

## Kentucky at Auburn

When: 6:30 p.m. Saturday

The series: Auburn leads 28-6-1.

#### Four-down territory

1. Wide open: The Tigers put in Stanford transfer Ashton Daniels at Arkansas after starting QB Jackson Arnold threw a pick-6 inside the red zone last week in the first half. Daniels was 6-of-8 passing for 77 yards, and the Tigers outscored Arkansas 33-3 to secure a 33-24 win and snap a four-game losing skid. Who will start Saturday? Auburn coach Hugh Freeze isn't sure, but the position is wide

- 2. Cam questionable: With the offense still having issues, the status of Cam Coleman becomes increasingly important. The Tigers' leading receiver (440 yards, three touchdowns) left last week's game with an ankle injury. The good news is it doesn't appear to be serious. "We're hopeful, but obviously don't know just yet," Freeze said. "It's not a high ankle sprain, it's down in the lower part. Those tend to heal quicker. We don't really know at this point." Coleman was a key cog last week, making a 23-yard touchdown catch for the offense's only score.
- 3. Red zone: Auburn can thank Alex McPherson and the defense for last week's win. McPherson's six field goals and a pick-6 supplied the bulk of the points for the Tigers. The offense contributed with just one touchdown. Red-zone scoring was a big issue last week, but it's also been a sore spot this season. Of the Tigers' 24 red-zone scores, 11 have been field goals. Auburn is 46% in the red zone scoring touchdowns (13-of-28).
- 4. A cut above: Kentucky OB Cutter Boley is coming off a pair of confidencebuilding performances against Texas and Tennessee, in which he was a combined 57-of-74 passing (77%) for 588 yards and five touchdowns. He also rushed for 76 yards and one touchdown. He is the first UK QB to complete at least 74.3% of his passes in consecutive games since Dusty Bonner in 1999. He is the first UK OB with at least 26 completions in consecutive games since 2015 (Patrick Towles) and consecutive conference games since 2010 (Mike Hartline).

#### **Key matchup**

#### Auburn WR Eric Singleton Jr. vs. Kentucky WR Kendrick Law

Singleton has to pick up the slack for Cam Coleman, who may not be 100%. He's second on the team with 367 yards and two touchdowns. Law leads the Wildcats in receptions (24), yards (302) and touchdowns (2).

#### Player of the week

#### **Xavier Atkins, LB**

Atkins is the MVP of the defense and has led or tied for the team lead in tackles in all five SEC games and is tied for second with 49 tackles in league play.

#### By the numbers

2: Auburn's Jeremiah Cobb has two straight games with 100-plus vards rushing.

2: The Tigers are tied for second in the league with a plus-7 turnover margin with four forced fumbles and seven interceptions.

3: Auburn has three players ranked in the SEC top 15 in tackles for loss. Xavier Atkins is first with 13, Keyron Crawford 10th with eight and Robert Woodyard Jr. 14th with seven.

20: Of Auburn's 36 offensive possessions that have resulted in points, 20 were drives of seven or more plays and 60 or more yards.

#### **Prediction**

#### **Auburn 35, Kentucky 14**

Daniels at OB gives Auburn a muchneeded boost. He doesn't make the offense more dynamic, but he does move the ball effectively and that's what the Tigers need more than anything. The defense continues to keep Auburn in games. You have to wonder where Auburn would be if it made a OB change earlier in the season-maybe Freeze wouldn't be on the hot seat.

# Oklahoma at Tennessee

When: 6:30 p.m. Saturday

**TV/radio:** ABC/FM-97.9, AM-1340 **Records:** No. 18 Oklahoma (6-2, 2-2 SEC), No. 14 Tennessee (6-2, 3-2) **The series:** Oklahoma leads 3-2.

#### Four-down territory

1. Dark Mode: Tennessee will don its "Dark Mode" uniforms against Oklahoma. The Vols have played in the black uniforms six times overall and five times under head coach Josh Heupel (4-1). It's also the first night game at Neyland Stadium this season. According to Rocky Top Insider, here is a look at the Vols' record under Heupel in various uniform combinations: orange jersey/white pants (20-2), orange jersey/orange pants (8-1), white jersey/white pants (8-8), white jersey/orange pants (1-4), Dark Mode (4-1, 1-1 with white helmet, 3-0 with black helmet), and Smokey grey (3-0).

**2. Sore spot:** There is a reason to be concerned before the Vols take on the Sooners in a must-win game for both team's playoff survival. Tennessee's defense has allowed 30-plus points in four straight games. Fortunately for UT, the offense responded in three of those games to earn the win. The offense may have to bail out the defense again against a Sooners team that has the capability to roll up big numbers. "The correctables have to get corrected and that's what we did this morning and that's what we will continue to work on this week. I'm excited to go play with these guys," Heupel said.

