



ALL-COUNTY SOFTBALL

Player of the Year GABY MCANAW

URBANA, SOPHOMORE, PITCHER

■ Top player for an Urbana team that reached the Class 4A state championship game, where it barely missed capturing its third state crown, falling 1-0 to Broadneck in the eighth inning. McAnaw was Frederick County's top pitcher, and she was in typically dominant form in the 4A final, striking out 12 and giving up just two hits in the complete game. She also ranked among the county's top hitters.

■ She led Frederick County pitchers in ERA (0.82), wins (17) and strikeouts (214, which was 118 more than the runner-up in that category). She tossed two perfect games, three no-hitters and two one-hitters. Fielding her position, she had no errors in 19 chances.

■ She was second on the team in batting average (.411) and led the Hawks in homers (5), doubles (11) and RBIs (32)



FIRST TEAM

MADY ANTHONY
SOPHOMORE, CATCHER
MIDDLETOWN

■ Rock solid catcher for the 2A state semifinalist. Batted .414 with a 8 doubles (which led the team), 1 triple, 2 homers and 34 RBIs, which led the county. Caught 135 innings and made no errors. Threw out 7 of 15 runners who tried to steal for a caught stealing percentage of 46.7.



ELENA DOYLE
SOPHOMORE, OUTFIELD
LINGANORE

■ Came up big in big games, including in the postseason, for the 3A state semifinalist. Batted .397 with 5 doubles, 2 triples and 28 RBIs, which was second-highest on the team. She read balls quickly, had a strong arm and committed no errors.



CAITLIN HINKELMAN
JUNIOR, CATCHER
WALKERSVILLE

■ One of the county's top hitters and a stalwart catcher. Led the Lions in hitting (.517), homers (4), RBIs (22) and slugging percentage (.862). Caught every inning (1212-3) and called most pitches. Of the 12 runners who tried to steal, she threw out 3 and picked off another.



MAYA LOWERY
FRESHMAN, INFIELD
BRUNSWICK

■ Quickly settled in as Brunswick's third baseman while becoming one of the county's top sluggers. Batted a team-high .471 with 7 doubles, 5 homers, which ranked second in the county, and 29 RBIs, which also ranked high on the county list.



BRADYN MACKAY
SENIOR, INFIELD
LINGANORE

■ Helped the Lancers reach the 3A state semifinals with her glove and bat. Hitting leadoff, she batted .487 with 10 doubles, 3 triples, 1 homer, 25 RBIs and 26 runs scored. Only made 2 errors all year as the starting shortstop.

SENIOR, INFIELD
URBANA

■ Georgetown commit who helped the Hawks reach the state final. Returning to shortstop after catching in 2025, she had just four errors on 66 chances. Was a calming influence for younger teammates in stressful situations. Batted .366 with 6 doubles, 2 triples, 2 homers and 22 RBIs.



HAYDEN MOXLEY
SENIOR, PITCHER-INFIELD
MIDDLETOWN

■ Top player for a team that reached the Class 2A state semifinals. Ranked third among county pitchers with a 1.34 ERA and finished with an 8-5 record. Was also one of the county's top hitters, batting a team-high .500 with 5 doubles, 3 homers and 25 RBIs.

SENIOR, OUTFIELD
OAKDALE

■ Her leadership and mighty bat helped the Bears enjoy a 12-7 turnaround season. She batted .463, led the team in homers with 4 and was second in RBIs with 20.



SOPHIA PEREZ
SOPHOMORE, INFIELD
CATOCTIN

■ Another dangerous bat for a Catoctin team that went 17-2. Batted .492, which ranked high in the county and second on the team, and finished with 8 doubles and 29 RBIs.



MAGGIE SLAGHT
FRESHMAN, OUTFIELD
URBANA

■ Lefty leadoff hitter who made an immediate impact for the 4A state finalist. She batted a team-high .419 with 6 doubles, 2 triples and 1 homer, which came in the state semis. Only struck out twice. Had a 1.000 fielding percentage on 19 chances in the outfield.



LANA SPAHR
SOPHOMORE, CATCHER
OAKDALE

■ Her presence behind the plate and production at the plate helped the Bears enjoy their most successful season in years with a 12-7 record. She batted a team-high .500, which ranked 3rd among FCPS hitters, with 3 homers and 19 RBIs.



CAITLYNN STAMBAUGH
SOPHOMORE, PITCHER
CATOCTIN

■ Emerged as the dependable ace for a team that lost Virginia-bound pitcher Taylor Smith. Throwing 89 1-3 innings, she ranked second in the county in ERA (1.18) and wins (13) while finishing with 96 strikeouts. Batted .433 with 3 doubles, 6 homers (which led the county) and 16 RBIs.



ROGYN THRASHER
JUNIOR, INFIELD
ST. JOHN'S CATHOLIC PREP

■ TJ transfer who helped the Vikings win the IAAM B Conference title, their first league championship in 10 years. Batted a team-high .556, which ranked second in Frederick County, with 17 RBIs and 22 runs scored. Earned All-IAAM first team honors.



LILLY TRUNNELL
SENIOR, CATCHER
LINGANORE

■ A major piece for the 3A state semifinalist. Batted .481 with 23 RBIs. Caught 124 innings and provided leadership for freshman pitcher Mikayla Bumgarner. Threw out 7 runners by connecting with shortstop and fellow difference-maker Bradyn McKay.



BRALYN WEST
JUNIOR, OUTFIELD
CATOCTIN

■ A three-time first-teamer who keeps getting better. She led Frederick County in hitting with a batting average of .603, which was achieved by getting 41 hits in 19 games. Had 12 doubles, 4 homers, 19 RBIs and 31 runs scored. Had a 1.000 fielding percentage in center field.
