



ALL-COUNTY FIELD HOCKEY

Offensive Player of the Year **LEXI BRISTOW**

URBANA SENIOR MIDFIELD

■ Capped her stellar career by being Frederick County's scoring leader and serving as the cornerstone for a team that was once again one of Frederick County's best. She was an ace distributor, a trait she first showed as a freshman on the varsity team, and rock-solid trail on defensive corners to help the Hawks post nine shutouts.

■ Finished with 19 goals and 15 assists for a county-best 53 points. For her career, she had 52 goals and 42 assists, which both rank in Urbana's top three.

■ She will continue her field hockey career at Lafayette College, becoming just the fifth Urbana player to earn a Division I field hockey scholarship.



Defensive Player of the Year **ALLENA JAWORSKI**

LINGANORE SENIOR GOALIE

■ The top goalie in Frederick County and a big reason why the Lancers became the first Frederick County field hockey team in 32 years to win a state title.

■ Had a 0.89 goals against average, a save percentage of 91 and posted 10 shutouts. Those stats are impressive, but they only scratch the surface when it comes to describing her value to the Lancers. Her ability to size up shooters and react made her a game-changing rock in close games, especially in the playoffs. In both the state semis against South River and the state final against Westminster, she made saves on penalty strokes for games that were later decided in double overtime.

■ She will continue her field hockey career at Division I Liberty University, which was ranked No. 7 in the final 2025 NCAA poll.



FIRST TEAM

KAITLYN BELTRAN SENIOR ATTACK MIDDLETOWN

■ Persistence and ability to play the ball quickly and effectively made her a key player on the offensive end for the Knights. She was either the inserter or pads player on corners. Finished with 3 goals and 10 assists.



ABBY DESOTELL SENIOR DEFENSE URBANA

■ Returning first-teamer who served as a key contributor for a defense that posted nine shutouts and helped the Hawks go 14-3 and reach the Class 4A state semifinals.



KARLI HARRISON JUNIOR DEFENSE WALKERSVILLE

■ Quarterback for the CMC Small Schools Division champ. Her poise and patience on defense helped her come up with key tackles, especially against breakaways. Anchored a defense that allowed just 10 goals against Frederick County teams.



MAKENZIE KILCOYNE JUNIOR ATTACK URBANA

■ She and Lexi Bristow formed a menacing one-two offensive punch for one of Frederick County's top teams. She finished with 52 points, which tied for second overall in Frederick County.



MIA MARQUART SOPHOMORE MIDFIELD WALKERSVILLE

■ Despite being routinely marked, Marquart ranked second in the county in points (52), finishing with a team-record 20 goals and team-high 12 assists. Her explosiveness and finesse stick work made her hard to stop and a cornerstone for the CMC Small Schools champ.



MADELYNN MYERS JUNIOR ATTACK CATOCTIN

■ Teamed up with Josey Shaffer to form one of Frederick County's most prolific one-two scoring punches. Possessing stick skills and drive, she had a team-high 21 goals and 1 assist for 43 points, which ranked among the county's top scorers.



AMILIA NASTO JUNIOR MIDFIELD LINGANORE

■ An impact player for the 3A state champs. With speed, stick skills and an ability to read plays, she was a force on both ends of the field. Had a huge goal against Westminster in the state final. Finished with 11 goals and 7 assists while being a dogged defender.



SHAY RAIFORD SENIOR DEFENSE OAKDALE

■ Oakdale's rock on defense who remains calm in stressful situations and has a strong drive that helps get the ball upfield. Had 7 defensive saves. Even contributed on offense, finishing with 1 goal and 5 assists. Was a critical player on offensive and defensive corners.



ADDISON RIDGELY JUNIOR MIDFIELD LINGANORE

■ This James Madison commit helped the Lancers win the 3A state title and the CMC crown. Had 16 goals and 7 assists. She was the main shooter on corners, and that's how she scored the game-winner in double overtime against South River in the state semis.



REESE RYMON JUNIOR MIDFIELD OAKDALE

■ Her hard shot might've been Frederick County's most wicked, and her 50 points (21 goals, 8 assists) ranked third in the county. Linganore gave up just three goals (not counting tournaments) to Frederick County teams all season, and Rymon had two of them.



JOSEY SHAFFER JUNIOR MIDFIELD CATOCTIN

■ Center midfielder who often fought off double teams to make solid passes or get off good shots on goal. Forming a prolific one-two punch with Madelynn Myers, Shaffer finished with a team-high 45 points (18 goals, 9 assists).



DESTINY SHOEMAKER SOPHOMORE MIDFIELD-ATTACK WALKERSVILLE

■ Key part of attack for the CMC Small School Division champs, finishing with 12 goals and five assists. Her stick skills and field vision helped her move the ball swiftly up the sidelines.



KAITLYN STAIGER SENIOR ATTACK OAKDALE

■ Another key weapon for the 11-5 Bears. Had a knack for carrying the ball consistently, getting takeaways and creating opportunities in the circle. Finished with 6 goals, 8 assists and 2 defensive saves.



ASHLEY TUCCI SENIOR MIDFIELD FREDERICK

■ Her ability to set up things on the field was a boon for the Cadets. She set a team record for career assists and provided valuable leadership as a captain. Finished with three goals and six assists.



JORDAN ZIMMERMAN SENIOR ATTACK LINGANORE

■ Capped her stellar season in the most noteworthy way imaginable, scoring the game-winning goal in double overtime against Westminster in the 3A state championship game. Ranked among the county's top scorers with 13 goals and 7 assists.
