



### Four-down territory

- 1. Welcome back: The Crimson Tide got some much-needed good news this week with return of defensive lineman Tim Keenan III and running back Jam Miller. Tide coach Kalen DeBoer announced both will play Saturday. The veterans are key pieces that have been missing this season due to injuries. Without Keenan, the defense is giving up 138 yards rushing per game while the offense is producing just 123 yards rushing without Miller. "It's good to have him back," DeBoer said of Kennan. "He's had a couple good days here, we'll continue to build here through the week of practice is what we're expecting."
- **2. Bumpy road:** The Crimson Tide has lost four of its last five road games under DeBoer, three last year and in the opener this season. They were favored to win in all four losses. The Crimson Tide is an underdog against Georgia and is playing in Athens for the first time since 2015. There are a few key factors to prevent mishaps on the road. "Really just prepare, invest, and do everything you can to be confident and do something special together," DeBoer said. "Just ask these guys to empty the tank every single day. And they've done that. That's what we've got to do on Saturday."
- **3. Steady hand:** Ty Simpson has been nearly flawless in the past two outings. He is 41 of his last 46 passes for 608 yards with seven touchdowns. He leads the SEC with a 186.64 pass efficiency. That accuracy will get tested with a road atmosphere, but the good news is Georgia is allowing more than 200 passing yards a game. "When Ty starts fast and guys can feel that, that he's making great decisions and we've cot command in the huddle and at the line of scrimmage, I think they feel that sense of control early in the game," Alabama offensive coordinator Ryan Grubb said.
- 4. Under the Gun(ner): Georgia's offense hasn't missed a beat with OB Gunner Stockton taking the helm. He's averaging 240 yards per game, but he is

also dangerous with his legs when the pocket collapses. Mobile QBs are a sore spot for Alabama (see Florida State's Tommy Castellanos). "He's tough. He's gritty. He's willing to get the yards in the read game. He makes the right decisions the vast majority of the time," DeBoer said. "He has certainly brought an element to their run game that maybe they didn't have as much with Carson (Beck) a year ago."

### **Key matchup**

### Alabama LB Deonte Lawson vs. Georgia LB Raylen Wilson

Stopping the run, as well as preventing the quarterbacks from breaking loose outside the pocket, will be key for either team. Lawson leads Alabama with 19 tackles, including one for a loss. Wilson leads UGA with 23 tackles and has one sack.

### Player of the week

### Tim Keenan III. DL

One of the Tide's team captains, Keenan hasn't played this season due to injury. He's been cleared to play and the run defense needs him in a big way.

### By the numbers

1: Alabama's plus-six turnover margin (three interceptions, three fumble recoveries) leads the SEC.

**15:** Alabama has a 15-10 record against Georgia in Athens.

**59:** The Crimson Tide has won 59 of its last 61 games when scoring a touchdown on the first offensive possession of the game.

### Georgia 24, Alabama 14

Alabama owns the Bulldogs in the regular season, winning nine straight. But this is a new era and the Alabama dynasty is in the rearview mirror. Alabama built confidence with a solid win against Wisconsin, but the run game, a staple of Crimson Tide teams, has vanished. # After 10-year wait, UGA will host Tide

ATHENS, Ga. – Kirby Smart has had to wait 10 years for his Georgia team to play at home against Alabama.

Saturday night's visit by No. 17 Alabama to No. 5 Georgia gives Smart, the former Crimson Tide defensive coordinator, a long-awaited opportunity to have the home-field advantage in the high-profile Southeastern Conference rivalry.

While waiting on this home game, Georgia has struggled to a 1-6 record against Alabama under Smart.

One of Smart's highlights of his decade leading the Georgia program is beating Alabama in Indianapolis on Jan. 10, 2022, to win the national championship, ending a 41-year title drought for the program. Georgia added a second straight national title the following year.

Otherwise, Alabama is 6-0 against Georgia in the Smart era. The Crimson Tide beat the Bulldogs 41-34 in Tuscaloosa last season in Kalen DeBoer's first SEC game as Alabama's coach. It was Alabama's second home win over Smart's Bulldogs. Alabama's other four wins over Smart and Georgia have come in Atlanta, including three SEC championship games and the 2018 national championship game.

