




Metavine





CONCEPT

Rising elegantly out of the foundation planter box is the Metavine. Its bamboo-like stem, made from welded steel tube, supports stamen-like tips resembling chandeliers and rolled steel tubes unfurling like leaves. Painted in bright colors inspired by nature, Metavine arches over the walkway inviting the viewer to look at it from every angle. Playful and elegant, Metavine is a site specific creation inspired by nature. Both light and airy it will be a dramatic stroke across the skyline without blocking any of the surrounding architecture.










Installation will require a setting crane and some onsite welding. An experienced erector will require 2-3 days depending on final design and the amount of required welding.

The sculpture will arrive by flatbed trailers in a few pre-assembled units with the backbone stem being at least 2. The circles and stems will be attached according to the engineer and installers input.

All parts will be primed and prepainted where possible with the final touchup paint applied after the erectors are finished.

Metavine's base plate will be fabricated based upon pre-existing anchor bolt locations. Anchor specs will be provided by the engineer.










Upon accepted commission final artist drawing will be made and delivered to engineers for their work to specify materials and welding requirements. Stamped drawings will then be sent to the fabricator.

The fabricator will draw what they need to cut all the parts and weld the assemblies.




About Cary Shafer

American sculptor, Cary Shafer is a classically-trained stone carver whose breadth of work includes major architectural projects, private garden installations, and freestanding abstract sculpture.

A native of Indiana, Cary attended the Chicago Art Institute before completing four years of training with Italian master-carver Vincent Palumbo at Washington's National Cathedral. Apprenticed in the historic tradition, Cary learned stone carving's complex body of technical knowledge, its secrets to stones, the preferred tools for varying stages of work, and the techniques for achieving light and shadow. Among the many ornamental stones, Cary carved the final gargoyle on the cathedral.

From studios across the United States and in Europe, Cary's work continues to evolve as he explores the boundaries of his art on the personal and the large-scale. Completing many unusual, private commissions, he has also contributed to projects nationwide, served as Artist-in-Residence at Crazy Horse Mountain, South Dakota, and conducted restoration work at the White House.

Cary's skill and spirit of creativity allows him to envision the unique and to execute site-specific requests with masterful attention to detail. As fluidly, this same aesthetic has led him to embrace art direction in the film industry, and to share the significance of his work in lectures at schools and universities. With each new project, Cary finds new opportunity for challenge and inspiration that draws on one of the oldest, rarest crafts in the world.
