GEORGE D. SCHEULEN



George D. Scheulen was born in Brooklyn, New York. Although born in New York, he moved to Virginia when he was six weeks old and was raised in the Stephens City area, outside of Winchester. He attended James Wood High School and Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University where he was a member of the Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC).

While in attendance at Virginia Tech, he was drafted and after basic training was selected to attend NCO (Non-Commissioned Officer) School. He served in the United States Army in the 1st Cavalry Division, known as the "First Team" and later in the "Sky Troopers". In 1965 he arrived in Vietnam as part of the first airmobile division, playing a critical role in the war and suffering the highest casualties of any U.S. Army division. They were deployed to the Central Highlands and coastal plains of Vietnam, utilizing air mobility for rapid movement and combat operation. Instead of horses, they used helicopters. With the rank of Sergeant, he was a squad leader in an infantry platoon. Their job was to locate and destroy the enemy, requiring extensive stretches of time in the jungle and often receiving enemy fire.

Mr. Scheulen is a recipient of the Bronze Star, awarded for valor and heroic achievement not involving aerial flight, and the Air Medal, awarded for meritorious achievement in aviation for all of the combat assaults in helicopters he completed.

After returning from Vietnam, he went back to Virginia Tech, where he completed his Bachelor of Science Degree. He began his work in public accounting in 1973, moving with his family to Warrenton in 1978 where he managed the Yount, Hyde & Barbour Warrenton office. In 1983, with William T. Patchett, Jr., he started Scheulen & Patchett, later to become Scheulen, Patchett & Edwards.

During his professional career, Mr. Scheulen was a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA); the Virginia Society of Certified Public Accountants (VSCPA), past Director; the VSCPA Educational Foundation, past Director; the Fauquier County Chamber of Commerce, past President, past Treasurer; the Warrenton Rotary Club, past President; the Fauquier Hokie Club, past President; and the Northern Piedmont Community Foundation, past Chairman of the Board.

Mr. Scheulen and his wife, Barbara, live in Warrenton, Virginia. They have two adult children, and five grandchildren.

Proper

Captain Mike Proper. Proper is an emergency medical services captain who was traveling on a flight from Washington's Dulles Airport to Las Vegas on Dec. 9, 2024, when another passenger fell ill with a possible stroke. About halfway through the flight, Proper responded to a call for medical assistance from the crew for help with an unconscious passenger. The man's wife said he was recently diagnosed with diabetes and had just started new medications. He provided oxygen and conducted a stroke assessment. The patient regained consciousness and

Proper helped monitor his condition for 90 minutes until the plane landed and paramedics arrived. He performed as trained, followed protocols and had excellent communication with the flight crew. His quick medical attention may have saved the patient's life.

First responders. On July 15, 2024, Emergency Medical Technicians Joshua Sabol and Jordan Rivera from the Warrenton Volunteer Fire Company and Connor Rodendough and Casey Burr of the Fauquier County Department of Fire Rescue System were dispatched to a business under construction and found two unconscious men inside the building. They tested the air for carbon monoxide and got a positive alert. They quickly removed the two men who were treated and survived.

Tanner

Trooper James C. "Chaz" Tanner. Tanner is a trooper with Virginia State Police Area 12 in Warrenton. He is being recognized for three separate investigations that resulted in high profile arrests, criminal charges and the recovery of drugs and guns.

On Nov. 8, 2024, Tanner was first officer on the scene of a fatal hit-and-run accident on Elk Run Road that killed a 73-year-old man as he crossed the road to his mailbox in front of his Catlett home. The case began with very limited evidence and no eyewitnesses, but Tanner relentlessly

followed leads until the suspect vehicle was identified after a tip from the suspect's neighbor. The 54-year-old suspect was charged with felony hit-and-run, manslaughter and operating a vehicle without an ignition interlock – a device that detects alcohol in a driver's system before allowing the car to start.

On Oct. 27, 2024, Tanner was on a traffic stop on I-66 for a fraudulent registration tag when he discovered the driver was a previously deported felon with a history of human smuggling. He called in support from the federal Immigration and Customs Enforcement. Along with three federal agents, the driver and four other occupants were arrested and charged with federal crimes, including a charge of human smuggling for the driver.

On Sept. 26, 2024, Tanner engaged in a pursuit with a fleeing vehicle on I-66 that ended with a chase on foot and the arrest of two men. The passenger was arrested for an out-of-state warrant and the driver for a traffic violation and charge of evading law enforcement. But Tanner then searched the driver and the vehicle and discovered 2 kilos of cocaine valued at \$200,000, along with two firearms. That led to additional charges and revealed a drug trafficking ring connecting across the U.S. and Mexico in a case that is still ongoing.

