History

The Stony Store was originally operated by the Elmore and Sparks Families in Stony in western Denton County. Their daughter, Louise Taylor, inherited the store and was the last to run it with her husband Henry. After the store closed, Louise and Henry's son, Carman O'Dell Taylor became the sole heir. He married Elvia Vereranda in 2002. Carman Taylor died in 2006 leaving the store to his wife. Bill Marquis purchased the structure from Elvia Taylor by giving her approximately \$800 from his pocket to save it from demolition and had it moved to his property.
