

The series: Oklahoma leads 3-0.

Four-down territory

- 1. Upper hand: Auburn OB Jackon Arnold will be in familiar territory Saturday as he faces his former team. At OU, Arnold passed for 1,421 yards and 12 TDs as a sophomore in 2024, playing in 10 games with nine starts. Whether that's a good thing in terms of game planning is up for debate. "As far as schematics, we're going with what our breakdowns say and what we see on tape from this year," Auburn coach Hugh Freeze said. "And get a game plan that we hope gives him a chance to have success. But really haven't talked about anything else other than that."
- **2. Lowering the Boom:** The Sooners have allowed just 19 points so far, including just two touchdowns. Granted, two of the opponents were Illinois State and Temple. Still, the Sooners have the top scoring defense in the SEC, and their run defense (96 yards allowed per game) will be the first big test for Auburn. The Tigers are running the ball well so far and are third in the SEC in rushing offense (242 yards per game). "They're very stingy, very physical," Freeze said of the Sooners. "When I watch them on tape, I'm looking at a team that should be in playoff discussions. They're that talented and that good."
- 3. Nobody's perfect: Auburn is a perfect 3-0 so far, but the team isn't playing at its best in some areas. The Tigers slipped in the second half last week, failing to move the ball offensively and not getting third-down stops defensively. Freeze thinks he knows what the issue was. "I told them in the team meeting that we have to quit feeling like we have to be perfect," he said. "When you're not perfect and have a long face, that isn't going to get it. It's about playing the next pay and the next possession."
- 4. All hands on deck: Auburn has played numerous freshmen this season, particularly on defense. Defensive end Jared Smith picked up his fourth sack last week and safety Eric Winters had a career-high five tackles. Seven freshmen started in the opener and many

more got some reps last week. That's on purpose. The Tigers need the younger players on the field to get experience and provide depth. They will need it in the SEC opener with Oklahoma. "We've been getting ready for this moment by playing those young kids," Freeze said. "You have to have that kind of depth in these games."

Key matchup

Auburn OB Jackson Arnold vs. Oklahoma **OB John Mateer**

A battle between two transfers, Arnold has 501 yards passing with four touchdowns. Mateer leads the SEC with 906 passing yards and has five TDs.

Player of the week **Kevron Crawford. LB**

He leads the Tigers with 16 tackles and is tied for the SEC lead with three sacks and second in the league with five tackles for loss.

By the numbers

0: Auburn has not allowed a first-quarter touchdown through three games.

1: Auburn is making its first trip to Oklahoma. OU won at Jordan-Hare last year, and the Sooners beat the Tigers in the Sugar Bowl in January 1972 and Janu-

Oklahoma 28, Auburn 24

UAB at Tennessee



The series: Tennessee leads 5-0.

Four-down territory

- **1. Hard lesson:** The Georgia loss was brutal, but with a 12-team playoff in place, the Vols are still in the hunt. One loss won't break them, but there is little margin for error now. Tennessee tight end Miles Kitselman pointed out the Vols lost two games last year and still made the playoffs. Even Georgia lost early last season and won the SEC and made the playoffs. "We're in that exact same boat right now. We can either dwell on this and mope in it, be sad, or you can learn from it," Kitselman said.
- 2. Joey has entered the chat: Although UT didn't get the win against Georgia, QB Joey Aguilar was impressive enough to get some Heisman Trophy consideration. FanDuel has Aguilar at +1600 odds to win, seven spots behind Miami's Carson Beck (+750). Aguilar is 63-of-95 passing for 906 yards, which is second in the SEC, with two interceptions to go with nine touchdowns.
- 3. That's an issue: Before the Georgia game, Tennessee's defense allowed just 7 of 29 third-down conversions. Georgia converted 8 of 17. "At times we have applied great pressure to the quarterback," Tennessee coach Josh Heupel said. "Some of that depends on what kind of pressure packages we are in, adjusting to the formation we are seeing. In coverage, we've given up things we feel like we are in control of. That's an area where we can get better."
- 4. You again: Before UAB coach Trent Dilfer was in Birmingham, the former NFL quarterback was coaching at Lipscomb Academy in Nashville. Vols linebacker Edwin Spillman played for Dilfer and knows a little something about what kind of offense they will see. "I would describe it as almost kind of similar to our offense, but also to a little bit of Syracuse," Spillman said. "They really like the wide splits back from what I remember seeing. They are a fast-flowing offense. They're going to try to let their playmakers go out there and do their thing."

