Officer Allen was then introduced to the Denton County Mental Health System and the amount of time it takes to get a subject evaluated and committed to a behavior health facility. Once we cleared the hospital Officer Allen used her time wisely and completed an information report (S10122281) regarding the incident with the suicidal female and the actions that Sanger PD took to ensure her safety. Officer Allen had no other dispatched calls for service, but did do 2 building checks and 1 suspicious vehicle. Overall it was a very slow shift with much of it spent at the hospital with the suicidal subject. Today was a great training opportunity for Officer Allen involving mentally unstable subjects, as we deal with a lot in the City of Sanger. Nothing further.

Bi-Weekly Observation Report

Comments: This bi-weekly observation report is for Phase 2 - shifts 08 (October 13th) through 15 (October 23rd). Officer Allen had 17 fewer calls-for-service and about a third of the traffic stops than the previous bi-weekly observation report but, Officer Allen had twice the number of reports, 3 DWI investigations that led to 3 arrests; one of the arrests being for felony DWI with a Child under the age of 15. During this reporting period, Officer Allen has been exposed to different types of calls besides the typical traffic stops and disturbances. Officer Allen participated in transporting a suicidal subject to the hospital for involuntary evaluation and eventual commitment. Officer Allen also participated in assisting the Denton County Sheriff's Office on multiple calls and relocating multiple 18-wheelers that were blocking the roadway near the truck entrance of the Walmart Distribution Center. Of course, Officer Allen participated in the 3 DWI arrests that she made over shift 13 and 14. SFST were only conducted on the first 2 DWI arrests on shift 13. FTO Thompson states that Officer Allen required a good deal of assistance administering the SFST even though she recently attended the SFST Refresher/Update course on August 11th. During the felony DWI arrest on shift 14, the driver was being placed in handcuffs by FTO Thompson and attempted to pull away / resist while Officer Allen was acting as a cover officer. FTO Thompson pulled the driver to the ground and fought with the driver for control of his hands while Officer Allen stood a few feet away and took no action. Fortunately, Sanger Officer Pease ran up from two vehicle lengths back to assist FTO Thompson in placing the driver into handcuffs. The entire scuffle took a little over 60 seconds. Officer Allen only watched as FTO Thompson and Officer Pease fought with the driver on the ground to place him in handcuffs. There is no valid reason why an officer should stand near-by and watch another wrestle/fight with a subject.

Any issue Officer Allen has or has had with paperwork, citizen contacts, traffic stops, how to handle different call types, etc. can most likely be addressed with time and repetition. How much time and how many repetitions? Those numbers are unknown as Officer Allen has completed a total of 41 shifts so far. As far as Officer Allen standing close and watching another officer or officers struggle/fight with an actively resisting subject on the ground is addressed; I do not know.