Tanner's exemplary work on these three separate cases showcases his commitment to the safety and justice of the citizens of Fauquier County. He has set a standard for other troopers to aspire to.

Delta Squad. On the early morning of May 29, 2024, deputies with the specially trained Delta Squad were dispatched to a home in Marshall on a report of a man with a weapon. When they arrived, they found a 35-year-old man holding a gun and a woman covered in blood. They quickly got the woman to safety and treated for her injuries. The suspect threatened to shoot officers, barricaded himself in the home and was arrested after a seven-hour standoff. The deputies that arrived on scene acted heroically by placing the injured woman's life before their own, knowing that the suspect had already inflicted bodily harm and stated that he was going to shoot any cop that arrived at his house.

First responders to a house fire. On Nov. 23, 2024, several first responders from the Warrenton Volunteer Fire Company, the Fauquier County Fire Rescue System and the Fauquier County Sheriff's Office responded to a report of a house fire with a possible trapped victim. They quickly began work to douse the flames and search for victims, but nobody was found inside. However, two unconscious dogs were removed to safety during the search and were treated with oxygen before being taken to a local veterinarian for further care. These crews demonstrated that any life, two legs or four legs may require rescue. All personnel went the extra mile to rescue these family pets from life threatening situations.

First responders. On August 13, 2024, Corporal Jeffrey Shaver was the first to arrive to CVS in Warrenton on a report of an assault. He found a 40-year-old suspect had exited his car and attacked a 78-year-old victim with a brick. Shaver quickly detained the suspect and then assisted in caring for the victim. Officers Rachel Shockey and Frances Radel arrived and also administered care to the victim, who was taken to the hospital but later died. Detective Michael Gemmell interviewed the suspect at the scene and obtained critical evidence. Detectives Matthew Eggers and Richard Kniatt also obtained key evidence from witnesses and video cameras. The suspect was later charged with murder. These officers remained calm, used great judgment, and displayed excellent teamwork in an effort to save the victim, complete a thorough investigation, and bring the alleged suspect to justice.

Dispatchers. On June 10, 2024, a series of calls reporting a child struck by a car came into the Fauquier County Communications Center. Several dispatchers took details from callers and worked to clarify the victim's injuries and instruct one caller to perform CPR. Dispatchers were able to determine the driver was still at the scene, verify the workplace of the child's mother so police could be sent to notify her, and call for a helicopter to take the child to Fairfax Hospital for treatment. The dispatchers excelled on this challenging, emotion-filled day by having the ability to significantly coordinate several agencies to respond to a horrific crash scene involving a child who was just out riding a bike on a relaxing, summer day because of their professionalism and devotion to Fauquier County.

Sheriff's deputies. On July 7, 2024, Deputy Duy Duong was patrolling on Lee Highway when two vehicles flew past at more than 100 miles per hour. Deputy Duong attempted to stop them, but they continued down a dead-end road before crashing both vehicles. The occupants then fled on foot. Deputies set up a perimeter and, with the help of a K-9 unit, located five people, including three juveniles. The deputies determined both vehicles were stolen and found ski masks and bricks in the vehicles. An investigation determined the suspects planned to break into a gun shop to steal guns. The suspects were later connected to other vehicle thefts in Loudoun County.

The observant actions of Deputy Duong and his quick response to the scene prevented further potential for numerous automobile crashes and injuries on the highway. The vehicle stops, the quick search and investigations, and prompt responses of the other deputies thwarted the possible burglary of the gun shop and put an end to the juveniles' stolen vehicle spree. Deputy Duong and the deputies involved in this potentially highly explosive case are valued members of the Fauquier County Sheriff's Office and serve as integral members of several of its divisions. They are dedicated to the safety of the residents of Fauquier through their exceptional proactive policing.

Sheriff's deputies. In July of 2024, Deputy Jonathan Grammo was dispatched to Andes Market in Remington when a caller said he spotted his stolen license plates on a vehicle at the gas pump. Grammo pursued the vehicle on Route 29 after it failed to stop and ended the chase with the pit maneuver. Grammo was injured but other deputies arrived and chased the suspect into the woods. Officers from several jurisdictions arrived but the suspect escaped. An investigation found the vehicle was stolen in Madison County along with several firearms that were in the trunk. The following morning sheriff's deputies identified a vehicle wanted in Culpeper County and another chase ensued on Route 29. Sgt. James Arrington again ended the chase with the pit maneuver and the suspect again fled on foot, but this time was captured. The man arrested was identified as the suspect in both chases and was wanted in several other jurisdictions. The heroic actions by Deputy Grammo, Deputy Duong, Sergeant Arrington and Deputy Healy, along with the observant actions of the other deputies who searched and investigated these crimes, helped to get a violent criminal off the streets.