Brazzell has turned into a star player in the SEC. He's second in the league in yards (364), catches (20) and TDs (5). Milliner is the Blazers' top receiver in yards (268), catches (17) and TDs (3).

Player of the week

Joshua Josephs. DE

Josephs has a sack in all three games and is tied for the SEC lead. His four tackles for loss rank fifth in the league. He's also come up big with two forced fumbles.

UNA at Illinois State

When: noon Saturday

TV: ESPN+

Records: UNA (1-2), No. 6 Illinois State

The series: Illinois State leads 1-0.

Four-down territory

- 1. Rank and file: Illinois State is the first ranked opponent on UNA's schedule. The Redbirds check in at No. 6 in the STATS FCS Top 25. Illinois State is ranked fourth in the coaches poll, but nobody really cares about or counts that one - at the high school or college levels. When's the last time you heard of an FBS team, for example, ranked in a coaches poll? Exactly. Anyway, Illinois State is one of four ranked teams (at the moment) the Lions are scheduled to face. Abilene Christian (No. 14 on Oct. 4), Austin Peay (No. 18 on Oct. 25) and Tarleton State (No. 3 on Nov. 15) await. UNA is 1-20 all time against ranked FCS opponents. That includes a 1-3 mark last season, which included a 24-17 loss to Illinois State and a 47-34 win over Abilene Christian.
- **2. Better get used to the road:** UNA won last week's matchup against Northeastern State (Oklahoma) – a bad Division II team - 49-21 in its final home opener at Braly Stadium. The Lions' next home game won't be until Oct. 11, almost a month later. And UNA hasn't been all that successful in road games since 2018, its first Division I season. The program is just 7-33 during that stretch, which includes losses at Western Kentucky and Southeast Missouri State this season.
- **3. Up against that MVFC:** This will be UNA's fourth matchup against a team from the Missouri Valley Football Conference — a league that has won 12 of the last 14 FCS national titles and appeared in all 14 - since 2018. It had four teams make the playoffs last season. The Lions are 0-3 against such teams, although two have been decided by a single score. After the 38-7 loss at North Dakota State in 2018, UNA lost 17-14 in overtime at Indiana State in 2021 and 24-17 to Illinois State
- **4.** An upcoming chance to recharge: The matchup at Illinois State is UNA's final nonconference game. The Lions have an off week after that, which is considerably earlier than it was a season ago. UNA didn't have a bye until the middle of October that year. Whether that's a good thing

or not, obviously, is still to be determined. The Lions went into last season's bye on a three-game win streak and came out of it losing their final four. This upcoming one could be helpful. UNA has a trip to Abilene Christian after this one.

Key matchup

Illinois State OB Tommy Rittenhouse vs. **UNA pass rush**

Rittenhouse opened the season with a 6-for-13 passing performance for a mere 22 yards. That came at Oklahoma, a team currently ranked No. 11 in the AP Top 25. Since then — against FCS opponents - the quarterback is 38-for-42 for 380 yards, five touchdowns and one interception. He's also been sacked just twice. Against, you guessed it, Oklahoma. UNA has recorded seven sacks over its last two games. The Lions had four at Southeast Missouri State and three against

Northeastern State. Some pressure would likely go a long way.

Player of the week **Destin Wade, OB**

He was the pick last week going into his first UNA start. He completed 11 of 15 passes for 161 yards and a touchdown in two-plus quarters against Northeastern State. The Lions scored points on the seven drives he played. But that was against an overmatched opponent. It'll be worth seeing how he does against legitimate competition.

By the numbers

5: Where UNA's rushing offense ranks in the FCS out of 118 teams. The Lions are averaging almost 245 yards per game. Only Delaware State (280), Tennessee Tech (272), Texas Rio Grande Valley (264) and Jackson State (249) are higher.

86: Where UNA's pass offense ranks. The Lions are averaging close to 155 yards per game. Their three passing touchdowns are tied for the 14th fewest. Three teams have thrown zero, five have tossed one and five thrown two.

