# **Service Standard Index**

The index is used by many police departments to determine future staffing needs for primary first responders, who are patrol officers whose main responsibility is to respond to calls to police. The ideal for a department is 60/40 target ration under this formula.

### The 60/40 target ratio

Available time: 60 percent of an officer's time is free to patrol, community policing, neighborhood problem solving and community interaction.

Obligated time: 40 percent is in responding to calls and administrative duties.

### Actual

The average number of calls an officer responds to in a year.

## Calculation

In addition to looking at the number of primary first responders Galveston had in 2013, the analysis also used these numbers:

### 34.33 minutes

average time a primary responder spends on a call

#### 41%

percentage of calls requiring a backup officer
