Grilled Hot Honey Chicken Wings

INGREDIENTS

3 lb. chicken wings, drum and flats Kosher salt & ground black pepper to taste

1 1/2 tsp. garlic powder 2 Tosp. unsalted butter ½ cup buffalo hot sauce 1/4 cup plus 1 Tbsp. honey (can use hot honey for extra heat, if desired) Juice of ½ lime

Prepare a grill using Kingsford Charcoal or charcoal of your choice to medium-high heat, and set it up for direct and indirect cooking, with the coals pushed to one side to create a hot zone and a cooler zone. The temperature should be around 400 degrees. Grease the grate to prevent

Grill the wings over the direct heat side of the grill with the lid closed, for about 10-15 minutes, turning once, until nicely browned. Meanwhile place the butter, hot sauce, honey and lime juice in a small saucepan over medium heat. Stir slowly until combined and heat until it barely simmers, without boiling. Move the wings to the indirect side of the grill and cook with the lid closed for about 20 minutes more, until the chicken is cooked through and has an internal temperature of 1165 degrees, basting frequently with the hot honey sauce and turning occasionally. Remove from the grill, spoon on any leftover sauce and serve hot. DIP with Hidden Valley Ranch or dipping sauce of your choice.



Four-down territory

- 1. Still the one: No one should read anything into Kalen DeBoer substituting starting QB Ty Simpson with Austin Mack last week against Louisiana-Monroe in the first half. Simpson is still the starter. DeBoer wanted Mack to get some work in with the starters, and to give Simpson some incentive. "I thought Ty responded pretty well, too," DeBoer said. "I think competition is just going to bring out the best in everyone."
- 2. In or out? Alabama is still missing some key pieces, including DL Tim Keenan and RB Jam Miller. Both have not played due to injuries. Last week, WR Ryan Williams didn't play due to concussion protocol and Jah-Marien Latham was also out with an injury. Keenan likely won't play for a couple more weeks, and Williams is listed as day-to-day. Miller could be ready by game time, however. "He's chomping at the bit," DeBoer said. "We've just got to make sure we're making a smart decision. That will be left up to our training staff and our doctors and how Jam feels."
- **3. Getting Badgered:** The Alabama run game was a dud against Florida State but rebounded against ULM. The Tide is back with another test against the Badgers, who have allowed 67 total rushing yards through two games. "There's going to be a little extra emphasis on (Wisconsin) stopping the run," Alabama offensive coordinator Ryan Grubb said. "(Watching the film) I just saw a group of guys that know what they're doing."
- **4. Bring the noise:** Wisconsin expects a rowdy crowd Saturday, although it might take Bama fans some time to wake up with the early kickoff. The Badgers are prepping for the noise and working on in-game communication. "We will be going with some different cadences and put some more on the guys up front to make sure we are on the same page," Wisconsin coach Luke Fickell said. "Can we simulate how loud the noise is going to be on Saturday? I don't think we can, but we will surely try."

Cuevas is third on the team in receptions with five, has 45 yards and is tied for the team lead with two TD receptions. Mason is a top target for the Badgers with seven catches with 102 yards, second on the team, with one TD.

Player of the week

Parker Brailsford, C

Wisconsin's defense, with nine sacks, will be up to the challenge against an Alabama line still finding its footing. Brailsford has to be the leader up front and get the Tide in the right alignment or it could be a long day.

By the numbers

5: Saturday's game will be just the fifth time a current Big Ten team has played Alabama in Tuscaloosa. The Tide won three of the previous four, beating UCLA in 2001, Rutgers in 1981 and Washington in 1975. Penn State spoiled Alabama's homecoming in 1990.

10: Wisconsin allowed 10 points through two games. The 5-point per game average is an improvement from the 13.5 through two games in 2024.

17: Ty Simpson was the third quarterback in SEC history with a perfect 100% completion percentage (minimum 10 attempts) after last week's 17-for-17 performance.

213: Germie Bernard's 213 receiving yards rank fourth in the SEC and 21st - Edwin Stanton

among all FBS receivers.

Prediction

Alabama 24. Wisconsin 17

The good news is Alabama played extremely well last week. The bad news is the Tide is facing another unranked opponent, in which DeBoer has a 6-4 record at Alabama. At least the game is in Tuscaloosa; that should help. The fact is, Alabama has no margin for error and must play elite football from here on. That brutal loss to FSU will be a reminder that mediocrity doesn't get you to the playoffs, much less win championships. That was never an issue under Nick Saban, but we're in a different world with DeBoer.

Four-down territory

1. Ready to run: Auburn might be without one of its top running backs, which means others, particularly Jeremiah Cobb, will have to step up. Damari Alston missed last week with a shoulder injury and is questionable for Saturday, Also. Durell Robinson was injured against Ball State and could miss a few weeks. Cobb was highly productive against Ball State, rushing for 121 yards and two scores. The door is also open for freshmen Omar Mabson and Alvin Henderson. "It will probably be a game-time decision," coach Hugh Freeze said of Alston. "Until you put the pads on and take a hit, I'm not exactly sure how he feels."