2021: The last time UNA had a noon kickoff. The Lions played three such games that year: at North Carolina A&T (a 38-34 loss), at Monmouth (a 45-33 loss) and at Hampton (a 35-27 win).

4: The number of road games left after Saturday's trip.

week's 28-7 home loss to Memphis. He averaged 48.2 yards per punt with five of at least 50 yards and five downed inside the 20. ... The Trojans' 112 yards offense was the weakest in their Division I history. ... Crenshaw was one punt shy of the school record set in 1984 by Doug Crane against Mississippi College. ... Crenshaw's 530 total punting yards easily bested the school record of 441


Tulane at No. 13 Ole Miss

They're 4-1 when it's played in Jackson, Mississippi. ... The Green Wave last beat Ole Miss in Oxford in 1988. The score was an eyepopping 14-9. Before that, it was 1980. It was a little more robust at 26-24. ... Tulane has already beaten a pair of Power Four opponents. The Green Wave erased Northwestern in the season opener 23-3 and topped Duke last week 34-27.... Ole Miss is 3-0 for the fifth straight year. The last time it had such a streak was from 1956-62.

The lowdown: Someone will be howling or growling after the Huskies and Bulldogs meet.... Mississippi State is trying to start 4-0 for the first time since winning its first nine games of 2014. That year, the Bulldogs reached No. 1 in the

national rankings and had a quarterback named Dak Prescott. ... NIU is 1-12 alltime vs. Southeastern Conference teams. The win was in 2003, 19-16 at Alabama. ... The Huskies are coming off a 20-9 loss at Maryland two weeks ago. ... Northern Illinois has held six straight opponents to 20 points or less, which is the second longest such streak in FBS. Florida has a seven-gamer. ... MSU sophomore Fluff Bothwell, a transfer from South Alabama, had the seventh multi-touchdown game of his career and second this season in last week's 63-0 win over Alcorn State. The Bulldogs led 42-0 at halftime.

Murray State, which lost 37-21 at Georgia State last week, is trying to avoid its second 0-4 start in four seasons and the seventh in school history. ... Both of Murray's series wins were in overtime: 23-17 in 2003 and 35-34 in 2013. ... The teams met in a nonconference game in 2022, a 34-3 JSU victory. ... 2021. ... Jags receiver Devin Voisin, who had one touchdown over the last two seasons, has four this year to rank third in the nation. ... USA redshirt freshman receiver Jeremy Scott scored his first career touchdown in last week's 31-15 loss at Auburn on his fourth career catch. ... Coastal, which has lost to Virginia and East Carolina by a combined 76-7, notched its win against FCS Charleston Southern 13-0 two weeks ago. ... Last week's 38-0 home loss to East Carolina was Coastal's first shutout loss since 42-0 at Stony Brook in October 2011 and first home shutout loss since 24-0 to Charleston Southern in November 2008. ... 

Manning: 'We're going to be better'

Texas quarterback Arch Manning had a simple message and a promise: There will be better days ahead from him.

"I know the type of player that I am," Manning said Monday as he answered another round of questions about a poor outing in last week's win over UTEP. "I know I'm going to play better and we're going to be better as an offense."

This week's matchup with Sam Houston State, a program in only its third season of FBS-level competition, would typically be an afterthought for the No. 8 team in the country.

But Manning's poor play has turned the Longhorns' final game before the Southeastern Conference schedule into a must-watch to see if he can deliver anything close to those preseason Heisman Trophy predictions.

If he struggles again, a suddenly doubtful fanbase turns its worries into a five-alarm fire. And even if he plays well, the result and Manning's stat line will likely be dismissed as coming against inferior competition.

Stats are one thing. Just passing the eye test this week would be a start.

Manning's play so far has stoked the embers of doubt. He struggled badly in a season-opening loss to Ohio State. He started slow the next week but rallied with four touchdown passes against San Jose State.

His day against UTEP last weekend was downright rough. Manning was 11-of-25 passing for 114 yards with one touchdown and interception. He had a streak of 10 consecutive incompletions. He sidearmed some throws and missed open receivers. There were boos late in the first half.

