





> The Frederick County Sheriff's Office Patrol Operations Section is conducting a pedestrian safety initiative in Frederick County throughout the summer months due to an increase in the number of pedestrian related incidents, citizen complaints, and a rise in pedestrian traffic. The Sheriff's Office will couple education with enforcement to reinforce knowledge of and compliance with pedestrian-related laws. The Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit will be distributing informational brochures to users of the roadway during their regular patrols. The Sheriff's Office encourages drivers and pedestrians to follow these tips:

>

> Pedestrians

>

> • Always use a sidewalk if one is provided. If a sidewalk is not provided, pedestrians must walk facing traffic on the left shoulder of the road.

>

> • Pedestrians should only cross the road at designated crosswalks.

>

> • If walking at night, pedestrians should carry a flashlight or wear reflective clothing.

>

> • Avoid using electronic devices while walking or jogging in congested areas or when crossing the road.

>

> • Look left, right, behind, and left again before crossing a street or stepping into traffic.

>

> • Watch for turning vehicles; make sure the driver sees you and will stop.

> Drivers

>

> • Watch for pedestrians at all times. Exercise caution when approaching a pedestrian, crosswalk, or intersection.

>

> • Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks.

>

> • Drive within the posted speed limit.

>

> • Stop fully at stop signs and signals.

>

> • Do not drive distracted.

>

> Maryland law requires pedestrians to follow these guidelines:

>

> • At an intersection, a pedestrian is subject to all traffic control signals.

>

- > • If a pedestrian crosses a roadway at any point other than in a marked crosswalk or in an unmarked crosswalk at an intersection, the pedestrian shall yield the right-of-way to any vehicle approaching on the roadway.
- >
- > • Where a sidewalk is provided, a pedestrian may not walk along and on an adjacent roadway.
- >
- > • Where a sidewalk is not provided, a pedestrian who walks along and on a highway may walk only on the left shoulder, if practicable, or on the left side of the roadway, as near as practicable to the edge of the roadway, facing any traffic that might approach from the opposite direction.
- >
- > • Except for the occupant of a disabled vehicle who seeks the aid of another vehicle, a person may not stand in a roadway to solicit a ride, employment, or business from the occupant of any vehicle.
- >
- > • In Frederick County a person may not stand in a roadway, a median divider, or an intersection to solicit money or donations from the occupant of a vehicle.

Things are a little less crazy now so I wanted to reach out again although I know with the Forth of July weekend upon us, I may not hear back right away.

On a different note - not related to elections or development per say, I was wondering if you could give me some guidance or suggestions as to what can be done in regards to road safety specifically in the MD 75 & MD 80 corridor.

In the last year the amount of dump trucks barreling up and down these small state roads as well as even smaller county roads has increased tremendously. I have followed a number of them myself to a location off of Ball Road - although I think that has dropped off some. However these and many other large trucks seem to have found there way around major roads to get to their destination. While it may not be illegal to use these roads, certainly the speeds are.I won't even mention the tractor trailers, that's a whole other ball game.

It is of a major concern to many of us here in Monrovia, Ijamsville, New Market, Mt. Airy and Urbana. As this has been part of our major fight against Monrovia Town Center and the construction hasn't even begun! Landsdale development has begun and has major safety issues all by itself. The construction entrance is on the South side of Ed McClain and if you are not familiar with that road, I encourage you to visit and you'll see why this is an unacceptable access for construction vehicles. I was told by someone in the county they will be relocating Ed McClain but it won't be done until sometime late fall, until then, we have a problem.

I know many of these may be issues that are out of your hands, but it would be nice for someone to at lease pay attention to the high speeds these trucks are taking on these roads.

I have started a diary from residents who live around here on incidents they have witnessed and I am compiling them to forward to anyone who will listen.

I would also be interested if there are any devices to use to show people how fast they are going. I remember a long time ago in Montgomery County you could "rent" a radar or speed device for a day or two just to show people how fast they were going - it might have been through our neighborhood watch though.
