



ALL-COUNTY SOFTBALL

Player of the Year VICTORIA MCCLAIN

MIDDLETOWN SENIOR PITCHER

■ A difference maker who helped propel a young Middletown team into the Class 2A state tournament. After getting struck by a ball in practice and suffering a fractured sinus cavity, she missed Middletown's first seven games, and the Knights got off to a 2-6 start. But after returning to action, McClain's stellar pitching and productive bat helped the Knights win their first regional title since 2015.

■ She was a dominant pitcher who went 10-3 with a 2.12 ERA and 104 strikeouts in 85 2-3 innings pitched. In the Class 2A West regional championship game, she fired a one-hit shutout to lead the Knights to an 8-0 win over Oakdale. She also ranked high on the Frederick County hitting leaders list, batting a team-high .474 with six doubles.



FIRST TEAM

EMILY DAY SENIOR OUTFIELD LINGANORE

■ Key performer for a Linganore team that reached the Class 3A state semifinals. In the regional playoffs, her two-run HR made the difference against TJ and she went 3-for-3 against Manchester Valley in the final. For the season, she batted .462 with 17 RBIs.



KATE DONAGHUE SENIOR CATCHER WALKERSVILLE

■ Tough catcher and offensive weapon for the Lions. She batted .435 with seven doubles and three homers. Serving as a leadoff hitter because of her OBP (.527) and baserunning skills, she scored 29 runs.



COURTNEY EYLER SOPHOMORE INFIELD CATOCTIN

■ Standout shortstop and offensive force for the CMC champs. She batted .595 with eight homers, three triples, 11 doubles, 46 runs and 24 RBIs. The leadoff hitter struck out just twice in 89 plate appearances.



WINTER HAWK SENIOR PITCHER THOMAS JOHNSON

■ A quality pitcher and solid hitter for the Patriots. In the pitchers circle, she went 10-6 with a 2.48 ERA and 74 strikeouts in 87 1-3 innings. She also batted .361 with 18 RBIs, one homer and five doubles.



KATIE LAING SENIOR PITCHER BRUNSWICK

■ Her pitching helped propel the Railroaders to their first regional title. Went 6-2 with four shutouts, a 1.68 ERA, 66 strikeouts in 62 2-3 innings and eight saves. Also hit .306. In state semis, fired a four-hitter and got the first hit off Bohemia Manor ace Madison Penta.



ASHLEY MAYTON SENIOR PITCHER-OUTFIELD CATOCTIN

■ Speedy athlete who, aside from being a top-notch outfielder, served solidly as the main pitcher for the CMC champs. Went 12-2 with a 3.21 ERA and 70 strikeouts in 91 2-3 innings. Batted .453 with five doubles, 13 stolen bases and nine sac bunts.



ABIGAYLE PERRY JUNIOR INFIELD BRUNSWICK

■ Standout shortstop who helped Brunswick win its first region title. The leadoff hitter hit .415 with one HR, two triples and seven doubles. Her running and cunning also allowed her to get 13 SBs. Had a two-run single in IA state semis against Bohemia Manor ace Madison Penta.



ASHLYNN ROUTZAHN FRESHMAN INFIELD MIDDLETOWN

■ Made an immediate impact for a Middletown team that reached the Class 2A state semifinals. She batted .436 with three homers, six doubles, one triple and a team-high 25 RBIs. She also provided a quality glove at second base.



SPENCER RUPINTA SOPHOMORE PITCHER URBANA

■ Dominant pitcher who helped the Hawks win the CMC Spires title. Went 13-3 with a 1.52 ERA. Had 172 strikeouts in 105 2-3 innings. Also contributed with the bat, finishing with three homers and 18 RBIs.



RAEGAN SMITH SENIOR INFIELD CATOCTIN

■ A dangerous power hitter who helped the Cougars defend their CMC crown. She had a county-best 12 homers. Also batted .513 with three triples, eight doubles, 49 RBIs and a slugging percentage of 1.171.



MADISON TOBERY JUNIOR INFIELD CATOCTIN

■ She enjoyed an error-free season at first base, a position she had never played for the Cougars before this season. A clutch hitter who had three game-winning hits in the seventh, she batted .463 with three homers, eight doubles and 27 RBIs.



KALEAH WETHERHOLT SOPHOMORE INFIELD OAKDALE

■ A clutch hitter and versatile infielder who helped the Bears reach the Class 2A West region final. She batted a team-high .425 with one homer, two triples, three doubles and 16 RBIs. She played shortstop and second base.



ASHLYN WHITE SOPHOMORE DP OAKDALE

■ While a shoulder injury from field hockey kept her from serving as a catcher, her bat proved valuable for the CMC Spires champion Hawks. Led Urbana in hitting (.446) and RBIs (21). She also helped coach backup catchers this season.



PAIGE WILHELM SENIOR INFIELD LINGANORE

■ An impact player for the state tournament-bound Lancers. She led the Lancers in batting (.494) and runs scored (30). Also had 10 extra base hits and flashed a solid glove at second base.



LINDSEY WINDSOR SENIOR PITCHER WALKERSVILLE

■ Finished her stellar career by breaking program records for career strikeouts (595) and games completed (65). Had a 3.07 ERA with 111 strikeouts in 98 innings. At the plate, she batted .359 with seven doubles, two triples and a team-high 23 RBIs.