Can Georgia's home-field advantage end Alabama's run of success against the Bulldogs?

"Playing at home, it helps," Smart said Monday. "The atmosphere helps, the crowd noise helps, being familiar with your surroundings and all that stuff helps, but at the end of the day, you have to go play football. It comes down to matchups, it comes down to who blocks and who tackles the best, who executes and does things in the key moments of the game. So, certainly glad it's at home, but we've still got to play well."

Georgia (3-0, 1-0) gained momentum for the visit from Alabama by beating Tennessee 44-41 in overtime on Sept. 13 in another important SEC game. Alabama (2-1, 0-0) beat Wisconsin 38-14 on Sept. 13. The Bulldogs and Crimson Tide were off last week.

Georgia's first two home games were wins over Marshall and Austin Peay. Smart wasn't happy to see fans leaving in the third quarter of the runaway 45-7 victory over Marshall on Aug. 30, and a

weather delay helped put a damper on the crowd in a sluggish 28-6 win over Austin Peay on Sept. 6.

There would be a significant difference in the Sanford Stadium atmosphere for any visit from Alabama. That edge could be intensified by the prime-time kickoff. Georgia's crowd noise is known to peak for high-profile night games.

"I would agree with that statement, that it's louder at night than day," Smart said. "... I think the crowd has a little longer to get prepared for it, and they're louder. I mean, they're not as taxed, not as much heat. So the games I've coached in, played in, been a part of, night games are a little more rowdy."

Georgia players used last week's extra practice time to begin getting excited about the big game.

"The talent they have and the talent we have, any time you get two elite programs going head to head, it results in some good games that we've all seen in the past," punter Brett Thorson said. "So obviously we want to win the SEC and we know Alabama is always going to be a tough team in the SEC. So any time that game comes up, you know it's going to be a good challenge really to test where we're at and where we're going this year. And it's exciting."



# Auburn at Texas A&M

### Four-down territory

**1. Explosive player:** Texas A&M ranks among the nation's best at generating 20 yard-plus rush or pass plays. Through three games, the Aggies have produced 22 (7.3 per game). Leading the way is receiver Mario Craver, who averages 22 yards per catch and had 207 yards last week against Notre Dame. All four of his touchdowns have been 20 or more yards, including one for 86 and another for 72. His 434 yards leads the SEC and is third in the nation. His 20 catches are second in the league.

**2. Hard Reed:** The Aggies have an explosive offense, and that starts with quarterback Marcel Reed. He is third in the SEC with 290 passing yards per game and can break loose outside the pocket. He has 124 rushing yards and has been sacked just twice. He's got nine passing touchdowns with one rushing. To put it mildly, he's dynamic. "As we saw last year, he's super twitchy and can throw and run it," Auburn coach Hugh Freeze said of Reed's 297 passing yards with three TDs and 66 rushing yards against the Tigers last season.

3. Thanks for nothing: Auburn got burned by Oklahoma last week on a touchdown that shouldn't have counted. A Sooners receiver faked walking off the field as if injured, but instead stopped near the sideline. He was wide open for a 22-yard touchdown. The SEC released a statement on the issue, admitting the TD should not have counted. "The officiating crew did not properly interpret the action as a hideout tactic. If properly officiated, the second-down play should have resulted in a team unsportsmanlike penalty of 15 yards assessed from the previous spot," the statement read.

4. Disappearing act: Auburn's leading rusher, Jeremiah Cobb, ran the ball just six times for 61 yards in the loss to Oklahoma. He broke one run for 44 yards, the Tigers' longest run of the day. Auburn's Jackson Arnold dropped back to pass 49 times and was sacked nine times. (Initially recorded as 10 sacks,

the total was revised to nine Sunday.) "I probably should have forced the run a little more," Freeze said. "But it was tough sledding in there to get those tough vards. I think we had the things in the passing game our guys could win on. I thought that was our best chance to win the game."

