





Four-down territory

- **1. Two hats:** D.J. Durkin is in as interim head coach, but it's business as usual regarding how the defense works. He will maintain his defensive coordinator duties and call all the schemes. "We won't change how we're doing that. I think we have a good flow of how to do things on defense," he said this week. "I love our staff. I love our group, and I don't want to uproot any changes on that." He also said that offensive coordinator Derrick Nix will call the plays on offense, a role that fired head coach Hugh Freeze performed.
- **2. Searching for QB1:** Durkin says there won't be any off-the-field changes, but what about on-the-field changes, particularly at quarterback? Ashton Daniels got his shot as starter against Kentucky and it didn't yield positive results (108 vards, five sacks). Jackson Arnold was inserted in the second half with not much success (2-of-3 for 15 yards, two sacks). "I know this, we have three tremendous young men that can play the quarterback position at a high level. They are in the conversation on that, and we'll make a decision soon," Durkin said.
- **3. Pavia problem:** Auburn has not been successful against quarterback Diego Pavia. The Tigers are 0-2 against him, once when he was at New Mexico State and last year with Vanderbilt. The odds are not good against Auburn this time around either. Pavia passed for 201 yards and three touchdowns two years ago in New Mexico State's 31-10 win, and he passed for 143 yards and a pair of TDs in a 17-7 Vanderbilt win last season. Pavia's averaging 229 yards per game this season with 18 touchdowns and six rushing scores.
- 4. Key to success: Texas provided the blueprint to beat Vanderbilt. The Longhorns held the Commodores to a season-low 58 rushing yards. Their previous season low was 136 against Alabama, another loss. Auburn has the edge with its No. 9-ranked run defense. The Tigers have held seven opponents, including four straight, to under 100 yards. Opponents are averaging just 2.4 yards per run and

83 yards per game for the season and 78 over the last four games.

Key matchup

Auburn DB Kensley Louidor-Faustin vs. **Vanderbilt DB CJ Heard**

Louidor-Faustin has provided a spark in the secondary with his three tackles for loss, two pass breakups and one interception. Heard is the Vandy leader with 47 tackles and also had a sack with one interception.

Player of the week

Alex McPherson, K

The only one doing the scoring lately

for Auburn is McPherson. After missing three against Missouri, he has connected on seven straight, accounting for 21 of Auburn's 36 points the past two games.

By the numbers

1: Of Auburn's interim coaches (Bill Oliver, Kevin Steele, Carnell Williams), Oliver has the only win in his first game, beating Louisiana Tech 32-17 in 1998.

6: Including Vandy, Auburn has played six opponents ranked in the top 16.

6: A loss guarantees Auburn will finish with six or less regular-season wins for the six straight season.

9: Auburn has held its opponent under its scoring average in all nine games this season.

Prediction

Vanderbilt 28, Auburn 21

Maybe the firing of Hugh Freeze will help inspire Auburn to victory. More likely, the Tigers will be motivated, but it won't be enough to carry them past Vandy. There is too much disarray on offense at this point of the season. Expect a few new wrinkles and explosive plays, but the OB situation is beyond hope.

Vanderbilt tries to rekindle momentum

AUSTIN, Texas - Vanderbilt's big rally against Texas last weekend came up short as an onside kick rolled out of bounds and took one last chance for the Commodores. with it.

And those mere inches in a desperate scramble for the ball may be all the difference between a really good season in Nashville and a great one.

No. 15 Vanderbilt rallied from a 34-10 fourth-quarter deficit at Texas last weekend in a 34-31 loss, an effort that - most $seasons-would \, please \, the \, Commodores.$

Not this year.

Instead of a statement road victory, the result was a dreaded second loss in conference play that could be the difference in getting a shot at the Southeastern Conference title game, and the College Football Playoff beyond that.

"I would have loved to have seen us recover that onside kick, but we didn't," Vanderbilt coach Clark Lea said last weekend.


He praised his team's grittiness in the rally but also noted why it was needed. The Commodores (7-2, 3-2 SEC) hope no such theatrics are needed when they host Auburn on Saturday.

"In our program, to say that we weren't the hardest playing team on the field hurts me, but that's how I feel," Lea said. "In the second half, we woke up to that, and I think we started to play the way we want to play. Just it was too late."

