

Eastern Gas Transmission & Storage (EGTS) proposes Project Oak Leaf to increase the capacity of its PL-1 pipeline system to deliver incremental volume to serve end-use customers in Maryland and Virginia. The Project will leverage existing EGTS infrastructure while increasing capacity on its system through pipeline and compressor station additions

In Frederick County, the project will include installation of turbine inlet air chillers at the Myersville Station; upgrades at the Jefferson Metering & Regulation (M&R) Station; a new M&R station in Point of Rocks; and installation of approximately 13 miles of new 36-inch-diameter pipeline.

Regulatory approval for the project will be obtained via application to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) pursuant to Section 7(c) of the Natural Gas Act. EGTS expects to file the application with FERC in late 2026.