### **Key matchup**

### Auburn DB Raion Strader vs. Texas A&M **DB Marcus Ratcliffe**

Shutting down big plays in the passing game is the goal this week. Raion Strader is a leader in Auburn's secondary with two pass breakups and six tackles. Ratcliffe leads the Aggies in tackles with 17 and pass breakups with three.

### Player of the week Jeremiah Cobb, RB

Auburn got away from the run game last week. Cobb should get a chance Saturday. He has 374 rushing vards with four touchdowns.

### By the numbers

1: The Tigers lead the SEC and rank fifth in FBS in rushing defense at 58.3 vards per game.

**1:** Aggie receiver Mario Craver leads the nation with 147.7 receiving yards per game.

# **Buzz** builds behind Ga. Tech's success

ATLANTA – Longtime Georgia Tech fan Luke Cowart can't remember the last time the Yellow Jackets entered an ACC matchup as a two-touchdown favorite. Need proof? His name on X is Georgia Tech pain account. He's been let down by this team a time or two.

But this week, BetMGM Sportsbook listed Georgia Tech as 14-point favorites over Wake Forest – a reflection of a program off to its first 4-0 start since 2014, now ranked No. 16 in the AP Top 25.

It's more than just buzz. No. 16 is the Yellow Jackets' highest ranking since 2015. The ceiling appears high for a Georgia Tech team likely favored in all but one of its remaining regular-season games. The stands at Bobby Dodd Stadium are filling up on Saturdays as the Yellow Jackets have entered national chatter and Heisman conversation.

Cowart would know best that it hasn't always been like this. His family has been season-ticket holders for 32 years. He didn't miss more than 10 home games from age 2 to 18.

"Opposing fan bases would completely take over our stadium," he said. "The lowest point of that was when I went to watch us play Ole Miss in 2022 and we

lost 42-0, and it was the first time I had heard us boo our own team and coach."

Coach Brent Key should be credited for fostering this new era of Georgia Tech football. Key took over as interim head coach midway through the 2022 season, succeeding former coach Geoff Collins. He was promoted to head coach the next fall, and in 2024 he was given a five-year extension, keeping him with the Yellow Jackets through 2029.

For eager fans, it's felt like a somewhat slow build. But what Key and his supporting crew have accomplished in recent years is admirable. The Yellow Jackets have gone 22-16 under Key. The team has steadily brought in new talent through recruits and the transfer portal. And in an era where retaining players is just as challenging as recruiting them, the core group has continued to lead the charge.

The team can feel the energy radiating quarterback Haynes King creeps into the from the stands. Those numbers translate directly to noise, momentum and confidence on Saturdays.

"It's always an amazing feeling to see the stands filled up to max potential because that gets us juiced up," senior defensive back Clayton Powell-Lee said. "For us on defense, us hearing third downs being called and you just hear the stadium rocking, it's like 'OK, we're here to play some ball."

# Tennessee at Mississippi State

When: 3:15 p.m. Saturday **TV/radio:** SEC/FM-97.9, AM-1340

**Records:** No. 15 Tennessee (3-1, 0-1 SEC), Mississippi State (4-0, 0-0) **The series:** Tennessee leads 30-16-1.

### Four-down territory

**1. Receiving praise:** Tennessee's Chris Brazzell is one of the top receivers in the country. His six touchdowns lead the nation, and he leads the team with 426 yards on 25 catches. He's a key cog in the offense this week as the Vols take on a stingy Bulldogs pass defense. "Chris, obviously, what he's done here in the first few ball games, is really special, but all of us, him included, have got to continue to grow and take another step here this week," Tennessee coach Josh Heupel said.

2. Taking their shots: Tennessee's Joey Aguilar has hit on four passes of 50-plus yards. Mississippi State's Blake Shapen has five. They are two of three SEC quarterbacks (Ole Miss' Trinidad Chambliss, four) with four plays over 50 yards. Tennessee had six pass plays of 50 or more yards all of last season. "There are some things in our playcalling that has played a part in that," Heupel said. "Joey is a big piece of that. He's making accurate throws down the field and letting our guys go and make plays."