Ouarterback Diego Pavia ran for a touchdown and passed for two in the desperate fourth quarter.

Pavia, the engine that drives the Commodores on the field and in the locker room, did what he could. Sacked six times, he was often on the run, but kept delivering big plays.

A Pavia fumble in the first quarter set 12-team field. up a Texas field goal. He was also sacked near the Vanderbilt goal line on the final touchdown drive but converted a 4thand-19 pass to keep the drive and the rally going.

Pavia had a 25-yard touchdown run and scoring passes of 67 and 8 yards in the fourth quarter.

Defensively, Vanderbilt never forced a turnover, never got a sack and only forced Texas to punt once. The game started with the Commodores giving up a 75-yard touchdown on the first play.

Vanderbilt has already qualified for a bowl game, but reaching the SEC championship game for the first time will need some things to happen around them and above them in the league standings to get there.

Vanderbilt was ninth heading into the Texas game and had hoped a win could boost the Commodores to match or beat the highest ranking in school history: No.

The Commodores are 16th in the initial CFP committee rankings released Tuesday, which would leave them out of the

"We can't play like we played today ... At some point, everything won't be out in front of us if we don't play the right way," Lea said. "We will keep charging at it, but this one hurts."

Four-down territory

- 1. Talkin' ball: Alabama offensive coordinator Ryan Grubb didn't spend the bye week relaxing. He spent it talking X's and O's with former NFL coach Jon Gruden. They met in the summer at a golf tournament, and they stayed in touch. The two caught up to talk offensive schemes and strategies. "Coach is great with stuff like that," Grubb said. "Sent him kind of a request list of some things I'd like to talk about with him. He's got more film than NFLfilms.com."
- **2. Teacher vs. pupil:** LSU interim coach Frank Wilson and Alabama defensive coordinator Kane Wommack share a link. Wilson coached the running backs at Southern Miss and Wommack was one of his players. Wommack knows a lot about Wilson and while the Tigers are reeling from the firing of head coach Brian Kelly, it's no reason to take them lightly on Saturday. "He'll have that team ready to go. They will be motivated, they'll be ready. They'll be well prepared," Wommack said. "I can't think of a better person to step in at LSU, in a place that cares deeply for that program and that state, and what this means to him."
- 3. Returning soon: Alabama lost linebacker Qua Russow several weeks ago with an injury, but he is expected to be back on the field as early as next week. Yhonzae Pierre has played well in Russaw's absence, racking up four sacks with eight QB hurries. Guard Geno VanDeMark is expected to return this week following an injury. Jaeden Roberts filled in for him against South Carolina. Tight end Danny Lewis Jr., who has battled injuries throughout the season, could see action against LSU.
- **4. Still an issue:** The run game situation hasn't improved. It's actually declined the last three games with 125 yards, 122 and 72, respectively. Bama is 14th in the SEC, but the good news is LSU is 15th in the league. The Tigers average 106 yards per game to Alabama's 118. Alabama's numbers are far off last year's pace of 173

yards per game with 41 total touchdowns (just nine in 2025).

Key matchup

Alabama WR Germie Bernard vs. LSU WR **Zavion Thomas**

Both are receiving and running threats. Bernard leads Alabama with 526 receiving yards and six touchdowns with 109 rushing yards and two scores. Thomas has 267 receiving yards with three scores and 102 rushing yards.

Player of the week

Parker Brailsford, C

Brailsford has yet to allow a sack across

245 pass blocking snaps according to Pro Football Focus, in addition to providing key blocks. He's a team captain for a reason.

By the numbers

Prediction

Alabama 24, LSU 13

The situation at LSU is a giant mess after losing three of its last four games, losing its coach and with all the drama between the athletic director and governor. It is not a good look. But it doesn't mean the Tigers will surrender to Alabama. A big win against the No. 4 team in the nation would end the turmoil quite a bit. The good news for the Crimson Tide is the game is at home, where they have lost to LSU just once in the past seven meetings.

The series: UNA leads 23-13.

