



ALL-COUNTY FLAG FOOTBALL

Offensive Player of the Year

MORGAN ROBERTS

LINGANORE SENIOR RUNNING BACK

■ The dynamic, speedy Roberts shined out of the backfield as she drove the Lancers' offense. She was Frederick County's leading rusher and second-leading receiver, helping Linganore win the county championship and make an appearance in the inaugural state tournament.

■ The senior carried the ball 53 times for 409 yards and ran for five scores, the most in the area. Roberts was the Lancers' top option in the passing game, reeling in 59 catches for 676 yards and seven touchdowns.

■ Roberts was also a standout defensive back for a Linganore squad that allowed 6.7 points per game, the second-fewest in the county.



Defensive Player of the Year

MACKENNA PATTERSON

URBANA JUNIOR DEFENSIVE BACK

■ A ballhawking cornerback, Patterson served as the top defender on Frederick County's top defensive team. She forced the most turnovers for a Hawks squad that paced the area in takeaways, leading a unit that carried Urbana to another undefeated regular season and the semifinals of the inaugural state tournament.

■ Her eight interceptions tied for the most in the area, and she ran two of those back for touchdowns. Patterson was an expert flag-puller, too, making 55 tackles.

■ On offense, the junior was the Hawks' leading receiver and one of the region's top pass catchers. She had 64 receptions for 581 yards and 10 scores, leading the county.



FIRST TEAM

GENEVIEVE CHASE

JUNIOR QUARTERBACK/DB

MIDDLETOWN

■ The standout safety snagged six picks and also took over under center for the Knights. Chase proved just as effective on offense despite missing three weeks with a hand injury, throwing for 1,262 yards and accounting for 15 total touchdowns.



CAITLYN CROTTY

SENIOR WIDE RECEIVER

URBANA

■ One of the area's most reliable pass catchers capped her senior season by helping the Hawks to an undefeated regular season and the state semifinals. Crotty caught 54 passes for 508 yards and five touchdowns.



SAVANNAH EANES

SENIOR QUARTERBACK

LINGANORE

■ The county's most experienced signal caller threw for 1,197 yards and 14 touchdowns, also rushing for 233 yards and two scores before her season was cut short by a knee injury in the Lancers' regular-season finale.



SIERRA EANES

SENIOR WIDE RECEIVER/DB

LINGANORE

■ A leader on both sides of the ball, Eanes helped the Lancers win the county championship and appear in the state tournament. She snagged two interceptions and made 16 tackles while catching 38 passes for 455 yards and four touchdowns on offense.



SHA'NIYAH GOINES

JUNIOR WIDE RECEIVER

FREDERICK

■ The sure-handed Goines was a reliable receiver and defender for the Cadets, who made the semifinals of the county tournament. She caught 20 passes for 258 yards and four touchdowns while also running in a score.



ALYSSA HARTIS

SENIOR WIDE RECEIVER

TUSCARORA

■ Hartis produced most of the Titans' offense. She caught 36 passes for 505 yards and five touchdowns while rushing eight times for 109 yards and two scores. On defense, she led the county with 59 tackles and snagged two picks.



ROSIE HENSON

FRESHMAN WIDE RECEIVER

FREDERICK

■ There was no better receiver in the county than Henson, whose 733 yards led all pass catchers. Henson's speed made her the Cadets' top target, as she frequently burned defenses and hauled in eight touchdown catches.



MADI KEAN

SENIOR LINEBACKER

BRUNSWICK

■ The senior's eight interceptions tied her for the county lead with Urbana's Mackenna Patterson. Kean helped a much-improved Railroaders squad get off the field more often on defense, as she also made 48 tackles.



BRIANA LEE

SENIOR ATHLETE

MIDDLETOWN

■ The do-it-all senior shined no matter where she played. Lee accounted for 714 all-purpose yards and four scores. She was the county's only player to register over 100 yards passing, rushing and receiving and had a team-leading eight sacks on defense.



LAYLA MCFARLAND

JUNIOR QUARTERBACK/DB

OAKDALE

■ She continued to be a stellar safety for the Bears, using her height to snag five interceptions. But McFarland took her biggest leap on offense, assuming starting quarterback duties and throwing for 1,117 yards and nine touchdowns.



AUDREY NEWTON

JUNIOR QUARTERBACK

URBANA

■ The county's best passer led the county's most potent aerial attack. Newton threw for 2,125 yards and 26 touchdowns, both high-water marks for a quarterback in the brief history of the sport in Maryland, as the Hawks made the state semifinals.



ZOE NSO

JUNIOR DEFENSIVE BACK

THOMAS JOHNSON

■ After a solid sophomore year, Nso broke out in 2024 and became the Patriots' top all-around player. She paced her squad with six interceptions on defense while catching 30 passes for 314 yards and six touchdowns.



JOSSLYN QUANSAH

SENIOR RUSHER

LINGANORE

■ No player in the county was better at getting off the line and stopping a ball carrier than Quansah. The speedy senior made a team-leading 57 tackles for a Lancers squad that won the county championship and made the state tournament.



ADDISON QUEEN

JUNIOR DEFENSIVE BACK

URBANA

■ The junior snagged four picks as part of a turnover-happy Hawks defense that was the best in the area and helped Urbana reach the state semifinals. She also had 36 tackles and a sack. On offense, Queen had 323 all-purpose yards and 4 touchdowns.



AVERY RAY

SOPHOMORE WIDE RECEIVER

OAKDALE

■ Ray rocketed up the county leaderboards as an explosive wide receiver for the Bears. The sophomore pulled in 45 receptions for 435 yards and five touchdowns. On defense, she had a pair of pick-sixes and made 35 tackles.



ARIANNA REED

SENIOR WIDE RECEIVER/DB

MIDDLETOWN

■ The senior looked like a seasoned pro in her first year of flag football. Reed's sticky hands helped her lead the Knights in interceptions (seven) and receiving (36 catches, 473 yards, three touchdowns) as they made the semifinals of the county tournament.



MAYA ROBINSON

SOPHOMORE QUARTERBACK

FREDERICK

■ After initially splitting snaps, Robinson earned the starting quarterback job and flourished as a dual-threat weapon. She led a much-improved Cadets attack by throwing for 1,730 yards and 16 touchdowns while rushing for 359 yards and two scores.



NAIMA THOMAS

SENIOR DEFENSIVE BACK

THOMAS JOHNSON

■ It was another fine season for Thomas, who nabbed five interceptions and registered a sack as one of the Patriots' defensive leaders. She developed into an offensive weapon, too, catching 11 passes for 166 yards.