Through three games, Manning is completing just 55% of his passes.

"It's frustrating because I know I'm better than that," Manning said. "But you know, we're going to be better this week and get clicking on offense. I'm excited to get going."

Texas coach Steve Sarkisian promised patience with a player hitting the first adversity of his career.

"Here's a guy who's had an awesome life, they way he's grown up, the people he's been surrounded by," Sarkisian said. "I think you learn a lot about yourself through adversity and overcoming

adversity. ... When he gets on the other side of it, I think all of this is going to serve well not only for him, but for us as

Texas wide receiver Parker Livingstone caught three touchdown passes in the first two games. Manning badly overthrew him on a wide-open route in the end zone against UTEP.

Livingstone said the wide receivers can help Manning by delivering more big plays when given the chance.

"When he throws us the ball, it's our job to make a guy miss and create an explosive," Livingstone said.

Off the field, Manning has raked in millions in endorsements. Some of his product television ads have aired during Texas games this season.

Certainly more was expected of a quarterback in his third season in coach Sarkisian's offense. And yet Manning often looks rushed or confused or just simply misses open receivers.

"All my life I've been an accurate passer," Manning said. "I've just got to get back to it."

Sarkisian believes he can bring Manning to the level of play that was expected. Sarkisian at various times has pleaded for patience from fans and pundits.

"I feel like we've done enough with him to have a pretty good understanding of who he is as a player and what he's capable of. I know there's a lot of football in him that's high-level football," Sarkisian said.

"Our job as coaches is to work him towards that," Sarkisian said. "We've righted the ship before, we'll get there."

Manning's teammates say they're still confident in him as their leader.

"He's still a great quarterback," offensive lineman Trevor Goosby said. "I tell him that every day."

Gators steadfast in support of Lagway

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - Florida quarterback DJ Lagway has gone from appearing rusty to looking lost. It's not what anyone envisioned even though he missed nearly nine months dealing with various injuries.

He is dancing in the pocket, leading to off-balance throws that end up sailing over receivers or spinning into the ground. He is failing to get through his progressions, allowing defenders to lock onto his first read. He is lacking situational awareness - when to audible, when to run and when to slide – and showing little feel for the game.

He is still coach Billy Napier's guy, and that is unlikely to change.

Napier is sticking with his turnoverprone starter despite a five-interception performance in a 20-10 loss at No. 3 LSU on Saturday night.

"DJ's our quarterback," said Napier, now 20-21 in four seasons at Florida. "He's one of the best quarterbacks in the country. He made some good decisions, but he also made some bad decisions."

Lots of them. The sophomore threw an interception in every quarter in Death Valley, including back-to-back picks on Florida's final two drives while trailing by 10. The fourth one came with the Gators in field-goal range and prompted a lengthy sideline discussion with Napier.

"I'm just excited to get back to work," said Lagway, who was making his first road start in Southeastern Conference play. "I got to get this taste out of my mouth. I played horrible football, and I got to do better."

Lagway couldn't recall ever turning over the ball five times in a game before Saturday. Not in high school. Not in peewee football. Not in his backyard.

"I've never had a performance like that in my life, so it's kind of hard to process it," he said. "But at the end of the day, it's all about how you bounce back and how you respond. And I'm planning on doing so."

The Gators, who have now lost consecutive games in each of Napier's four seasons, play at rival and fourth-ranked Miami (3-0) on Saturday night. Florida is winless in eight road games against ranked teams during Napier's tenure.

Florida (1-2) faces seven more ranked

opponents this season, including three in a row against the Hurricanes, Texas and Texas A&M over the next month. No one should be surprised to see Lagway start all of them, even though promising freshman Tramell Jones Jr. waits on the bench.

Napier has shown unwavering loyalty to his players and coaches. He kept defensive coordinator Austin Armstrong, special teams coordinator Chris Couch and strength and conditioning coach Marc Hocke despite essentially demoting them. And he continues to rotate backups into games even though there's an obvious drop-off.

It is hard to argue with his Lagway decision. After all, Lagway went 6-1 as a starter as a freshman and showed glimpses of greatness. But he has experienced setback after setback since.

