Unvaccinated woman dies at GRMC

The Joint Information Center reported Guam's 171st COVID-19-related fatality.

The patient was a 65-year-old woman who died at 12:46 p.m. Wednesday at the Guam Regional Medical City.

The woman was unvaccinated and had multiple underlying health conditions.

"Our island continues to feel the effects of the pandemic, and another family's world has been upended by this disease," Gov. Lou Leon

Guerrero said.

"As we join the island in mourning, we remind everyone ... that we have the tools, the capability and the fortitude to control the upheaval before us, and bring about a safer future," she said.

Cases

The Department of Public Health and Social Services reported 202 new cases of COVID-19 out of 1,567 tests performed Sept. 14.
