isn't much room for error with a fanbase accustomed to more hoisting hardware at the end of the season.

## Tennessee vs. Syracuse

When: 11 a.m. Saturday

Where: Atlanta

The series: Tennessee leads 3-0.

#### Four-down territory

- 1. Missing yards: Tennessee teams have gone over 2,500 rushing yards for four straight seasons, which is a first in program history. Jaylen Wright and Dylan Sampson had much to do with that. This season the Vols turn to DeSean Bishop and Star Thomas, a Duke transfer. "This opportunity I have in front of me is not just something that I am proud about, but a lot of people around here are proud about," Bishop said. "A lot of people out here are rooting for me and praying for my success. I can't let them down and I won't."
- **2.** No sneak peek: Tennessee, along with most college teams, normally release a depth chart on the first day of game week. Coach Josh Heupel opted not to do that. Several positions are set, including the quarterback spot with Joey Aguilar. There are questions about other positions and backups, but Heupel isn't giving any hints as to who those will be. ""You'll find out on Saturday when the depth chart is released," he said.
- **3. Orange in the red:** The Vols were ranked No. 80 in red-zone scoring last season at just over 80%. It breaks down to 25 rushing TDs, 14 passing scores and 13 made field goals in 63 red-zone trips. "You have to play smart football down there," Heupel said. "The efficiency of the run game is a big part of that as well. If you are throwing the football, you have to be efficient with it as well. A lot of what takes place in the middle of the field is as important in the red zone."
- **4. Fast and furious:** Tennessee has a knack of dominating the first quarter. Opponents managed only two firstquarter offensive touchdowns during the regular season last year. The UT offense, meanwhile, has outscored opponents 543-202 in the first quarter under Heupel. In fact, since 2021, the Vols are first in the nation in first-quarter scoring at 10.44 points per game. Heupel's teams have scored at least one touchdown in the first quarter in 73 of the 88 games he has coached.

#### **Key matchup**

#### Tennessee OB Joey Aguilar vs. Syracuse **OB Rickie Collins**

Both players are making debuts with new teams. Aguilar is in his fifth season, having played in junior college, Appalachian State and a short spring stint at UCLA. Collins saw limited time in two seasons at LSU.

#### Player of the week

#### Miles Kitselman, TE

Heupel said this week the tight ends need to play an important role in the opener. Kitselman is looking to take the

next step forward as a leader. He had 301 vards and four TDs last season.

#### By the numbers

**30:** Josh Heupel has guided Tennessee to its winningest three-year stretch (30 from 2022-24) since the Vols won 30 games from 1998-2000.

15: Tennessee has a 15-1 nonconference regular-season record in the Heupel era and has won 14 straight.

**789:** Syracuse is 789 miles away from Knoxville.

20: The Vols have held 11 of their last 14 opponents to under 20 points.

#### **Prediction**

#### **Tennessee 35, Syracuse 13**

Right now, no one expects Tennessee to repeat what it accomplished last season. There are too many questions about the offense that need to be answered before talk of a playoff berth can be tossed around. A strong showing in the opener can go a long way in giving new Vols starters confidence. They will need a boatload of that when Georgia comes calling in a couple of weeks.

## UNA at Western Kentucky


#### Four-down territory

1. It's all about the money, money, **money:** It's the annual money game for UNA. Western Kentucky is paying the Lions \$300,000. A chance to win? We'll leave that up to you right now or you can cheat and check the bottom of this charticle. UNA is 2-8 all-time against FBS teams, including a 40-0 loss at Memphis last season. The wins came in 1973 against Appalachian State (21-7) and in 1997 at Southwestern Louisiana (48-42 in 4 OTs), now known as Louisiana-Lafayette. So, none during the Division

**2. Season-opening woes:** The first game of the season hasn't been especially kind to UNA. The Lions are 2-5 in such games since moving to Division I in 2018. The five losses have come in the last five years such as the 37-15 loss to Southeast Missouri last year in the FCS Kickoff game. In those seven matchups, UNA has been outscored 195-131 with two matchups being decided by a single possession. The 34-30 win at Southern Utah in 2018 and the 17-14 overtime loss at Indiana State in 2022.

3. Top Gun? Is that how Western Kentucky quarterback Maverick McIvor got his name? Don't know. But the signal caller isn't an unfamiliar face to UNA. The Lions saw him in each of the previous two seasons while he was with Abilene Christian. McIvor finished a combined 42-of-72 passing for 462 yards, three touchdowns and one interception. He was 33-for-51 with 401 yards passing and three touchdowns in his Western Kentucky debut last week, a 41-24 win over Conference USA foe Sam Houston State.

**4. Lion signaling:** McIvor's counterpart will be Ari Patu. It would be a surprise if he wasn't considering he spent training camp and UNA's scrimmages running with the first-team offense. Patu played in just three games last season due a wrist injury that required surgery. He was 48-of-86 passing for 535 yards, a touchdown and five interceptions. He finished with 14 total turnovers. It will be interesting to see how he plays in Year 2 of coach Brent Dearmon's offense.

#### **Key matchup**

#### **Western Kentucky WR Matthew Henry** vs. UNA secondary

Like McIvor, Henry is a new Hilltopper. He transferred in from FCS Western Illinois after logging 1,211 yards and six touchdowns on 64 catches in 2024. He certainly appeared to be one of his quarterback's favorite targets in Western Kentucky's opener. He caught seven passes for 148 yards and a touchdown. Yeah, that'll play. The Lions, meanwhile, are starting new players in three-fifths of their secondary. Something to watch.