**3. Mirror image:** The Vols' defense faces a skilled quarterback in Oklahoma's John Mateer. The defense has seen a version of him already this season, in some ways. Tennessee held off Arkansas QB Taylen Green in a close win a couple weeks ago. "(Mateer) is kind of similar (to Green). I would not say he is as athletic as him, but he is still similar, so we have to keep our eyes on him, keep him in the pocket to make sure he does not get to our edges like we tried to do with Taylen Green," Tennessee defensive lineman Dominic Bailey said.

4. Not on their mind: With playoff limited to 12 spots, every game counts. The Vols have two losses already and can't afford any slipups the rest of the season. "I'm approaching that one day

at a time," tight end Miles Kitselman said. "None of that matters if you don't take care of the weekend that is in front of you and take care of the day that is in front of you, the meeting that is in front of you, the lift that is in front of you, so just attacking it day-by-day and being very process oriented, not worried about the results but worried about the process."

#### **Key matchup**

#### Tennessee QB Joey Aguilar vs. Oklahoma OB John Mateer

Aguilar has one of the best arms in the nation, passing for 2,344 yards and 18 touchdowns. Mateer is mobile out of the pocket (226 rushing, five TDs) and has a good arm, too (1,790, eight TDs).

#### Player of the week Mike Matthews, WR

Matthews caught six passes for 107 yards last week, his third 100-yard game of the season. His 562 yards is third on the team but he's capable of big plays.

#### By the numbers

5: Tennessee has five defensive touchdowns this season, which is tied with Louisiana Tech for the national lead.

Maybe the Vols are on to something with the "Dark Mode" uniforms. If it works, why change it? Something that must change is the defense. Missing tackles, missed assignments and silly mistakes isn't going to cut it despite the offense putting up video game numbers. Corralling Sooner QB John Mateer has to be the priority. If the defense can step up just a little bit, Tennessee's Joey Aguilar and the offense will take care of the rest.

## UNA at Utah Tech

When: 3 p.m. Saturday

TV: ESPN+

Records: UNA (2-6, 1-3 UAC), Utah

The series: UNA leads 2-0.

#### Four-down territory

**1. Not quite the same height:** This will be UNA's second trip to the state of Utah in two years. The Lions played at Southern Utah last season and with it came some pretty high altitude. Southern Utah's stadium in Cedar City sits at 5,769 feet above sea level, the fourth highest in Division I after Wyoming (7,215), Northern Arizona (6,980) and Air Force (6,620). Utah Tech's isn't quite that high. St. George, which is located two hours closer to Las Vegas than Salt Lake City, is only 2,700 feet above sea level. But that's still a little more than 2.000 above Florence.

2. Kindred spirits? UNA and Utah Tech are separated by 1,687 miles - on the shortest route through Mississippi, Tennessee, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona and then Utah – but the programs certainly have something important in common. Neither has been very good, let alone competitive, since making the jump to the FCS. The Lions moved ahead of the 2018 season. They are 23-55 since then, including 7-22 against conference foes. The Trailblazers left Division II after the 2019 season. They have compiled an 11-47 record, including 4-20 against league opponents, since. Both UNA and Utah Tech are at the bottom of the UAC standings.

3. Last meeting for, it appears, a while: Utah Tech - as well as Southern Utah won't be moving to the rebranded WAC (which will also be known as the UAC) next season. Instead, the Utah schools will be joining the Big Sky in 2026 to replace the departing Sacramento State, which is set to join the Big West in all sports but football. Utah Tech and Southern Utah will be competing against the likes of Eastern Washington, Idaho, Idaho State, Montana, Montana State, Northern Arizona, Northern Colorado, Portland State and Weber State.

**4. A learning QB:** Saturday will mark the 10th career start for Utah Tech signal caller Bronson Barben. Unlike when the Lions faced Austin Peay's first-year

starter Chris Parson last week, Barben hasn't been quite as dynamic. The redshirt freshman is completing a little more than 58% of his throws for 1,000 yards, four touchdowns and six interceptions. Barben has more multi-interception games (2) than multi-TD outings (1). He's also rushed for a score. Barben, however, was 5-for-8 for 137 vards and two touchdowns last year at UNA.

#### **Key matchup**

#### **UNA LB Demarcious Robinson/DB Cam**eron Jamar vs. Utah Tech TE Eric Olsen

The Lions will likely have different people covering Olsen in different defensive packages, so why not list two here? Olsen currently ranks first among FCS tight ends in catches (37) and yards (412) to go along with his two touchdowns. He's the Trailblazers' main offensive threat.

#### Player of the week

#### Noah Gregg, WR

Gregg is coming off his first 100-yard game. He had five catches for 106 yards in last week's loss at Austin Peay. It was also UNA's first of the season. The Lions had five such performances from various players last year.

