1985

Humana opened a 43-bed unit aimed at women's health problems - minus obstetrics.

### 1988

Moses H. Cone Memorial Hospital (later part of Cone Health) purchased the facility and reinstated the Greensboro Hospital name.

## February 2020 -

Women's Hospital closes and Cone Health opens the new Women's and Children's Center at Moses Cone Hospital.

## September 2021

Cone Health gives up the building and grounds in a real estate swap with Greensboro-based Deep River Partners.

# 1977

Opened as Greensboro Hospital. the city's first for-profit hospital. a controversial concept at the time. It had 100 beds and was operated by Humana, CBS News correspondent Charles Kuralt was the keynote speaker at the dedication.

#### 1982

Additional 30 beds approved. It was renamed Humana Hospital-Greensboro, Relations soured with the medical community after Humana opened MedFirst clinics, offering extended office hours and treatment of patients with minor emergencies and without appointments. Some physicians resigned from the hospital's board in protest, and Humana lost significant occupancy as some doctors did not refer patients to Humana after this point. At one point, occupancy was so low that the hospital temporarily closed the upper floor.

## 1990

After much renovation. the facility became the Women's Hospital of Greensboro, still under Cone ownership. It is the first free-standing hospital dedicated solely to women and newborns in the state.

## April 2020
