



ALL-COUNTY BOYS LACROSSE

FIRST TEAM

Offensive Player of the Year ROMAN LAROCCO

LINGANORE Junior Attackman

■ On a team that graduated 70 percent of its scoring output from the previous season, LaRocco turned in a record-setting 2019 season — the biggest reason for the Lancers not experiencing a dropoff. His ability to facilitate matched his scoring prowess, driving the Lancers to their second straight Class 3A West region final appearance.

■ After recording just 30 points the previous season, established Frederick County single-season records for goals (78), assists (69) and points (147).

■ Delivered big performances in the postseason, scoring 26 points over three playoffs, including a six-goal, two-assist effort in a region final loss to Westminster. Has verbally committed to play lacrosse at Boston University.



Defensive Player of the Year KEVIN MEDINA

URBANA Senior Goalie

■ The backbone of a defense that surrendered just 4.1 goals per game and allowed just two opponents to score in double digits.

■ Had a knack for coming up with big saves in tight matches, most notably in close victories over Glenelg and Linganore — games decided by two goals and one goal, respectively.

■ Recorded a .640 save percentage and 5.25 goals against average, finishing with 112 saves.

■ Earned U.S. Lacrosse Western Maryland Chapter All-Academic honors.



WILL COLETTI JUNIOR FOGO/MIDFIELDER LINGANORE

■ He continued his excellence at the faceoff X (.834 faceoff win percentage), but Coletti increased his value by emerging as a dangerous midfielder. A U.S. Lacrosse Western Maryland Chapter All-American, he tallied 32 goals and 21 assists.



DILLON DIERMAN SENIOR DEFENSEMAN MIDDLETOWN

■ Providing a strong physical presence, the 6-foot-5 Dierman has been a fixture on Middletown's back line, starting for the Knights the past three years. Amassed 53 ground balls and 36 caused turnovers in addition to tallying two goals and two assists.



COOPER FABRY SENIOR MIDFIELDER LINGANORE

■ Like LaRocco, Fabry increased his production significantly from the previous season, giving the Lancers a consistent scoring threat. Registered 35 goals, 23 assists, 61 ground balls and 13 caused turnovers.



SHAWN GIBBONS SENIOR GOALKEEPER OAKDALE

■ Last year's Defensive Player of the Year, Gibbons continued playing at a high level in goal despite playing on a team that suffered heavy losses to graduation. Posted a county-best .654 save percentage, finishing with 178 saves.



AIDAN GILSDORF SENIOR DEFENSEMAN THOMAS JOHNSON

■ Gilsdorf's primary position may have been defenseman, but he ended up being a jack of all trades for the Patriots, playing several other positions and sparking TJ's man-up offense. Collected 15 goals, six assists and a team-high 38 ground balls and 27 caused turnovers.



LUKE HALLMAN SENIOR ATTACKMAN MIDDLETOWN

■ One of Frederick County's most prolific scorers, Hallman recorded his second consecutive 69-goal season. Also collected 25 assists, 39 ground balls and 14 caused turnovers. U.S. Lacrosse All-American will play collegiately at Robert Morris University.



LAYNE HARICH SENIOR MIDFIELDER BRUNSWICK

■ A model of consistency, Harich landed on the All-Area first team for the fourth straight season. He tallied 42 goals, 41 assists and 36 ground balls, ending his career with 147 goals and 112 assists. Harich will play collegiately at Seton Hill University.



ROLAND HOCKENBERY SENIOR FOGO/MIDFIELDER MIDDLETOWN

■ Like Coletti, Hockenbery was more than just a faceoff specialist for the Knights. In addition to winning 78.5 percent of his faceoffs, tallied 21 goals, 12 assists, 80 ground balls and 11 caused turnovers. Will play collegiately at the University of Delaware.



JACK JOZWIAK SOPHOMORE ATTACKMAN URBANA

■ Scored 52 goals, but Jozwiak's great vision and strong stick skills allowed him to repeatedly thread passes through tight windows and onto the sticks of teammates. Had 59 assists, 27 ground balls and 15 caused turnovers.



JASON JOZWIAK SOPHOMORE ATTACKMAN URBANA

■ A transfer from Calvert Hall along with his brother, Jack, Jason Jozwiak became one of Frederick County's most consistent finishers around the crease, totalling 57 goals, 36 assists, 38 ground balls and nine caused turnovers.



ERIC KOLAR SOPHOMORE MIDFIELDER URBANA

■ Another dynamic offensive weapon on a stacked Urbana team, Kolar provided even more value with his strong defense on an aggressive Urbana ride. Finished with 32 goals, 19 assists, 37 ground balls and 16 caused turnovers.



JASON KOLAR SOPHOMORE ATTACKMAN URBANA

■ Fired the ball with pinpoint accuracy as Kolar found the back of the net on 55 percent of his shots, leading to a team-leading 67 goals. He also accumulated 23 assists, 18 ground balls and eight caused turnovers.



JOEY MASSON JUNIOR DEFENSEMAN URBANA

■ Masson consistently limited the effectiveness of the opposition's top scoring threat for Frederick County's top defensive team. Led the Hawks with 22 caused turnovers in addition to scooping up 21 ground balls.



MIKE MAURO SENIOR DEFENSEMAN LINGANORE

■ Tough interior defense around the crease again proved invaluable as Mauro landed on the All-Area first team for the second consecutive season. Finished with 26 ground balls and 13 caused turnovers in addition to tallying a goal and two assists.



BRENDAN SCHMITZ SENIOR MIDFIELDER URBANA

■ Defenders often had a difficult time dealing with Schmitz's speed, which allowed him to create plenty of space to pepper the goal with hard shots. Compiled 33 goals and 13 assists along with 24 ground balls.



JON WHEAT SENIOR DEFENSEMAN LINGANORE

■ Having long displayed his range and athleticism as an LSM, Wheat showed his versatility by excelling on the back line while still being a factor in transition. Had seven goals and five assists while leading the Lancers in ground balls (66) and caused turnovers (33).
