



ALL-COUNTY BOYS BASKETBALL

Player of the Year COLLIN SCHLEE

OAKDALE Senior guard
 ■ May now be best known for receiving a football scholarship from Kent State and leading the Bears' football team to its first state championship, but Schlee again showed off the sheer athleticism that attracted attention from college basketball programs. On a team that suffered heavy losses to graduation, he helped ensure that Oakdale remained the top team in the county with his extraordinary talent, leading them to a fourth straight CMC title and a second straight appearance in the Class 2A state tournament.

■ Making an impact in several different ways, from shooting the ball well from beyond the arc to skying above opponents for rebounds to making clean steals and racing downcourt for crowd-pleasing dunks, Schlee averaged 19.1 points and 10.4 rebounds for 23-4 Oakdale. But as the only returning starter on the Bears, he also stood out as a distributor, averaging a team-high 4.3 assists. He became the only player in program history to record 500 points, 250 rebounds and 100 assists in a single season.

■ Finished with 1,401 points, 523 rebounds and 202 assists in his high school career.



FIRST TEAM

DAN BOUSH SENIOR FORWARD MIDDLETOWN

■ Already an imposing post player before the season, added a consistent outside shot to a strong all-around game. Averaged 16.7 points and 6.3 rebounds for the Knights, who finished 16-8.

JAHMIK HILL SENIOR GUARD FREDERICK

■ Thanks to elite jumping ability, flourished on the offensive boards and could hang in the air and hit tough shots over defenders. Averaged 22.7 points, 7.9 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 2.2 steals.

JR POWE SENIOR GUARD/FORWARD THOMAS JOHNSON

■ Set the tone for a rugged Patriots team with his nonstop effort, particularly on the glass. Averaged 16.7 points and 8.5 rebounds for two-time Class 3A West region champs. Scored 1,093 career points.

RICHARD RIVAS SENIOR GUARD THOMAS JOHNSON

■ Added a stepback jumper and improved as a rebounder, making him that much more dangerous on the offensive end. Averaged 16.7 points and 4.2 assists, finishing with 1,007 career points.

TRUMAINE STRICKLAND SENIOR GUARD TUSCARORA

■ Added some bulk over the offseason, becoming extremely difficult to defend on drives to the basket. Led the county in scoring (23.2 ppg) while also averaging 4.2 assists and 4.6 rebounds.