**6:** The number of consecutive losing seasons UNA has. A loss Saturday would make it No. 7.

## Alabama's DeBoer 'definitely evolving'

TUSCALOOSA - Alabama's sevengame winning streak has revealed a new side of coach Kalen DeBoer.

And it could set the tone for the fourthranked Crimson Tide as it moves closer to securing a spot in the Southeastern Conference championship game and the College Football Playoff.

Alabama (7-1, 5-0 SEC), which has won every game since a stunning loss at Florida State to open the season, is off this week before beginning a three-game homestand that includes LSU and No. 18 Oklahoma.

DeBoer is sure to be fired up before each of the games. He certainly was for Alabama's last home game, a 37-20 win against rival Tennessee.

With AC/DC's "Thunderstruck" blaring inside Bryant-Denny Stadium, DeBoer led players toward the field before the opening kick. His energy steadily increased as they made their way through the hallways and out of the tunnel.

DeBoer clapped his hands every so often, yelling "Let's go!" His energy culminated with him slapping the goalpost as the team reached the field.

"That's definitely a new side of coach DeBoer, and it's good," receiver Germie Bernard said. "We need for him to be fired up because, as players, we learn from the leader. He's the leader, and so he has to lead by example, and he's been doing a great job of that."

DeBoer attributed the moment to feeding off of the players' pregame energy. The clip provided a peek into the growing confidence inside the Alabama program, one that seemed to be missing during the ups and downs of DeBoer's first year in Tuscaloosa.

"If you haven't seen that emotion from the outside, now you have," linebacker Deontae Lawson said. "That's the coach DeBoer that we're getting used to. He's it." definitely evolving."

Alabama's rise and DeBoer's swagger began after that Week 1 debacle in Tallahassee. The Crimson Tide players began holding players-only meetings every Friday. DeBoer arrives at the end of each one to deliver a message. Now, several weeks later, it's considered the turning point to the season.

to say," Lawson recalled. "He said some things, and the guys just got really very excited. That was the first little taste of

The sense of urgency has been palpable.

Florida State's four-game losing skid has made the opener a "bad loss" for Alabama, creating a back-against-thewall mentality. There's also a new level of comfort between DeBoer, his staff and his players.

"I've been able to just really tap into "He came in and said what he needed just the guys as a whole," DeBoer said.

"But also really individually and be able to know what makes one guy tick vs. another. You talk to the whole team, certainly, but you also have to have that relationship and that understanding of what makes guys go. So I think our coaching staff gets that, and we communicate very well."

Alabama's current résumé is one of the strongest in college football, complete with four wins against ranked opponents. And the Tide ended an unsettling trend with last week's come-frombehind 29-22 victory at South Carolina.

Alabama won as a double-digit awayfrom-home favorite, a position that didn't bode well for a program that lost to FSU in Week 1 and to Vanderbilt, Oklahoma and Michigan last year in similar positions.

"I challenged the guys, and they believe it: That the world has not seen Bama's best yet," DeBoer said. "That's really what we're striving to do. When you keep it really as simple as possible on that, have great preparation, everyone caring about what we're trying to accomplish, you have that edge."





The Gamecocks have dropped three straight, most recently 29-22 at home to Alabama, which scored twice in the final 2 1/2 minutes. ... Ole Miss' Trinidad Chambliss ranks 15th in the nation with 2,240 yards of total offense. ... Winston Watkins' 111 yards receiving in last week's 34-26 win at Oklahoma was the most by an Ole Miss freshman since Elijah Moore had 129 vs. South Carolina in 2018. ... ## Defense carries Indiana's playoff hopes

It's easy to get enamored with No. 2 Indiana's glitzy offense.

The gritty, increasingly stout defense has been just as impressive — maybe even better.

The Hoosiers set the tone with an interception return for a touchdown on the second play of last weekend's game and that came two weeks after holding usually high-octane Oregon to one field goal over the final 39 minutes of game

So, as Indiana continues chasing its goals – a perfect regular season, the first Big Ten championship game berth in school history, a second straight playoff bid and a national championship - coach Curt Cignetti knows he needs a strong, steady defense to achieve those feats.

"The kids respond," Cignetti said after a 56-6 rout of UCLA. "They have a lot of pride. We have some defensive backs back there that have really good ball skills. The safeties, as much as I like to get on them about being late to get lined up and stuff like that, they have really good ball skills. They've made a lot of really nice interceptions. Our linebackers do, too. We do a good job of stopping the run."

Frankly, the Hoosiers (8-0, 5-0 Big Ten) have done everything pretty well this season.