Four-down territory

1. Trying to escape the bottom: There are nine teams in the United Athletic Conference. UNA is officially tied for last in the standings with Utah Tech. Although, if tiebreakers were taken into account, the Lions would own last place. The Trailblazers, after all, did beat UNA 34-33 in overtime last week. But the Lions could potentially escape the league cellar with a win over West Georgia. Utah Tech is playing at No. 18 Abilene Christian, which knocked Tarleton State from the ranks of the unbeaten last week. Central Arkansas and Eastern Kentucky, meanwhile, are one game ahead of UNA and Utah Tech. Central Arkansas is at Austin Peay. Eastern Kentucky hosts Southern Utah.

2. Possibly adding on to a winning **record:** No, not UNA. The Lions secured their seventh straight losing season thanks to that Utah Tech loss. This is referring to West Georgia. The Wolves, who are coming off a bye, clinched their first Division I winning season on Oct. 25 by beating Central Arkansas 18-17. (Remember, UNA was blown out by the Bears 49-21 this year.) West Georgia is in its second Division I season and is only playing 11 games. UNA's lone winning DI record occurred in 2018, but that was against a mixed DI and DII schedule. The Wolves' slate this season hasn't featured any lower-level opponents.

3. Just shy of a decade: The last time West Georgia graced the immaculate confines of Braly Stadium was 2016 - the year UNA played for the Division II national title. The Lions came out with a 24-23 victory after Blake Hawkins scored on a 2-yard run with 1:44 remaining. It was the second of two fourth-quarter UNA touchdowns. Quarterback Jacob Tucker crossed the goal line from 2 yards out with 9:24 left. West Georgia beat the Lions 37-23 the next year in Carrollton, while UNA took a 25-16 victory last season in the programs' inaugural DI meeting. Over the last 10 matchups between the two, UNA holds a 7-3 advantage with six of

those contests being decided by two scores or less.

4. Shortening the field: A good return game - via kickoff or punt - is never a bad thing. DeAndre Buchannon provides that for West Georgia. The junior is one of three players in the UAC to return a kickoff for a touchdown. (Eastern Kentucky's T.J. Mitchell and Southern Utah's Ran Sawyer are the others.) Buchannon returned a kickoff

92 yards in the season opener against Samford. He also leads the conference in kick return average (31 yards) with Mitchell and Sawyer second and third, respectively. Buchannon is third in punt return average (5.9) as well.

UNA offensive line vs. West Georgia DL David Hoage

The Lions rank second in the UAC in - David Glovach

sacks allowed with 13. Hoage, however, presents an interesting challenge. The seventh-year player's six sacks rank third in the UAC behind Southern Utah's Lando Brown (11.5) and Tarleton State's Angelo Anderson (8.5). It doesn't hurt the Wolves have generated the most sacks in the conference (26), either.

Player of the week

Juice Allen, RB

Allen logged 25 carries for 102 yards in last week's loss. It was his second 100-yard game of the season and third of his UNA tenure in last week's loss. But Allen was also held without a touchdown for the third time in four games. The Lions tend to win when the tailback scores at least twice. They beat Division II Northeastern State (Oklahoma) on Sept. 13 when he had rushed for a pair of touchdowns. UNA topped Eastern Kentucky on Oct. 18 when he had three. UNA is 0-7 otherwise. But there are plenty of other reasons for the Lions' struggles.

By the numbers

3-2: West Georgia's road record. That's three more road wins than UNA.

126.4: The number of yards Allen needs to average over the final three games to hit the 1,000-yard mark. He currently averages 69 and has 621 yards

15: The number of turnovers West Georgia has forced - eight interceptions and seven fumbles. UNA has turned the ball over 14 times - eight picks and six fumbles.

2nd: West Georgia's conference rank in points per game allowed at 24. UNA is ninth at 38.8. The Wolves are sixth in points scored at 26. The Lions fourth at 28.

Prediction

West Georgia 33. UNA 27

Yes, this is a game at Braly Stadium where the Lions are 2-1 this season. But UNA has to give you some confidence it can win first. And that has been in short supply. But if we're being honest, this would be a bad - perhaps embarrassing - loss for the Lions.

