



Four-down territory

- 1. Missing in action: Alabama will be without linebacker Justin Jefferson for the first half against the Badgers. He was called for targeting against South Florida and, by rule, must miss one half of the next game. "It's always disappointing when you have a dynamic player that is not available for one half of the game," Alabama defensive coordinator Kane Wommack said. "We looked at that play and looked at it from about every angle that I could. We'll deal with it and get ourselves ready for him in the second half."
- **2. Jump up and get down:** The Crimson Tide has "Dixieland Delight" by country music group Alabama to get the crowd fired up. Wisconsin breaks out "Jump Around" by House of Pain. When the song blasts on the loudspeakers at the end of the third quarter, Badger fans (particularly the student section) jump in unison to the song. It's been a Wisconsin tradition since 1998. According to The Daily Cardinal, the stadium was renovated in 2003, and school administrators opted for the song not to be played in the home opener, citing safety concerns. After a heavy backlash, the song returned into the rotation the next home game.
- line didn't have its best game against South Florida. The unit was called for seven penalties with right tackle Wilkin No. 7 LSU in 1988. Formby getting flagged three times for holding. Most of the issues could stem from tackle Kadyn Proctor not playing due to a shoulder injury, which caused some shuffling on the line. Elijah Pritchett was also dealing with a slight injury but did play in the fourth quarter. Head coach Kalen DeBoer said he's optimistic Proctor and Pritchett will play against Wisconsin.
- 4. Big Ten letdown: Wisconsin and Ohio State are the only Big Ten programs to defeat a top-10 SEC team in the regular season. A win over No. 4 Alabama would be the highest-ranked regular-season victory over an SEC team by a Big Ten program. Against top-10 teams, the Big Ten is 2-8 since 1972. Wisconsin beat No.

5 LSU in 2016 while Ohio State dropped Madison this weekend.

Key matchup

Alabama RB Jam Miller vs. Wisconsin RB Chez Mellusi

Miller broke loose against South Florida last week for 140 yards with a touchdown. He's averaging 97 yards per game early in the season and 9.7 yards per carry. Mellusi leads Wisconsin with 134 rushing yards and three touchdowns.

Tim Keenan, DL

The junior took control for the Alabama defense last week with nine tackles, including two sacks. He was named SEC defensive lineman of the week. Don't expect him to take his foot off the gas in

By the numbers

- 3: Freshman receiver Ryan Williams has six catches through two games with half of them (3) going for touchdowns. He leads the team with 207 yards.
- 9: Alabama QB Jalen Milroe has accounted for nine touchdowns in only two games. His four rushing scores are the most by any quarterback in the FBS and his five passing TDs are tied for the fourth-most.
- 25: This season marks the 25th anniversary of Ron Dayne's record-setting 1999 Heisman Trophy season. The former Badger running back will be honored during Saturday's game.

213: In the last 20 years, Alabama has 213 wins, which leads the nation. In that

The Badgers haven't won a game against an AP top-5 opponent at home since 2010. Give the edge to the Crimson Tide, but the offensive line and the secondary have a lot of work

Not-so-fine line: Tide seeks rebound effort

Alabama center Parker Brailsford knows offensive linemen mostly get talked about thanks to negative numbers like penalties and sacks.

The fourth-ranked Crimson Tide's blockers are getting plenty such attention this week.

A line forced to mix and match because of injuries to tackles Kadyn Proctor and Elijah Pritchett allowed four sacks against South Florida and committed nine penalties with two negating touchdowns.

Brailsford and his fellow linemen are hoping to go back to the anonymity familiar to linemen everywhere starting with Alabama's first road game Saturday against Wisconsin.

"Honestly when you guys (reporters) don't talk about us, that's the best thing," said Brailsford, who transferred from Washington with coach Kalen DeBoer.

"When our running backs, our quarterback, our receivers get recognition, I just feel like that's the same thing as us getting recognition, because we've got to do our job for them to do theirs."

Alabama is hoping that shaky performance in a 42-16 win that was a one-point game going into the fourth quarter was a blip, not an ongoing concern. It's entirely possible since the shuffled starting unit only worked together a couple of practices before the game.

