STEM NIGHT AT AUX SABLE ELEMENTARY

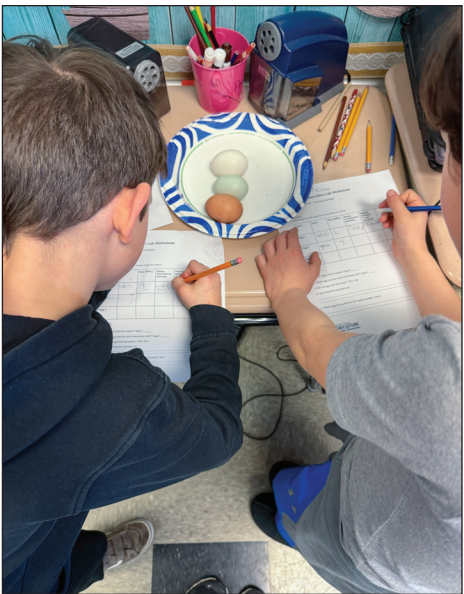