Burton started the Blazers' previous game, a 31-24 home upset of thenunbeaten Memphis. ... UAB's Brandon Hawkins Jr. had four catches for 89 yards and a touchdown at UConn, plus ran for a 32-yard score on a busted play. ... UConn led 31-0 midway through the third quarter. ... Rice is coming off a 38-14 home loss to Memphis in which the Owls cranked out 212 yards offense. ... Memphis led 28-0 midway through the second quarter and, by halftime, had scored on five of its six possessions. ... Under first-year head coach Scott Abell, the Owls are trying for their first winning season since 2014. ... 

Breaking down FBS conference races

The race for college football's conference titles takes on a new importance in the era of an expanded playoff.

Champions of the top leagues have a shot at automatic bids. And given the size some leagues have ballooned to, the chase to reach a conference title game can seem unusually chaotic. Of the FBS conferences, only the Sun Belt still uses divisions, with the other leagues simply

pitting their first - and second-place finishers in the title game.

The race for college football's conference titles takes on a new importance in the era of an expanded playoff, with champions of the top leagues having a shot at automatic bids. And given the size some leagues have ballooned to, the chase to reach a conference title game can seem unusually chaotic.

Of the FBS conferences, only the Sun Belt still uses divisions, with the other leagues simply pitting their first- and second-place finishers in the title game. Georgia on Nov. 15 and hosts Texas A&M Here's a look at where each conference stands. (All records are in-conference records.)

SEC

Standings: Texas A&M (5-0) and Alabama (5-0) are tied for first, followed by Mississippi (5-1), Georgia (5-1) and Texas (4-1).

Possible tiebreakers: Alabama beat Georgia, and Georgia beat Mississippi.

Down the stretch: Texas plays at

Betting favorite: Alabama (+115 according to BetMGM Sportsbook).

Conference USA

Standings: Conference USA isn't in the playoff mix, with every team having at least two losses overall, but there's still a conference title race to watch. Kennesaw State (4-0) and Jacksonville State (4-0)

IMU (5-0) leads the East Division in the Sun Belt, with Coastal Carolina (4-1) close behind. Southern Mississippi (4-0) leads the West, followed by Troy (4-1) and Arkansas State (4-1).

Possible tiebreakers: Arkansas State has a head-to-head win over Troy.

Down the stretch: There's still a lot to be decided here, with James Madison playing at Coastal Carolina on Nov. 29. Southern Miss is at Arkansas State next weekend and hosts Troy on Nov. 29.

ACC

Standings: Virginia (5-0) is now the only unbeaten team in ACC play, followed by Georgia Tech (5-1), Pittsburgh (5-1), Louisville (4-1), SMU (4-1) and Duke (4-1).

Possible tiebreakers: Virginia has a headto-head win over Louisville, Georgia Tech beat Duke and Louisville beat Pitt.

Down the stretch: Duke hosts Virginia on Nov. 15. Then a week later, Georgia Tech hosts Pitt and SMU hosts Louisville. Miami (2-2) can hand Pitt a head-to-head loss on Nov. 29, but the Hurricanes need help to get back into the title picture.

Betting favorites: Georgia Tech and Duke (+300 according to BetMGM Sportsbook).

American Athletic

Standings: After Navy's loss to North Texas on Saturday, a whopping six teams have one loss in conference play: Navy (5-1), Memphis (4-1), North Texas (4-1), South Florida (3-1), Tulane (3-1) and East Carolina (3-1). The AAC champ has a shot to earn the Group of Five bid to the 12-team playoff.

Betting favorite: Texas Tech (-200 according to BetMGM Sportsbook).

Big Ten

Standings: Indiana (6-0) and Ohio State (5-0) top the standings, and they don't play each other in the regular season. Michigan (5-1), Iowa (4-1), Oregon (4-1) and Southern California (4-1) are next in line.

Possible tiebreakers: Indiana has beaten Iowa and Oregon, and USC beat Michigan.

Down the stretch: Iowa hosts Oregon on Nov. 8 and plays at USC on Nov. 15. Oregon hosts USC on Nov. 22. Michigan hosts Ohio State on Nov. 29.

Betting favorite: Ohio State (-155 according to BetMGM Sportsbook).

