## Co-Wrestler of the Year **EARL BLAKE**

#### LINGANORE SENIOR 132 POUNDS

Known for his speed and relentlessness on his feet, capped his sensational high school career with his first undefeated season at 45-0.

Overcame breathing difficulties in the Class 4A-3A state final at 132 pounds to earn a 10-7 victory over Bethesda-Chevy Chase's Eli Guttentag and his third consecutive state title.

Closed his high school career with an overall record of 158-12. Finished as a four-time Frederick County champion and a two-time regional champion.

Led Linganore to its first regional championship and first apperance in the state duals finals. Also helped the Lancers win their first county team championship since 1990.

Will continue his wrestling career at Kent State University.

## Co-Wrestler of the Year **KEVIN MAKOSY**

#### **URBANA SENIOR 195 POUNDS**

One of the most technically sound wrestlers to ever compete in Frederick County, capped his final season of high school wrestling with his second consecutive state title at 195 pounds in Class 4A-3A.

A four-time county champion and three-time regional champion, finished his career at Urbana with a 141-12 record, including a 35–1 mark this season, and the highest national ranking in school history, No. 13 at 195 pounds. His final high school victory over was a 13-5 major decision over Paint Branch's Austin Smith in the state final. He was the only wrestler to beat Smith all season, as he also won the Class 4A-3A North region final at 195 between the two.

Named the Most Outstanding Wrestler of the Frederick County tournament after pinning his way to the championship.

Will continue his wrestling career at the University of Maryland.