**3. Beware of dog:** Mississippi State is off and running in 2025 with a 4-0 mark, including a win over then-No. 12 Arizona State in Week 2. Tennessee downed the Bulldogs last season but should expect a much better game this time. The defense is giving up just 129 passing yards a game and has five interceptions while allowing just 12 points per game. "I think their entire roster, they're deeper than they were a year ago. Their young guys that they had a year ago have continued to develop. They're playing extremely well," Heupel said.

**4. More cowbell:** Tennessee hits the road for the first time this season and will have to endure excessive clanging of cowbells from the Mississippi State fans. It's a unique environment. The key to handling the odd noise is communication and getting everyone in sync. Overall, though, Tennessee defensive lineman Bryson Eason said the Bulldog tradition is unique and fun. "I think

it's going to be cool to be in that type of environment, and to be in that hostile area," Eason said. "I am ready for it. I love hostile environments, I feel like it brings the best out of people."

### **Key matchup**

### Tennessee RB Star Thomas vs. Miss. **State RB Fluff Bothwell**

This is a great matchup based just on their names. They are also evenly matched. Thomas leads the Vols with 272 yards and four TDs while Bothwell is steady for the Bulldogs with 271 yards with four TDs.

### Player of the week **Bravion Staley, WR**

All the attention will be on Chris Brazzell II, which gives Staley a chance to make some plays. He's second on the team with 281 yards with two touchdowns.

### By the numbers

## ADs wait and see about sponsor patches

The leader of the largest multimedia rights holder in college athletics is confident sponsor patches will begin appearing on team jerseys sooner than later with schools under pressure to find new ways to make money in this new era of revenue-sharing with athletes.

Learfield President and CEO Cole Gahagan told The Associated Press the 67 power-conference schools and Notre Dame could combine to tap into hundreds of millions of dollars of new revenue once NCAA approval is granted. Gahagan predicted approval would come within months.

Sponsor patches on the front, back or sleeves of jerseys have been part of international soccer for decades and have become common in the NBA. NHL, MLS and Major League Baseball in recent years. Last year, the 23 MLB teams with jersey patches generated a total of \$204 million from those ads, according to sports marketing data firm SponsorUnited.

"There's no reason why colleges should sit behind those leagues with that opportunity, as sizable as it is," Gahagan said.

Other than the logo of a school's apparel sponsor, corporate branding patches on uniforms are prohibited by the NCAA. But the NCAA's decision last year to allow commercial advertisements on football fields makes approval of uniform patches seem inevitable.

"It'll come, and it should come," Nebraska athletic director Troy Dannen said. "As part of the NCAA modernizing its rules, it's overdue."

A potential holdup would be the exclusivity clauses in schools' contracts with apparel partners. Brands such as adidas, Nike and Under Armour do not allow marks of other corporate sponsors on the uniforms they supply to schools. Auburn, Alabama and Tennessee are Nike schools.

Gahagan said he and other stakeholders have had promising conversations with the apparel companies to ease that restriction. Learfield in December announced a program that would provide additional marketing opportunities for the apparel providers in exchange for allowing other jersey patches. Nike and Under Armour did not respond to requests for comment and adidas

declined to comment.

Texas Tech athletic director Kirby Hocutt said he didn't foresee his apparel sponsor being a roadblock.

"I've found that adidas in everything we've had conversations about - jersey patches included - has been open minded and reasonable and willing to consider any opportunity that's going to advance Texas Tech athletics," he said.

Nebraska and Texas Tech, like most other power-conference programs, are spending the maximum \$20.5 million on


direct revenue-sharing payments to athletes this school year. They've had to be creative in finding ways to fund the new expense, and Hocutt said jersey patches show promise.

"It's definitely something that is in the sponsorship deck that we're presenting to select partners about that opportunity in anticipation of it happening," The said. "Do we have a deal on deck? Not quite yet."

For some schools, Dannen said, the patches might not be as lucrative as believed.

When a school grants its multimedia rights to companies such as Learfield or Playfly, the school is paid a guaranteed amount of money to have the rights-holder handle all marketing and advertising.