The numbers were an offensive lineman's bad dream: six holding penalties (one was nullified by a defensive flag), an illegal block in the back and two false starts.

Proctor, who started as a freshman last season, has missed the first two games with a left shoulder injury. DeBoer said he expects Proctor to be "pretty dang close" to able to get onto the field by week's end.

Alabama was trying to hold Pritchett out to heal a minor injury but inserted him at the end of the game. The Tide scored 21 points over the final 5:50, including a pair of long touchdown runs.

Alabama slid Tyler Booker from left guard to left tackle. He was replaced by Michigan State transfer Geno VanDe-Mark, a six-game starter last season for the Spartans. Wilkin Formby, a redshirt freshman from Tuscaloosa's Northridge High School, started at right tackle.

Formby was called for four holding penalties (one off-set) and VanDeMark drew two holding penalties and another for false start. Booker said the offensive

linemen collectively decided during the game "we're going to right our wrongs right now."

The offense did produce a dominant and more pristine fourth quarter.

"We were just definitely beating ourselves," Booker said. "I'm glad we went through this adversity so we know how to learn from it in the future."

It was a mistake-filled performance but offensive coordinator Nick Sheridan and Brailsford both said they're not leaning on injuries to explain it away.

Sheridan said the general policy remains to field the offensive line group that gets the most repetitions together in practice.

"We don't make any excuses," the Tide offensive coordinator said. "The guys out there are starters and the expectation is they will play well and execute and do their job.

"We don't allow anyone in the building to talk about shuffling. The guys who are ready to practice, that's who we practice with and prepare them to execute, do their job. And if they are out there on the field they are capable of doing it. That's where our focus is."



New Mexico at Auburn

Four-down territory

1. Change up: It's no secret the quarterback play of Payton Thorne wasn't inspiring last week. Could a change be coming soon? "It's really hard for me not to play a young man who is consistently the best performer in practice," Auburn coach Hugh Freeze said. "You have to carry that over into the games." Freeze's concerns were with Thorne not throwing to open receivers and throwing four interceptions. "If that continues, we may have to go in another direction," he said. That opens the door for redshirt freshman Hank Brown, who has nine career pass attempts.

2. Offensive remedy: Freeze didn't mince words this week about the Tigers' offensive effort with Cal. "It was an awful performance," he said. Saturday's game with New Mexico might be the jumpstart Auburn needs. The Lobos gave up 35 points to Montana State and 61 to Arizona. The Lobos have allowed 627 total passing yards. "We've got to find our consistency and it's (coaches') job to find that," Freeze said.

3. Nowhere to run: The Auburn offense may be struggling to find an identity, but the defense has made strides early and appears to be locked in. Through two games, Auburn has allowed just 24 points and 142 rushing yards through two games. The run defense held Cal and Alabama A&M to a combined 74 yards through seven quarters, including single-digit totals in four quarters. A big 73-yard fourth quarter by Cal is the outlier. Getting runners down behind the line of scrimmage is impressive, too. Auburn has 14 tackles for loss against running backs and receivers.

4. Tigers on the mend: Right tackle Izavion Miller missed most of last week's game with an injury and freshman receiver Cam Coleman left the game late with an injury. Freeze said both are questionable to play against New Mexico. However, Freeze said he thinks Coleman has a better chance of playing than Miller. "It would be difficult for (Miller) to play and I'm not sure on Cam," Freeze said. "It depends on how

quickly he gets some range of motion in that shoulder."

Key matchup

Auburn WR KeAndre Lambert-Smith vs. **New Mexico WR Luke Wysong**

Lambert-Smith leads Auburn with 110 yards on five catches with three touchdowns, including one for 67 yards. Wysong is the go-to player for the Lobos. He leads the team with 224 yards on 24 catches with one touchdown.

Player of the week

Jarquez Hunter, RB

The Tigers are doing everything they can to get Hunter the ball. He's a playmaker and leads Auburn with 121 rushing vards and one touchdown. He may end up with much bigger numbers after Saturday. The Lobos allow 283 rushing yards per game and have allowed seven rushing TDs.