Mid-American

Standings: Every MAC team began this week with at least three losses overall. The conference leaders are Miami of Ohio (4-0), Buffalo (4-1), Western Michigan (4-1) and Ohio (3-1).

Possible tiebreakers: Miami beat Western Michigan.

Down the stretch: Miami played at Ohio on Tuesday night and at Buffalo on Nov. 19. Ohio is at WMU on Nov. 11 and at Buffalo on Nov. 28.

Mountain West

Standings: The Mountain West received a bid to the playoff last season via Boise State, but right now only San Diego State and UNLV have fewer than three losses overall. On Nov. 22, Fresno State hosts Utah State and San Diego State hosts San Jose State. New Mexico hosts San Diego State on Nov. 28, the same day Utah State hosts Boise State. San Jose State hosts Fresno State the following day.

Don't look now: OU, Texas (almost) back

Oklahoma and Texas are back, Hugh Freeze's golf schedule just freed up, and folks are griping about Josh Heupel less than a year after he got Tennessee to the playoffs for the first time.

It just means more, right?

Welcome to the SEC where the chaos continues unabated. With a month to go. things are starting to come into fuzzier focus. Four league teams look to be in great shape after they unveiled the first CFP rankings Tuesday.

But given everything that's happened, don't count on the status quo staving the same. Here's a look at the SEC's CFP prospects:

No. 3 Texas A&M (8-0, 5-0 SEC)

If the season ended today: The Aggies would lock in a top-3 seed and a firstround CFP bye.

What's standing in the way: The finish isn't a cakewalk. Road games at No. 19 Missouri and No. 13 Texas await. One loss wouldn't hurt, but two could change everything.

The skinny: Lock. Texas A&M has been too consistent to fall apart.

No. 4 Alabama (7-1, 5-0)

If the season ended today: Bama would get a top-4 seed and first-roundbye.

What's standing in the way: One circa-2024 performance. The Tide gets its two biggest games (LSU and Oklahoma) at home before ending the season on The Plains, where strange things always happen.

The skinny: If the Tide takes care of business, a close loss at Auburn would probably be survivable and make the Tide a first-round CFP host.

No. 5 Georgia (7-1, 5-1)

If the season ended today: Georgia would be a first-round host.

What's standing in the way: The Dawgs get No. 13 Texas and No. 16 Georgia Tech at home to close the regular season — two programs playing for their playoff life.

The skinny: Georgia has a Top 5 win over Ole Miss. But a loss down the stretch could leave the Bulldogs the odd team out.

No. 7 Ole Miss (8-1, 5-1)

If the season ended today: Ole Miss

would be a first-round host.

What's standing in the way: Start with LSU and Florida — not in the field, but in the rumor mill. Both want Lane Kiffin bolting to restore their programs. The guess here is that he remains in Oxford, but the attention has proven distracting before.

The skinny: Even with a loss to Florida or Mississippi State, Ole Miss should survive.

Still need help

Texas (7-2, 4-1): With one Top 10 foe (Vandy) dispatched, the Longhorns still have the best opportunity to join the field. Georgia and Texas A&M are mustwins now, but this team seems to thrive under pressure.

Oklahoma (7-2, 3-2): Must win out. The trip to Tuscaloosa is OU's biggest game of the year.

Vanderbilt (7-2, 3-2): Ditto, for consideration. But Oklahoma's win at Tennessee really hurt Vandy's last remaining springboard.

Missouri (6-2, 2-2): Fate is a highway dead ahead for the Tigers with dates against No. 3 Texas A&M and No. 11 Oklahoma. A longshot, but if Mizzou wins out, it is in.

Looking ahead

• Texas A&M at Missouri (2:30 p.m. on ABC): Like we said, don't count out Eli Drinkwitz's team just yet. Keep this

in mind: before bringing the curtain down on the Brian Kelly era, the Aggies barely escaped with a three-point win at Arkansas.

 Auburn at Vanderbilt (3 p.m. on SEC **Network):** Will the Tigers respond to D.J. Durkin the way the defense has and end Vandy's storybook season?

• LSU at Alabama (6 p.m. on ABC): - So much talent, so little direction. How will the Tigers bounce back? Historically, LSU has had more luck against the Tide at Bryant-Denny Stadium than at home.


