



The 20,000 square foot single-story facility will feature a skilled trades workshop, flexible classroom spaces, teaching kitchen and a new home for the YMCA Youth Service Bureau.

Due to the generous donation of property from the McMillen Foundation, the YMCA Enterprise Zone will be situated immediately north of the Renaissance Pointe YMCA. The location is ideal since it will minimize travel and provide a catalyst for neighborhood economic development. This three-phase project will include:

- **Career Opportunities Center**
- **Outdoor Corner Park**
- **Athletic/Special Event Fields**

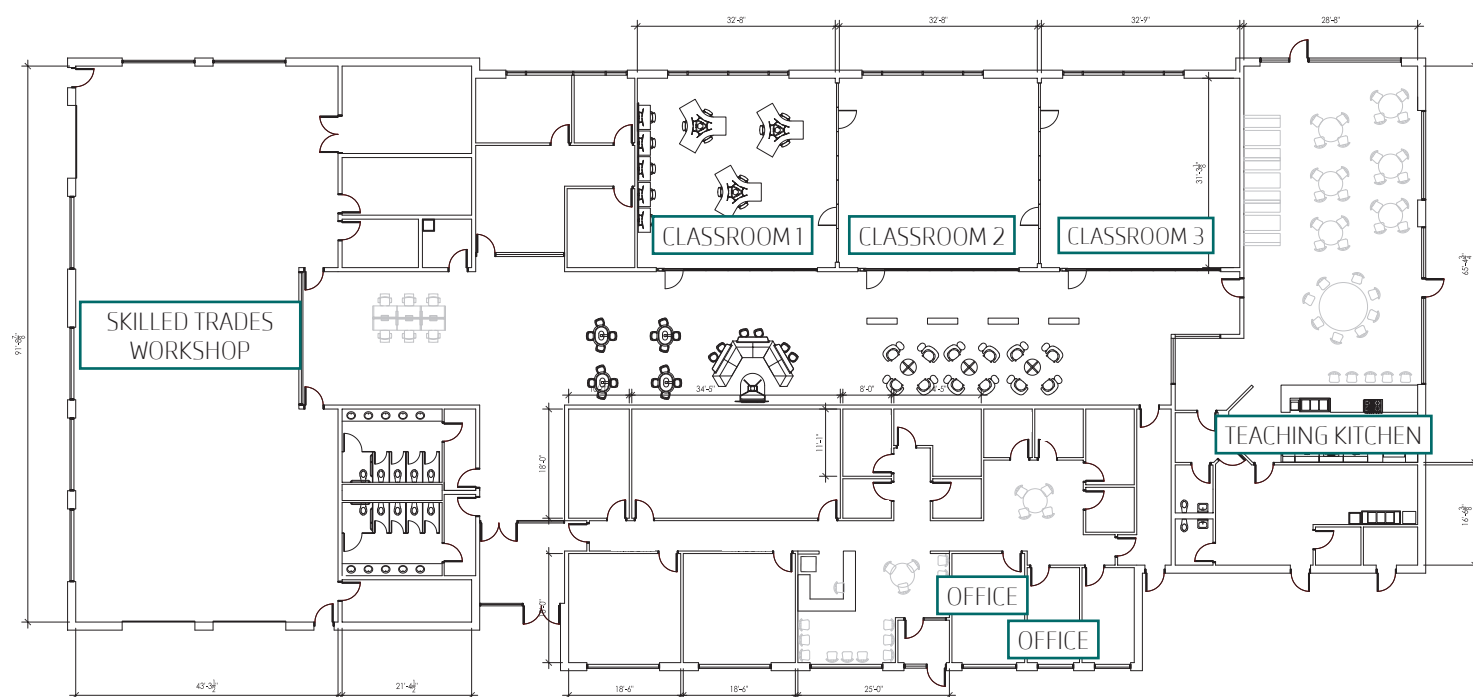

Since 1858, the YMCA of Greater Fort Wayne has been committed to strengthening the community. The YMCA has been serving the southeast Fort Wayne community for decades beginning with the Old Fort YMCA in 1956 and the Southeast Family YMCA in 1965. The Renaissance Pointe YMCA was dedicated in November of 2010, bringing both Y's together into a new state-of-the-art facility located on Bowser Avenue.

The YMCA of Greater Fort Wayne is continually focused on the betterment of people at all stages of life through impactful programs from swimming lessons to youth intervention, mentoring and family programming to elderly support. Each year of our history has been marked by undeniable accomplishments in the face of the challenges of changing times, but more than anything, what marks our history is our dedication to helping people.

WHY AN ENTERPRISE ZONE & THE YMCA?

The YMCA Enterprise Zone education curriculum will introduce youth and young adults to career fields that require technical expertise and hands-on work. The Enterprise Zone will offer:

- **Career exploration for teens**
- **Career coaching for teens and young adults**
- **Training programs for young adults**

Various disciplines will be explored in construction trades, computer science, and culinary arts. Examples could include carpentry, plumbing, electrical, coding, animation, food service, and nutrition.

Through partnerships and current YMCA programs, teens will also explore careers in manufacturing, health sciences, human services and media/communication.

The YMCA Enterprise Zone extends the YMCA's Hope for Youth Initiative (2017) and the Renaissance Pointe YMCA's College and Career Readiness Programs (2019) by deepening opportunities for youth and teens to succeed through exploring careers and identifying their passion.

The YMCA's success with youth education and character development programs position the Y to bring together the right partners, the right programs and the right people to help youth succeed in life.

PROJECT & PURPOSE

The Hanna Creighton Neighborhood in southeast Fort Wayne is historically one of the most economically disadvantaged zip codes in Indiana. Young people need knowledge about numerous vocational opportunities in order to develop a career or educational path that helps them become productive and successful adults.

The YMCA Enterprise Zone is a \$7 million multi-phase project which will provide a local center for teens and young adults to explore careers and receive training that will propel them toward a sustainable, meaningful future.

VISION

EMPLOYMENT – Career coaching, resume and interview skills, soft skill development, and job fairs.

ENTERPRISE – Business development skills, hands on learning lab and entrepreneurship.

EQUITY – Narrow the "opportunity gap" and racial disparities in wealth by connecting youth to career opportunities. Focus on participants from under resourced neighborhoods and underrepresented demographics. Retrack students into higher education opportunities if applicable.

PROGRAMS – Career planning, career exploration (Examples could include financial literacy classes, skilled trade experiences, and adult certification classes).

PEOPLE – Values-Based Role Models, Mentorship, Career Coaches, Instructors, and Educators.

PARTNERS – Ivy Tech Community College, local school districts, building trades, youth serving nonprofits, etc.