By the numbers

7: Auburn's wide receivers have caught seven touchdowns in the first two games. which matches the total for the Tiger receivers for the entire 2023 season.

8: Auburn is tied for eighth nationally and tied for second in the SEC with 19 tackles for loss.

Auburn 35, New Mexico 9

Stunning isn't a strong-enough word to describe last week's Tigers loss to Cal. If Auburn drops the game against New Mexico, you can expect Tiger fans to come up with a few choice words to describe it. That won't happen. Sure, the offense wasn't up to par, but Auburn will put the Lobos away early. Plus, this is New Mexico, not New Mexico State from a season ago. Expect a big day from the running game and the defense.

UNA at UT Martin

When: 6 p.m. Saturday

Four-down territory

1. Well, someone's got to do it: All right, might as well get this out of the way. As stated above, UNA is 0-3. UT Martin is 0-2. Someone has to come away with their first win Saturday. So, who might it be? (For a score possibility, see below.) The Skyhawks won last season's meeting 37-21. Both have already played Southeast Missouri with the Lions losing 37-15 and UT Martin losing 45-42 in double overtime. UNA, though, hasn't done well on the road. Since 2022, their first full Division I season, the Lions are 1-13 away from Braly Stadium.

2. It's the last one: The last nonconference game this season, that is. A guess here, but UNA would like to close that portion of its schedule with some kind of positive momentum before getting into United Athletic Conference (ASUN-WAC partnership) games. After all, those wins or losses will matter quite a bit more. And there are eight of those matchups coming. UNA went 1-5 against UAC schools a year ago.

3. The end zone can be your friend: It's no secret, points have been hard to come by for the Lions' offense. Through three games, the unit averages fewer than 11 points after a 15-point effort against Southeast Missouri, none at Memphis and a 17-point outing against Illinois State. That ranks UNA 99th out of 115 FCS scoring offenses. Take away the Memphis game and the Lions still only average 16 points, good for a tie for 82nd.

4. Converting third downs would help: UNA has struggled to put up points. The Lions haven't been great on "money downs," either. UNA is 11-for-41 on third-down opportunities this season. (That's less than 27% for those interested.) It was 4-for-14 last Saturday. Now, would it be helpful to move the sticks before getting to third down? Yes. But that's always realistic. So, it's best to make the most of the opportunities you're presented.

Key matchup

UT Martin QB Kinkead Dent vs. UNA secondary

Dent didn't do much in the Skyhawks'

season opener against Kansas State. He completed 7 of 14 throws for a whopping 87 yards. He was better against Southeast Missouri with 277 yards and four touchdowns. UNA has six pass breakups and an interception through three games. But two of those breakups and the interception came courtesy of linebacker Jackson Bratton.

Player of the week

Ari Patu, OB

The transfer from Stanford needs to play well. Nothing more, nothing less. Patu threw for a career-high 328 yards against Illinois State, but he also turned the ball over twice, bringing his season turnover total to eight. The Lions have nine total as a team. Overall, Patu is completing 56% of his throws. It's hard to win when your quarterback is struggling to be consistent.

By the numbers

29: The number of yards seventhyear receiver Takairee Kenebrew needs to reach 2,000 for his career. His 1,971 currently rank seventh in school history.

Four-down territory

1. Perfect fit: If Tennessee fans had any reservations about Dylan Sampson taking over as the No. 1 running back spot for Jaylen Wright, they no longer exist. Sampson leads the SEC with 256 rushing yards and is tied with the touchdown lead at five. He's averaging 8 yards per carry. He's gained 322 all-purpose vards, which also leads the SEC.

2. Clean it up: About the only issue Tennessee had last week against N.C. State was penalties. The Vols were flagged seven times for 70 yards, including some personal foul calls. In the opener, Tennessee had six penalties for 52 yards. "You have to play smart football," Vols coach Josh Heupel said. "You can't do things that hurt yourself. We've had a couple of penalties on special teams. You can't change the field position like that."