Nebraska in 2022 signed a 15-year, \$300 million contract with Playfly. Under the terms, Nebraska receives a \$13.5 million guarantee for its multimedia rights in 2025-26. For revenue Playfly generates in excess of \$20 million in 2025-26, Nebraska receives a 72.5% royalty.







# It's bag-packing time for the SEC

It's time to start packing up, fellas.

Sam Pittman has had competitive teams at Arkansas, despite an annual exodus of talent via the transfer portal. This year's edition continues to be snakebit, though. The latest example: blowing an 18-point halftime lead at Memphis before fumbling away the opportunity for a go-ahead score at the end.

We really like Pittman, whose team could be 4-0 with a break or two. But the inability to grow the program makes a change inevitable.

At Florida, Billy Napier salvaged his job last season by winning five of the last seven games — including upsets of Top 25 rivals LSU and Ole Miss.

But that seems like a sepia-toned memory now. The Gators are 1-3 and weren't competitive in a 26-7 beatdown at Miami.


Those who knew Napier at previous stops as an assistant, including Alabama and Clemson, believe he will be a big success somewhere. Just not at Florida.

If AD Scott Stricklin makes the call, expect it soon. The Gators are off until an Oct. 4 date with Texas. Jon Gruden is openly campaigning for a job in the SEC and there are plenty of next-generation head coaches out there who would seemingly be a good fit.

But if you're expecting things to change, think again. Dan Mullen couldn't do it there. Neither could Will Muschamp. Frankly, if you look at Florida's history, there have only been two elite periods - one led by Steve Spurrier and another by Urban Meyer (at least until Nick Saban came along). This is a historically underachieving program, so there's evidence the problems go beyond coaching.

At Auburn, Hugh Freeze has dealt with his own hot-seat drama. But in a loss at Oklahoma, the Tigers problems were evident - lack of protection for quarterback Jackson Arnold as Oklahoma recorded a school-record nine sacks (initially recorded as 10 sacks before being revised Sunday) and some controversial calls that cost Auburn a 14-point swing.

Auburn has shown improvement in terms of the eye test, but the schedule alone could crank up the heat again if

Auburn doesn't rebound quickly at Texas A&M.

At Alabama, Kalen DeBoer has the Crimson Tide looking the part of a contender again. The idea of firing a second-year coach of his caliber is ludicrous, but if the Tide doesn't show up Saturday, the rumors begin again.

### **Looking ahead**

 Auburn at Texas A&M (2:30 p.m. Saturday on ESPN): Are the ninth-ranked Aggies for real? The only evidence thus far is an incredible come-from-behind victory at Notre Dame. A year ago, A&M was riding a seven-game winning streak before getting ambushed at South Carolina. Three weeks later, dreams of a playoff ended with a four-overtime loss at Auburn – Hugh Freeze's biggest win

to date. The Aggies want vengeance, but if Auburn fixes things up front this one goes down to the wire again.

LSU at Ole Miss (2:30 p.m. on ABC): Will the real powerhouse contender please stand up? LSU's defense looks like a national title unit. If the offense catches fire, look out. Ole Miss has the offense clicking no matter who's at quarterback, and a 45-10 throttling of Tulane deserves more credit than Lane Kiffin and Co. get. This one is under the radar, but it should be a back-and-forth affair.

• Tennessee at Mississippi State (3:15 on the SEC Network): Who'da thunk that State would welcome the Vols as the undefeated team? The Bulldogs already have arguably one of the league's two biggest nonconference wins (thank you, Arizona State). But Tennessee upgraded

at quarterback with Joev Aguilar and can score points in a hurry – enough to pop State's bubble.

 Alabama at Georgia (6:30 p.m. on **ABC):** The South's biggest rivalry of the last decade resumes between the hedges, where Kirby Smart points out it's the Tide's first visit since he became head coach. Alabama has owned this series, winning nine of the last 10 (and only playing outside the state of Georgia thrice). This already seems a must-win for Bama, but all the pressure is on Georgia because of Smart's track record against his former team.