2. Could be better: The Auburn offense has rolled up 80 points through two games and is averaging 455 yards. That's not too bad, but Freeze isn't doing a lot of celebrating. There is still much that needs improving. "It's hard to sit here and act like we weren't solid, but there are things on the film that I think we need to improve," Freeze said. "We'll go to work this week to try and improve that as we host what I think is a very good football team in South Alabama."

3. Hot start: One area where Freeze isn't finding much to complain about is the defensive pressure. Through two games the Tigers have 10 sacks and 19 tackles for loss. The production is coming from several players. With the Tigers rotating in different players throughout the games, the defense is fresher and faster. "So far, so good. Just hope that buy-in continues," Freeze said. "I do still believe that our strength there is because of numbers and playing a limited number of snaps with incredible technique and passion and fundamentals."

4. Tiger fight: South Alabama has never been one to back down from facing Power Four schools. The Jaguars have one win in seven games against the SEC (21-20 vs. Mississippi State in 2016). The Jaguars also have a win over Oklahoma State in 2023. "They're very multiple, motion, shifts, things that make you think and make you check," Freeze said of the Jags. "Before you know it, if you're not careful,

vou've made the wrong check and one of those guvs (Devin Voisin and Anthony Eager) that can really run is hurting you."

Key matchup

Auburn RB Jeremiah Cobb vs. South Alabama RB Kentre Bullock

It's likely Cobb gets the start and that's not a bad thing. He's the team leader with 195 yards (7 yards per carry) and three touchdowns. Bullock is the workhorse for the Jaguars with 234 rushing yards (5 yards per carry) and three scores.

Player of the week

Cam Coleman, WR

It's about time for the sophomore to

have a breakout game. He leads the team with 100 yards on eight catches with no touchdowns.

4: Auburn has four sets of brothers on its roster, second most in the country (AnQuon and Antwon Fegans, Keldric and JJ Faulk, Antonio and Elijah Melendez, Duke and Erick Smith).

Four-down territory

1. Rising Star: Vols running back Star Thomas is tied for first in the SEC in scoring with three rushing TDs and one receiving score. He's also eighth in the league in rushing (161 yards). The. Vols will be leaning on Thomas against Georgia, which has allowed just 123 yards through two games. "We try to keep the same approach every week - come out and be the same group that we are from day in and day out. We don't try to overthink things like we try let the game come to us," Thomas said.

2. The big Gun(ner): Georgia QB Gunner Stockton has been just what the Bulldogs wanted him to be so far - efficient and mistake-free. In two games he's 40-of-58 passing for 417 yards with two TDs and no interceptions. He can also run. Most important, he hasn't been sacked. Tennessee has to rattle his cage a bit if the Vols expect to have a chance. "You have got to do a great job of applying pressure but still bottling him up inside of the pocket, not letting him get outside of it," Vols coach Josh Heupel said. "If they choose, he certainly can be part of the quarterback run game as well and try to tilt the numbers. So, huge test for us defensively."

3. No average Joe: Vols QB Joey Aguilar is the FBS active career leader in total offense per game (288.2) and is also the FBS active career leader in passing yards per game (270.2). He's making his 27th FBS start in his 28th career FBS game and first SEC matchup. He's 15-11 as a starter. "You never see him like overthinking things," Thomas said. "He's always calm and when you got a quarterback like that, like it's destined for everybody around him to be the same way."

4. Welcome back: Tennessee and The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame will jointly honor 2025 College Football Hall of Fame electee John Henderson at halftime. Henderson was a two-time All-American at UT and winner of the Outland Trophy in 2000. "College football hall of famer and one of the greats to have ever played the position and

certainly one of the greats here," Heupel said. "(It would) be great to have a bunch of his teammates back here as we get a chance to celebrate him, too."

In big games, field position is a key, and punt returns play a big role in that. Carter has 94 return yards with a long of 40 on four opportunities. Branch has just 33 yards on four returns but has the ability to break one.

Player of the week

Joey Aguilar, OB

What Tennessee needs most against

Georgia is stability and patience. Aguilar brings that with his steadiness in the pocket and not getting rattled. He's got the home crowd behind him, too, so that helps.

Stockton, UGA seek spark at Volunteers

ATHENS, Ga. – Georgia's lackluster offense in a win over Austin Peay failed to generate momentum for quarterback Gunner Stockton as he now prepares for his first true road game in the No. 6 Bulldogs' visit to No. 15 Tennessee on Saturday.

Stockton appeared tentative on some throws as Georgia led by only 11 points at halftime in its 28-6 win over the FCS team. The Bulldogs (2-0) fell two spots in the AP Top 25 following the sluggish effort in their final warmup for their Southeastern Conference opener against the Volunteers.

"We've got to find ways to be explosive," UGA coach Kirby Smart said. "You've got to be able to throw the ball down the field and take shots and that's probably the toughest thing I'm most disappointed in."

Smart said Stockton has displayed the necessary ability to make explosive throws in practice but has been limited to shorter throws by the defensive schemes of Marshall and Austin Peay.

"It's more about how people are playing us right now," Smart said. "It's been two weeks in a row that there's just a ton of cushion. ... If they want to play like that, you've got to take what they give you."