3. Successful transfers: The Vols' offense is among the best in the nation, second behind Ole Miss in scoring. A big part of the early success is due to the transfer portal. Chris Brazzell II leads Tennessee with eight catches, while tight ends Miles Kitselman and Holden Staes have combined for six receptions for 70 yards and two touchdowns.

4. Golden opportunity: Kent State does not instill fear in most teams across the country, but Tennessee still has to line up and face the Golden Flashes. So, what does Heupel do to get his team ready to face a team that is a 48-point underdog? "You can go back and look at the scores each week from across America," he said. "There are examples of guys who didn't prepare, didn't practice right or have the right competitive spirit to take advantage of the opportunity.

Key matchup

Tennessee WR Chris Brazzell II vs. Kent State WR Chrishon McCray

Brazzell has been a consistent target at receiver with his team-leading eight catches. He's been a big help with midrange receptions. McCray is a preseason all-MAC player who has nine catches for 94 yards and two touchdowns.

Player of the week **Tyre West. DE**

One of the reasons why the Vols' defense has allowed 370 total yards and just 13 points is West. He's quick off the edge and gets to the quarterback. He has one sack and has five total tackles. He's also got a forced fumble.

By the numbers

2: Tennessee is second in FBS in scoring offense (60 points per game). Kent State's defense is 125th, allowing 40 points per game.

3: Tennessee's defense has not surrendered a touchdown in three straight games. That is the longest streak for the Vols since three straight in 1985.

10: Tennessee has never faced Kent State. but the Vols are 10-0 against MAC teams.

25: Tennessee has 25 games under Heupel with the running game totaling 200 or more yards.

Prediction

Tennessee 52. Kent State 6

No reason to give any analysis for this one since the Vols are nearly a 50-point favorite. They might reach 50 points by halftime. They came close to doing that against Chattanooga. The big point of interest is the continuing development of Nico Iamaleava because the big test comes next week when Tennessee travels to Oklahoma for the SEC opener. That's where the Vols found out what they are made of.



For Gamecocks, bandwagon 'getting full'

COLUMBIA, S.C. – Who's in first? In the Southeastern Conference, that's South Carolina.

The Gamecocks (2-0, 1-0) routed Kentucky 31-6 last week in the only SEC league game so far.

And that means an extra challenge for fourth-year coach Shane Beamer as his team looks to build on its first-place status when it faces No. 16 LSU (1-1) on Saturday.

ESPN's "College GameDay" is in town for the first time in a decade, and Beamer will put in a little extra work keeping his young team grounded.

"The bandwagon, if you will, is getting full," Beamer said Tuesday. He wants his players to understand "there's people on that bandwagon right now that'll jump right off the next time things don't go

Ouarterback LaNorris Sellers, a redshirt freshman in his first season as starter, struggled in the team's late escape against Old Dominion two weeks ago but rebounded with a pair of TD passes at Kentucky.

Sellers knows he and his teammates can get overwhelmed if they don't prepare with energy and focus. "We're going to keep that same mindset," he

Still, it has been a wild couple of weeks. South Carolina, picked 13th in the SEC this preseason, began with a troubling performance against ODU. The Monarchs were ahead 19-16 in the fourth quarter and if not for a late ODU fumble that led to Sellers' winning TD, Beamer would be on a much hotter seat than he is now.

"You've got to be an idiot to think people weren't disappointed" with the Old Dominion game, Beamer said.

Beamer told his team to stay the course and that the positives he had watched throughout preseason camp after a 5-7 mark a season ago would surface.

Few outside the program believed that would happen at Kentucky, where the Gamecocks had won just once in their previous five visits.

"We knew what we had," said defensive back Jalon Kilgore, who has had interceptions in each of the first two

South Carolina took a 10-0 lead and pulled away in the second half. He

added a second TD pass and safety Nick Emmanwori had a pick-six to put things

Can the Gamecocks bring the same effort and tenacity against LSU?

Kilgore believes they will, despite the Tigers leading the SEC with eight TD passes. "We just have to play our game and things are going to be straight," he said.

