

ALL-COUNTY **FLAG FOOTBALL**

Offensive Player of the Year

LEXI PETRIE

LINGANORE SENIOR OUARTERBACK

- In her only full season as a starter, Petrie looked like a seasoned pro while leading Frederick County's top offense. A lacrosse player by trade. Petrie was a calm decision-maker in the pocket, smashing a variety of county single-season offensive records.
- Petrie could make plays with her arm and legs. She threw for 4,180 yards and 55 touchdowns, both marks leading the county by wide margins. She also scrambled 80 times for 468 rushing yards and seven touchdowns on the ground, the latter mark tying for the county lead
- She was at her best in the postseason, tossing four touchdowns in the Class 2A/1A final to lead Linganore to the Class 2A/1A championship, the first girls flag football state title for any Frederick County school.





Defensive Player of the Year

MAKENNA ROBERTS

LINGANORE SOPHOMORE DEFENSIVE BACK

- The two-way star broke out in her second year at Linganore. Roberts parlayed a strong freshman campaign at cornerback into an even better sophomore season, using her elite speed to hawk a Frederick County-leading and single-season record 13 interceptions, to go with 52 flag pulls.
- Roberts was just as prolific on offense. She slotted at wide receiver and blazed past defenses for a county-leading 1,754 yards on 110 receptions, hauling in 15 touchdowns as a reliable option for quarterback Lexi Petrie.
- Roberts was named the MVP of the Class 2A/1A title game after hauling in nine catches for 178 yards and two touchdowns, helping the Lancers win Frederick County's first girls flag football state championship

FIRST TEAM

MORGAN BOOTH

JUNIOR RUSHER OAKDALE

■ Her blazing speed proved the difference in many of the Bears' wins, especially on de-fense. Her 48 flag pulls led Oakdale, with 19 coming for a loss. On offense, she caught 40 passes for 339 yards and three touchdowns while running 31 times for 229 yards.

BECCA BURGESS

JUNIOR WIDE RECEIVER **MIDDLETOWN**

She was a significant two-way threat and an integral part of the Knights' late-season surge. Burgess caught 46 passes for 619 yards and five touchdowns. As a cornerback, she had four picks, deflected seven passes and made 26 flag pulls.

BROOKLYN DOMMEL FRESHMAN DEFENSIVE BACK

LINGANORE

■ She showed no signs of a learning curve as she helped the Lancers win the Class 2A/IA state title. Dommel had a county-high 67 flag pulls plus three picks as a lockdown corner. She also caught seven touchdown passes

JULIA DUERR SENIOR CENTER

URBANA

■ The county's most effective center helped deliver the Hawks another undefeated regular season and their first county title. Duerr blocked well for quarterback Audrey Newton and caught 49 passes, five for touchdowns, for a team-leading 489 yards.

SHA'NIYAH GOINES SENIOR WIDE RECEIVER

FREDERICK

She spent another season as one of the county's top pass catchers on one of the area's most explosive offenses. Goines hauled in 673 receiving yards and three touchdowns on 43 catches as a trusty target for quarterback Da'Myra Wallace

RACHAEL HEPNER SENIOR RUNNING BACK

LINGANORE

■ The dynamic backfield threat proved instrumental in leading the Lancers to the Class 2A/1A state title. Her 551 rushing yards led the county, as did her 22 receiving touchdowns. She finished with 1,469 all-purpose yards and 25 total scores



CAHYA JEFFERSON SENIOR DEFENSIVE BACK

TUSCARORA

■ She led one of the county's top five defenses, flying around the field to stop drives and keep the Titans in contention. Jefferson had 44 flag pulls, eight interceptions and a sack, also deflecting 14 passes to cap her high school career with a team-record 32



AUDREY NEWTON SENIOR QUARTERBACK

URBANA

■ She finished her high school career with another year as one of the county's top signal callers. The veteran led the Hawks to another undefeated regular season and their first county title, finishing with 2,368 passing yards and 33 touchdowns.



ZOE NSO

SENIOR DEFENSIVE BACK THOMAS JOHNSON

A gritty leader whose hands proved invaluable on both sides of the ball, Nso led the Patriots to their best season yet. She picked off seven passes as part of a shutdown defensive backfield, also snagging six touchdowns on 394 receiving yards.



KESSY PANOU-KWADJAMBOU

SENIOR RUSHER FREDERICK

■ She was constantly in the opposing backfield, presenting a speedy nightmare for quarterbacks. Panou-Kwadjambou was always quick off the line, and her 28 flag pulls for a loss led the county. She finished with 44 total pulls.



MACKENNA PATTERSON SENIOR DEFENSIVE BACK

URBANA

■ It was another excellent season for one of the area's top defenders. Patterson's 47 flag pulls and seven interceptions, including a pick-six, helped the Hawks win their first county title. She also caught 44 passes for 402 yards and two scores



LILLI PONTIUS SENIOR WIDE RECEIVER

URBANA ■ She stood tall in a crowded receiver

room, proving a handful for opposing cornerbacks. Pontius caught a team-leading nine touchdowns as Urbana won its first county title, hauling in 30 catches for 372



BROOKE PUTNAM SOPHOMORE ATHLETE

WALKERSVILLE

■ Putnam played nearly every snap on both sides of the ball for the Lions. She totaled 525 yards rushing, receiving and passing while not allowing a sack as a blocker. She snared nine picks, returning two for touchdowns, and had 43 flag pulls.



AVERY RAY JUNIOR WIDE RECEIVER OAKDAI F

■ Ray had another highly productive season as one of the county's top pass-catchers, leading the Bears with 68 receptions for 801 yards and 11 touchdowns. She also proved a strong linebacker, pulling 37 flags while grabbing two interceptions



MAYA ROBINSON JUNIOR WIDE RECEIVER

FREDERICK

■ She managed a transition from quarterback to receiver exceptionally well, serving as the engine of the Cadets' explosive aerial attack. Robinson finished with 91 catches for 1,081 yards and 14 touchdowns, ranking top three in the county in all categories.



SIENNA RUSSO JUNIOR ATHLETE

BRUNSWICK

■ The Roaders' top two-way playmaker, Russo served as an aggressive threat no matter where she lined up. She finished with 34 flag pulls, 13 sacks and a pick on defense while hauling in three touchdown catches and 230 receiving yards on offense.



KATELYN WAGUESPACK JUNIOR DEFENSIVE BACK THOMAS JOHNSON

■ Her superb coverage skills made Waguespack the Patriots' defensive heartbeat. Her instinct and field vision led to 10 interceptions, locking down the defensive backfield with Zoe Nso. On offense, she had 162 receiving yards and three touchdowns.



DA'MYRA WALLACE JUNIOR QUARTERBACK

FREDERICK ■ She broke team records as a first-year

starter, emerging as a consistent passer and leader who managed the Cadets' explosive offense with aplomb. Wallace threw for 2,648 yards and 24 touchdowns, also rushing for 336 yards and seven scores