They head to Maryland this weekend ranked among the top 12 in the Football Bowl Subdivision in scoring defense (10.9 points per game), total defense (242.8 yards), pass defense (157.4) and run defense (85.4). Their time of possession advantage, more than nine minutes per game, also ranks fourth nationally.

But how good this defense has been is not reflected by numbers alone.

Prior to the Michigan State game, Spartans coach Jonathan Smith said he couldn't find a weakness. Other coaches and analysts have raved about Indiana's ability to tackle and their use of proper techniques — features that don't happen by chance.

"They get us really prepared for every game," defensive tackle Tyrique Tucker said, referring to the Hoosiers' coaches. "They make sure we know everything. We see all the looks at practice. They all do a really great job at preparing us for what we are about to see out there."

They'll even mix it up come game time.

Following Saturday's contest, Bruins interim coach Tim Skipper credited the Hoosiers with throwing some "unscouted" looks at his offense, something a veteran unit like Indiana's is capable of.

Linebacker Aiden Fisher, who had the game-changing takeaway against UCLA, defensive end Mikail Kamara and cornerback D'Angelo Ponds each possess All-American credentials and each followed Cignetti and defensive coordinator Bryant Haines from James Madison to Indiana. Tucker, another

transfer from James Madison, is one of the Big Ten's top interior linemen.

Their experience in the system has helped new transfers such as safety Louis Moore, who played at Ole Miss last year, and defensive lineman Hosea Wheeler. who was at Western Kentucky, make quick, productive transitions.

The emergence of Isaiah Jones as a starting linebacker has helped, too.

Jones made only two starts in 2024, but has become a menace for opposing quarterbacks and now ranks third on the team in tackles (45), behind only Moore and Fisher. Iones also took over the defensive play-calling duties last weekend when Fisher left with a knee injury after only two series.

While Fisher is expected to play against the Terrapins (4-3, 1-3), Jones promises to be ready if he's making the calls again at Maryland. But the secret to his success is simple – preparation.

"We have a lot of cut-ups," Jones said earlier this season. "Really, it's just using angles and attacking the offense. We don't want to sit back and kind of react to the offense; we want to get after them, get after the quarterback, and kind of get them off schedule."

### Only beauty in SEC shows on scoreboard

The college football we've always known has flipped on its head. Payers get paid like pros and coaches go from legends to the firing line in the course of a season or two — or in weeks, depending on expectations.

That's why perspectives must change.

You may feel Mississippi State blew a 17-point lead last weekend or that South Carolina choked away an eightpoint upset in 135 seconds.

That's old school thinking.

The truth is the SEC is more like the NFL today. Aesthetics don't matter. It's all about winning in crunch time.

Texas just did that again. A week after avoiding the upset of all upsets in Lexington, the Longhorns rallied from a 17-point fourth-quarter deficit for another overtime victory in Starkville, taming Mississippi State 45-38.

Alabama needed 15 points in the final 2:15 to survive at South Carolina and avoid a damaging loss. That's the definition of a trap game, following a string of four-straight Top 25 wins.

Good teams find a way to win. They make plays under duress. That's the difference between 10-2 and headed for the playoffs and 5-7 and looking for a coaching upgrade.


We said a week ago Texas A&M was starting to pull away with a favorable schedule down the stretch. The Aggies emphasized the point with a 49-25 beatdown at LSU, perhaps the singlemost impressive conference victory this season.

But let's not get carried away. Texas A&M also survived nailbiters with Auburn (at home) and Arkansas to get to the top of the standings before feasting on an LSU program that's lost its way.

To get to Atlanta, they'll have to finish off Beau Pribula-less Missouri, South Carolina and Texas. That's close to "lock" territory.

There may not be a great team in the SEC this season. Meanwhile, the Big Ten conceivably has two in Ohio State and Indiana. (Yes, Indiana is real.)

But come postseason time, no one will be more stress-tested than the SEC teams that advance.

#### **Looking ahead**

- Vanderbilt at Texas (11 a.m. on ABC): Vandy's still dandy heading into the final leg of its four-week Top 25 challenge with only a loss at Alabama marring the way. If the Commodores survive Saturday, they become a legitimate frontrunner for the CFP. Don't count out Texas, either. Three of the next four games come against Top 10 foes. A sweep gets the Longhorns in.
- **Georgia vs Florida (2:30 p.m. on ABC):** The Gators arrive at the Cocktail Party a week rested and removed from the Billy Napier drama. Expect this one to be tight for three quarters.
- Oklahoma at Tennessee (6:30 p.m. on ABC): Welcome to the CFP wild-card playoffs. The only problem: The winner isn't guaranteed a bid, but the loser's definitely looking elsewhere in December.
- Kentucky at Auburn (6:30 p.m. on ESPN): The Tigers can double their winning streak, move to near lock for a bowl berth and stop the Hugh Freeze rumors with a victory at home.