Beating Kentucky was a mild surprise and put the Gamecocks in a good spot to return to a bowl game, something they missed last year.

Taking down the Tigers? That could add to the team's belief of even bigger

things to come, which punter Kai Kroeger said has been building all offseason. He understands the excitement from friends, family and fans after last week, all of which he and his teammates must block out to prepare for LSU.

"It's definitely difficult with everything going on," said Kroeger, voted SEC special teams player of the week. "But Coach Beamer does a great job having us focus on what we have to do each week."

Beamer will lean on older Gamecocks like Kroeger and fifth-year players in center Vershon Lee and defensive linemen Alex Huntley and Tonka Hemingway to set the tone for younger plavers.

All four were around in 2022 when the Gamecocks gained national attention after defeating top-10 programs Tennessee and Clemson in consecutive weeks. All know how quickly momentum

Beamer hopes to look back on the Kentucky win as a springboard for a season few expected. He's working to make sure things don't slide in a different direction.

"I feel like we're prepared. Practice today showed me we're preparing the right way," Beamer said. "We need to continue to improve and then turn it loose on Saturday."

Buffs' Deion: No beef with Colorado band

BOULDER, Colo. - Instead of chatting about how the world saw Colorado get "our butts kicked" by Nebraska, Deion Sanders opened his weekly news conference talking about the school's fight song.

It's just the latest sign of how no topic is too remote in a program run by Sanders.

The Buffaloes coach began Tuesday by addressing the "main thing," which was local radio station 104.3 The Fan's report that he had asked the school's band not to play the fight song at Folsom Field after a score by Shedeur Sanders so his quarterback son's theme music could run.

"Whoever reported that I told the band not to play the fight song, that's idiotic. Y'all know that," said Sanders, whose team travels to Colorado State on Saturday after a 28-10 loss at Nebraska last weekend. "Get the facts before you run with false narratives."

The school issued a statement denying the report that Sanders instructed the Colorado band to refrain from playing the fight song during a 31-26 win over North Dakota State during the season opener in Boulder. The stadium briefly played other pieces of music - including for Shedeur Sanders and kicker Alejandro Mata - before the band took over.

"The fight songs 'Glory, Glory, Colorado' and 'Fight CU' have been played after CU touchdowns and field goals for years and were played every time the Buffaloes scored against North Dakota State earlier this season," the statement said. "It's common throughout college football for individual players to have small snippets of songs played during games."

These sorts of reports are nothing new for Deion Sanders. He said he's used to them but expressed concern when it drags others — he mentioned the band - into the drama.

"Oftentimes in life, we believe the first thing we hear in which we shouldn't," Sanders said. "I just would challenge you to be more responsible with your reporting. I never wanted to get personal. So when it gets personal, you got to really think about that. You've got to understand – I have a huge platform. I could really get personal if I wanted to, but I choose not to do that, because that's rado rallied to beat the Rams 43-35 in

not right. Some things in life are just not right.

"We were brought up to love thy neighbor as much as we can."

Earlier this season, Sanders barred a newspaper columnist from asking questions at football-related events over what he deemed as pessimistic coverage.

As for any sort of simmering feud with Colorado State coach Jay Norvell or Norvell's family stemming from last season, Sanders downplayed it. Colodouble overtime last season at Folsom

"I had the honor and the pleasure at the Big 12 meetings to meet his wife. She's delightful," Sanders said of Norvell. "I don't judge people based off what they say when they're emotional. I can't do that. My heart ain't built like that."

Sanders also addressed a post on social media by Corey Phillips, the director of player personnel for the team. He wrote about hearing a racial slur as the squad left the Nebraska game Saturday.

"If they said it happened, though when you guys say it happened, don't it mean it happened?" Sanders quipped. "You guys said a lot of things happened that really hadn't happened. I don't know anything about racist, so I try to stay out of the race stuff. I don't like to play that card until I'm dealt that hand profoundly in front of others."

Sanders closed his news conference with a cautionary reminder.

"Remember, validate everything before you run with it," Sanders said.