#### Player of the week

#### **UNA** passing game

Sure it says player, but we'll cheat and go with multiple. Namely, the receiving

corps. The Lions lost their top three pass catchers from 2024: Takairee Kenebrew (46 catches, 772 yards, 4 TDs), Dakota Warfield (46, 568, 3) and Kobe Warden (42, 513, 3). Tanaka Scott (26, 407 3) and Justin Luke (5, 141, 2) are back, while UNA added Justin Pegues from Bowling Green and tight end Christian Burkhalter from Georgia Tech. Being in sync with Patu early in the season could go a long way. Some of that will depend on the offensive line, too.

#### By the numbers







## Swinney thrived after nearly being fired

CLEMSON, S.C. - Dabo Swinney appears destined for the College Football Hall of Fame.

He has won eight Atlantic Coast Conference championships in the last 10 years and two national championships, and now his fourth-ranked Clemson Tigers look poised for another run at glory as they kick off the 2025 season Saturday night at home against No. 9 LSU.

Swinney is first to admit it's been one heck of a ride - and he's been "blessed" beyond words.

But it wasn't all trophies and celebrations for the Pelham native when he took over the Tigers 17 years ago as an interim head coach.

There were tense moments for Swinnev early on, none more so than in the moments following the Tigers' lopsided 29-7 defeat to in-state rival South Carolina in November 2010 in front of more than 81,000 mostly dejected fans at Clemson's Memorial Stadium. The loss dropped the Tigers to 6-6 in the regular season and Swinney to 19-14 since taking over as head coach.

As he emerged that day from his news conference, Swinney found his wife, Kathleen, in tears in the hallway.

"I walk out and she's crying and I just thought she was just sad, you know, that she feels bad for me," Swinney recalled.

He gave her a hug and assured her everything was going to be all right.

That's when she looked at him in the eyes and told him that Terry Don Phillips, Clemson's athletic director at the time, was waiting to see him in his office.

"Oh," is the only thing Swinney could muster, and the tension in his body mounted.

"I mean, I think I'm getting fired and my wife thinks I'm getting fired," Swinney recalled at the Atlantic Coast Conference championship media days.

Knocked back by the news, Swinney took a few minutes to gather his thoughts before reminding himself that "God's got me."

He walked down the hallway to find the door cracked open. He peered inside and found Phillips sitting on the couch.

So this is how it ends, Swinney thought to himself.

He entered the room. But the pink slip never came. Swinney wasn't fired that

Instead, he was surprised when Phillips offered his wholehearted, unconditional

"I go from thinking I'm getting fired to Terry Don Phillips telling me how much he believes in me," Swinney said. "He said to me, 'Hey there's going to be a lot of criticism and there's going to be a lot of this and that, (but) I want you to keep doing what you're doing. I want you to know that I've got your back. I believe in you more now than even when I hired you."

With that, Phillips got up from the couch and prepared to walk out of his office before turning back to Swinney and saying "and if it doesn't work, you can come help me pack - and I'll come help you pack."

Phillips then hugged Swinney on his way out.

"Terry Don Phillips is not a man of a lot of words, but he had a lot of conviction

in his words and he meant what he said," Swinney said.

Swinney sat in stunned silence for a few minutes before his wife walked into his office, worried about her husband's job security.

"I told her, 'Didn't get fired,' and she's like, 'What?'" Swinney said.

Tim Bourret, who was Clemson's sports information director, witnessed the event unfolding. He said it was a tense time given the way the regular season had ended. But he felt that Swinney had earned some stock from Phillips by leading the Tigers to the ACC championship game in 2009 before losing to Georgia Tech.

"Terry Don just had a sixth sense about Dabo and his ability to lead the program," Bourret said. "I didn't think he was going to get fired, but then again I had been around long enough to know that people make decisions based off what happens against South Carolina."

Bourret said Phillips had come to admire Swinney's tireless work as an assistant coach at Clemson before hiring him as the interim head coach in 2008. He said Phillips took notice of how players, even those who played positions other than the one Swinney coached, could be found hanging out in Swinney's office between practices.

"He had a way with players – and he was a great recruiter," Bourret said. "And Terry Don took notice of that."

Swinney, of course, never did have to pack up his things at Clemson.

The Tigers bounced back to go 10-4 the following season, earning a trip to the Orange Bowl. It was the first of 13 double-digit win seasons over the next 14 years for Swinney, who has built the Tigers into one of the most successful and consistent programs in college

football.

Since 2011, the Tigers have won a remarkable 84.3% percent of their games (161-30) under Swinney, including nine ACC championships. He is the winningest coach in ACC history with 180 victories.

The lessons Swinney learned that day have shaped his coaching career.

Two years ago, after Clemson failed to win 10 games, Swinney had a decision to make when it came to struggling young

quarterback Cade Klubnik. Like Swinnev. Klubnik had found himself under intense scrutiny and many Tigers fans were urging him to explore the transfer portal and for Swinney to find a replacement.

But Swinney showed the same faith in Klubnik that Phillips once showed in

Klubnik responded last season by leading the Tigers to a second straight ACC championship and a return to the College Football Playoff after a two-year absence. Klubnik enters this season as a first-team Associated Press preseason All-American and is viewed as one of the favorites to win the Heisman Trophy. He's s projected first-round NFL draft

All because Swinney believed in him.

"I experienced that too, right?" said Swinney, a three-time winner of the Paul "Bear" Bryant Award given to college football's best head coach. "I know what it means to have someone believe in vou."

Bourret, who worked at Clemson until 2017, said it's hard to imagine where the program might be had Phillips not kept Swinney.

"There could not be a better fit for this program," Bourret said. "Dabo would probably be successful at any program, but it is amazing what he has done at Clemson. He'll be in the Hall of Fame someday, no doubt. Terry Don's sixth sense certainly proved right."

South Carolina fans already have Oct. 25 circled. That's when Alabama visits, and this is the popular pick for an upset that could impact the CFP.