Stockton recognized the offensive performance against Austin Peay "wasn't our standard of how we're supposed to play. We need to get back to work."

Added Stockton: "You definitely want to be explosive."

Asked what is the identity of the Georgia offense, Stockton said, "I think our identity is we can run the ball and taking our shots and being able to throw the ball."

The Bulldogs' chances for improved production would increase if right tackle Earnest Greene III (back) and right guard Juan Gaston (knee, ankle) return from injuries. Smart said Monday he was "hopeful to get them back."

Smart called Stockton "a warrior" after the junior passed for two touchdowns and ran for two scores in the Bulldogs' 45-7 win over Marshall to open the season. Even so, Smart said the next step for Stockton is to play with more confidence, and that will be needed against the Vols, who rolled to a

72-17 rout of East Tennessee State last

"That's what we came here for and that's why we enjoy playing in the SEC," Stockton said of the test against Tennessee. "We're excited to get started and grateful for the opportunity."

Stockton has completed 40 of 58 passes for 458 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions. He had only one career start entering the season

after taking over in the College Football Playoff following Carson Beck's seasonending elbow surgery. Stockton won the full-time job following Beck's transfer to Miami.

"He's played really well," Tennessee coach Josh Heupel said of Stockton. "You look at him this year, he's taken great care of the football, he's been accurate with it, he's got the ability to be extremely mobile and extend and create

plays on his own."

Heupel said Stockton and a balanced running game led by Nate Frazier makes for a "huge test for us defensively."

Four-down territory

1. Wade-ing into the deep end: Two games into the season, UNA decided to make a switch at quarterback. Destin Wade, can you please stand up? Wade replaces a struggling Ari Patu after taking over in the second half of last week's 30-21 loss at Southeast Missouri State. Wade finished 8-for-18 passing for 103 yards and two touchdowns. Saturday will mark Wade's second college start. He was in the lineup for Kentucky's 21-0 loss to Iowa in the 2022 Music City Bowl. Wade completed 16 of 30 passes for 98 yards and two interceptions. He did not see a snap in 2023 and took just two for Colorado last season. But perhaps it's what the Lions need to help a team that's been held to 21 points or less in 15 of the last 24 games.

2. Handing over that check: UNA received \$300,000 for its season opener at Western Kentucky. Now, the Lions get the chance to be the ones to dole out some money. Northeastern State, a Division II team from Tahlequah, Oklahoma, will receive \$65,000 for Saturday's game. It was initially \$55,000, but UNA sweetened the deal when it needed to move the game up a week from its original date. It could be a good buy. The Lions have lost six straight dating to last season. Northeastern State left its conference two years ago to compete as an independent program because it was not winning enough. The RiverHawks have just three winning seasons since 2000.

3. Final first at Braly: This is scheduled to be UNA's last season opener at Braly Stadium with the school set to open its new stadium next year. The Lions will honor players from the 1940s through the 1980s. They will also wear a Florence State "F" emblem on their helmets. UNA has had some success in home openers since moving to Division I in 2018. The Lions are 4-3 in such games. But those outings have often come in pairs — two wins followed by two losses and so forth. UNA lost its first home game 24-17 to Illinois State last season.

4. The Longest Yard: This probably isn't relevant to Saturday's game, but it is next closest is Cam Woods with six

Oklahoma, Vandy help SEC rise again

Week 2 brought us recovery and redemption in the SEC.

Alabama and Texas rolled mismatched foes for their first wins, Auburn flexed its way into the AP Top 25 for the first time since 2021, and LSU, Georgia and South Carolina took care of business.

But three games stood out as image changers.

Boomer is back

We've been hesitant to jump on the Oklahoma hype train, but Never Fear John Mateer and the reworked Sooners offense made us believers Saturday. OU dominated Michigan 24-13, and the transfer quarterback was the biggest difference.

OU has just two weeks before its next test, when Auburn comes to town. The winner of their Sept. 20 showdown becomes a serious CFP contender.

Vandy's dandy again

The Commodores stunned Virginia Tech in overtime last season, an early sign that the program had become competitive under Clark Lea. Eventually, Alabama and Auburn would fall under Vandy's spell as the Commodores rode the wave to a winning record and rare bowl victory.

Saturday night, Vanderbilt went to Blacksburg and stunned the Hokies again, scoring 34 unanswered points to win 44-20 behind Diego Pavia. This program still may not yet be a legitimate contender; but trust me, the NIL has changed the landscape. Vandy has the alumni base to make it work in Nashville long term.

Bully! Bully!

No game changed perception more than Mississippi State's last-minute 24-20 win against Arizona State. The Bulldogs were competitive last season in Tempe against a team that made it to the quarterfinal round of the inaugural 14-team playoff.

Back in Starkville for the 2025 rematch, State stayed within striking distance before striking fatally and finally on a 58-yard bomb from Blake Shapen to Brene Thompson with 30 seconds left.

back-to-back Top 25 wins in memory, all the focus is on the underwhelming Gators. Making matters worse for Napier: AD Scott Stricklin shared a suite with ex-ball coaches Steve Spurrier and Urban Meyer, and none of the three looked pleased with the outcome.