He missed the majority of two games last season because of a left hamstring injury. He was slowed to start 2025 following surgery to repair a core-muscle injury. He missed all of spring practice because of a sore throwing shoulder that team doctors believe stems from a lingering high school injury. And then he strained his left calf while running with teammates days before training camp began in late July.

He has fully practiced just four weeks since January, although his popularity continued to soar. The 20-year-old Lagway has name, image and likeness deals with Gatorade, Jordan Brand, Mercedes-Benz, Lamborghini Orlando, T-Mobile, Beats by Dre,

Chipotle and others.

His value as a brand ambassador seemingly took a hit in Baton Rouge. Lagway completed 33 of 49 passes — both career highs – for 287 yards and a touchdown against the Tigers. He was sacked three times and finished with 19 yards rushing on nine carries.

Those modest numbers probably would have been enough to win, but his turnovers were the difference. His second pick set up a field goal and his third was returned 58 yards for a score.

"It's not just on one person," linebacker Myles Graham said. "It's on all of us, and we've got to all-around play better. The game slipped out of our hands two weeks in a row, so that's a problem that we're going to fix."

Is the SEC too deep for its own good?

There's a notion that the SEC is competitive, but there's no alpha dog this season. At first glance, that notion is nonsense. Upon further review, it may be spot on.

Look across the college football landscape. Teams that were expected to contend for conference titles are taking on water. That includes Clemson in the ACC and Kansas State in the Big 12. Throw in Notre Dame, which is 0-2 after a pair of narrow Top 25 losses.

Clemson and Kansas State can at least recover by winning their conferences., though that's not likely. But Notre Dame has just one team currently ranked in the Top 25 left on the schedule. The Fighting Irish are kaput already.

Texas A&M added to the Irish misery Saturday night with a thrilling, 41-40 come-from-behind win engineered by Marcel Reed. Yet no one is proclaiming the Aggies the SEC's best powerhouse just vet.

But what sets the league apart is the traditional bottom. Vanderbilt is already 3-0 and just beat South Carolina decisively after the Gamecocks lost QB LaNorris Sellers to injury.

Going into the year, Mississippi State was the obvious choice for bringing up the rear of the league. But the Bulldogs already have an upset of 2024 CFP participant Arizona State on the ledger. Jeff Lebby's second edition is already hallway to bowl eligibility.

Only Kentucky looks like fodder for the rest of the league this year.

My point is this: The SEC may not have a team that laps the pack. Instead, it may have very good teams with three or four headed to the postseason capable of winning it all.

If that many get there.

I'm going out on a limb and predicting this: The SEC champ will have at least two conference losses. I wouldn't be shocked if the winner had three.

That is going to cause a stress test for the CFP selection committee. The emphasis is supposed to be on strength of schedule and quality wins. But you're going to have some less than imposing records to choose from.

My guess is that Georgia, Alabama and

Texas (underwhelming, but with the most favorable schedule) make the field. You could easily substitute LSU, Oklahoma and Tennessee or Missouri.

For years everyone predicted that the expanded playoff would make the regular season meaningless. Instead, you're going to have more November games that resonate with national ramifications than ever before.

Looking ahead

• Auburn at Oklahoma (2:30 p.m. Sat**urday on ABC):** Is it too early to call this a CFP play-in game? Two surprisingly good teams face off with each already claiming an impressive nonconference win. Add the subplot of Auburn's Jackson Arnold returning to his former school, and this one is as big as it gets in September. Consider the winner a legitimate contender.

 South Carolina at Missouri (6 p.m. **Saturday on ESPN):** Missouri has quietly risen into the Top 25 with a new QB and one old-school scalp after taking down arch-rival Kansas. South Carolina limps in likely without Sellers (note that we're writing this early in the week, so things can change). Both have other opportunities to correct their course, but an impressive Mizzou win puts the Tigers in the thick of contention.

 Florida at Miami (6:30 p.m. Saturday on **ABC):** The Gators arrive on a two-game skid, and Billy Napier's seat has gone from hot to radioactive. At 1-2, the Gators look and play like a disappointment. But if they can clean up penalties and turnovers, they're capable of pulling off the upset. But this may be more old-school Miami, capable of running away with the ACC. We'll know more late Saturday night.


